Local Government Act 1960.

### ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act 1960-1983, it shall be lawful for the Governor on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets and such land shall, from

the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

## PRISONS ACT 1981-1982.

## PRISONS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 2) 1984.

MADE by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Prisons Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1984.
- Reg. 8 amended.— 2. Regulation 8 of the Prisons Regulations 1982\*, as amended, is amended—
- (a) by deleting subregulations (1) and (2) and substituting the following subregulations—
- “ (1) A prison officer who receives from a medical practitioner other than the prison medical officer or medical officer any treatment of the kind normally provided by a general practitioner, for himself, his spouse, or his dependent children, may claim from the Director a sum equal to the amount which he is personally liable to pay and has paid, less the amount which is refundable as medicare benefits for that treatment and the Director may authorize payment of that sum to him.
- (2) In this regulation “medicare benefits” has the meaning given to that expression in the Health Insurance Act 1973 (as amended) of the Parliament of the Commonwealth. ”;
- (b) in subregulation (5)—
- (i) by deleting “a medical benefit fund or like society” and substituting the following—  
“ medicare benefits ”; and
- (ii) by deleting “the relevant medical benefit fund or like society,”; and
- (c) by inserting after subregulation (6) the following subregulations—
- “ (7) A prison officer living in a *de facto* marital relationship for a period of 12 months or longer shall be entitled to the benefits set out in this regulation, in relation to his *de facto* wife and dependent children.
- (8) The Director may request a Superintendent or other senior ranking officer to confirm that a *de facto* marital relationship exists and where that officer is not able to confirm that the relationship does exist, the prison officer making the claim shall provide proof of the relationship by means of a statutory declaration which shall continue in force until rescinded by the declarant, and the declarant shall rescind the declaration when making a claim, if the relationship no longer exists. ”.

## HEALTH ACT 1911.

City of Subiaco.

By-Laws.

CITY of Subiaco being a local authority under the provisions of the abovementioned Act and having adopted the Model By-laws Series "A" made under the Act does hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Act and all other powers enabling it make and publish the following by-laws—

1. In these by-laws the Model By-laws Series "A" as amended from time to time adopted by the City of Subiaco by resolution published in the *Government Gazette* of 15 October 1964 and amended from time to time are referred to as "the principal by-laws".

2. The principal by-laws are amended by inserting after by-law 66A of Part I the following by-law—

66B. (1) Subject to the provisions of this by-law the owner or occupier of premises shall not—

(a) keep or permit to be kept; or

(b) sell or offer for sale or permit to be sold or offered for sale, a rat on or from those premises.

(2) Sub-by-law (1) hereof does not prevent the keeping of rats for the purposes of scientific or medical research on premises owned or occupied by—

(a) the University of Western Australia; or

(b) another institution or organisation approved by the local authority, (in this by-law called "a research organisation").

(3) A research organisation which keeps rats for the purposes of scientific or medical research shall—

(a) cause all live rats to be kept in cages which are kept locked;

(b) cause accurate and complete written records of all rats brought onto the premises and disposed of to be kept;

(c) permit a health surveyor to inspect the records referred to in paragraph (b) of this sub-by-law at all reasonable times and to take copies thereof and extracts therefrom;

(d) if a rat escapes cause all reasonable steps to be taken in accordance with these by-laws to trap or destroy it.



Causeway Interchange.







Mitchell Freeway-Britannia Road to Gibney Avenue Interchanges.







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
