PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA } By His Excellency Professor Gordon Reid, Governor

PURSUANT to section 5A of the Money Lenders Act 1912, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby grant Standard Chartered Australia Limited, a body corporate whose registered office in Western Australia is situated at 89 St. George's Terrace, Perth, hereinafter referred to as "the company", exemption from registration under that Act for the period specified in the Schedule to this proclamation and upon the conditions specified in that Schedule.

Schedule.

Period of Exemption.

The period of 3 years beginning on the day on which this proclamation is published in the *Government Gazette*.

Conditions of Exemption.

1. While this exemption has effect the company shall—

- (a) comply with; and
- (b) ensure that persons acting for it or on its behalf comply with,

the restrictions and requirements imposed by section 20 of the Money Lenders Act 1912 as if the company were a money lender within the meaning of that Act.

2. The company shall not make a loan within Western Australia pursuant to this exemption other than a loan of not less than \$50 000 made to a body corporate.

3. The company shall, if and when requested to do so by the Attorney General, provide a statement of all loans made by it while this exemption has effect showing the amount of each loan, the interest charged, and

the reason advanced by the borrower for seeking the loan.

Instructions to Licensing Officers.

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by virtue of section 17 of the Fisheries Act 1905, I hereby issue the following directions to Licensing Officers regarding the granting and renewal of professional fisherman's licenses and fishing boat licenses for the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery:—

- (1) All professional fisherman's licenses issued for the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery shall be endorsed as follows:

"The holder of this license is authorised to engage in taking fish for sale from the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery".

Fishing Unit No.
Owner fisherman/part owner fisherman/
assistant fisherman/temporary assistant
fisherman/trainee.

- (2) All fishing boat licenses issued for the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery shall be endorsed as follows:

"The boat named herein is licensed to be used for the taking of fish for sale in the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery".
Fishing Unit No.

- (3) The fishing units which may be licensed to take fish in the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery are to be restricted to those listed in the attached schedule or such replacements as are approved excepting as is provided hereunder.

- (4) A fishing unit shall consist of:

- (a) A primary fishing vessel (mother ship);
(b) not more than four netting dinghies;
(c) not more than the number of fishermen listed in the attached schedule.

- (5) A fishing unit is entitled to use at any one time, an aggregate length of net that does not exceed 1 000 metres multiplied by the number of owner, part owners, and trainees within that unit, who are actively fishing at that time within waters of the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery.

- (6) Each fisherman authorised to fish within the waters of the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery pursuant to clause (1) other than an assistant or temporary assistant fisherman may use up to two beamtrawl prawn nets at any one time.

- (7) Licenses for units and fishermen additional to those listed in clause (3) above may be issued on the written approval of the Director of Fisheries:

- (a) to the son or daughter of a designated Owner/Part Owner Fisherman of a Mandurah Estuarine Fishing Unit, to be a trainee fisherman to assist in the operation of that unit provided that the size of the unit does not increase beyond that permitted by sub-clause (4) (a) and 4 (b) above, and that not more than one trainee fisherman is endorsed for that unit;

- (b) to a trainee fisherman endorsed in accordance with subclause (a) of this clause to be the designated Owner/Part Owner Fisherman and (subject to the approval of the Director of Fisheries),

to provide for take over of the operation of the unit on the retirement from the fishing industry of the existing designated Owner/Part Owner Fisherman.

- (c) in such cases where the Director of Fisheries considers it equitable that an established fishing unit may have an additional fisherman to assist with the operations of the fishing unit.

- (8) A temporary assistant or assistant fisherman may not fish within the waters of the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery except when under the direct control and continued presence of the owner or part owner of that fishing unit.

- (9) Assistant fishermen upon their withdrawal from the fishing unit shall not be replaced.

- (10) Units and fishermen listed in clauses (3) and (7) above may be reduced by:

- (a) not replacing owner fishermen or part owner fishermen upon their retirement or other withdrawal from the fishing industry;

- (b) not renewing licenses where the fishing performance of the unit has been such that it can be established that the members of the unit do not spend the major part of their working time fishing and do not earn a substantial part of their income from fishing.

- (11) A professional fisherman who has been authorised to engage in taking fish for sale in the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery and who wishes to engage in professional fishing in another fishery for a period of time shall first obtain the approval of the Director of Fisheries who may specify conditions relating to the entitlement to return to the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery as a professional fisherman.

- (12) The holder of an endorsed license who relinquishes a license or endorsement or retires from the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery shall not be replaced by any other person except with the approval of the Director of Fisheries who may grant or refuse such approval after investigating the potential of the fishery.

- (13) The holder of an endorsed license for any of the fisheries listed hereunder shall not hold an endorsed license to fish in the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery:

- (i) Shark Bay Beach Seine and Mesh Net Fishery;
(ii) Swan/Canning Estuarine Fishery;
(iii) Leschenault Estuarine Fishery;
(iv) Hardy Inlet Estuarine Fishery; and
(v) South Coast Estuarine Fishery.

For the purpose of these instructions:

"the Mandurah Estuarine Fishery" means the commercial fishery in the waters of the Peel Inlet and Harvey Estuary, together with the Murray, Serpentine and Dandalup Rivers and all their tributaries and affluents upstream of the mouth of the groynes marking the channel entrance to the Peel Inlet and Harvey Estuary where it meets the Indian Ocean.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of land within the Shire of Cranbrook.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before 15 November 1984, to plough, burn, scarify, cultivate or otherwise clear, and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until 15 April 1985, in the following positions and of the following dimensions on the land owned or occupied by you:

1. Rural Land (i.e. all land within the Shire of Cranbrook other than within a townsite).

(a) Firebreaks not less than two and one half (2.5) metres (eight feet) wide:

(i) Immediately inside all external boundaries of cleared land. To avoid any obstructions or erosion prone areas this may be varied up to 200 m from the external boundary; and

(ii) Immediately surrounding any part of the land used for pasture and or crop, intended for harvest; and

(b) Where the area of the land is in excess of 2 023 square metres, or is used for agriculture or grazing purposes, firebreaks at least 2 metres wide shall be cleared immediately inside all the external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

Requirements in Respect of Urban Land: On all land owned or occupied by you within a townsite you must on or before 15 December 1984:—

Have clear of all inflammable matter and all bush as defined in the Bush Fires Act, save standing live trees, firebreaks according to the following requirements:—

(a) Where the area of the land is 2 023 square metres or less and the land is not used for agriculture or grazing purposes, all inflammable matter and all bush as defined in the Bush Fires Act, save standing live trees, shall be removed from the whole of the land, OR

(b) Where the land is used for agriculture or grazing purposes or is more than 2 023 square metres in area, firebreaks at least 2 metres wide shall be cleared of all inflammable matter and all bush as defined in the Bush Fires Act, save standing live trees, immediately inside all the external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

Requirements in Respect of Fuel Storage on Rural and Urban Land: On all land owned or occupied by you upon which there is situated any drum or drums which are normally used for the storage of automotive fuel or any ramp or other structure used for the purpose of storing such drums You Must on or before 15 November 1984 have clear of all inflammable matter and all bush as defined in the Bush Fires Act, fire breaks at least 6 metres wide immediately surrounding all such drums, ramps or structures.

Application to vary above requirements: If it is considered for any reason to be impracticable to clear firebreaks as required by this Notice, you must apply to the Council for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position or by an alternative date, or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council, or its duly authorised Officer, you must comply with the requirements of this Notice.

Burning: If the requirements of this Notice are to be complied with by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$400 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the costs of performing the work directed in this order if this is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Council will be prepared to accept well grazed kikuyu as an adequate firebreak.

firebreaks at least 3 metres wide inside all external boundaries of land—

- (a) immediately adjacent to and completely surrounding all land which has been cleared or partly cleared; and
- (b) within 60 metres of the perimeter of any haystack, building or group of buildings, so positioned as to completely surround such haystack, building or group of buildings; and

(2) Where the area of cleared or partly cleared land is more than 121 hectares, clear of all inflammable material additional firebreaks in such positions as to divide the land into areas not exceeding 121 hectares, each separate area to be completely surrounded by firebreaks inside all external boundaries of the land and thereafter maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including 31 March 1985

B—On Townsite Land or Land Subdivided for Residential Purposes: Clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 3 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land, and thereafter maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including 31 March 1985.

FINANCE BROKERS CONTROL ACT 1975.

(Section 44 (1) and (2).)

C.A. 86/83.

THE Finance Brokers Supervisory Board has fixed the following schedule to be the maximum amounts of remuneration for services rendered by persons carrying on the business of a Finance Broker. The schedule shall apply in the case of contracts made on or after 1 October 1984 and replaces the schedule published in the *Government Gazette* on 22 May 1981.

1. Application Fee:

- (i) For loans up to \$100 000. \$100 non refundable for each loan.

The application fee is a payment against the eventual brokerage charge.

- (ii) For loans over \$100 000.

Fee established by prior mutual agreement in writing between the parties.

2. Inspection Fees:

- (i) Initial Inspections: Up to 30 kilometres radius—\$50.

Over 30 kilometres radius—\$50 plus \$45 per hour spent outside the 30 kilometre radius with a maximum of \$130 per half day or part thereof or \$260 per day.

- (ii) Subsequent Inspections:

- (a) For progress advances for residential properties within 30 kilometres radius \$30 per inspection with a maximum of \$120 per property.

- (b) For progress advances for residential properties beyond 30 kilometres radius and commercial properties in the course of erection by negotiation with the client.

3. Brokerage Fees:

- (i) Local Money Loans:

- (a) For loans up to \$100 000—2 per cent.

- (b) For loans over \$100 000.

Fee established by prior mutual agreement in writing between the parties.

- (ii) Bridging Loans:

On loans of 6 months or less \$100 plus 1 per cent.

Over 6 months—normal rates.

- (iii) Interstate and Overseas Loans:

Rates subject to prior written agreement between broker and client. If interim Bridging Finance also arranged additional brokerage of 1 per cent to be charged. Subject to loans in excess of \$100 000 being by negotiation between parties.

- (iv) Conditions of Brokerage Charges:

- (a) Brokerage should not be charged by a selling agent where a Contract of Sale or Mortgage to Vendor is arranged. The Agent Broker may, however, charge on a time basis for consultations and work done (see miscellaneous charges).

- (b) Where the selling agent is also the broker a separate written Loan Application is also required before brokerage can be charged.

- (c) No brokerage or other fees are applicable to Building Society loans.

4. Transfer of Mortgage between Investor Clients: Standard scale of fees plus out of pockets, payable by the Transferor.

5. Extension of Mortgages: Two-fifths standard brokerage inclusive of any reinspection, but revaluations, solicitors costs, stamp duty, and registration should be in addition.

6. Finalisation Fee (discharge): Flat fee of \$45 to include all services required of a broker, in addition to legal costs, out of pockets, and settlement fees.

7. Commission on Interest Collections:

- (a) Interest Collections only—6 per cent of interest collections inclusive of postages, cheque duty and bank charges.

- (b) Total Mortgage Management—including interest collection and supervision of mortgagors' compliance with all mortgage clauses—

8 per cent of interest collections, inclusive of postages, cheque duty and bank charges except where the broker is acting as an agent for an insurance company in which case a fee of 6 per cent applies.

8. Miscellaneous Charges:

- (a) Production of Title—\$30.

- (b) Titles Office Searches \$6 plus Titles Office fees.

- (c) Additional Interest Statements as provided in the Finance Brokers Code of Conduct \$10 for each statement issued.

- (d) Bank Cheques—\$5 including costs.

- (e) Where no brokerage fees are payable consultations, advice, investigations and negotiations on finance—standard charge of \$45 per hour based on the actual time spent.

- (f) Disbursements directly and reasonably incurred by the broker in the negotiations relating to a loan or a proposed loan and without limiting the generality of the foregoing would include—search fees, production fees, telephone trunk calls, telex, telegrams, accommodation expenses, postages and courier service and relevant government charges.

The Broker shall at the request of the client produce to the client such evidence of disbursement that the client should reasonably require.

- (g) Where a broker is appointed as an Agent for the mortgagee under the terms of mortgage charge to be negotiated with the mortgagee but not to exceed \$45 per hour.

IT is hereby notified for general information that, in accordance with the provisions of the Dairy Industry Act 1973-1983, the Dairy Industry Authority of Western Australia has fixed the undermentioned prices and rates—

MINIMUM PRICES TO DAIRYMEN:

Minimum price to be paid to dairymen by the Authority at the dairy for market milk containing not less than 11.75 per cent total milk solids as determined by Australian Standard Method 1084-1974, section 3, in relation to a representative composite sample taken over a testing period; and containing not less than 3.2 per cent milk fat as determined by the Babcock or Milko-Tester methods in relation to the same representative composite sample at the rate of 29.01 cents per litre.

Minimum price to be paid to dairymen by the Authority at the dairy for special products milk containing not less than 11.75 per cent total milk solids as determined by the Australian Standard Method 1084-1974, section 3, in relation to a representative composite sample taken over a testing period; and containing not less than 3.2 per cent milk fat as determined by the Babcock or Milko-Tester methods in relation to the same representative composite sample at the rates of:

- 17.25 cents per litre for special products milk (except flavoured milk);
- 29.01 cents per litre for milk for flavoured milk.

DAIRY INDUSTRY ACT 1973-1983—*continued.*

MAXIMUM PRICES TO AUTHORITY:

Maximum price to be paid to the Authority by dairy produce factories for market milk at the rate of 31·05 cents per litre.

Maximum price to be paid to the Authority by dairy produce factories for special products milk at the rates of:

- 17·89 cents per litre for special products milk (except flavoured milk);
- 29·65 cents per litre for milk for flavoured milk.

MAXIMUM TRANSPORT CHARGES (Market Milk only):

Maximum charge for transport of market milk from dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area to dairy produce factories in the metropolitan area at the rate of 1·75 cents per litre.

OTHER CHARGES (Market Milk only):

Maximum charge for treatment, excluding pasteurisation and packing, of market milk at dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area at the rate of 1·96 cents per litre.

Maximum price to be charged at dairy produce factories in the metropolitan area for market milk received for treatment from dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area at the rate of 36·46 cents per litre.

ACCEPTANCE AND DISPOSAL OF MILK BY THE AUTHORITY:

It is further determined that, where milk delivered by a dairyman—

is found to contain less than 11·75 per cent total milk solids, as determined by the aforementioned Standard Method during any testing period on a second or succeeding occasion after 1 January, 1984 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of that testing period will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found to contain less than 3·2 per cent milk fat, as determined by one of the aforementioned methods during any testing period on a second or succeeding occasion after 1 January, 1984 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of that testing period will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain antibiotic on a second occasion after 1 January, 1984 or a second occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain antibiotic on a third or succeeding occasion after 1 January, 1984 or on a third or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by the dairyman for the duration of that testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on the first occasion after 1 January, 1984 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on a second or succeeding occasion after 1 January, 1984 or on a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added solids on the first occasion after 1 January, 1984 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of two testing periods.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added solids on a second or succeeding occasion after 1 January, 1984 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of four testing periods.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day after 1 January, 1984 or on any day in a subsequent quota year, to have a bacterial count of over 50 000 bacteria per millilitre not less than 10 days—

after an initial examination indicating over 100 000 bacteria per millilitre;

or, after any two initial examinations within the quota year indicating over 100 000 bacteria per millilitre;

or, after two consecutive initial examinations indicating over 50 000 bacteria per millilitre—

milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk as follows:

on the first occurrence in any quota year—for that one day;

on the second occurrence in any quota year—for that day and for the two closest days within the same test period;

on the third or succeeding occasion in any quota year—for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs.

Where milk delivered by a dairyman is acceptable as market milk or special products milk and the abovementioned prices for market milk or special products milk apply—

market milk or special products milk delivered by a dairyman to the Authority is accepted by the Authority at the dairyman's registered dairy produce premises.

market milk or special products milk delivered by a dairyman and accepted by the Authority is disposed of by the Authority to the dairy produce factory at the point of acceptance by the Authority.
