PURSUANT to section 5A of the Money Lenders Act 1912, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby grant FIRST CHICAGO AUSTRALIA LIMITED, a body corporate whose principal office in Western Australia is situated c/o Messrs. Parker & Parker, 140 St. George's Terrace, Perth, hereinafter referred to as "the company", exemption from registration under that Act for the period specified in the Schedule to this proclamation and upon the conditions specified in that Schedule.

### Schedule.

#### Period of Exemption.

The period of 3 years beginning on the day on which this proclamation is published in the *Government Gazette*.

#### Conditions of Exemption.

1. While this exemption has effect the company shall—

- (a) comply with; and
- (b) ensure that persons acting for it or on its behalf comply with,

the restrictions and requirements imposed by section 20 of the Money Lenders Act 1912 as if the company were a money lender within the meaning of that Act.

2. The company shall not make a loan within Western Australia pursuant to this exemption other than a loan of not less than \$50 000 made to a body corporate.

3. The company shall, if and when requested to do so by the Attorney General, provide a statement of all loans made by it while this exemption has effect

showing the amount of each loan, the interest charged, and the reason advanced by the borrower for seeking the loan.

## HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

Shire of Merredin.

By-Law Relating to Eating Houses.

SHIRE OF MERREDIN being a local authority under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act does hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Act and all other powers enabling it make and publish the following by-law:

## PART I—Preliminary.

1. Arrangement: This by-law is divided into parts as follows—

PART I—Preliminary, Clauses 1 and 2.

PART II—Registration of Eating Houses and Licensing of Proprietors, Clauses 3-7.

PART III—Penalties, Clause 8.

2. Interpretation:

- (1) In this by-law unless the context otherwise requires—

“Act” means the Health Act 1911 (as amended);

“clause” means a clause of this by-law;

“local authority” means the municipality of the Shire of Merredin;

“Schedule” means a schedule to this by-law;

“sub-clause” means a sub-clause of the clause in which the term is used; words and expression not defined herein have the respective meanings given to them in and for the purposes of the Act.

- (2) A reference to an Act of Parliament or to a section of an Act of Parliament includes any amendment thereto or re-enactment thereof for the time being in force.
- (3) Headings of clauses are for reference only and do not affect the construction of this by-law.

## PART II—Registration of Eating Houses and Licensing of Proprietors.

3. Prescribed Date: The prescribed date for the purposes of section 162 of the Act is the date upon which this by-law comes into operation.

4. Registration of Eating Houses: An application for registration of an eating house shall be—

- (a) in writing;
- (b) in or substantially in the form contained in the First Schedule;
- (c) accompanied by a plan and specification of the eating house;
- (d) accompanied by the fee specified in the Third Schedule.

5. Licensing of Proprietors: An application for the issue of a licence to the proprietor of an eating house shall be—

- (a) in writing;
- (b) in or substantially in the form contained in the Second Schedule;
- (c) accompanied by the fee specified in the Third Schedule.

6. Duration of Registration and Licence: Registration of an eating house and a licence for the proprietor of an eating house shall respectively be applied or annually on or before the 1st day of July in each year and, subject to the Act and to the provisions of this by-law, have effect for one (1) year from that date.

7. Certificates of Registration and Licences:

- (1) A certificate of registration of an eating house shall be in the form of the Fourth Schedule.
- (2) A licence issued to a proprietor of an eating house shall be in the form of the Fifth Schedule.
- (3) The proprietor of an eating house shall display the certificate of registration and licence in a conspicuous place at the eating house and whenever requested by a health surveyor to do so shall produce to him the certificate of registration and licence.

## PART III—Penalties.

8. A person who commits a breach of or fails to comply with any of the requirements of this by-law commits an offence and is liable to a maximum penalty of \$100 and where the breach is of a continuing nature in addition to a daily penalty not exceeding \$4 for every day or part of a day during which the breach is continued after complaint of the breach has been made.

Where adjoining land is in common ownership or occupancy, firebreaks may be constructed so as to encompass such lots collectively. Firebreaks not less than 2.5 m wide shall be constructed around all buildings and haystacks situated on the land.

3. Fuel Dumps/Tanks/Depots: Where there are flammable liquid or gas containers on the land, whether such containers are full or empty, owners and occupiers shall:

- (a) Townsite Land—Clear the whole of the land of inflammable material.
- (b) Rural Land—Locate such dumps/tanks/ramps not less than 15 metres from any public thoroughfare or improvement upon the land, and construct firebreaks not less than 6 metres in width around and immediately adjacent to all such installations.

##### 4. General:

- (a) The term "Inflammable Material" for the purpose of this notice includes bush (as defined in the Bush Fires Act 1954-1981), timber, boxes, cartons, paper and the like inflammable materials, rubbish and any combustible matter, but does not include buildings, green standing trees, or growing bushes or plants in gardens or lawns.

- Citation. 1. These by-laws may be cited as the Harvey, Waroona and Collie River Irrigation Districts Amendment By-laws 1984.
- Principal by-laws. 2. In these by-laws the Harvey, Waroona and Collie River Irrigation Districts By-laws 1975\*, are referred to as the principal by-laws.
- By-laws 11A and 11B inserted. 3. After By-law 11 of the principal by-laws, the following by-laws are inserted—
- “ 11A. (1) An occupier who desires to be supplied with water other than irrigation water from works by means of a pipe, for purposes approved under section 42 (2), shall apply to the Minister in the form of Form 3 giving the particulars required by the form.
- (2) An occupier who applies to take water under this by-law is liable to pay the costs of any works constructed by the Minister for the purpose of supplying water to his land.
- (3) An application made under this by-law shall be lodged with the District Officer at the office of the Minister in the district from which the water is supplied.
- (4) An occupier who desires to be supplied with water pursuant to this by-law shall pay the charges set out in items 5 and 6 of the First Schedule.
- 11B. (1) Where a ratepayer desires to be supplied with water from works by means of a pipe, for the purpose of irrigation by a trickle supply in addition to the supply to which he is entitled in respect of rates, the water used for that purpose shall be aggregated with other irrigation water used by the ratepayer, for the purpose of levying charges under By-law 19.
- (2) A ratepayer supplied with water pursuant to this by-law shall pay the charges set out in item 5 of the First Schedule.
- By-law 17 repealed. 4. By-law 17 of the principal by-laws is repealed.
- By-laws 18 and 19 repealed and substituted. 5. By-laws 18 and 19 of the principal by-laws are repealed and the following by-laws are substituted—
- Water entitlement. “ 18. (1) Subject to the Act and to these by-laws every ratepayer is entitled to a supply of water at a rate of 3 000 cubic metres of water per rated hectare per annum.
- (2) A ratepayer is not entitled to a supply of water under this by-law unless he has paid the irrigation rates liable to be paid in respect of his land.
- (3) The Minister may refuse to supply water to any land in respect of which irrigation rates remain unpaid.
- Charges for water. 19. (1) The charge for water supplied to a ratepayer shall be that set out in item 3 of the First Schedule.
- (2) The Minister may refuse to supply water to any property where charges for water supplied to a ratepayer on that property remain unpaid. ”



- 3. The installation costs (excluding meter) will be the responsibility of the applicant.
- 4. The consumer to be responsible for the cost of all repairs to the service.
- 5. All internal reticulation and plumbing to withstand a 70 metre head and to meet departmental standards as advised by the Public Works Department.
- 6. An annual service charge as prescribed in item 5 of the First Schedule of the Harvey, Waroona and Collie River Irrigation Districts By-laws will be levied from the date of connection of the service.
- 7. The charge for all water consumed will be as prescribed in item 6 of the First Schedule of the Harvey, Waroona and Collie River Irrigation Districts By-laws.

## FACTORIES AND SHOPS (ROSTERED EXTRAORDINARY TRADING HOURS) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 2) 1984.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Factories and Shops (Rostered Extraordinary Trading Hours) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1984.

Where the shopkeeper of a filling station specified by notice pursuant to section 92 (8) intends to cease selling fuel or any requisite so specified he shall, at least 14 days before so ceasing give to the Chief Inspector notice of that intention and of the day on which it is to take effect. ”.

## STATUTE No. 15—WAIT HEALTH SCIENCES FOUNDATION.

## WHEREAS—

- (a) The Institute has agreed to accept donations to be applied solely for the purposes of the WAIT Health Sciences Foundation as herein described.
- (b) Funds donated for the purposes of the WAIT Health Sciences Foundation are to be kept apart from the other funds and property of the Institute and made the subject of the WAIT Health Sciences Foundation.
- (c) This Statute is to establish the WAIT Health Sciences Foundation.

## ACCORDINGLY it is enacted as follows—

## 1. Definitions.

## 1.1 In this Statute unless the context otherwise requires—

“Board” means the Board of Management of the Foundation;

“Council” means the Council of the Western Australian Institute of Technology;

“Donor” means any person who has donated moneys, property or assets to the Foundation and includes a duly nominated representative of a Donor;

“Person” includes a partnership, association, corporation or company whether incorporated or unincorporated;

“The Fund” means the WAIT Health Sciences Foundation established by this Statute and includes all property, both real and personal, from time to time held by the Institute on account of or for the Foundation pursuant hereto and all investments representing such property or any part thereof and any income arising therefrom;

“Year” means each period of twelve (12) months ending on 31 December.

## 2. The Fund:

2.1 The Fund hereby constituted shall be known as the WAIT Health Sciences Foundation.

2.2 The Fund shall be kept apart in the accounts and records of the Institute from the other funds and property of the Institute and applied solely in accordance with the terms of this Statute.

2.3 Subject to subsection 2.2 The Fund shall be invested by the Institute in accordance with the Act.

## 3. Objects:

3.1 The objects of the Foundation shall be to provide funds to support the advancement of knowledge in the health sciences through research, demonstration and evaluation.

3.2 For the purpose of carrying out the objects of the Foundation the Council may, on the prior recommendation of the Board, from time to time authorise grants or the expenditure of moneys being part of The Fund to—

- (a) bring together practitioners, researchers and educators in the health sciences for the sharing of knowledge and experience in health related endeavours;
- (b) provide financial support to enable persons involved in health sciences education and research to share and extend their knowledge;
- (c) support activities directed towards improving the health of the community;
- (d) support cooperative activities related to health issues between education, the community, government, and industry;
- (e) provide or arrange for all necessary facilities, equipment, staff, and other resources necessary to support the attainment of these objects;
- (f) engage in such other activities as may be consistent with the objects of the Foundation.

## 4. Donations:

4.1 Donations to the Foundation may be accepted from any source including donations by way of—

- (a) lump sum donations;
- (b) donations in instalments;
- (c) interest from amounts deposited with the Institute or otherwise;
- (d) donations or bequests of property or assets.

## Schedule—continued.

5. Donors:
  - 5.1 Any Donor that is a body corporate, may by notice to the Board, nominate any person to represent it for any of the purposes of this Statute and may from time to time change its representative.
  - 5.2 The Secretary shall keep a register of all Donors and nominated representatives.
6. Board:
  - 6.1 The Board shall consist of—
    - (a) a Chairman appointed by the Council;
    - (b) seven members appointed by the Council; at least two shall be members of the Council and not more than three shall be donors;
    - (c) one person nominated by the Minister for Health;
    - (d) the Dean of Health Sciences at the Institute *ex officio*.
  - 6.2 Each member of the Board shall hold office for a period of three years from the date of appointment and shall be eligible for re-appointment.
  - 6.3 The Council may approve the appointment of an alternate member for any member of the Board for a stated period of for any absence due to illness.
  - 6.4 The office of a member of the Board shall be vacated if the member gives written notice of resignation to the Secretary.
7. Powers and Responsibilities of the Board:
  - 7.1 The Board shall from time to time make recommendations to the Council with regard to the carrying out of the objects of the Foundation.
  - 7.2 The general management and administration of the Foundation shall be vested in the Board.
  - 7.3 The Board may establish such specialist and advisory committees as it deems necessary from time to time composed of such members of the Board or other persons as the Board may decide.
  - 7.4 The Board shall report annually to the Council on the affairs and operations of the Foundation and cause to be prepared an annual audited financial statement for submission to each Annual General Meeting.
8. Proceedings of the Board:
  - 8.1 The Board may meet together for the despatch of business adjourn and otherwise regulate its meetings as it thinks fit and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined one half of the members of the Board shall form a quorum.
  - 8.2 The Chairman of the Board may at any time and the Secretary upon the request of at least two members thereof shall convene a meeting of the Board. At least one meeting of the Board shall be held each Year. Unless otherwise agreed by the Board at least seven (7) days' notice of any meeting shall be given by the Secretary.
  - 8.3 Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes, each member having one vote, and in the case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.
  - 8.4 The Chairman shall act as Chairman of any meeting of the Board. If the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the meeting, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.
9. Annual General Meeting.
  - 9.1 An Annual General Meeting shall be held each Year for the purpose of receiving and considering the Board's annual report on the affairs and operations of The Fund for the previous Year and the audited financial statements in respect thereof and such other matters as may be dealt with in accordance with this Statute.
  - 9.2 All Donors shall be entitled to attend any Annual General Meeting.
  - 9.3 The Chairman of the Board shall be Chairman of the Annual General Meeting of Donors.
10. Secretary:
  - 10.1 The Council shall from time to time nominate a person to act as Secretary of the Foundation. The Secretary shall perform such duties as may from time to time be required by the Board.
11. Dissolution:
  - 11.1 The Council may on the prior recommendation of the Board resolve that the Foundation be dissolved and the Foundation shall be deemed to be dissolved on the repeal of this Statute.
  - 11.2 In the event that the Foundation is dissolved any moneys or assets then forming part thereof shall be disbursed by the Council in such manner, as after considering any recommendation of the Board, it shall consider appropriate and consistent with the Act.
