Halogenated Dibenzodioxins and Dibenzofurans except as a contaminant in proportions not exceeding those specified by relevant Commonwealth, State or Territory legislation.

PURSUANT to section 5 (1) (a) and (c) of the Prisons Act 1981-1984, I, the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby declare—

POISONS ACT 1964.

Notice.

(Section 24 (5).)

1. I, JAMES COLUMBA McNULTY, Executive Director Public Health and Scientific Support Services, acting under the provisions of section 24 (5) of the Poisons Act 1964 and section 9 of the Health Legislation Administration Act 1984, do hereby cancel the notice issued under that section of the Act on 16 April 1982, and impose the conditions, restrictions and limitations on the sale, supply, use and possession of the poisons which are specified in the Seventh Schedule of Appendix "A" to the Poisons Act 1964 and also specified in the first column of the Schedule to this notice, as are set out directly opposite and corresponding to that poison in the second column of that Schedule.

2. In this notice unless the contrary intention appears—

"Executive Director" means the Executive Director Public Health and Scientific Support Services;

"Department" has the meaning attributed to it in the Public Service Act 1978;

"Pesticides Regulations" means the Pesticides Regulations made under the Health Act 1911;

"primary producers" means persons whose land is used for all or any of the following businesses—

(a) an agricultural business (but not a forestry or reafforestation business); and

(b) a grazing, horticultural, viticultural, apicultural, pig-raising or poultry farming business;

"registered veterinary surgeon" has the meaning attributed to it in the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1960;

"research" means research approved by the Executive Director.

3. The conditions, restrictions and limitations on the sale, supply, use and possession of the specified poisons imposed by this notice shall not affect—

(a) the supply to and use by persons approved by the Executive Director for research, or other specific purposes;

(b) the sale by persons licensed to manufacture and distribute or sell by wholesale to retailers licensed in accordance with the Poisons Act Regulations 1965, to sell such poisons;

(c) the sale by persons licensed to manufacture and distribute or sell by wholesale to commercial pesticide firms or pesticide operators licensed under the provisions of the Pesticide Regulations to use these poisons in accordance with the label registered or licence issued under the Pesticide Regulations;

(d) the use and possession by registered commercial pesticide firms or licensed pesticide operators for use in accordance with licences issued under the Pesticide Regulations;

(e) the sale by persons licensed to manufacture and distribute or sell poisons specified in the Seventh Schedule by wholesale or by retail to industrial users approved by the Executive Director;

(f) the use and possession of poisons specified in the Seventh Schedule by industrial users approved by the Executive Director.

4. Calibration Methods for Noise Measurement Equipment and Audiometers.

Those methods adopted by approved laboratories, provided that a certificate is issued showing the results of that calibration, are approved methods for the purposes of the Regulations.

The certificate need not give individual details of calibration results, but sufficient information to identify the particular instrument calibrated and the results of that calibration in terms of the instrument satisfying (or otherwise) all the tests conducted.

The certificate shall show the clause numbers of the relevant standards to which the instrument has been calibrated.

Complete details of test results should be available if required. Where there is no relevant standard, either for a particular performance characteristic, or for a complete instrument performance, the laboratory shall perform such tests as are necessary to satisfy it that the instrument is operating within the standard of performance specified by the manufacturer. Details of these tests performed shall be made available if requested.

5. Laboratories for Testing Intrinsic Safety.

Those laboratories registered with the National Association of Testing Authorities for testing equipment or apparatus in accordance with Australian Standard 1829-1981 are approved laboratories for the purposes of regulation 7 (a) of the Regulations.

6. Noise Measurement Equipment for Explosive or Flammable Atmospheres.

8. Procedure for Assessment of Hearing Protection Devices.

The following procedures are approved for showing adequate attenuation of noise by hearing protection devices for the purposes of regulation 16 of the Regulations 1983:

- (a) If it is practicable to conduct an octave band frequency analysis of the noise, and the sound pressure levels in the octave bands with centre frequencies 31.5 Hz, 63 Hz and 16 kHz do not contribute significantly to the overall noise level, that procedure in Australian Standard 1269-1983 Appendix C, Section C3.1, provided the standard attenuation measurements used for the device are the current results obtained by the National Acoustic Laboratories, Commonwealth Department of Health (N.A.L.)
- (b) If it is practicable to conduct an octave band frequency analysis of the noise and the sound pressure levels in the octave bands with centre frequencies 31.5 Hz, 63 Hz or 16 kHz do contribute significantly to the overall noise level, a procedure extrapolated from that in (a), using for the corrected attenuation values of 31.5 Hz and 63 Hz the same value as calculated for 125 Hz and for 16 kHz the value calculated for 8 kHz.
- (c) If it is not practicable to conduct an octave band frequency analysis of the noise due to its short duration and infrequent occurrence, that procedure in Australian Standard 1269-1983 Appendix C, Section C3.2, provided that the SLC values used for the device are those obtained by NAL, and that the unweighted sound pressure level may be used instead of the C-weighted sound pressure level.
- (d) If in addition the peak noise level exceeds 140 dB (lin), the device shall have an SLC value, as determined by NAL of at least 29.0 B.

If assessment by the appropriate procedure (a), (b) or (c) above shows that no available hearing protection device is capable of attenuating the noise at the ear to less than 90 dB (A), a combination of an earmuff and earplug having SLC values, as determined by NAL, of at least 29.0 and 20.0 dB respectively, shall be used.

9. Form of Audiogram.

The following forms of audiograms are approved for use for the purposes of regulation 23 of the Regulations:

- (a) a chart and the symbols similar to that given in Appendix C of Australian Standard 2586-1983, excepting that the range of hearing levels displayed may be altered to suit the range of the particular audiometer(s) in use;
- (b) a table showing the hearing threshold level, for the right and left ears separately, for each of the tested frequencies including 500 Hz, 1000 Hz, 2000 Hz, 3000 Hz, 4000 Hz and 6000 Hz;
- (c) a chart labelled as in (a), but with separate sections for the results of testing left and right ears (for use with automatic audiometers),

—provided they include information on the designated worker's or former designated worker's full name, date of birth and employer; the audiometer used (make, model, serial number); the date and time of the hearing test; the type of test (reference or monitoring); and the signature and approval number of the audiometric officer conducting the test.

By-law Relating to Extractive Industries.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 8 May 1984 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following:

By-law Relating to Extractive Industries.

1. In this by-law unless the context otherwise requires:—
 - "Act" means the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended);
 - "Carrying on an extractive industry" means quarrying and excavating for stone, gravel, sand and other material;
 - "Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Toodyay;
 - "Excavation licence" means a licence to carry on an extractive industry issued in accordance with this by-law;
 - "excavation site" means a defined area of land upon which it is proposed to carry on an extractive industry or upon which an extractive industry is carried out;
 - "Licensee" means the holder of an excavation licence;
 - "Minister" means the Minister for Local Government;
 - "Municipal district" means the municipal district of the Shire of Toodyay;
 - "Person" includes a body corporate.

Other words and expressions have the same meaning as they have in the Act.
2. A person shall not carry on an extractive industry on any land within the municipal district without first having obtained an excavation licence to do so from the Council.
3. An application to the Council for an excavation licence or a renewal thereof shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto and shall be accompanied by:—
 - 3.1 four copies of excavation site plan to a scale of between 1:500 and 1:2 000, showing, *inter alia*—
 - 3.2.1 existing and proposed land contours at one metre intervals based on Australian Height Datum,
 - 3.2.2 the maximum area and depth of the excavation site,
 - 3.2.3 distances from public and private streets, lot boundaries, fences, buildings, drains, water courses and land affected by registered grants of easement in the vicinity of the excavation site;
 - 3.2 four copies of an excavation programme containing, *inter alia*—
 - 3.2.1 a description of the existing excavation site environment and the likely effect upon this of the proposed excavation,
 - 3.2.2 the nature and estimated duration of the proposed excavation,
 - 3.2.3 a schedule of estimated stages of the excavation programme and of the time periods within which it is proposed operations will be carried out,
 - 3.2.4 a description of the methods by which existing vegetation is to be cleared and topsoil and overburden removed and/or stockpiled,
 - 3.2.5 a description of the means of access to the excavation site and the types of roads to be constructed,
 - 3.2.6 a description of the methods by which the excavation site is to be kept drained,
 - 3.2.7 a description of the measures to be taken to minimise noise and dust nuisance, erosion, water course siltation, adverse visual impact and dangers to the general public;
 - 3.3 four copies of a rehabilitation programme indicating, *inter alia*—
 - 3.3.1 the objectives of the programme, having due regard to the nature of the surrounding area and the proposed end use of the excavation site;
 - 3.3.2 whether restoration and reinstatement of the excavation site is to be undertaken progressively or upon completion of excavation operations,
 - 3.3.3 the method by which topsoil is to be replaced and seeded,
 - 3.3.4 the numbers and types of trees to be planted and other landscaping features developed;
 - 3.4 a form of consent in writing of the owner of the excavation site to the application.
4. An application for an excavation licence shall provide the Council with such additional information concerning the proposed excavation as the Council may reasonably require.
5. On receipt of an application for an excavation licence, the Council:—
 - 5.1 shall forward a notice to the owners and occupiers of all land adjoining the land upon which it is proposed to excavate, or within an area determined by the Council as likely to be affected by the granting of a licence, advising of the application and specifying that they may, within twenty-one days from the date of service of the letter, object to or make representations in writing in respect of the issue of a licence by the Council,

- 5.2 shall publish in a newspaper circulating in the municipal district a notice advising of the application and specifying that any interested person may, within twenty-one days after the date of publication of the notice, object to or make representations in writing in respect of the issue of a licence by the Council,
- 5.3 may cause to be displayed in a prominent position on the excavation site a notice specifying particulars of the proposed excavation and inviting objections to and representation in respect thereof from members of the public, for a period of twenty-one days from the date of publication of the notice referred to Clause 5.2.
6. An excavation licence shall be substantially in the form of the Second Schedule hereto and shall be valid for such term not exceeding ten years from the date of issue as the Council may at that date determine and may be renewed thereafter by the Council for a further term or terms.
7. Excavation licence and renewal fees shall be payable to the Council in the amounts set out in the Third Schedule hereto.
8. The Council may impose conditions upon an excavation licence in respect of the following matters:—
 - 8.1 the hours during which excavation work may be carried out,
 - 8.2 the hours during which blasting operations may be carried out,
 - 8.3 the depths below which a person shall not excavate,
 - 8.4 distances from adjoining land or streets within which a person shall excavate,
 - 8.5 the safety of persons employed at the excavation site,
 - 8.6 the planting, care and maintenance of trees, shrubs and other landscaping features during the time in which the extractive industry is carried out in order to effectively screen the area to be excavated,
 - 8.7 the drainage of the excavation site and the disposal of water therein,
 - 8.8 the restoration and reinstatement of the excavation site,
 - 8.9 the provision of retaining walls to prevent subsidence of any portion of the excavation or of land abutting the excavation,
 - 8.10 requiring the licensee to enter into an agreement with the Council in respect of any condition or conditions imposed,
 - 8.11 otherwise regulating the carrying on of an extractive industry.
9. Upon the expiration of an excavation licence or the sooner cessation of any excavation work, the licensee shall ensure that—
 - 9.1 the excavation is restored and reinstated in accordance with proposals approved by Council or in such manner as the Council shall subsequently agree with the licensee in writing,
 - 9.2 any face permitted to remain upon the excavation site is left safe with all loose materials removed therefrom, and the sides sloped to a batter of not more than 1:3,
 - 9.3 the agreed floor level of the excavation site is graded to an even surface or otherwise in accordance with excavation and rehabilitation programmes approved by the Council,
 - 9.4 all dumps of stone, sand or other material are so left that no portion of that stone, and/or other material, can escape onto land not owned or occupied by the licensee nor into any stream, water course or drain that is not wholly situated within the land owned or occupied by the licensee.
10. The Council—
 - 10.1 may require as a condition of an excavation licence payment by the licensee into a fund established by the Council for the purpose of restoring and reinstating the excavation site a sum calculated at a rate per hectare, or part thereof, of the excavation site proposed to be excavated annually, set out in the Third Schedule hereto,
 - 10.2 may apply money in such a fund to or towards the restoration and reinstatement of the excavation site if the licensee does not carry out such restoration and reinstatement at his own cost upon completion of the excavation or the expiration of the licence, whichever the case may be,
 - 10.3 shall refund to the licensee moneys paid by him into such a fund upon satisfactory restoration and reinstatement of the excavation site.
11. As an alternative to payment into a fund in accordance with Clause 10 hereof the Council:
 - 11.1 may require an applicant for an excavation licence to give to the Council a bond, with or without sureties in a sum calculated as aforesaid to ensure that he will either carry out, or cause to be carried out, the restoration and reinstatement of the excavation site agreed between the applicant and the Council upon the granting of an excavation licence and in the case of default in carrying out or causing to be carried out such restoration and reinstatement, the bond is thereupon forfeited to the Council, and
 - 11.2 may apply the amount of a bond forfeited as aforesaid, or so much of that amount as is required, towards the carrying out of such restoration and reinstatement work.
12. Subject always to any condition imposed by the Council in accordance with Clause 8 of this by-law a person shall not without the written approval of the Council:
 - 12.1 excavate within 20 metres of the boundary of any land not owned by him,
 - 12.2 excavate within 20 metres of any land affected by a registered grant of easement or 40 metres of any water course,
 - 12.3 excavate within a distance of 40 metres of any road.

13. A licensee shall:

- 13.1 not remove natural trees or scrub within 40 metres (or such lesser distance as may be allowed by the Council in accordance with Clause 8 of this by-law) of the boundary of any road reserve on land in respect of which an excavation licence has been granted, except for the purpose of constructing access roads or erecting buildings for use in connection with the excavation and then only with the express approval of the Council and subject to any conditions which the Council may impose in accordance with Clause 8 hereof,
- 13.2 where the Council so requires, securely fence the excavation and keep the gateways locked when not actually in use in order that unauthorised persons will not enter the excavation,
- 13.3 where the Council so requires, drain and keep drained the excavation site in such a manner as to prevent the accumulation of water therein,
- 13.4 subject always to any condition imposed by Council in accordance with Clause 8.2 hereof, refrain from carrying out blasting operations in or about an excavation site except between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays (inclusive),
- 13.5 take all reasonable steps to prevent the emission of dust, noise and other forms of nuisance from the excavation site,
- 13.6 not excavate other than in accordance with the terms of application, and accompanying site plans and excavation and management programmes approved by the Council.
- 13.7 restore and reinstate the excavation site in accordance with the terms of the application and accompanying site plans and excavation and rehabilitation programmes approved by the Council,
- 13.8 otherwise comply with conditions imposed by the Council in accordance with Clause 8 hereof.

14. If a licensee fails to comply with:

- 14.1 any of the conditions of an excavation licence,
- 14.2 any provisions of this by-law, or
- 14.3 conditions of an Agreement with the Council made in accordance with Clause 8.10 hereof,

and the default continues following the expiration of a period of fourteen days from service upon the licensee of written notice from the Council of such default, the Council may cancel the excavation licence of the defaulting licensee.

15. Any person who contravenes the provisions of this by-law commits an offence and is liable upon conviction to:

- 15.1 a maximum penalty not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00),
- 15.2 in the event of a continuing offence following conviction, a daily penalty not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) for every day or part of a day during which such offence continues.

16. The provisions of this by-law shall apply to all land other than land excluded by the provisions of Section 235 of the Act within the municipal district and shall apply to every excavation whether commenced prior to or following the coming into operation of this by-law.

DOG ACT 1976.

The Municipality of the Shire of Three Springs.

By-laws Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 14 August 1984, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

PART I—Preliminary.

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires:

“Act” means the Dog Act 1976 as amended.

“by-law” means one of these by-laws.

“Clerk” means the Shire Clerk for the time being of the Shire of Three Springs or the person acting for the time being in that capacity.

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Three Springs.

“schedule” means a schedule to these by-laws.

“sub by-law” means sub by-law of the by-law in which the term is used.

“Townsite” shall mean the townsite of Three Springs or Arrino as defined under the Land Act.

Expressions used in these by-laws have the meanings given to them by the Act.

2. These by-laws apply throughout the whole district of the Shire of Three Springs.

PART II—Impounding of Dogs.

3. The charges in relation to the seizure and impounding of a dog and maintenance thereof in a pound payable under section 29 (4) of the Act are as specified in the First Schedule.

4. (1) The pound keeper shall be in attendance at a pound for the release of dogs at the times and on days of the week the Clerk determines from time to time.

(2) In the absence of a pound keeper a claim for a dog seized or impounded may be made to the Clerk or to an authorised person.

(3) The additional fee specified in the First Schedule is payable where arrangements are made for the release of a dog at a time or on a day other than those determined by the Clerk under sub by-law (1).

5. The fee payable where a dog is destroyed at the request of the owner thereof pursuant to section 29 (14) of the Act is that specified in the First Schedule.

6. The payment of fees or charges in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog does not relieve the owner of the dog of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of the Act, the Dog Act Regulations, 1976 or these by-laws.

PART III—Keeping Dogs.

7. The occupier of premises shall not unless the premises are licensed as an approved kennel establishment or have been granted exemption pursuant to section 26 (3) of the Act keep, or permit to be kept on those premises, more than two dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age if the premises are situated within the townsite. In respect to all other areas within the Council's control the limit of dogs over the age of three months permitted to be kept on any premises is six.

8. The occupier of premises on which a dog is kept shall:

(a) cause the premises or portion thereof on which the dog is kept to be fenced in a manner capable of confining the dog.

(b) ensure that every gate or door in the fence has a proper latch or other means of fastening.

(c) maintain the fence and all gates and doors in good order and condition.

9. (1) An application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in writing and shall be in or substantially in the form contained in the Second Schedule and shall be supplied by evidence that due notice of the proposed use of the land has been given to persons in the locality.

(2) Unless the Council otherwise decides an applicant for a licence shall give notice of the proposed use of the land by:

(a) not less than one advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district; and

(b) giving written notice to the owners and occupiers of all adjoining properties, at least thirty days before the application is made to the Council.

10. The fee payable for the issue of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment is that specified in the First Schedule.

11. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in or substantially in the form contained in the Third Schedule.

12. The fee payable for the renewal of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment is that specified in the First Schedule.

13. A person shall not erect a kennel unless it complies with the provisions of these by-laws and until plans and specifications and a location plan showing the proposed site for the kennel and of the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council and the fee for a licence prescribed in the First Schedule has been paid.

14. The owner or occupier of premises which have been licensed as an approved kennel establishment shall provide kennel or kennels which comply with the following specifications:—

- (a) each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto;
- (b) each kennel and each yard and every part thereto shall not be any less distance than 30 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier;
- (c) each kennel and each yard and every part thereto shall not be any less distance than 30 metres from any road or street;
- (d) each kennel and each yard and every part thereto shall not be any less distance than 20 metres from any dwelling house, Church, schoolroom, hall or factory;
- (e) the walls shall be rigid, impervious and structurally sound;
- (f) the roof shall be constructed of impervious material or other material approved by Council;
- (g) all untreated external surfaces of a material shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint;
- (h) the lowest internal height shall be at least 2 metres from the floor.
- (i) each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence no less than 2 metres in height constructed of galvanised iron, wood, galvanised link mesh or netting;
- (j) all gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening;
- (k) the upper surfaces of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 mm above the surface of the surrounding kennel ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface and shall have a drain which shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of Council;
- (l) the floor of a yard shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of a kennel;
- (m) for each dog kept herein every kennel shall have not less than 2 metres squared of floor space and every yard not less than 2.5 metres squared;
- (n) each kennel shall be constructed so far as is practicable with materials which prevent or minimise emission of noise therefrom;

15. A person who keeps or permits dogs to be kept in an approved kennel establishment shall:

- (a) keep dogs in kennels and yards appropriate to the breed or kind in question, sited and maintained in accordance with the requirements of public health and sufficiently secured;
- (b) not permit any dog to escape from the kennel or yard in which it is kept, or wander at large except for the purpose of reasonable exercise whilst under the control of a person who has attained the age of eighteen years; and
- (c) maintain all kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels used by dogs therein in a clean condition and cleanse and disinfect them when required to do so by an authorised person.

16. A right of appeal to a local court is conferred by section 27 of the Act where the Council refuses the grant of a licence or gives notice of intention to cancel a licence in respect of an approved kennel establishment.

PART IV—General.

17. The person liable for the control of a dog shall prevent the dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless restricted on a chain, cord, leash or harness;

- (a) an area set aside for public recreation;
- (b) any land vested in or under the control of the Council.

18. The person liable for the control of a dog shall prevent the dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) a public building;
- (b) a theatre;
- (c) a house of worship or cemetery;
- (d) a shop or other public business premises;
- (e) a public bathing area.

19. No person shall:—

- (a) unless a poundkeeper or other officer of the Council duly authorised in that regard, release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;
- (b) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound, dog cart, vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.

20. A person who fails to comply with or contravenes any of the provisions of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a maximum penalty of \$100.00.

21. The By-laws relating to Dogs published on pages 764 and 765 of the *Government Gazette* dated 7 May, 1954 are hereby revoked.
