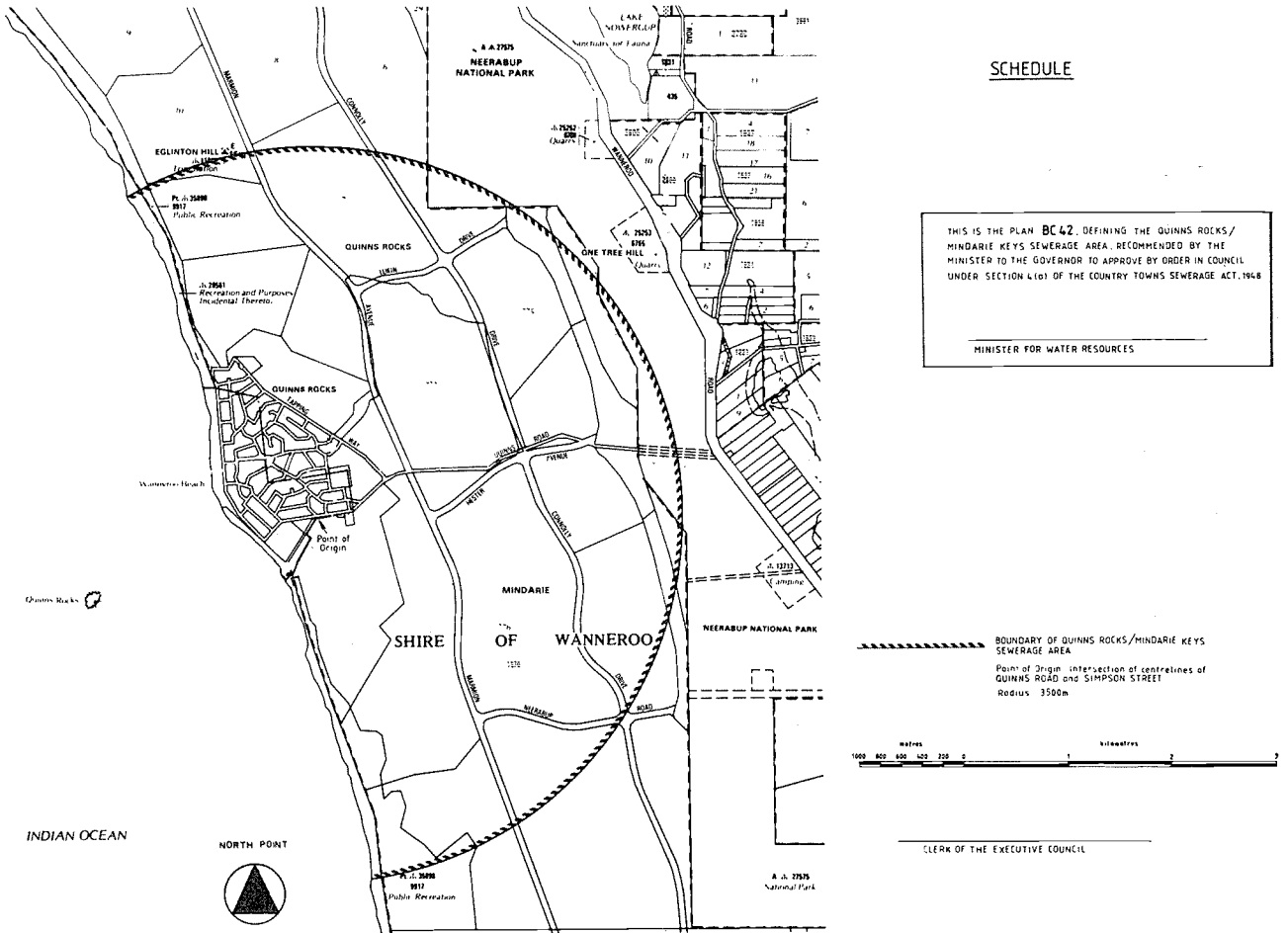

COMPANIES (APPLICATION OF LAWS) ACT 1981

COMPANIES (APPLICATION OF LAWS) (No. 2) REGULATIONS 1987

WHEREAS it is provided by section 15 of the *Companies (Application of Laws) Act 1981* that where, under the Agreement made on 22 December 1978 between the Commonwealth and the States, the Ministerial Council approves proposed regulations to be made under that Act for certain purposes, the Governor may make those regulations; the following regulations in accordance with that section are made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Companies (Application of Laws) (No. 2) Regulations 1987*.

Commencement

2. These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which Part 2 of the *Insurance and Superannuation Commission (Consequential Provisions) Act 1987* of the Commonwealth comes into operation.

Definition

3. In these regulations, "the Act" means the *Companies (Application of Laws) Act 1981*.

Amendment of Schedule 1 to the Act

4. Schedule 1 to the Act is amended by inserting after clause 58 the following—

" 58A. In section 363 (1) (h) of the Commonwealth Act, after the passage "Act 1987" there were inserted the words "of the Commonwealth". "

5. Schedule 2 to the Act is amended by inserting after clause 26 the following—

" 26A. In Companies Form 113 in Schedule 2, in note (2), after the passage "Act 1985" there were inserted the words "of the Commonwealth". "

" (d) to drive an omnibus out from a bus embayment- for sufficient time to permit the driver of an approaching vehicle, with which there would be a danger of collision if the omnibus were to be driven out from the bus embayment, to give way. "; and

MEDICAL ACT 1894

In the matter of the Medical Act 1894 and amendments and in the matter of Fook Kong Wong, Medical Practitioner, of 8/5 Rangeway Shopping Centre, corner Mullewa Road and Rifle Range Road, Geraldton, Western Australia.

THE Medical Board of Western Australia having held an inquiry into an allegation pursuant to section 13 (1) (d) of the Medical Act as amended on 23, 24, 26 and 27 November and 9 December 1987, in accordance with the Act and having heard and considered the evidence produced for the inquiry, duly found as follows:

- (1) That it was proved to the satisfaction of the Board that Dr Fook Kong Wong was guilty of incom-

petency as a medical practitioner in the State of Western Australia, and

- (2) That Dr Fook Kong Wong be suspended from the Register for a period of six (6) months commencing 9 December 1987. The Board also indicated that at the expiration of that period of time, consideration shall be given by the Board to the imposition of conditions which the Board think necessary to impose in the public interest.

WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT 1950
(AS AMENDED)

W429/63, W49/48.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by section 14 of the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950, I hereby declare an Open Season in respect of fauna of those species of wild duck described in the Schedule hereto, in all those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the South-West and Eucla Land Divisions as defined in section 28 of the Land Act 1933, for the period from Friday 1 January 1988 until Saturday 31 December 1988 subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) That the species of wild duck described in the Schedule hereto may not be taken except by landholders and lease-holders (or their nominated agents) on land which they own or occupy and is used for primary production which lies within the boundaries of the South-West and Eucla Land Divisions as defined in section 28 of the Land Act 1933, and on which the fauna mentioned are the cause of damage to primary production and water storage.
- (2) That a person shall not take or attempt to take that species of wild duck described in the Schedule hereto by any means other than a firearm licensed in accordance with the provisions of the Firearms Act 1973.
- (3) That a person shall not take for the purpose of keeping in captivity or for the purpose of aviculture or for commercial purposes, that species of wild duck described in the Schedule hereto.
- (4) That a person shall not receive or dispose of for commercial purposes that species of wild duck described in the Schedule hereto.
- (5) That a person shall not possess or transport that species of wild duck described in the Schedule hereto, unless at least one fully feathered wing is attached to the bird, and that the wing and plumage may be removed from the duck:
 - (a) when the duck is prepared for immediate cooking; and
 - (b) after the duck is taken to the residence of its owner for preservation.
- (6) A Wildlife Officer may, if after inspection of the property he considers it necessary, prohibit the taking of that species of wild duck described in the Schedule hereto on that property, until the landholder obtains a Damage Licence in accordance with the Wildlife Conservation Regulations and thereupon no persons shall take those wild ducks on that property except under authority of a licence.

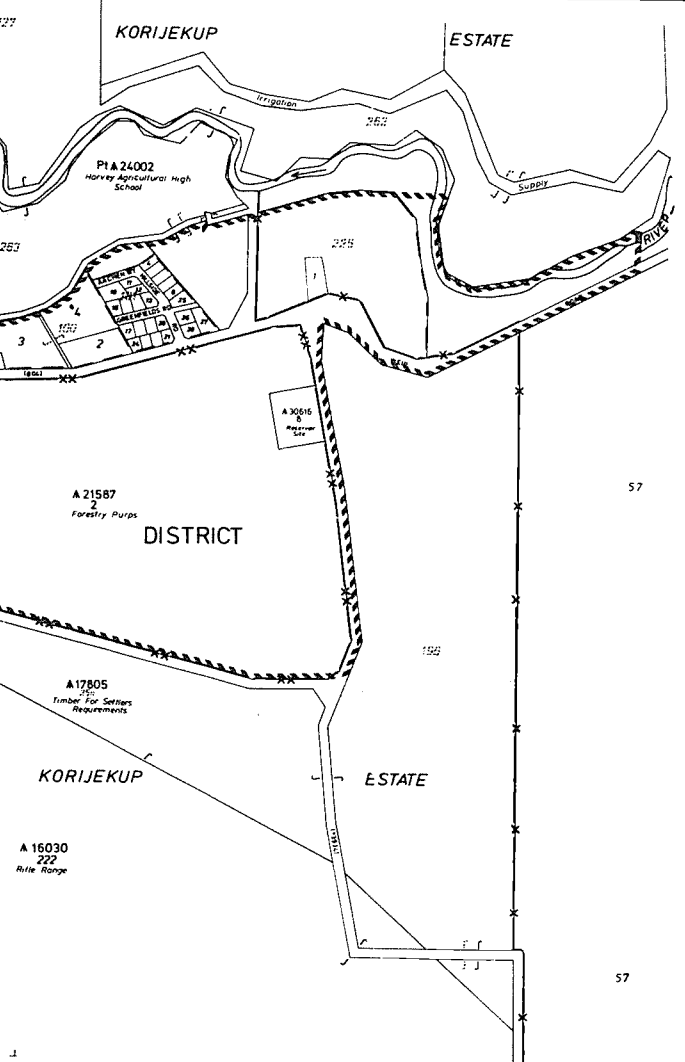

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

Notice to all owners/occupiers of land within the City of Subiaco

Firebreak or Removal of Flammable Materials
Order 1987-1988

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, owners and/or occupiers of property within the City of Subiaco are hereby required on or before 30 November 1987, and thereafter to 31 March 1988, or within 14 days of the date of becoming owner or occupier, should this be after 30 November 1987, to maintain a firebreak or remove flammable material as follows—

- (a) Where the land is 2 024 square metres (approximately one half acre) or less, remove all flammable material from the whole of the land. (For the purposes of this notice, flammable material does not include low standing trees, cultivated plants or shrubs in gardens.)
- (b) Where the land exceeds 2 024 square metres (approximately one half acre) you should have a firebreak not less than three metres wide and clear of all external boundaries of the land and immediately surrounding all buildings and improvements on the land.

If it is considered impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks, or remove flammable material as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised Officer not later than 15 November 1987, for permission to provide a firebreak in alternative positions, or to take alternative measures to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is an infringement penalty of \$40 or a fine of not more than \$400 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner/occupier by the date required by this notice.

FACTORIES AND SHOPS (HOLIDAY RESORTS) EXEMPTION ORDER (No. 1) 1987

MADE by the Minister for Labour, Productivity and Employment.

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the *Factories and Shops (Holiday Resorts) Exemption Order (No. 1) 1987*.

Commencement

2. This Order shall come into operation on 1 January 1988.

Interpretation

3. In this Order—

“Public Holiday” means a public holiday under section 5, section 7 or section 8 of the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1972 but does not include Anzac Day, Christmas Day or Good Friday;

“school term” means a school term determined by the Minister charged with the administration of the Education Act 1928 under that Act.

Exemption Periods

4. It is hereby directed pursuant to section 92A of the Act that in any year during the period commencing on the first-mentioned day in each of the following paragraphs and ending at the close of business on the second-mentioned day in each of those paragraphs, namely—

- (a) 1 January to the second Sunday in February;
- (b) the Saturday preceding Labour Day to the following Monday;
- (c) the Saturday following the end of the first school term to the Sunday preceding the second school term;
- (d) where Anzac Day falls on a Friday—the Saturday following that day to the following Sunday;
 - (i) where Anzac Day falls on a Saturday—the Sunday following that day to the following Monday;
 - (ii) where Anzac Day falls on a Sunday—the Saturday preceding that day and the Monday following that day;
- (e) where Anzac Day falls on a Monday—the Saturday preceding that Monday to the following Sunday;
- (f) the Saturday following Good Friday to Easter Monday;
- (g) the Saturday preceding Foundation Day to Foundation Day;
- (h) the Saturday following the end of the second school term to the Sunday preceding the third school term;
- (i) the Saturday following the end of the third school term to the Sunday preceding the fourth school term;
- (j) the Saturday preceding the Queens Birthday public holiday to the Queens Birthday public holiday;
- (k) the first Monday in December to Christmas Eve;
- (l) Boxing Day to the last day of December,

the shops in the areas or localities specified in Column 1 of the Schedule are exempted from Part IX of Division II excluding Section 92 of the Factories and Shops Act 1963 on the days specified in that schedule subject to the conditions as to hours of closing specified opposite and corresponding to those areas or localities in Column 2 of the Schedule.

INDUSTRIAL TRAINING (APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING) AMENDMENT
REGULATIONS 1987

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Industrial Training (Apprenticeship Training) Amendment Regulations 1987*.

Commencement

2. These regulations shall come into operation on 1 January 1988.

Principal regulations

3. In these regulations the *Industrial Training (Apprenticeship Training) Regulations 1981** are referred to as the principal regulations.

Regulation 4 amended

4. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the definitions of "Schedule" and "trade" and substituting the following definitions—

- " "stage" in relation to a course of training applicable to a trade means an approved stage of that course;
- "trade" means a trade that is an apprenticeship trade for the purposes of the Act, listed in Schedule 1. "

Regulation 6 repealed and a regulation substituted

5. Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—

Term of apprenticeship

" 6. (1) The term of an apprenticeship in a trade listed in Schedule 1 is the term specified in that schedule opposite the trade unless it is provided otherwise under these regulations or the *Industrial Training (General Apprenticeship) Regulations 1981*.

(2) Where an apprentice commences an apprenticeship for a trade during or after 1988 and the term of the apprenticeship is shown in Schedule 1 as 4 or 5 years, the term shall be only 3 years if the apprentice has successfully completed an approved pre-apprenticeship course consisting of—

- (a) 2 or more stages of the course of training for the apprentice's trade; or
- (b) less than 2 stages of the course of training for the apprentice's trade and the apprentice and his or her employer and, if applicable, parent or guardian agree to a 3 year term.

(3) The Director may reduce the term of an apprenticeship for a trade on the application of the apprentice in a form approved by the Director if—

- (a) the apprentice has completed 3 years of the apprenticeship;
- (b) the apprentice has, during or after 1987, successfully completed an approved pre-apprenticeship course consisting of less than 2 stages of the course of training for the trade; and
- (c) in the opinion of the Director, the apprentice is competent in the trade. "
