By-laws Relating to Roosters.

1. In these by-laws the Model By-laws Series "A" as amended from time to time adopted by the City of Bayswater by resolution published in the *Government Gazette* of 21 July 1964 are referred to as "the principal by-laws".

2. The principal by-laws are amended by inserting after By-law 29B of Part I the following by-law—

29C. (1) Subject to sub-by-law (3) of this by-law, on and after the date upon which this by-law takes effect an occupier of premises shall not keep a rooster or permit a rooster to be kept on those premises.

(2) The Council may, upon written application to it, grant approval to a person who is an occupier of premises to keep on those premises not more than one rooster.

(3) A person who has been granted approval under sub-by-law (2) hereof to keep a bird may keep the bird on the premises only while he is the occupier thereof.

(4) This by-law operates and has effect in the whole of the district of the City of Bayswater.

(5) This by-law has effect notwithstanding By-law 29A of this Part.

#### HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

##### Town of East Fremantle.

THE Town of East Fremantle being a Local Authority under the provisions of the abovementioned Act and having adopted the Model By-laws—Series "A" made under the Act, does hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Act and all other powers enabling it, make and publish the following by-laws.

1. In these by-laws the Model By-laws—Series "A" as amended from time to time adopted by the Town of East Fremantle by resolution published in the *Government Gazette* of 12 December 1956 and amended from time to time are referred to as "the principal by-laws".

2. The principal by-laws are amended by repealing By-laws 12, 13 and 14 of Part 1 and substituting the following.

##### 12.—Interpretation.

"Health Surveyor" means the Health Surveyor of the Local Authority.

"Other Premises" means premises which are not residential.

"Receptacle" means—

(a) in the case of residential premises, a polyethylene cart fitted with wheels and a handle with a lid, supplied by the Local Authority or its Contractor, or other type of receptacles specified or approved by the Local Authority, OR,

(b) in the case of other premises a refuse receptacle approved by the Health Surveyor.

"Residential Premises" means premises used for residential purposes.

##### 13.—(1) Residential Premises.

The occupier of every residential premises in the District shall:—

(a) subject to paragraph (c) hereof, cause all household refuse to be deposited in a receptacle;

(b) at all practicable times keep the lid of the receptacle tightly closed;

(c) not deposit or permit to be deposited in a receptacle:—

(i) more than 70 kg of refuse at any one time,

(ii) any material being or consisting of:

(a) hot or burning ashes

(b) oil

(c) liquid

(d) paint

(e) solvent

(f) any other corrosive chemical

(g) bricks, concrete, earth or like substance

- (iii) an object which is greater in length, width or breadth than the corresponding dimensions of the receptacle or which will not allow the lid of the receptacle to be tightly closed;
- (iv) refuse which is or is likely to become offensive or a nuisance or to give off an offensive or obnoxious odour or to attract flies or cause fly breeding unless it is first wrapped in absorbent or impervious material, or placed in a sealed impervious container;
- (v) at all times keep the receptacle clean and whenever directed by a Health Surveyor thoroughly cleanse such receptacle.

(2) In the case of residential premises consisting of more than 3 residential units, the Local Authority may require the use of a receptacle or receptacles other than a polyethylene cart and the occupier of the premises shall comply with and observe the directions given by the Local Authority.

(3) Other Premises—

(a) the occupier of every premises in the District being "Other Premises", shall:

- (i) cause all refuse to be deposited in a receptacle in a manner which is compatible with the type of receptacle used;
- (ii) take all reasonable steps to prevent fly breeding in and emission of offensive or noxious odour from the receptacle;
- (iii) cause the receptacle to be located on the premises in a position where—
  - (a) it is screened so as not to be visible from a street but is readily accessible for the purpose of collection of the contents thereof;
  - (b) it does not obstruct a driveway, service road or footpath on those premises;
  - (c) it does not cause a nuisance to the occupiers adjoining premises;
- (iv) at all times keep the receptacle clean and whenever directed by a Health Surveyor thoroughly cleanse the receptacle;
- (v) where the premises are used for the manufacture, presentation or sale of food or any putrescible refuse emanates from the premises cause the receptacle to be cleaned with a suitable detergent and treated with a disinfectant at least once per week.

(b) The Health Surveyor may direct that refuse of the type referred to in paragraph (v) of sub-by-law (1) hereof or which emanates from premises referred to in that paragraph be collected and removed more often than once per week.

(c) When refuse emanating from other premises is of a nature that the Health Surveyor considers requires to be treated before being placed in a receptacle, he may give directions as to the manner in which it is to be so treated and the occupier of these premises shall comply with these directions.

14.—Receptacles to remain the property of the Local Authority or its Contractor.

- (a) a receptacle supplied by the Local Authority or its Contractor remains the property of the Local Authority or its Contractor, as the case may be;
- (b) when a receptacle assigned to a particular premises is lost, stolen, damaged or becomes defective, the occupier of that premises shall notify the Local Authority of such occurrence within 7 days after the occurrence and may be liable for the replacement cost of the bin.

3. By-law 18 of Part 1 of the principal by-laws is amended by deleting the word "cart" in line 2 and substituting the words "collection vehicle".

## HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

The Municipality of the Shire of Wanneroo.

Health By-laws Series "A".

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Wanneroo hereby records having resolved on 29 August 1984, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following amendment to its Health By-laws Series "A" as published in the *Government Gazette* on 17 July 1963 and adopted by the Shire of Wanneroo, with amendments on 4 June 1970.

## PART I—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

Keeping of Poultry or Pigeons.

1. Delete by-law 29A and replace as follows:—

29A For the purpose of By-law 29A the following definitions shall apply.

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Wanneroo.

"Poultry" means any domestic fowl or chicken, bantam, duck, goose, guinea fowl, pheasant or turkey.

"Residential Area" means any land situated within a residential area zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme.

"Rural Area" means any land situated within a rural zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme.

"Special Rural" means any land situated within a special rural zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme.

"Town Planning Scheme" means the Shire of Wanneroo Town Planning Scheme No. 1 published in the *Government Gazette* on 13 September 1972 and amended from time to time (including amendments made after the date of coming into operation of this by-law) or any other Town Planning Scheme or by-laws made by the Council for the time being in force.

## 1. Keeping Poultry in Residential Zones.

The occupier of premises situated on land zoned residential shall not keep thereon or permit to be kept thereon any poultry otherwise than under the following conditions:—

- (a) No poultry shall be kept in an open yard in a residential zone.
- (b) Poultry must be kept in a shed or house designed to permit the use of a deep litter system.
- (c) Poultry houses shall be constructed to at least the following specifications:—
  - Floor shall be concrete 50 mm thick and smooth cement rendered finish;
  - Frames shall be of timber (treated for termites), steel, brick or other approved materials;
  - Cladding shall be of asbestos, sheet metal, brick or weather-board or other materials approved by the Health Surveyor;
  - Roof shall be of corrugated asbestos, tiles, sheet metal or other materials approved by the Health Surveyor.
- (d) The roof shall have sufficient slope to shed storm water.
- (e) The house must be designed and constructed in a sound and weatherproof manner and be of sufficient height to allow easy entry for cleaning.
- (f) The minimum size of any shed must allow at least .3 square metres for each and every bird kept therein.
- (g) Provision must be made to provide adequate ventilation to the shed during hot weather.
- (h) Roof, walls, floors, doors and ventilating panels must be maintained in good order and condition at all times.

- (i) Floors must be covered by a layer of dry sawdust at least 75 mm deep. Shed must be constructed to ensure that sawdust remains dry at all times and the sawdust shall be changed at least once every six (6) months or when directed by a Health Surveyor.
- (j) No poultry house shall be nearer than 1 m from the boundary of land in other occupation or 10 m from any dwelling house or 10 m from a street upon which a side boundary abuts.
- (k) Not more than 12 poultry (including a maximum of 2 ducks) shall be kept on residential land.
- (l) The keeping of roosters is prohibited in residential areas.

2. Keeping Poultry in Special Rural Zones.

The occupier of premises situated on land zoned special rural shall not keep thereon or permit to be kept thereon poultry otherwise than under the following conditions:—

- (a) Poultry shall be kept in a shed designed to permit the use of a deep litter system or in open yards with a shed that has a concrete floor at least 50 mm in thickness, finished to a smooth cement surface and laid with a fall of at least one in fifty to the doorway.
- (b) Sheds shall be of sound construction and shed and yard maintained in good and clean condition at all times.
- (c) Poultry sheds must be of sufficient height to allow easy entry for cleaning.
- (d) No poultry shed shall be nearer than 1 m from the boundary of land in other occupation or 15 m from any dwelling house or 25 m from a street upon which a side boundary abuts.
- (e) No person shall keep more than 25 head of poultry unless approved in writing by Council.

3. Keeping Poultry in Rural Zones.

The occupier of premises situated on land zoned rural shall not keep thereon or permit to be kept thereon poultry otherwise than under the following conditions:—

- (a) No person shall keep more than 50 head of poultry, unless approved in writing by Council.

4. No person shall keep poultry in any area other than those defined in this by-law.

2. Insert new by-law as follows:—

29AA The occupier of premises on which any animal or bird is kept shall at all times maintain in a clean condition every structure, cage and enclosure in which an animal or bird is kept and shall whenever so directed by a Health Surveyor, cleanse, disinfest or disinfect such structure, cage and enclosure.



## Audit Report.

Auditor's Report to the Ratepayers of the Town of Kwinana.

I have audited the Municipality's accounts set out on pages 1 to 31 in accordance with the Local Government Act 1960 and Australian Auditing Standards.

I make the following reservations in expressing my opinion—

1. As this is the first year of my appointment, I am unable to express an opinion on the opening balance of the Municipal Accumulation and Trust Account.

2. The application of the accounting policy in relation to reserve accounting which enables the Council to comply with the Local Government Act 1960 and Accounting Directions whereby the Council raises reserve fund accounts and a reserve fund control account when Council funds are set aside into separate bank accounts for specific purposes results in an overstatement of assets and liabilities of \$2 556 662.50.
3. As indicated in the accounting policy set out in Note 1 (b) the cash basis of accounting has been adopted. This is not in accordance with generally accepted Accounting Standards.

Except for the above matters, in my opinion the Accounts present fairly the financial position of the Town of Kwinana at 30 June 1984, and the statement of accounts for the year then ended, and have been prepared in accordance with the Local Government Act 1960, Accounting Directions and Australian Accounting Standards.

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT (ELECTORAL) REGULATIONS 1984.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Local Government (Electoral) Regulations 1984.

Commence-  
ment and  
application.2. (1) Subject to subregulation (2), these regulations shall come into operation on the day on which they are published in the *Gazette*.

(2) These regulations shall apply to the annual elections to be held under the Act in May 1985, to any poll or referendum so held on the day on which those annual elections are so held and to all subsequent elections, polls and referenda so held.

3. For the purpose of a poll conducted under section 10A, 28, 30A or 533 of the Act, the returning officer shall use the electoral roll of the municipality.

Electoral  
forms.

4. The forms set out in the Schedule are prescribed forms for the purposes of the respective provisions of the Act specified in those forms.

Contents  
of electoral  
rolls.

5. (1) For the purposes of section 45 (b) and subject to subregulation (2), the prescribed particulars for an elector are—

(a) in the case of a residence roll, his surname, other names and residence;

(b) in the case of an owners and occupiers roll, his surname, other names and postal address, details of the rateable property in respect of which he qualifies for registration and whether he so qualifies as owner or occupier of that rateable property; and

(c) in the case of a consolidated roll, the particulars prescribed by this subregulation in respect of the residents roll or the owners and occupiers roll by virtue of registration on which he is registered on the consolidated roll.

(2) When the residence of an elector is not shown on an electoral roll under the Electoral Act 1907 by virtue of section 51B of that Act—

(a) that residence shall not be shown on the relevant residents roll; and

(b) the clerk shall as soon as is practicable delete from the relevant owners and occupiers roll and from any relevant consolidated roll any particulars which identify that residence.

(3) Each page of a residents roll, owners and occupiers roll or consolidated roll shall be numbered.

Maximum fee for copy of roll.

6. For the purposes of section 49, the maximum fee prescribed for each copy of the electoral roll is \$10.

Notice of results of elections, polls and referenda.

7. For the purposes of section 138 (2), the prescribed particulars are—

- (a) in the case of an election, the names of the municipality and of the ward thereof, if any, the date of the election and the office to which it related, the reason for the vacancy and the candidate elected; or
- (b) in the case of a poll or referendum, the name of the municipality and the date, purpose and result of the poll or referendum.

Repeal and saving.

8. (1) The Local Government Electoral Regulations 1981\* (in this regulation called the repealed regulations) are repealed.

(2) Notwithstanding subregulation (1), the repealed regulations shall continue to apply to all elections and polls held during the period commencing on the day on which these regulations come into operation and ending immediately before the day on which the annual elections referred to in regulation 2 (2) are held as if the repealed regulations had not been repealed.

Children who live within the areas and boundaries stated shall attend the schools to which such boundaries apply unless directed otherwise or unless an option is provided. Children who live outside the areas and boundaries shall not attend the schools to which such boundaries apply unless written approval for such admission is obtained from the undersigned.

## School Boundaries.

## 1. Beldon—Heathridge—Mullaloo—Ocean Reef Area.

With the opening of the BELDON PRIMARY SCHOOL in 1985, the redefinition of some school boundaries has become necessary as follows:

## (a) Heathridge Primary School.

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:

From the intersection of Marmion Avenue and Ocean Reef Road, east and southeast along Ocean Reef Road to the proposed Mitchell Freeway, north and northwest along the proposed Mitchell Freeway to Hodges Drive, west along Hodges Drive to Marmion Avenue, and south along Marmion Avenue to Ocean Reef Road.

The boundary parts of Marmion Avenue (east side) Ocean Reef Road (north side), the proposed Mitchell Freeway (west side) and Hodges Drive (south side) are included within the area for the Heathridge Primary School.

The following has been declared as an optional area between Heathridge Primary School and Mullaloo Heights Primary School:

The Locality of Ocean Reef.

The following has been declared as an optional area between Heathridge Primary School, Camberwarra Primary School and Beldon Primary School:

From the intersection of Craigie Drive and Eddystone Avenue, north along Eddystone Avenue and its proposed extension to Ocean Reef Road, southeast along Ocean Reef Road to the easterly extension of Coyle Road, west from this point along Coyle Road to Craigie Drive and in a general westerly direction along Craigie Drive to Eddystone Avenue.

The boundary parts of Eddystone Avenue (east side), Ocean Reef Road (south side), Craigie Drive (north side) and the boundary street of Coyle Road (north side), are included within the optional area as designated above.

This optional area will remain in force until the establishment of a primary school in the southeastern part of the locality of Heathridge, at which time it will be incorporated into the area for the new school.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1985 and living within the boundary for the Heathridge Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Heathridge Primary School except as follows:

(i) Children from the first optional area referred to above may attend either Heathridge or Mullaloo Heights Primary School.

(ii) Children from the second optional area referred to above may attend either Heathridge, Beldon or Camberwarra Primary School.

## (b) Camberwarra Primary School.

The boundary for the above-mentioned school remains as published in the *Government Gazette* of 24 December 1981.

The following area has been declared as an optional area between Camberwarra Primary School, Beldon Primary School and Heathridge Primary School:

From the intersection of Craigie Drive and Eddystone Avenue, north along Eddystone Avenue and its proposed extension to Ocean Reef Road, southeast along Ocean Reef Road to the easterly extension of Coyle Road, west from this point along Coyle Road to Craigie Drive and in a general westerly direction along Craigie Drive to Eddystone Avenue.

The boundary parts of Eddystone Avenue (east side), Ocean Reef Road (south side), Craigie Drive (north side) and the boundary street of Coyle Road (north side), are included within the optional area as designated above.

This optional area will remain in force until the establishment of a primary school in the southeastern part of the Locality of Heathridge, at which time it will be incorporated into the area for the new school.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1985 and living within the boundary for the Camberwarra Primary School as published in the *Government Gazette* of 24 December 1981, shall attend the Camberwarra Primary School

except that children from the optional area referred to above may attend either Camberwarra, Beldon or Heathridge Primary School.

(c) Mullaloo Heights Primary School.

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:

From the Indian Ocean south of the east-west alignment of Merrifield Place, due east to West Coast Highway, north along West Coast Highway to Mullaloo Drive, in a general easterly direction along Mullaloo Drive to Kallaroo Place, east along Kallaroo Place to Marmion Avenue, north along Marmion Avenue to Ocean Reef Road, west along Ocean Reef Road to the junction with West Coast Highway, and thence due west to the Indian Ocean.

The boundary part of Merrifield Place (both sides), West Coast Highway (both sides), Mullaloo Drive (north side), Marmion Avenue (west side), Ocean Reef Road (south side) and the boundary street of Kallaroo Place (north side), are included within the area for the Mullaloo Heights Primary School.

The following has been declared as an optional area between Mullaloo Heights Primary School and Heathridge Primary School:

The Locality of Ocean Reef.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1985 and living within the boundary for the Mullaloo Heights Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Mullaloo Heights Primary School, except that children from the optional area may attend either Mullaloo Heights or Heathridge Primary School.

(d) Beldon Primary School

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:

From the intersection of Ocean Reef Road and Marmion Avenue, south along Marmion Avenue to Craigie Drive, in a general easterly direction along Craigie Drive to Eddystone Avenue, north along Eddystone Avenue and its proposed extension to Ocean Reef Road and northwest and west along Ocean Reef Road to Marmion Avenue.

The boundary parts of Ocean Reef Road (south side), Marmion Avenue (east side), Craigie Drive (north side) and Eddystone Avenue (west side) are included within the area for the Beldon Primary School.

The following has been declared as an optional area between Beldon Primary School, Camberwarra Primary School and Heathridge Primary School:

From the intersection of Craigie Drive and Eddystone Avenue, north along Eddystone Avenue and its proposed extension to Ocean Reef Road, southeast along Ocean Reef Road to the easterly extension of Coyle Road, west from this point along Coyle Road to Craigie Drive and in a general westerly direction along Craigie Drive to Eddystone Avenue.

The boundary parts of Eddystone Avenue (east side), Ocean Reef Road (south side), Craigie Drive (north side) and the boundary street of Coyle Road (north side) are included within the optional area as designated above.

This optional area will remain in force until the establishment of a primary school in the southeastern part of the locality of Heathridge, at which time it will be incorporated into the area for the new school.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 6 inclusive in 1985 and living within the boundary for the Beldon Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Beldon Primary School, except that children from the optional area may attend either Beldon, Camberwarra or Heathridge Primary School.

2. BRAESIDE AND KATANNING PRIMARY SCHOOLS.

The boundary between the above-mentioned schools is as follows:

From the junction of Marmion Street and Carew Street, southeast along Carew Street to Cove Street, northeast along Cove Street to Conroy Street, southeast along Conroy Street to Clive Street, northeast along Clive Street to Kobeelya Avenue, northeast along Kobeelya Avenue to Brownie Street and southeast along Brownie Street to Golf Links Road.

The boundary street of Brownie Street and the boundary parts of Carew Street, Clive Street, Cove Street, Conroy Street and Kobeelya Avenue (both sides in all cases) are excluded from the area for the Braeside Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1985 and living in the area to the north of the boundary, as defined above, shall attend the Braeside Primary School, whilst children from the area south of the above-mentioned boundary shall be excluded from attending the Braeside Primary School.

Children travelling on the Bullock Hills, Cartmetcup, Kwobrup and Warren Road buses, may attend either the Braeside Primary School or the Katanning Primary School. Children travelling on all other school bus services shall attend the Katanning Primary School.

The following exceptions shall apply to the boundary stated above:

- (a) Children currently (1984) attending the Braeside Primary School and living in the area now designated for the Katanning Primary School shall have the option of continuing to attend the Braeside Primary School or of transferring to the Katanning Primary School.
- (b) Younger siblings of children referred to in (a) above may attend the primary school currently (1984) attended by their older siblings, regardless of their place of residence.

The above concessions do not apply to new families moving into the area after the end of the 1984 school year, nor to families with children attending school for the first time in 1985. Children of such families will be required to attend the appropriate school according to the above-mentioned boundary.

3. COOLOONGUP PRIMARY SCHOOL.

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:

From the junction of Ennis Avenue and Rae Road, southwest along Rae Road to Read Street, south-southeast along Read Street to Safety Bay Road, east along Safety Bay Road to Ennis Avenue and north and north-west along Ennis Avenue to Rae Road.

The boundary parts of Rae Road (south side), Read Street (east side), Safety Bay Road (north side) and Ennis Avenue (west side) are included within the area for Cooloongup Primary School.

Children attending Government Schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1985 and living within the area for Cooloongup Primary School, as provided above, shall attend Cooloongup Primary School.

The following optional areas shall apply:

- (a) Optional for Bungaree, Cooloongup and Hillman Primary Schools.

The area bounded by Read Street, Rae Road, Ennis Avenue, Dixon Road and the proposed Leghorn Street. The boundary parts of Read Street (east side), Rae Road (north side), Ennis Avenue (west side), Dixon Street (both sides) and the boundary street of the proposed Leghorn Street (both sides) are included in the optional area.

- (b) Optional for Cooloongup, Safety Bay and Warnbro Primary Schools.

The area bounded by Safety Bay Road (both sides), Warnbro Beach Road (both sides) View Road (both sides), Safety Bay Road (both sides), Seahaven Street (both sides), Charthouse Road (both sides), Seabreeze Street (both sides), Jamaican Road (both sides), Kingston Way (southern arm, both sides), Read Street (west side), Rae Road (south side), Waikiki Road (east side) and Malibu Road (southeast side).

#### 4. SAFETY BAY PRIMARY SCHOOL.

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:

The Indian Ocean at a point due west of Boundary Road, east along Boundary Road to Safety Bay Road, east across Safety Bay Road to the proposed Garden Island Highway, southeast along the proposed Garden Island Highway to Rae Road, east along Rae Road to the northern extension of Waikiki Road, south along Waikiki Road to Malibu Road and southwest along Malibu Road to and across Safety Bay Road to the Indian Ocean.

The boundary streets of Boundary Road (both sides) and Waikiki Road (west side) and the boundary parts of the proposed Garden Island Highway (south side), Rae Road (south side) and Malibu Road (northwest side) are included within the area for the Safety Bay Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1985 and living within the area for the Safety Bay Primary School, as provided above, shall attend Safety Bay Primary School.

The following is to be an optional area for Safety Bay, Cooloongup and Warnbro Primary Schools:

The area bounded by Safety Bay Road (both sides), Warnbro Beach Road (both sides), View Road (both sides), Safety Bay Road (both sides) Seahaven Street (both sides), Charthouse Road (both sides) Seabreeze Street (both sides), Jamaican Road (both sides), Kingston Way (southern arm, both sides), Read Street (west side), Rae Road (south side), Waikiki Road (east side) and Malibu Road (southeast side).

#### 5. TOM PRICE AND NORTH TOM PRICE PRIMARY SCHOOLS.

The boundary between the above-mentioned schools is as follows:

The Dampier-Paraburdoo railway line.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 6 inclusive in 1985 and living west of the Dampier-Paraburdoo railway line shall attend North Tom Price Primary School, whilst children in the same Years living east of the railway line shall attend Tom Price Primary School.

The following exception shall apply to the boundary as stated above:

- (a) Children from the Caravan Park shall attend Tom Price Primary School.

- (b) Children currently (1984) attending North Tom Price Primary School and living in the area now designated for Tom Price Primary School shall have the option of continuing to attend North Tom Price Primary School or of transferring to Tom Price Primary School. This concession shall be extended to younger siblings but will not apply to new families moving to Tom Price after the end of the 1984 school year, nor to families with children attending school for the first time in 1985. Children of such families will be required to attend the appropriate school in accordance with the above-mentioned boundary.

#### 6. WARNBRO PRIMARY SCHOOL.

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:

From the Indian Ocean at a point opposite the junction of Warnbro Beach Road and View Road, north-east to and along View Road to Safety Bay Road, northwest along Safety Bay Road to Seahaven Street, northeast along Seahaven Street to Charthouse Road, northwest along Charthouse Road to Seabreeze Street, northeast along Seabreeze Street to Jamaican Road, southeast along Jamaican Road to Kingston Way, north-east along the southwest/northeast alignment of Kingston Way to Read Street, southeast along Read Street to and across Safety Bay Road to Warnbro Sound Avenue and south along Warnbro Sound Avenue.

The boundary street of Warnbro Sound Avenue (west side) and the boundary parts of Read Street (west side) are included within the area for the Warnbro Primary School whilst the boundary streets of View Road, Seahaven Street and Seabreeze Street and the boundary parts of Safety Bay Road, Charthouse Road, Kingston Way and Jamaican Road (both sides in each case) are excluded from the area for the Warnbro Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1985 and living within the area for the Warnbro Primary School, as provided above, shall attend Warnbro Primary School.

The following is to be an optional area for Warnbro, Cooloongup and Safety Bay Primary Schools:

The area bounded by Safety Bay Road (both sides), Warnbro Beach Road (both sides), View Road (both sides), Safety Bay Road (both sides), Seahaven Street (both sides), Charthouse Road (both sides), Seabreeze Street (both sides), Jamaican Road (both sides), Kingston Way (southern arm, both sides), Read Street (west side), Rae Road (south side), Waikiki Road (east side) and Malibu Road (southeast side).

#### 7. WEST MIDLAND PRIMARY SCHOOL.

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:

From the point where Lloyd Street crosses the railway line, in a general westerly direction along the railway line to its junction with the north-south railway line at a point just west of High Street, south along the railway line to Adelaide Street, southeast along Adelaide Street and its extension to the Roe Freeway, north along the Roe Freeway to Military Road, north along Military Road to Clayton Street and in a general northwesterly direction along Clayton Street to the level crossing at Lloyd Street.

The boundary parts of the Roe Freeway (west side) and the boundary street of Adelaide Street (both sides) are included within the area for the West Midland Primary School whilst the boundary parts of Clayton Street (both sides) and the boundary street of Military Road (both sides) are excluded from the area for the West Midland Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 6 inclusive in 1985 (Years 1-7 inclusive in 1986 and thereafter), and living within the boundary for the West Midland Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the West Midland Primary School.
