1. Subdivision of Special Rural Area No. 6 shall be generally in accordance with Plan of Subdivision Special Rural Area No. 6—(Swan Point) annexed to this document and dated the 6th April, 1983.

2. The minimum lot size shall be two hectares.

3. Within Special Rural Zone Area No. 6:—

(a) The intent is to create a combined hobby-farm and rural-residential retreat area, with emphasis on the merging of development with the landscape; rural-residential lots to be located generally in timbered areas and valleys.

(a)

Specified Area of Locality.

- Lot 7 of Swan Location 969, Part Swan Location 682, Swan Locations 680 and 681 and defined as Rural Industry Zone.

(b)

Special Provisions to specified Rural.

- The subdivision of Rural Industry Zone is to accord with the subdivisional plan attached as endorsed by the Shire Clerk and variation shall only be permitted with the written approval of the Council and the Town Planning Board.

2. 2.1 The minimum lot size shall be no less than 2 hectares.

2.2 There shall be no direct access to the Brand Highway from any lot within the area.

2.3 Only one industry or use shall be permitted on each individual lot.

2.4 No development shall be commenced without Council first having granted its planning approval.

2.5 Development application to the Council shall embody the basic premise that development and associated services are secondary to the natural features of the site. To fully illustrate the total development programme for each lot, such plans, sketches and specifications shall aim to minimise the visual effect of the resultant development on the rural landscape.

2.6 A site layout plan showing in detail the location and extent of areas for the parking of vehicles, loading and unloading bays and ramps, including access roadways and any areas to be used for open air storage of fuel or raw materials or products or by-products or waste of manufacture and proposals for garden treatment, landscaping and any other information Council may require shall be submitted with the application for planning approval.

2.7 A dwelling house may be constructed on a lot but only if Council is satisfied that the owner will be carrying out a rural industrial activity on that lot.

2.8 No dwelling shall be constructed within the Rural Industry Zone that has an internal floor area of less than 45 square metres or is constructed of materials that do not blend in with the landscape and are not acceptable to Council.

2.9 All buildings and sites shall be maintained in a good condition and appearance and such works as may be necessary from time to time to ensure a continuation of that standard. Where it considers that those standards are not being satisfactorily maintained, Council may require the owner of a site to undertake certain works to rectify this.

2.10 No dwelling house or outbuilding shall be constructed closer than 40 metres to the front and rear lot boundaries unless the topography or flora of the site or the shape of the lot dictate otherwise. Where the topography or flora of a site or the shape of the lot make the construction of dwelling houses or outbuildings difficult, the Council may set an alternative set-back. Set-backs for buildings shall not be closer than 10 metres to side boundaries.

2.11 The number of parking and loading spaces to be provided in respect of any particular site shall be determined by the Council, having regard to the nature of the use and likely volumes of goods, materials or people moving to and from the site.

2.12 No dwelling unit shall be constructed or approved for construction unless a domestic water supply is incorporated into the approved plans, and no dwelling shall be considered fit for human habitation unless such a supply has been installed and is operating.

2.13 Adequate water supply for human habitation will be considered as an adequate supply of underground potable water, being water in which the levels of physical, chemical and bacteriological constituents do not exceed the maximum permissible levels set out in International Standards for Drinking Water—Third Edition, World Health Organization 1971, or which has been approved by the Local Authority, subject to any conditions which may have been laid down by the Commissioner of Public Health and Medical Services, or rain water tanks of not less than 92 000 litres capacity and in addition thereof, a secondary water supply sufficient for toilet and garden use.

2.14 Any trees with a trunk girth of 0.6 metres measured 0.6 metres from the ground within Rural Industry Zone are to be retained unless prior written consent of the Council is given to remove the said trees.

In areas so specified in the Plan of Subdivision, no clearing of the natural vegetation shall take place, other than as may be necessary to obtain access for vehicles and services to the property.

NOTE: For the said trees that have to be moved to make way for housing, fencing, fire-break, outbuilding and accessway construction, the Building Permit as issued by Council shall be deemed as written consent of the Council to remove those said trees. Any such trees requiring removal shall be replaced in an area to be determined by Council.

2.15 In areas which Council considers deficient in tree cover, it may require, as a condition of any Building Permit issued in these areas, the owner to plant up to 20 native trees of species specified by the Council.

2.16 The breeding or keeping of animals for commercial gain shall not be permitted without the express approval of the Council.

2.17 Intensive agricultural pursuits for commercial gain shall not be permitted without the express approval of the Council.

2.18 All waste disposal emanating from a site shall be disposed of within that site, to the satisfaction of Council, or shall be stored on site and removed from it as required under the Health Act.

2.19 The Council may impose additional conditions to its consent that in its opinion are necessary to preserve the concept of the zone.

2.20 Applications for development must include provision for adequate fire protection measures to the satisfaction of the Shire of Gingin in consultation with the Bushfires Board.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960.

The Municipality of the Town of Bassendean.

By-law Relating to Payment of Rates.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Local Government Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 27 February 1984 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law:

- 1. In this by-law unless the context requires otherwise—
 "Act" means the Local Government Act 1960 as amended;
 "clause" means a clause of this by-law;
 "Council" means Council of the Municipality of the Town of Bassendean;
 "year" means a period commencing on the first day of July and ending on the next following thirtieth day of June;
 "penalty" means a penalty added by force of section 550A of the Act.
- 2. Rates imposed by the Council under the provisions of the Act become due and payable on the day on which the memorandum referred to in section 550 (1) of the Act is published in the *Government Gazette*.
- 3. Notwithstanding that the rates have become due and payable in accordance with clause 1, a person liable in a year for the payment of a rate made for a period of one year may within twenty-eight days of the notice of valuation and rate being issued, give notice in writing in the form of the Schedule to the Council that he elects to pay the rate by three (3) instalments which so far as practicable shall be equal.
- 4. A person who has elected to pay the rate by instalments is liable for the payment of any penalty imposed by the Council in accordance with section 550A of the Act on the rate if the rate is not paid in full by the relevant date referred to in that section.
- 5. If any instalment is in arrears for a period of one month or more the total outstanding balance, together with any penalties applicable under the Act, becomes due and payable forthwith.
- 6. Every notice of valuation and rate which may be paid in instalments pursuant to the provisions of this by-law shall have printed thereon or annexed thereto a statement to bring to the notice of the ratepayer the provisions of this by-law, but it is sufficient compliance with the requirements of this clause if the words "Provision exists for payment of this account by instalments. Details available at Council Office." are printed on the notice of valuation and rate or annexed thereto.
- 7. Rates and charges which are in arrears from the previous year or years are due and payable with the first instalment unless prior arrangements acceptable to the Council are made.
- 8. In each case where a ratepayer elects to pay by instalment in accordance with clause 3, each instalment is subject to an administration fee of \$5.00 and the total administration fees are payable with the first instalment.
- 9. A discount not exceeding 10% as determined by the Council and specified in the notice of valuation and rate shall be allowed to a person liable to pay the rate if the rate and any arrears are paid in full within the time (not being less than 28 days after the issue of the notice of valuation and rate) after the day on which the rate becomes due and payable as the Council determines and specifies in that notice.

DOG ACT 1976.

The Municipality of the Town of Bassendean.

By-laws Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all the powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned, municipality hereby records having resolved on 23 January 1984, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

1. The by-laws relating to dogs published in the *Government Gazette* of 23 June 1959, 29 May 1963, 17 September 1964, 14 December 1973, and 26 April 1974, are hereby repealed.

2. In these by-laws unless the context requires otherwise:—

“Act” means the Dog Act 1976;

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Bassendean;

“Municipality” means the Municipality of the Town of Bassendean; and words and expressions used in these by-laws have the meanings respectively given to them in and for the purposes of the Act.

3. Any person who owns a dog or who is responsible or liable for the control of a dog, shall once the dog has reached the age of three months, cause the same to be registered with the Council and shall, for that purpose, fill in all the necessary forms and pay all fees prescribed by the Dog Act and the regulations made thereunder.

4. Subject to the Council's by-laws relating to dog kennels, no person shall keep, or permit to be kept, more than two dogs over the age of three months on any premises within the municipality.

5. The owner of a dog or any person liable for the control thereof shall prevent that dog entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) a public building;
- (b) a theatre;
- (c) a house of worship.

6. The owner of a dog or any person liable for the control thereof shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless restrained by a chain, cord or leash:—

- (a) a sportsground;
- (b) a carpark;
- (c) a school; or
- (d) a shop or other business premises other than a pet shop or veterinary clinic.

7. The occupier of premises whereon any dog is kept shall:—

- (a) Enclose the premises or the portion thereof in which the dog is kept with a fence of sufficient height and of such a nature as to prevent the dog escaping therefrom;
- (b) Maintain the fence in good order and condition;
- (c) Ensure that any gate or door within the fence is fitted with an efficient self-closing mechanism to ensure that the gate or door automatically closes after being opened.
- (d) In this by-law the term “fence” includes a wall.

8. The Council may establish and maintain or use a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act or of these by-laws.

9. The pounds to be used by the Town of Bassendean are established on part of Location 6670 Scadden Street, Bassendean, and at the Swan Animal Haven, Kalamunda Road, Guildford.

10. Any dog seized either by a member of the police force or by an officer authorized by the Council pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act may be placed in a pound.

11. Upon such seizure and impounding of a dog, the keeper of the pound or any other officer authorised by the Council shall take all reasonable steps to ascertain the owner thereof and shall notify in writing such owner without delay that the dog has been impounded.

12. If the pound keeper or other authorised officer is satisfied that a person is the owner of a dog impounded or is acting on behalf of the owner thereof, the dog shall be released to such person upon payment of the fees prescribed in the Schedule hereto.

13. The pound keeper or other authorised officer shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of the dogs at such times and on such days as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.

14. Any person applying for the release of the dog seized or impounded shall establish to the satisfaction of the pound keeper or other officer authorised by the Council of his ownership of the dog seized or impounded or otherwise of his authority to take delivery of it. The pound keeper or officer may accept such proof as may be considered satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against the pound keeper or other authorised officer of the Council or against the Council.

15. Subject to the provisions of section 29 (8) of the Act, any dog which has been seized or impounded and which is not claimed may be sold by the pound keeper or other officer authorised by the Council. In this by-law, the claiming of a dog means and includes delivery of the dog to its owner and payment of the prescribed fee.

16. The proceeds of sale of any dog pursuant to the preceding by-law are the property of the Council and shall be disposed of in such a manner as the Council thinks fit. The owner of any such dog shall have no claim against the Council or any of its employees in respect of such sale.

17. Council may and is hereby authorised to order the destruction of any dog which has been impounded and not been claimed and for which no offer of purchase has been received within the time prescribed by section 29 (8) of the Act.

18. Any owner at whose request a dog is destroyed, whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, shall pay to the Council the fee specified in the Schedule hereto.

19. No person shall unless a pound keeper or other officer of the Council duly authorised in that respect, release or attempt to release a dog from a pound.

20. Any person who shall obstruct or hinder the pound keeper or any other authorised employee of the Council or a member of the Police Force in the performance of his duties under these by-laws commits an offence.

21. Any person contravening any of these by-laws commits an offence and shall, upon conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding \$100.

22. The payment of fines in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog does not relieve the owner of it from liability to a penalty for any breach of the Act, regulations or these by-laws.

For the keeping and maintenance of a dog in a pound—\$6.00 per day or part of a day.

For the destruction of a dog—\$15.00.

1. These By-laws may be cited as the Town of Northam Payment of Rates By-laws.
2. In these By-laws, unless the context requires otherwise:—
 - “Act” means the Local Government Act 1960 as amended.
 - “Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Northam.
 - “Year” means a period commencing on the first day of July and ending on the next following thirtieth day of June.
 - “Penalty” means a penalty added by force of section 550A of the Act.
3. Rates imposed by the Council of the Town of Northam under the provisions of the Act shall become due and payable on the day on which the memorandum referred to in section 550 (1) of the Act is published in the *Government Gazette*.
4. Notwithstanding that the rates shall become due and payable in accordance with Clause 3 hereof, a person liable in any year for the payment of any rate made for a period of one year may within twenty-eight days of the notice of valuation and rate being issued, give notice in writing to the Council or to the effect of the form in the Schedule that he elects to pay any such rate by five (which shall be as equal as is practicable) instalments on or before the first day of September, October, November, December and January respectively.
5. Where the notice of valuation and rate is issued on or after the first day of August in that year there shall be deemed to be compliance with the requirements of this clause if the instalment payable on or before the first day of September is paid within twenty-eight days of the date of the issue of the notice of valuation and rate.
6. If any instalments shall be in arrears for a period of one month or more then the total outstanding balance, together with any penalties applicable under the Act shall become due and payable forthwith.
7. Every notice of valuation and rate which may be paid in instalments pursuant to the provisions of these by-laws shall have printed thereon or annexed thereto a statement to bring to the notice of the ratepayer the provisions of these by-laws. There shall be sufficient compliance with the requirements of this clause if the words “Provision exists for payment of this account by instalments. Details available at Council Office” are printed on the notice of valuation and rate or annexed thereto.
8. Rates and charges which are in arrears from the previous year or years shall be due and payable with the first instalment unless prior arrangements acceptable to the Council are made.
9. In each case where a ratepayer elects to pay by instalments in accordance with Clause 4, each instalment will be subject to a uniform administration fee determined by Council and not exceeding \$5.00 and the total administration fee shall be payable with the first instalment.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960 (AS AMENDED).

The Municipality of the Shire of Mandurah.

By-law Relating to Reserves and Foreshores.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 28 September 1983 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law:—

1. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires:—
 - "Act" means the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended) or re-enacted;
 - "Authorised Officer" means an Officer of the Council who is authorised by the Council to serve notices under sections 669C and 669D of the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended);
 - "Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Mandurah;
 - "Foreshore" means all the land in the Shire of Mandurah which lies between the low water mark and the high water mark of the Indian Ocean;
 - "Owner" in relation to a vehicle means the person who is the holder of the requisite vehicle licence under the Road Traffic Act 1974 in respect of that vehicle, or, if the vehicle is not licensed under that Act, the person who owns the vehicle or is entitled to its possession;
 - "Reserve" means a public Reserve vested in or under the care, control or management of the Shire of Mandurah but does not include a road reserve;
 - "Vehicle" has the same meaning as is given to that word in the Road Traffic Act as amended from time to time but includes trail bikes, beach buggies and other recreational vehicles whether licensed or unlicensed.

2. On a reserve or a foreshore a person other than a Shire employee executing his normal duties shall not:—
 - (a) throw or discharge any stone, arrow, bullet, or other missile;
 - (b) commit or cause a nuisance;
 - (c) be in a state of intoxication;
 - (d) behave in a disorderly manner, create or take part in a disturbance, use foul or indecent language or commit any act of indecency;
 - (e) bet, gamble, or call-the-odds, or offer to bet or gamble;
 - (f) climb over or upon a fence or gate;
 - (g) unlock or fasten a gate, unless authorised by the Council to do so;
 - (h) enter any dressing or training room, or use any locker therein unless authorised by the Council to do so;
 - (i) destroy, damage, injure or cause harm to any bird or animal;
 - (j) damage or injure any plant, lawn, flower, shrub or tree;
 - (k) cut or damage any soil or turf;
 - (l) climb any tree;
 - (m) deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, offal, paper, bottles, broken glass, china or litter of any kind whatsoever except in a receptacle provided for the purpose.
3. A person shall not without the consent of the Council:—
 - (a) drive or ride or bring any vehicle onto a reserve or foreshore or permit any person to drive or ride or bring any vehicle onto a reserve or foreshore except on or over such parts of the reserve or foreshore as are set aside as roads or driveways or vehicle parking areas;
 - (b) park or stand any vehicle on a reserve except in an area set aside for that purpose;
 - (c) park or stand a vehicle on a foreshore except in the course of launching or recovering a boat on a boat ramp set aside by the Council for the launching of boats.
4. On a foreshore a person shall not:—
 - (a) sell, expose for sale or invite any offer to buy any goods, wares, food, refreshments, fruit or other merchandise or things (whether of the like kind as the foregoing or not) except in an area set apart for the purpose by the Council and then only with the prior consent of the Council;
 - (b) hire, expose for hire or invite any offer to take on hire any vehicle boat or other vessel or thing (whether of the like kind as the foregoing or not) except in an area set apart for the purpose by the Council and then only with the prior consent of the Council.
5. On a reserve a person shall not without the consent of the Council:—
 - (a) sell, expose for sale or invite any offer to buy any goods, wares, food, refreshments, fruit or other merchandise or things;
 - (b) play or practice at golf or strike a golf ball except on an area set aside for that purpose;
 - (c) take part in a procession or demonstration;
 - (d) organise, address or participate in a political meeting or rally;
 - (e) use or instal a loud speaker or amplifier;
 - (f) distribute or exhibit any printed or written pamphlet, hand bill, placard or notice in any manner whatsoever;
 - (g) stamp, pencil, affix, construct or erect or cause to be stamped, stencilled, affixed, constructed or erected any signboard, hoarding, placard, hand bill, notice, advertisement or document whatsoever;
 - (h) light a fire other than in a fire place provided for the purpose;
 - (i) camp, lodge or tarry overnight, or frequent for the purpose of camping, lodging or tarrying overnight;
 - (j) erect a tent or any other temporary cover for the purpose of entertainment or for the display of any merchandise.
6. On a reserve a person shall not practice or play in or at any game in such a way as to cause inconvenience or annoyance to any other person.
7. (a) In this clause reference to an "animal" does not include a dog.
 - (b) The Council may set aside a reserve or foreshore or portion of a reserve or foreshore as an area upon which a person may ride or drive an animal or into which a person may bring an animal.
 - (c) A person shall not ride or drive or bring an animal onto any reserve or foreshore or any part thereof that has not been set aside for that purpose pursuant to subclause (b) of this clause.
 - (d) A person shall not ride, drive exercise, train or race any animal on any part of a reserve or foreshore set aside under subclause (b) of this clause in a manner so as to create or become a nuisance.
8. (a) The Council may set aside a reserve or portion of a reserve as an area on which persons may fly mechanically operated model aeroplanes and the Council may define or limit the hours and days during which such model aeroplanes may be flown.

(b) A person shall not fly a mechanically operated model aeroplane on a reserve or portion of a reserve that has not been set aside pursuant to subclause (a) of this clause or at a time or on a day defined or limited by the Council under subclause (a) of this clause.

9. (a) The Council may set aside a reserve or portion of a reserve as a children's playground.

(b) The Council may limit the ages of persons who are permitted to use a playground set aside under subclause (a) of this clause and may erect a notice of that affect on the playground.

(c) A person over the age specified in a notice erected on a playground set aside under subclause (a) of this clause, other than a person having the charge of a child or children in that playground, shall not enter or use that playground or interfere with the use of it by a child or children.

10. A person found in a state of intoxication on a reserve or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in a disturbance, or using foul or indecent language, or committing an act of indecency thereon may be forthwith removed from the reserve by a member of the Police Force.

11. A person found betting, gambling or calling-the-odds or offering to bet or gamble within a reserve may be forthwith removed from the reserve by any member of the Police Force.

12. A person who does not do a thing which by or under these By-laws he is required or directed to do and a person who does a thing which by or under this By-law is prohibited from doing, commits an offence.

13. A person who commits an offence against this By-law is liable on conviction, to a maximum penalty of \$500.

14. The modified penalty for an offence against Clause 3 (a) of this By-law for an offence against Clause 3 (b) and for an offence against Clause 3 (c) of this By-law, if dealt with under section 669D of the Act, is \$30.

15. (a) A notice served under subsection (2) of section 669C at the Act in respect of an offence against this By-law shall be in or to the effect of Form 1 of the Schedule of this By-law.

(b) An infringement notice served under section 669D of the Act in respect of an offence against this By-law shall be in or to the effect of Form 2 of the Schedule to this By-law.

(c) A notice sent under subsection (5) of section 669D of the Act withdrawing an infringement notice served under that section in respect of an offence against this By-law shall be in or to the effect of Form 3 of the Schedule of this By-law.

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale By-laws (Signs on Municipal Property).
2. "Sign" includes advertisements, bills, placards affixed, painted or stencilled on any man-made object, tree or other vegetation whether living or not.
3. A person shall not erect or maintain a sign on any street or land vested in or under the care, control or management of the Council without first obtaining the written permission of Council.
4. Nothing in this by-law relates to a sign erected or maintained pursuant to any Act having operation within the State or to a sign not exceeding 1 m² that is:—
 - (1) a sale sign relating to adjacent property;
 - (2) a sign erected or affixed, on the street alignment to indicate the name and occupation or profession of the occupier of the premises;

5. The Council:—

- (1) may remove any sign placed or erected, contrary to the provisions of these by-laws and may, without incurring any liability therefore dispose of any sign so removed, in such manner as it thinks fit;
- (2) where in exercise of the power conferred by sub-by-law (1) of this By-law, the Council removes and disposes of a sign, it may recover the cost of the removal and disposal, in any Court of competent jurisdiction, from the person responsible for the placing or erecting of the sign.
