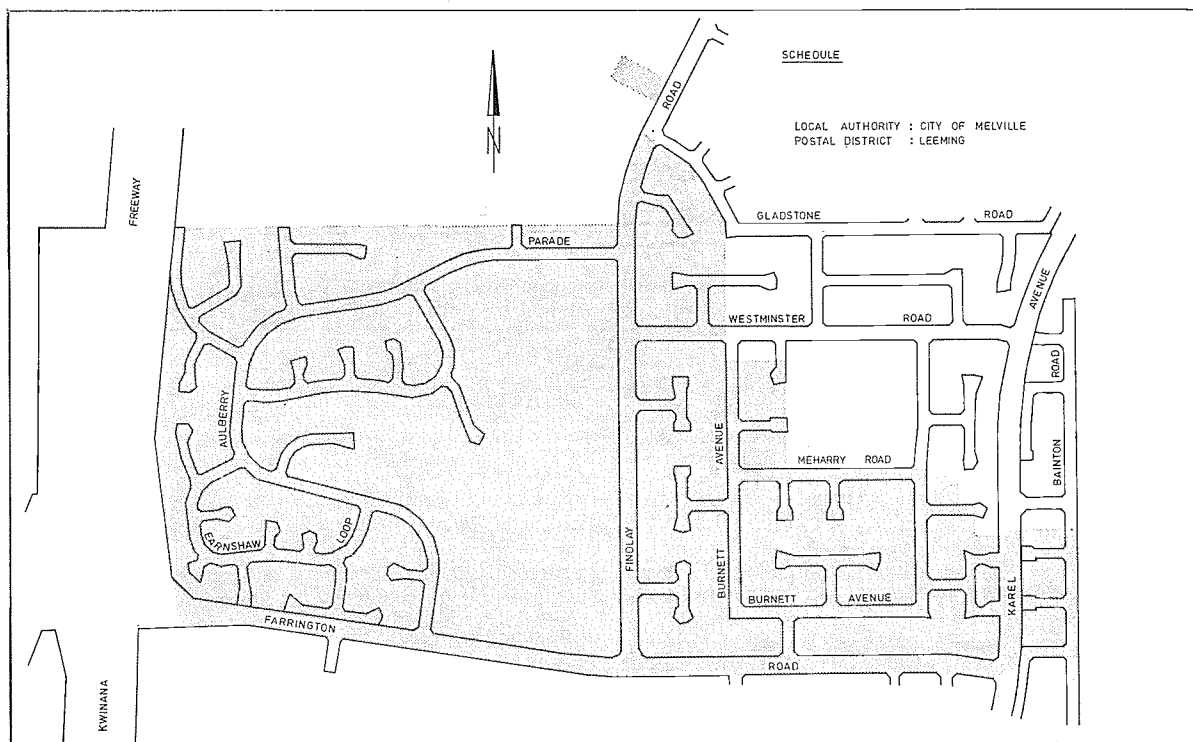

The accounts of the Shire of Moora have been audited for the financial year ended 30 June 1983. The accounts have been found to be in order and properly kept in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act 1960 and have been allowed subject to the comments contained in this report. An amount of \$23 664.75 remaining unspent for Main Roads Additional Grants has not been transferred to a Trust Fund or a Reserve Fund as required by Accounting Direction 6 (13). In consequence the Municipal Fund, Bank Overdraft in the Balance Sheet has been understated by a like amount. Description of land are not sufficiently detailed in the asset register to enable audit verification of relevant title deeds. In addition Lot 4 Melbourne Street, Moora was not included in the asset register.

In my opinion, subject to the above comments the Balance Sheet and the related financial statements for the year ended 30 June 1983 have been prepared on a basis consistent with the Local Government Act Accounting Directions and present a true and fair view of the affairs of the Shire.

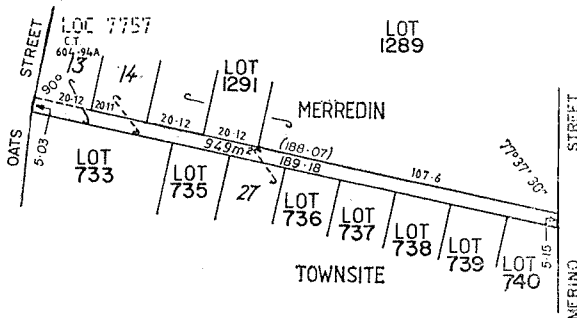
