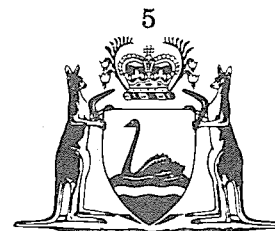

## SUSPENSION OF SECTION 25

Bush Fires Board,  
Perth.

Correspondence No. 62.

It is hereby notified that the Hon. Minister administering the Bush Fires Act 1954, has approved pursuant to the powers contained in Section 25 of the said Act, the suspension of the operation of section 25B that relates to a fire to be lit, or which is lit, for the purpose of destroying garden refuse or rubbish or any like purpose during the declared Prohibited and Restricted Burning Times on land set aside for the purpose in the Municipal District of the Shire of Broomehill. This notice shall have effect until revoked and is issued subject to the following conditions:—

## Specified Conditions

Broomehill Rubbish Disposal Site situated on Reserve 10285 on Norrish Road, Broomehill.

1. All burning of rubbish to be confined to the constructed trench area.
2. That the wire retaining fence be maintained in a sound condition.
3. A sign be erected and maintained at the entrance of the site warning of prohibition of unauthorised lighting of fires and to inform the public that dumping in any other place is prohibited.
4. That all grass and bush of an inflammable nature save standing live trees on the site be burnt or removed on a radius of 50 metres of the trench mentioned in (1) above before the first fire is lit.
5. That burning on the site be carried out on Thursday of any week, between the hours of 1000 and 1700 hrs.
6. That burning be under the control of the Shire Rubbish Collector, or such persons as authorised to do so by the Shire Clerk.
7. The site to be checked for fire safety by 1700 hrs on each day when burning has been carried out by such persons authorised to do so by the Shire Clerk.
8. No fire to be lit on land subject to the suspension on a day for which the fire danger forecast as issued by the Bureau of Meteorology in Perth in respect to the locality is "Very High" or "Extreme".

## RETAIL TRADING HOURS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No.3) 1990

## Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Retail Trading Hours Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 1990*.

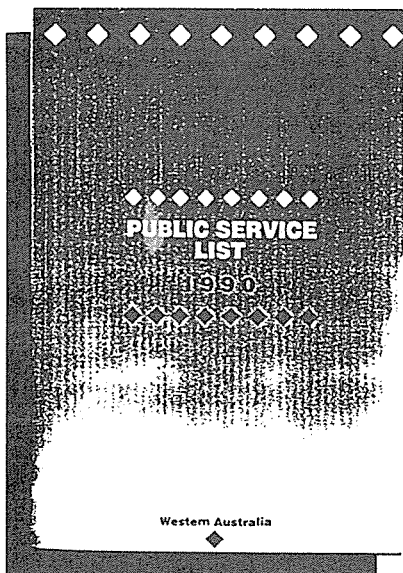
