## HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

## The Municipality of the Shire of Cunderdin.

## By-laws Relating to Intensive Piggeries.

WHEREAS under the Health Act 1911 as amended, a local authority may make by-laws, now therefore, the Shire of Cunderdin being the local authority for the health district of Cunderdin has resolved to make the following by-laws.

1. These by-laws may be cited as the "Shire of Cunderdin Intensive Housing of Pigs By-laws" and shall apply within the whole of the Shire of Cunderdin.

2. For the purpose of these by-laws, the following definitions shall apply:—

"Authorised Officer" means a person lawfully appointed by Council for the purpose of these by-laws.

"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Cunderdin.

"District" means the Municipal District of the Shire of Cunderdin.

"Intensive Piggery" means those premises where pigs are kept in buildings or yards at a stocking density of less than 2 square metres per 45 kilograms of total live pig body weight and includes any effluent disposal or drainage system connected thereto.

3. No person shall establish an intensive piggery within the Shire of Cunderdin without the approval of the Council.

The intensive housing of pigs may be permitted in all areas of the local authority with the exception of the following:—

(a) The townsites of Cunderdin and Meckering and all that land within three kilometres outside the boundaries of those townsites.

4. Any person intending to establish an intensive piggery within the district shall submit to the Council.

(a) Plans and specifications in duplicate of the proposed intensive piggery including:—

(i) Details of the approximate number of pigs to be kept.

(ii) Details of the drainage and effluent disposal system to be installed.

(iii) Details of the method by which cleaning down of the premises shall be conducted.

5. No person shall establish or maintain an intensive piggery unless every portion of such piggery is:—

(a) At least 100 metres from any house or other place of human habitation or any place whatsoever where food for human consumption is prepared or stored.

(b) At least 200 metres from the boundary of the lot upon which the intensive piggery is to be situated.

6. (a) All buildings and yards shall be maintained in a structurally sound and clean condition.

(b) Drainage and treatment of effluent waste shall be carried out and maintained in such a manner as to prevent a nuisance arising.

(c) The owner or occupier of an intensive piggery shall undertake effective measures to control the breeding and presence of flies and vermin to the satisfaction of Council's authorised officer.

7. Any person who establishes or conducts an intensive piggery in breach of these by-laws commits an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$200 and, in the case of continuing offence, to a penalty not exceeding \$4 for each day the offence is continued.

8. (a) Where there is a default by an owner or occupier of an intensive piggery in complying with the provisions of these by-laws the Council or its authorised officer may by notice in writing served on that owner or occupier order that the default be rectified and in the event of non-compliance with that notice the Council or its authorised officer may effect such work as is necessary to comply with the requirements of the order.

(b) The cost of effecting the work referred to in paragraph (a) hereof shall be a debt due and owing by the owner or occupier of that intensive piggery to the Council and may be recovered by the Council in a court of competent jurisdiction.

#### HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

Shire of Merredin.

By-laws.

THE Shire of Merredin being a local authority under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act and having adopted the Model By-laws Series "A" made under the Act does hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Act and all other powers enabling it make and publish the following by-laws—

1. In these by-laws the Model By-laws Series "A" as amended from time to time adopted by the Shire of Merredin by resolution published in the *Government Gazette* of 8 July 1970 and amended from time to time are referred to as "the principal by-laws".

2. By-law 19 of Section A of Part IX of the principal by-laws is amended by deleting "twenty pounds" and substituting "\$200.00" and deleting "two pounds" and substituting "four dollars".

3. Section C of Part IX of the principal by-laws is amended by inserting the following new by-law after by-law 7 thereof—

8. (1) In this by-law, unless the context requires otherwise—

"district" means the municipal district of the Municipality of the Shire of Merredin;

"intensive piggery" means a piggery in which at any time the ratio of live body weight of pigs kept therein to the floor area thereof is less than 22.5 kg to 1 sq.m;

"lot" has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of the Town Planning and Development Act 1928;

"townsite" has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of the Local Government Act 1960.

(2) For the purpose of ascertaining the floor area of a piggery the floor shall be measured from the inside faces of external walls and all internal walls shall be disregarded.

(3) A person shall not carry on an intensive piggery—

(a) within the townsite of Merredin or within 5 km outside the boundaries thereof;

(b) within the townsites of Burracoppin, Hines Hill, Muntadgin, Nangeenan or Nukarni or within 1.5 km outside the boundaries thereof;

(c) elsewhere in the district except with the approval of the local authority on land zoned for the purposes of general farming; or

(d) within a distance of—

(i) 200 m from a dwellinghouse or place in which food for human consumption is prepared or stored;

- (ii) 200 m from the boundary of the lot on which the intensive piggery is located; or
- (iii) 1.5 km from a dwellinghouse situated on a lot other than the lot on which the intensive piggery is located.

(4) Any person who proposes to establish and carry on an intensive piggery within the district shall make application to the local authority for its approval and shall submit to the local authority with the application—

- (a) plans and specifications in duplicate of the proposed intensive piggery;
- (b) details in writing of—
  - (i) the maximum number of pigs to be kept in the intensive piggery at any time;
  - (ii) the proposed drainage and effluent disposal system to be installed;
  - (iii) the proposed method of cleaning the intensive piggery.

(5) The provisions and requirements of this by-law are in addition to and not in derogation of those of the remaining by-laws of this Section and of Section A of this Part.

## HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

Shire of Williams.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 (as amended) a Local Authority may make or adopt by-laws and may alter, amend, or repeal any by-law so made or adopted:—

Now therefore the Shire of Williams being a Local Health Authority, within the meaning of the Act and having adopted the model by-laws described as Series "A", as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954, in the *Government Gazette* on 17 July 1963 and as amended from time to time thereafter doth hereby resolve and determine that the said Model by-law so amended and adopted shall be further amended as follows:—

## Part VII—Food.

(1) By deleting the whole of section (2) of by-law 51 and substituting a new section (2) as follows:—

(2) Every person desiring to engage in the trade of an itinerant vendor of food shall before so engaging in such trade, or, if already so engaged then during the first week of July in every year apply to the Local Authority in the form of Schedule "C" for a licence to carry on such trade and with such application deposit a fee of sixty dollars (\$60.00).

(2) By deleting the whole of section (4) of by-law 51 and substituting a new section (4) as follows:—

(4) Every licence granted under this by-law shall operate only during the period ending the thirtieth (30th) day of June next succeeding the date of issue, and after the said thirtieth (30th) day of June shall cease to be of any force or effect.

"

#### HEALTH ACT 1911.

#### BLOOD AND TISSUE (TRANSMISSIBLE DISEASES) REGULATIONS 1985.

MADE by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Deputy of the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Blood and Tissue (Transmissible Diseases) Regulations 1985.

Interpretation. 2. (1) In these regulations—  
"blood" includes—  
(a) any substance derived from blood; or  
(b) any tissue, including bone marrow and the placenta, of a kind used of likely to be used as a source from which to derive a constituent of blood for therapeutic use or for the preparation of a substance for therapeutic use;  
"tissue" includes any organ or part of the human body or a substance extracted from, or from a part of, the human body and intended for therapeutic use.

(2) A reference in these regulations to the donating of blood shall be read as including a reference to the donation of any tissue, or any part of any tissue or of a substance obtained from the blood or tissue, or of any ovum or semen.

The taking of blood without a declaration. 3. (1) Subject to this regulation, a person shall not—  
(a) take any blood intended for therapeutic use; or  
(b) knowingly accept for therapeutic use any blood donated, unless the person donating the blood made a declaration in the form prescribed by these regulations within the 12 hours preceding the donation of the blood.

Penalty: \$200.

(2) Where the donor of any blood is by reason of injury or illness incapable of making a declaration in the form prescribed by these regulations, a person who takes, or accepts a donation of, blood from that donor for therapeutic use where the circumstances are such as to be, in the opinion of a person who is a designated officer, or the delegate of a designated officer, for the purposes of the Human Tissue and Transplant Act 1982, medically justifiable shall not be taken to have contravened subregulation (1).

(3) The taking or accepting of blood that is intended—

(a) for the use of the donor; or

(b) for a use other than a therapeutic use,

shall be taken not to contravene subregulation (1) notwithstanding that no declaration is made in respect of that blood.

4. A person who intends to donate blood for therapeutic use is required to furnish in writing to the person taking the blood at the time of donating that blood a declaration made in the form prescribed by these regulations before a witness who is authorized by these regulations to permit such a declaration to be made in their presence, that declaration having been made within the preceding 12 hours, and shall not donate blood unless such a declaration is furnished.

5. For the purpose of taking declarations required by these regulations, a person who is within one of the following categories of authorized persons may permit such a declaration to be made before them—

(a) any person authorized to permit a statutory declaration to be made before them;

(b) a person who is a designated officer, or the delegate of a designated officer, for the purposes of the Human Tissue and Transplant Act 1982;

(c) a medical practitioner;

(d) a staff member of the Red Cross Blood Transfusion Service; or

(e) a registered general nurse employed for the taking of tissue,

and shall sign the declaration, date it and endorse on it the time at which it was made and the category of authorization to which they belong.

IF THE DECLARATION IS KNOWINGLY MADE FALSELY IN ANY MATERIAL PARTICULAR YOU MAY BE LIABLE TO IMPRISONMENT FOR 3 YEARS UNDER SECTION 170 OF THE CRIMINAL CODE.

IF YOU ARE NOT SURE AS TO ANY MATTER OR WISH TO ADD ANY INFORMATION OR COMMENT, PLEASE USE THE SPACE FOR NOTES PROVIDED.

#### DECLARATION

I HEREBY DECLARE TO THE BEST OF MY KNOWLEDGE THAT:

1. I have not engaged in male-to-male sexual activity during the past 5 years;
2. I have no reason to believe I am suffering from AIDS or any disease related to it;
3. I have not injected myself with any substance not prescribed by a qualified medical practitioner within the past 5 years;
4. I am not suffering from night sweats, unintentional weight loss or persistent fever, diarrhoea or swollen glands;
5. I have not received a blood transfusion or treatment with human blood products within the past 5 years;

".

## Restriction on Causing Nuisances:

2. No person shall carry on any activity, conduct any business or engage in any undertaking on any land or premises in such a manner as to permit the escape therefrom of smoke, dust, sawdust, fumes, water or liquid wastes in such a quantity or extent or in such a manner as to create or be a nuisance to any inhabitant in the neighbourhood of such land or premises, or to traffic or persons using roads in the vicinity.

3. No person shall cause or permit the emission of light or vibrations from premises to such an extent or in such manner as to create or be a nuisance to any inhabitant in the neighbourhood of such premises or to traffic or persons using roads in the vicinity.

4. No person shall stack or permit the accumulation of or burn on any land or premises any sawdust in such a place or in such manner that it, or the smoke therefrom, shall be or become a nuisance to any inhabitants in the neighbourhood of such land or premises, or to traffic or persons using roads in the vicinity.

## Offensive or Dangerous Things:

5. If any person keeps a thing whether an animal or bird or any other thing whether animate or inanimate which in the opinion of the Council is offensive or dangerous the Council may give to such person notice in writing requiring him to remove from the District or destroy such offensive or dangerous thing.

6. A person who fails to comply with the requirements of a notice given to him pursuant to the preceding by-law commits an offence.

## Pollution of Water:

7. No person shall pollute, obstruct, injure or damage any water course, water channel, well, dam, tank, reservoir or other waters without the written authority of the Council.

## Offensive Noises or Odours for Advertisement Purposes:

8. No person shall, for advertisement purposes, in a street, way, footpath or other public place or on private property—

- (a) make any noise; or
- (b) cause an obnoxious odour

which by reason of its nature, intensity or persistence causes a nuisance, annoyance or distress to any person or is offensive to any person.

## Disused Motor Vehicles and Machinery:

9. No person shall dispose of a disused motor vehicle, an old motor vehicle body, or any old machinery within the District except at a place set aside or approved of by the Council for that purpose.

## Penalties:

10. Any person who commits an offence against these by-laws shall be liable, on conviction, to—

- (a) a maximum penalty of \$500; and
- (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$50 per day.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River hereby records having resolved on 1 March 1984, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law amendments:—

The by-laws of the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River Relating to Signs and Bill Posting published in the *Government Gazette* on 7 October 1983 and 28 October 1983 are hereby amended in the following manner:—

- (a) By-law 2: In line 2, insert the words, "so as to be visible from a street, reserve or other public place" between the words "of those premises" and "except".
- (b) By-law 8 (h): Delete the numerals "30" in line two and substitute the numerals "300".
- (c) By-law 26: Add new sub-by-law (f):  
" not be erected for a period exceeding six (6) months without the approval of Council. "
- (d) By-laws 27 and 28: Delete both by-laws entirely and substitute the following:  
" External Wall Signs.

27. (1) A sign painted or affixed on an external wall or fascia shall conform to the following:

- (a) A horizontal sign on the front elevation of a building shall:
- (i) afford a minimum headway of 2.4 metres if projecting greater than 50 mm from the wall to which it is attached;
  - (ii) have a maximum height of 1.2 metres and not be within 600 mm of either end of the wall;
- (b) A vertical sign on the front elevation of a building shall:
- (i) not exceed 900 mm in width;
  - (ii) be of a height at least twice its width but not exceeding 2.5 metres in height;

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-by-law (1) of this by-law the Council may permit an increase of not more than 50% of the heights mentioned, in any part or parts of the sign to permit the inclusion of a motif or capital letter. "

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960.

## The Municipality of the Shire of Plantagenet.

By-laws relating to the Control and Storage of Old and Disused Vehicles and Machinery and Depositing and Removal of Refuse, Rubbish and Disused Materials.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovenamed municipality hereby records having resolved on 13 September 1984, to revoke the adoption of the by-law relating to the Control and Storage of Old and Disused Motor Vehicles and Machinery, as published in the *Government Gazette* on 28 February 1975, and to make and submit for the confirmation of the Governor, the following by-laws:

1. These by-laws shall apply to and be in force within the Municipality of the Shire of Plantagenet.

2. In these by-laws unless the context requires otherwise—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Plantagenet.

“District” means the municipality of the Shire of Plantagenet.

“Old or disused vehicles and machinery” means any old or disused motor vehicle, any old or disused motor vehicle body, any old or disused machinery and any old or disused part of a motor vehicle, motor vehicle body or machinery.

“Person” means any person or body corporate or group of persons.

3. No person shall—

(a) store or cause to be stored or permit to be stored any old or disused vehicles or machinery, or

(b) dismantle or break-up, cause to dismantle or break-up or permit the dismantle or break-up of any old or disused vehicles and machinery, unless:—

(i) inside a building or

(ii) within an area enclosed by a fence or wall not less than two metres in height and of such a nature as to screen all old or disused vehicles and machinery from the street and from adjoining properties.

4. Where any person has stored or caused to be stored or permitted to be stored any old or disused vehicle and machinery and in the opinion of the Council, it is causing an unsightly condition that person shall be given written notice requiring the abatement of the unsightly condition.

5. Where any person fails to comply with a notice issued in accordance with By-law 4, he commits an offence.

6. If there is—

(a) on any vacant land within the district any trees, scrub, undergrowth or rubbish; or

(b) on any land within the district any refuse, rubbish or disused materials, whether of the same kind or a different kind from that here specified,

which in the opinion of the Council is likely to affect adversely the value of adjoining property or the health, comfort or convenience of the inhabitants thereof, the Council may cause a notice under the hand of the Shire Clerk to be served on the owner or occupier of such land requiring him, within the time specified in such notice to clear land of such trees, scrub, undergrowth, or remove such refuse, rubbish or disused material from such land.

7. Every owner or occupier of land upon whom a notice is served under By-law 6 of these by-laws, shall comply with such notice within the time therein specified and any owner or occupier of land who fails to comply with the terms of the notice so served commits an offence.

8. Where the owner or occupier does not clear the land of such trees, scrub, undergrowth, or remove the refuse, rubbish or disused material as required by the notice given by the Council the Council is authorised without payment of any compensation in respect thereof to remove it and dispose of it at the expense of, and recover in a Court of competent jurisdiction the amount of the expense from, the owner or occupier to whom the notice was given.

9. Any person contravening the provisions of these by-laws is liable to a maximum penalty of \$500 and in addition a maximum daily penalty of \$20 for each day during which the offence continues.
