FAMILY COURT ACT 1975

FAMILY COURT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA REGULATIONS 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Part I—Preliminary

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Family Court of Western Australia Regulations 1988*.

Commencement

2. These regulations shall come into operation on the day fixed for the coming into operation of the *Family Court Amendment Act 1987*.

Interpretation

3. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—

“court of summary jurisdiction” means a court of summary jurisdiction referred to in section 75 of the Act;

“Court” means the Family Court of Western Australia created by the *Family Court Act 1975* and a court of summary jurisdiction.

Metropolitan region

4. For the purposes of the Act the metropolitan region is that part of the State that comprised the metropolitan region on 5 January 1976 under the *Town Planning and Development Act 1928*.

Part II—General

Central Registry

5. (1) The Central Registry of the Family Court shall be at Perth.

(2) There may be such registries of the Court outside the metropolitan region as are from time to time specified in these regulations.

Fees of Marshal

6. The fees payable to the Marshal shall be in accordance with Part III of the Fifth Schedule to the *Supreme Court Rules 1971*.

Recording of Proceedings

7. (1) Wherever practicable all proceedings in the Court shall be fully recorded.

(2) A record of proceedings need be transcribed only where a Judge, Magistrate or the Registrar so orders.

(3) Where a record of proceedings is transcribed on the order of a Judge, Magistrate or the Registrar, a party to proceedings is entitled to have one copy of the transcript of the proceedings.

Registration of decree

8. (1) A decree may be registered in any Court exercising jurisdiction under the Act.
- (2) In this rule "decree" has the same meaning as in section 81 of the Act.

Part III—Accounting and Enforcement**Collector of Maintenance**

9. The Collector of Maintenance or the clerk of a court of summary jurisdiction—
 - (a) shall receive moneys payable to him or to a Court and disburse those moneys to the person named in the order or registered agreement;
 - (b) shall keep proper accounts as to payments due under an order or registered agreement, and payments made under an order or registered agreement; and
 - (c) subject to regulation 13 may enforce an order or registered agreement at the request of a person entitled to receive moneys under that order or registered agreement.

Accounting

10. (1) A ledger shall be maintained at the Central Registry and by the clerk of every court of summary jurisdiction.

(2) Where moneys are paid to an officer of a Court pursuant to an order or registered agreement made by it or registered in it, the officer shall disburse those moneys to the person named in the order or registered agreement as being entitled to receive payment in accordance with the terms of the order or registered agreement or to the attorney of that person.

(3) Subject to any express directions given by the person making the payment, money paid pursuant to a provision of an order or registered agreement is deemed to be a payment made to the person entitled to receive it in satisfaction to the extent of the payment firstly of any fees payable in respect of the enforcement and secondly to amounts due and unpaid under the provision (an amount due at an earlier date being satisfied before an amount due at a later date).

(4) Where a person making the payment does so before the date on which the moneys are due and payable the Collector or clerk of the court to which payment has been made may disburse them before that date if the person gives an authority in writing to that effect and an indemnity in writing in respect of the early payment.

(5) Where a person who is obliged to make payments under 2 or more provisions of an order or registered agreement or under provisions of 2 or more orders or registered agreements pays an amount that is less than the aggregate amount payable under those provisions, without giving any directions as to the appropriation of the moneys so paid, the Collector or the clerk of the court to which the payment has been made may, subject to subregulation (4), appropriate the moneys so paid for or towards the satisfaction of the amounts payable, in such manner as he thinks proper.

Notice of election

11. (1) Subject to regulation 12 (1) a person who is entitled to enforce one or more of the provisions of a maintenance order or registered agreement may elect not to enforce a specified provision.

(2) An election under subregulation (1) shall be made by notice in writing to the Collector or clerk of the court in which the maintenance order or registered agreement is enforceable.

(3) The Collector or clerk referred to in subregulation (2) shall cause notice of the election to be given to the person or persons liable to make payments under the maintenance order or registered agreement and the provision specified in the notice shall not be enforced subject to regulation 12 (3) without leave of the Court or relevant court of summary jurisdiction.

(4) A notice of election given under this regulation shall not affect the enforcement of any other provision of the maintenance order or registered agreement.

Notice of withdrawal of election

12. (1) A notice of election referred to in regulation 11 may be withdrawn at any time by the person entitled to enforce the maintenance order or registered agreement.

(2) The withdrawal of a notice of election shall be made by notice in writing to the Collector or clerk of the court referred to in regulation 11 (2).

(3) The Collector or clerk referred to in subregulation (2) shall cause notice of withdrawal of the notice of election to be given to the person or persons referred to in regulation 11 (3) and the provision specified in the notice of election shall be enforceable, from the day of the notice of withdrawal without leave of the Court or relevant court of summary jurisdiction.

Duties of Collector or clerk as to enforcement

13. On application by or on behalf of any person entitled to enforce a maintenance order or registered agreement to the Collector or to the clerk of the court in which the order or registered agreement is enforceable the Collector or that clerk may take all or any steps necessary or expedient to enforce the order or registered agreement but the person making the application shall have the same liability for all costs properly incurred in or about the enforcement proceedings as if they had been taken by that person and the Collector or the clerk may refuse to act on the application where it appears to him unreasonable to do so.

Part IV—Repeal and Savings**Repeal**

14. The *Family Court of Western Australia Regulations 1976** are repealed.

(2) Subject to subregulations (4) and (5), an obligation incurred or undertaking given under the repealed regulations before the commencement of these regulations if of a kind to which these regulations or the rules apply shall be treated as if incurred or given under these regulations or the rules as the case requires.

(3) Subject to subregulations (4) and (5), where a person has, before the commencement of these regulations, omitted to do any act or thing in accordance with the repealed regulations and the act or thing is one to which these regulations apply, the act or thing shall be treated as if omitted to be done under these regulations unless subsequently done in accordance with these regulations.

(4) These regulations do not operate to revive any period of time for the doing of any act or thing, being a period of time which, under the repealed regulations had expired before the commencement of these regulations.

(5) A period of time that commenced under the repealed regulations but had not expired before the commencement of these regulations shall, if the matter in respect of which that period has commenced is a matter to which these regulations apply, continue as if these regulations had not come into operation.

(6) In this regulation—

“repealed regulations” means the *Family Court of Western Australia Regulations 1976* repealed by regulation 13;

“rules” means the *Family Court of Western Australia Rules 1987*.

FAMILY COURT ACT 1975

FAMILY COURT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA RULES 1988

MADE by the Judges under section 88A.

Part I—Preliminary

Citation

1. These rules may be cited as the *Family Court of Western Australia Rules 1988*.

Commencement

2. These rules shall come into operation on the day fixed for the coming into operation of the *Family Court Amendment Act 1987*.

Interpretation

3. In these rules, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Central Registry” means the Central Registry of the Court;

“court of summary jurisdiction” means a court of summary jurisdiction referred to in section 75 of the Act;

“decree” has the same meaning as in section 81 of the Act;

“Family Law Rules” means the Family Law Rules made under the Family Law Act;

“the Act” means the *Family Court Act 1975*.

Part II—Family Court of Western Australia

Seal

4. (1) The Court shall have a seal which shall contain the words “The Seal of the Family Court of Western Australia”.

(2) The seal may be impressed on any document by a rubber stamp or similar process.

Sitting vacations and holidays

5. (1) The Court shall sit at such places and times as the Chief Judge directs.

(2) There shall be no Court vacations but the Court shall not sit on the days specified in subrule (3) unless the Judge constituting the Court otherwise directs.

(3) Subject to subrule (4) the Central Registry shall be open on every day in the year except Saturdays and Sundays, Good Friday, Monday and Tuesday in Easter week, Christmas Day and the next following working day and all Public Service holidays.

(4) Unless the Chief Judge or Registrar otherwise directs the Central Registry shall be open from 9.00 am to 3.30 pm.

Oaths and affirmations

6. (1) The Court may require and administer all necessary oaths and affirmations.

(2) The form of an oath or affirmation shall be the same as nearly as may be as that used in the Supreme Court.

Decrees to be recorded

7. Every decree of the Court shall be recorded by the proper officer of the Court in a record kept for that purpose.

Register of proceedings

8. The Registrar shall keep a register for the Court and shall cause to be entered in the register particulars of all applications lodged in the Court.

Part III—Non-Federal Jurisdiction

Adoption of Commonwealth practice and procedure

9. (1) The practice and procedure of the Court and courts of summary jurisdiction relating to matters in their non-federal jurisdiction, except those conferred on the Court by the *Adoption of Children Act 1896*, shall be the same, as nearly as may be, as the practice and procedure provided in the Family Law Rules relating to like matters, unless a contrary intention appears in a written law.

(2) In this rule practice and procedure includes all matters with respect to which rules may be made under the Act.

Costs where the Court has no jurisdiction

10. Where a matter is brought in the Court or in a court of summary jurisdiction over which the Court has no jurisdiction, the Judge or Magistrate shall order the matter to be struck out, and the Court or court of summary jurisdiction has power to award costs to the same extent, and recoverable in the same manner, as if the Court had jurisdiction therein and the person bringing the matter had not appeared in the Court or the court of summary jurisdiction or had so appeared and failed to establish his case.

Persons who may take affidavits

11. An affidavit required for use in or before the Court or any officer of the Court, or in a court of summary jurisdiction, and a recognizance required to be filed therein, may be sworn or executed before a Judge, a Registrar, a Deputy Registrar, the Marshal, the Collector of Maintenance, a Magistrate, a Justice of the Peace or any other person allowed by any written law or the Family Law Rules to take an affidavit or recognizance.

Part IV—Appeals

Notice of Appeal

12. (1) An appeal under section 81 (2) of the Act to the Court from a court of summary jurisdiction shall be instituted by filing a notice of appeal.

(2) A notice of appeal referred to in subrule (1) shall be—

(a) in the form of the form of notice of appeal prescribed by the Family Law Rules in relation to appeals from courts of summary jurisdiction under section 96 of the Family Law Act; and

(b) filed in the Court within 28 days after the making of the decree in relation to which the appeal is made or such further time as the Court may allow.

(3) A copy of the notice of appeal shall, in accordance with the provisions of the Family Law Rules relating to service of notices of appeal from courts of summary jurisdiction under section 96 of the Family Law Act, be served on—

(a) all parties to the proceedings; and

(b) the clerk of the court appealed from,

within 14 days after the filing of the notice of appeal.

(4) Where notice of appeal under section 81 (2) of the Act to the Court from a court of summary jurisdiction has been filed in accordance with subrule (1), the Magistrate who made the decree or a Judge may make an order staying the execution or operation of the decree pending the determination of the appeal and where such an order has been made, a court having jurisdiction under the Act shall not, pending the determination of the appeal, enforce the decree or entertain proceedings for the enforcement of the decree.

Savings

13. (1) Subject to subrules (4) and (5), proceedings pending or orders or directions made, appointments made or authorizations given, documents filed or served, or any other act or thing done, before the commencement of these rules, in accordance with the repealed regulations, shall, if of a kind to which these rules or the regulations apply, be treated as if pending, made, given, filed, served, or done, as the case requires, in accordance with these rules or the regulations, as the case requires.

(2) Subject to subrules (4) and (5), an obligation incurred or undertaking given under the repealed regulations before the commencement of these rules if of a kind to which these rules or the regulations apply shall be treated as if incurred or given under these rules or the regulations as the case requires.

(3) Subject to subrules (4) and (5), where a person has, before the commencement of these rules, omitted to do any act or thing in accordance with the repealed regulations and the act or thing is one to which these rules apply, the act or thing shall be treated as if omitted to be done under these rules unless subsequently done in accordance with these rules.

(4) These rules do not operate to revive any period of time for the doing of any act or thing, being a period of time which, under the repealed regulations, had expired before the commencement of these rules.

(5) A period of time that commenced under the repealed regulations but had not expired before the commencement of these rules shall, if the matter in respect of which that period has commenced is a matter to which these rules apply, continue as if these rules had not come into operation.

(6) In this rule—

“regulations” means the *Family Court of Western Australia Regulations 1988*;

“repealed regulations” means the *Family Court of Western Australia Regulations 1976* repealed by regulation 13 of the *Family Court of Western Australia Regulations 1988*.

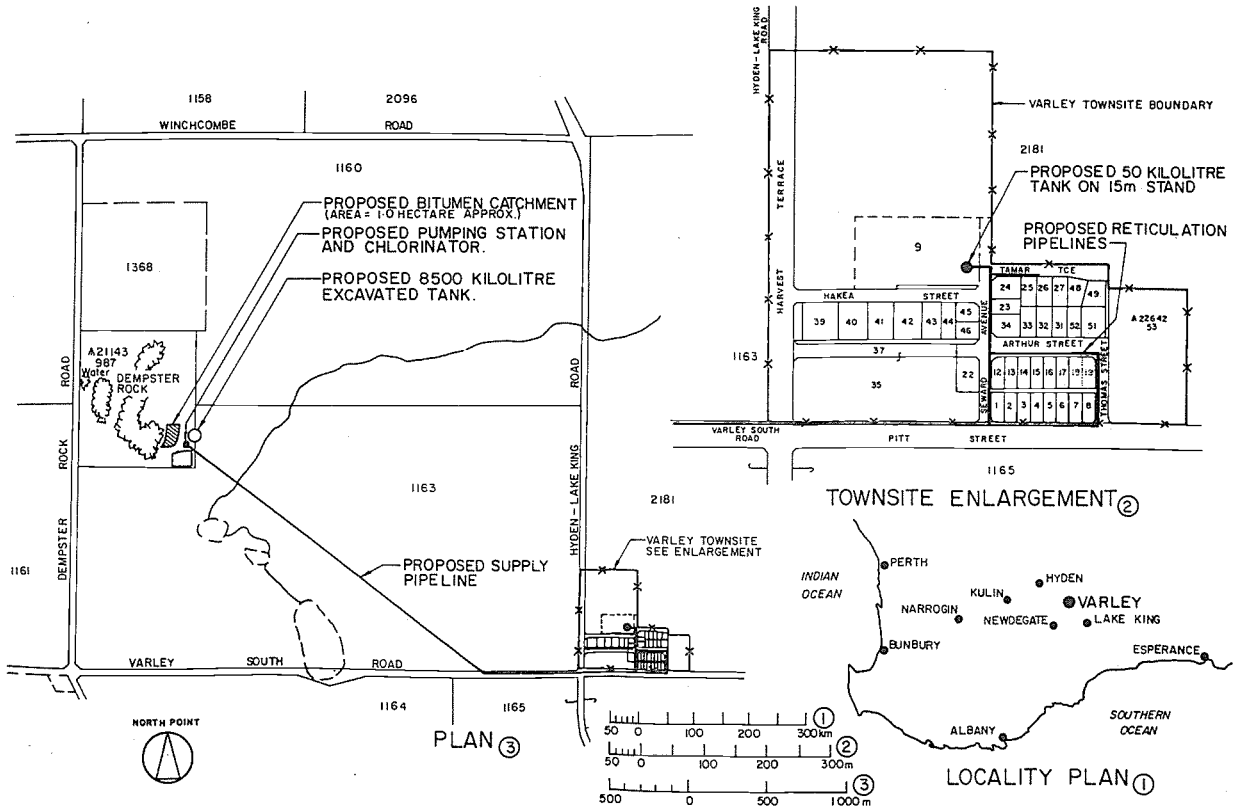

Quarantine area

4. (1) The land specified in the Schedule to this notice is declared to constitute a property quarantine area.

(2) Land in the property quarantine area constituted by this notice is quarantined land for the purposes of the regulations by reason of the presence of the declared plant Noogoora burr (*Xanthium occidentale*, *Xanthium cavanillesii*, *Xanthium italicum*, *Xanthium orientale*).

Removal from quarantined land

5. (1) Where land is, pursuant to this notice, quarantined land, any—

- (a) animal;
- (b) animal hide, skin, coat or fibre;
- (c) animal excrement;
- (d) soil;
- (e) hay, chaff, fodder or grain made or produced from any crop grown on the quarantined land; or
- (f) vehicle or machine that has been used for agricultural excavation, or earth moving purposes on the quarantined land,

that is on the quarantined land shall not be moved from the quarantined land except pursuant to an approval given under regulation 7 of the regulations or a general exemption having effect under regulation 9 of the regulations.

Amendment to Statute No. 15—Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts
