WESTERN AUSTRALIA FRANCIS BURT, Governor. [L.S.] By His Excellency the Honourable Sir Francis Theodore Page Burt, Companion of the Order of Australia, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Queen's Counsel, Governor of the State of Western Australia.

DOLA File 560/980.

Under section 243 of the Transfer of Land Act 1893, I, the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby revest in Her Majesty as of her former estate, the land comprising Esperance Lots 812 and 820 being the whole of the land in Certificate of Titles Volumes 1605 and 1652 Folios 730 and 932 respectively (now comprising Lot 894 and Lots 893 and 895 on Diagram 89759).

ABORIGINAL COMMUNITIES ACT 1979 MUGARINYA COMMUNITY ASSOCIATED INCORPORATED COMMUNITY BY-LAWS

(YANDEEARRA)

Part 1-Preliminary.

Citation

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Mugarinya Community Association Incorporated By-laws.

Commencement

2. These by-laws shall come into effect when approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette.

Definitions

3. In these by-laws unless the context requires otherwise "by-law" means one of these by-laws—

"the Act" means the Aboriginal Communities Act 1979.

"The Community" means (as the context requires) Mugarinya Community Associated Incorporated (Yandeearra) and that collective group comprising the membership of Mugarinya Community Associated Incorporated (Yandeearra), their spouses and dependants (where not members in their own right) and "members of the community" has a correlative meaning.

"Liquor" means liquor as defined in the Liquor Licensing Act 1988.

"Deleterious Substance" means glue or any volatile liquid containing hydrocarbons.

"Vehicle" means any motor vehicle, designed and manufactured to be capable of self propulsion and includes any trailer or caravan while attached to a vehicle.

"The Council" means the Council of Mugarinya Community Association Incorporated (Yandeearra).

These by-laws shall apply-

- (a) on all community land, and
- (b) to all persons on community land, whether members of the community or not.

Part 2—Community Lands.

Permission required to enter community land

- 4. Save as otherwise provided by any law of the State or Commonwealth.
 - (a) No person who is not recognised by the Council to be Aboriginal, may enter or remain on Community land without prior permission of the Council.
 - (b) Such permission may be given either orally or in writing and may be subject to such terms or conditions as the Council sees fit.
 - (c) The Council may revoke such permission at any time and without the necessity of stating any reason for the action.
 - (d) The Council may order any person whatsoever (other than a member of the Community) to leave community land and to remain off community land for such a time as the Council may direct.
 - (e) Employees of Government Departments of the State or Commonwealth entering or being on community lands in connection with their duties shall be deemed to have permission under By-law 4 (a).
 - (f) The Council may act through any of its members to make or to revoke any of the permission or directions referred to in this by-law.

Remain on community lands

- 5. (a) A person who requires permission under these by-laws shall not enter or remain on community land without permission.
- (b) A person who has permission under these by-laws to enter or remain on community land shall not contravene any term or condition of that permission to be or remain on community land.
- (c) Any person ordered by the Council to leave community land shall do so as is reasonably possible.

Restriction of entry into areas

- 6. Subject to the provisions of any Act or regulation to the contrary-
 - (a) The Council may place signs on community land for the purpose of prohibiting entry to the part of land on which the sign is placed or to such part of the community land as indicated by the inscription of the sign.
 - (b) Any person who fails to obey directions of the inscription on such a sign commits a breach of these by-laws.

Homes

7. Any person who is told (by the principal occupant or by the person then in charge thereof) to leave the house of another and who refuses to leave as directed commits a breach of these by-laws.

Part 3-Liquor and Deleterious Substances.

Restriction of Liquor

- 8. The Council may, in its discretion and subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as it sees fit,
 - (a) Permit any person to bring, possess, use or supply liquor on community lands.
 - (b) No person shall, without the permission of the Council, bring, possess, use or supply liquor on community lands.
 - (c) No person shall enter onto or remain on community land whilst under the influence of liquor to the extent that his behaviour causes alarm, annoyance or upset to members of the community.

Pharmaceutical

9. Pharmaceutical preparations and substances properly used in the ordinary course of medical practice shall exempt from the operation of this by-law whilst in the possession or control of a medical professional or where properly prescribed and issued to a patient by a medical professional.

Deleterious substance or petrol

- 10. (a) A person shall not be in possession of a deleterious substance or petrol on community land for the purpose of inhalation.
- (b) A person shall not sell or supply a deleterious substance or petrol to another person on community land if there are reasonable grounds for suspecting that the other person—
 - (i) intends to use the deleterious substance or petrol for the purpose of inhalation; or
 - (ii) intends to sell or supply the deleterious substance or petrol for the purpose of inhalation.

Part 4-Traffic.

Traffic signs

- 11. (a) The Council may place signs ('traffic signs') on community land for the purpose of regulating vehicle traffic.
- (b) Any person who fails to obey the directions of the inscription on a traffic sign commits a breach of these by-laws.

Careless and dangerous driving

- 12. (a) No person shall drive a vehicle on community land without due care and attention.
- (b) No person shall drive a vehicle on community land in a manner which, having regard to all of the circumstances, is dangerous to any person.
- (c) No person shall drive a vehicle owned by the Community or leased or hired to the Community—
 - (i) Without first having the permission of the Council or of a person placed by the Council in charge or control of the vehicle for the time being.
 - (ii) When under the influence of liquor or a deleterious substance.
 - (iii) Without being the holder of a current valid motor driver's licence of a class appropriate to the vehicle to be driven.

Part 5-The Regulation of Other Matters.

Offensive behaviour

13. No person shall cause a disturbance or annoyance to other persons by using abusive language, fighting or otherwise behaving in an offensive or disorderly manner.

Wilful damage

14. No person shall damage any tree, bush, lawn, building, structure, vehicle or other thing, whether the property of the Community or of any individual person.

Disruption of meetings

15. No person shall interrupt any meeting of the Council or of the Community, or any customary meeting, by noise or any offensive or disorderly behaviour.

Firearms, offensive weapons and dangerous materials

- 16. (a) No person shall use or discharge any firearm or other offensive weapon without approval of the Council which approval may be withdrawn by the Council at any time without having to give any reason therefore.
 - For the purpose of this section "offensive weapons" includes Crossbow and Bow and Arrow.

Part 6-Enforcement and Proceedings.

Powers of Police

- 17. A member of the Police Force may-
 - (a) Take proceedings against any person for a breach of these by-laws.
 - (b) Where any person has committed or is found committing an offence against these by-laws and it appears to the Police Officer on reasonable grounds to be likely that injury to persons or damage to property will be caused by that person if left at large; apprehend and remove that person from community land.
 - (c) Request the name and address of any person who he believes on reasonable grounds—
 - (i) to be on community land, in breach of any by-law, or
 - (ii) to have, while on community land, committed a breach of a by-law.

- (d) If he has reasonable cause to suspect that liquor or a deleterious substance is in any vehicle in contravention of these by-laws: stop, detain and search such vehicle and seize any liquor or deleterious substance and any receptacle containing liquor or a deleterious substance which he may find in or on the vehicle and may retain in his custody or control any property so seized until dealt with according to these by-laws.
- (e) If a liquor or a deleterious substance is found in a vehicle through the exercise of the power conferred by By-law 17, seize the vehicle, search and detain it for up to maximum period of fourteen days if such is considered necessary by the Police Officer, on reasonable grounds to prevent a repetition of the prescribed conduct.

Procedure

18. Subject to the *Child Welfare Act 1947*, proceedings for an offence against by-law shall be commenced by the way of complaint and summons under and in accordance with the *Justices Act 1902* and shall be commenced within six months after the offence was committed.

Part 7-Penalties and Orders of the Court.

Penalties

- 19. (a) Any person who breaches or fails to comply with any of these by-laws is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine or a term of imprisonment or both, but no fines so imposed shall exceed \$100 and no term of imprisonment so imposed shall exceed three months.
- (b) In addition to the penalties provided under paragraph (a) of this by-law, the Court may order any person convicted of an offence under these by-laws to pay compensation not greater than \$250 to the community or to any person, where, in the course of committing the offence, the person convicted has caused damage to property of the community or of that other person.
- (c) In any prosecution for an offence under these by-laws having as an element the possession or use of a prohibited substance a Court upon proceeding to conviction of the person charged may make such orders as it sees fit concerning the destruction, disposal or forfeiture of property seized pursuant to an exercise of the power contained in By-law 16 (d).

Defence of acting under custom

20. It is a defence to a complaint of an offence against these by-laws to show that the defendant was acting under and excused by an custom of the community.

Council members

- 21. (a) Council member who is charged with an offence against By-law 8 shall be deemed to have ceased to be effective Councillor.
- (b) In the event that such charge against the Council member is withdrawn or is dismissed after trial then, by that occurrence he shall be restored to his former position.

ABORIGINAL COMMUNITIES ACT 1979 JIGALONG COMMUNITY INCORPORATED COMMUNITY BY-LAWS

Part 1—Preliminary.

Citation

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Jigalong Community Incorporated By-laws.

Commencement

2. These by-laws shall come into effect when approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette.

Definitions

3. In these by-laws unless the context requires otherwise "by-law" means one of these by-laws—

"the Act" means the Aboriginal Communities Act 1979.

"The Community" means (as the context requires) Jigalong Community Incorporated and that collective group comprising the membership of Jigalong Community Incorporated, their spouses and dependants (where not members in their own right) and "members of the community" has a correlative meaning.

"Liquor" means liquor as defined in the Liquor Licensing Act 1988.

"Deleterious Substance" means glue or any volatile liquid containing hydrocarbons.

"Vehicle" means any motor vehicle, designed and manufactured to be capable of self propulsion and includes any trailer or caravan while attached to a vehicle.

"The Council" means the Council of Jigalong Community Incorporated.

These by-laws shall apply-

- (a) on all community land, and
- (b) to all persons on community land, whether members of the community or not.

 - (ii) intends to sell or supply the deleterious substance or petrol for the purpose of inhalation.

Part 4-Traffic.

Traffic signs

- 11. (a) The Council may place signs ('traffic signs') on community land for the purpose of regulating vehicle traffic.
- (b) Any person who fails to obey the directions of the inscription on a traffic sign commits a breach of these by-laws.

Careless and dangerous driving

- 12. (a) No person shall drive a vehicle on community land without due care and attention.
- (b) No person shall drive a vehicle on community land in a manner which, having regard to all of the circumstances, is dangerous to any person.
- (c) No person shall drive a vehicle owned by the Community or leased or hired to the Community—
 - (i) Without first having the permission of the Council or of a person placed by the Council in charge or control of the vehicle for the time being.
 - (ii) When under the influence of liquor or a deleterious substance.
 - (iii) Without being the holder of a current valid motor driver's licence of a class appropriate to the vehicle to be driven.

Part 5-The Regulation of Other Matters.

Offensive behaviour

13. No person shall cause a disturbance or annoyance to other persons by using abusive language, fighting otherwise behaving in an offensive or disorderly manner.

Wilful damage

14. No person shall damage any tree, bush, lawn, building, structure, vehicle or other thing, whether the property of the Community or of any individual person.

Disruption of meetings

Part 1—Preliminary.

Citation

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Aboriginal Movement for Outback Survival (Mt Margaret Mission) By-laws.

Commencement

2. These by-laws shall come into effect when approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette.

Definitions

 - "The Community" means (as the context requires) Aboriginal Movement for Outback Survival (Mt Margaret Mission) and that collective group comprising the membership of Aboriginal Movement for Outback Survival (Mt Margaret Mission), their spouses and dependants (where not members in their own right) and "member of the community" has a correlative meaning.
 - "Liquor" means liquor as defined in the Liquor Licensing Act 1988.
 - "Deleterious Substance" means glue or any volatile liquid containing hydrocarbons.
 - "Vehicle" means any motor vehicle, designed and manufactured to be capable of self propulsion and includes any trailer or caravan while attached to a vehicle.

 - (a) Permit any person to bring, possess, use or supply liquor on community lands.
 - (b) No person shall, without the permission of the Council, bring, possess, use or supply liquor on community lands.
 - (c) No person shall enter onto or remain on community land whilst under the influence of liquor to the extent that his behaviour causes alarm, annoyance or upset to members of the community.

Pharmaceutical

9. Pharmaceutical preparations and substances properly used in the ordinary course of medical practice shall exempt from the operation of this by-law whilst in the possession or control of a medical professional or where properly prescribed and issued to a patient by a medical professional.

Deleterious substance or petrol

- 10. (a) A person shall not be in possession of a deleterious substance or petrol on community land for the purpose of inhalation.
- (b) A person shall not sell or supply a deleterious substance or petrol to another person on community land if there are reasonable grounds for suspecting that the other person—
 - (i) intends to use the deleterious substance or petrol for the purpose of inhalation; or
 - (ii) intends to sell or supply the deleterious substance or petrol for the purpose of inhalation.

Part 4-Traffic.

Traffic signs

- 11. (a) The Council may place signs ('traffic signs') on community land for the purpose of regulating vehicle traffic.
- (b) Any person who fails to obey the directions of the inscription on a traffic sign commits a breach of these by-laws.

Careless and dangerous driving

- 12. (a) No person shall drive a vehicle on community land without due care and attention.
- (b) No person shall drive a vehicle on community land in a manner which, having regard to all of the circumstances, is dangerous to any person.
- (c) No person shall drive a vehicle owned by the Community or leased or hired to the Community:
 - (i) Without first having the permission of the Council or of a person placed by the Council in charge or control of the vehicle for the time being.
 - (ii) When under the influence of liquor or a deleterious substance.
 - (iii) Without being the holder of a current valid motor driver's licence of a class appropriate to the vehicle to be driven.

Part 5-The Regulation of Other Matters.

Offensive behaviour

13. No person shall cause a disturbance or annoyance to other persons by using abusive language, fighting or otherwise behaving in an offensive or disorderly manner.

Wilful damage

14. No person shall damage any tree, bush, lawn, building, structure, vehicle or other thing, whether the property of the Community or of any individual person.

Disruption of meetings

15. No person shall interrupt any meeting of the Council or of the Community, or any customary meeting, by noise or any offensive or disorderly behaviour.

Part 6-Enforcement and Proceedings.

Powers of Police

- 16. A member of the Police Force may-
 - (a) Take proceedings against any person for a breach of these by-laws.
 - (b) Where any person has committed or is found committing an offence against these by-laws and it appears to the Police Officer on reasonable grounds to be likely that injury to persons or damage to property will be caused by that person if left at large; apprehend and remove that person from community land.
 - (c) Request the name and address of any person who he believes on reasonable grounds—
 - (i) to be on community land, in breach of any by-law, or
 - (ii) to have, while on community land, committed a breach of a by-law.
 - (d) If he has reasonable cause to suspect that liquor or a deleterious substance is in any vehicle in contravention of these by-laws: stop, detain and search such vehicle and seize any liquor or deleterious substance and any receptacle containing liquor or a deleterious substance which he may find in or on the vehicle and may retain in his custody or control any property so seized until dealt with according to these by-laws.
 - (e) If a liquor or a deleterious substance is found in a vehicle through the exercise of the power conferred by By-law 17, seize the vehicle, search and detain it for up to maximum period of fourteen days if such is considered necessary by the Police Officer, on reasonable grounds to prevent a repetition of the prescribed conduct.

Procedure

17. Subject to the *Child Welfare Act 1947*, proceedings for an offence against by-law shall be commenced by the way of complaint and summons under and in accordance with the *Justices Act 1902* and shall be commenced within six months after the offence was committed.

Part 7-Penalties and Orders of the Court.

Penalties

- 18. (a) Any person who breaches or fails to comply with any of these by-laws is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine or a term of imprisonment or both, but no fines so imposed shall exceed \$100 and no term of imprisonment so imposed shall exceed three months.
- (b) In addition to the penalties provided under paragraph (a) of this by-law, the Court may order any person convicted of an offence under these by-laws to pay compensation not greater than \$250 to the community or to any person, where, in the course of committing the offence, the person convicted has caused damage to property of the community or of that other person.
- (c) In any prosecution for an offence under these by-laws having as an element the possession or use of a prohibited substance a Court upon proceeding to conviction of the person charged may make such orders as it sees fit concerning the destruction, disposal or forfeiture of property seized pursuant to an exercise of the power contained in By-law 16 (d).

Defence of acting under custom

19. It is a defence to a complaint of an offence against these by-laws to show that the defendant was acting under and excused by an custom of the community.

Council members

- 20. (a) Council member who is charged with an offence against By-law 8 shall be deemed to have ceased to be effective Councillor.
- (b) In the event that such charge against the Council member is withdrawn or is dismissed after trial then, by that occurrence he shall be restored to his former position.

The by-laws are amended as follows-

Section 1 is amended by deleting the definition of "Dividing Line" and inserting a new description as follows—

"Dividing Line" means an imaginary line commencing at the northern boundaries of Avon locations 8108 and 715 and following the eastern boundaries of the Clackline-Toodyay, Eastern and Great Southern Railway Reserves, to the boundary of the Shire of Northam.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

The Municipality of the Shire of Busselton Firebreak By-laws

- (1) Interpretation-
 - (a) "Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Busselton.
 - (b) "District" means the district of the Council.
 - (c) "Firebreak Period" means in relation to urban, rural and special rural land, a period from and including 15th December in any year until and including 12th April in the following year.
 - (d) "Firebreak" means the land from which all inflammable material (except living trees, shrubs and plants) has been removed and on which no inflammable material (except living trees, shrubs and plants) is permitted during the firebreak period and is not less than 2 metres wide and constructed within a perimeter of 20 metres of all homesteads, buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas on the land.
 - (e) "Fuel Depots/Storage Facilities" means a depot for storage or bulk sale of solid or liquid gaseous fuel, but does not include a service station.
 - (f) "Haystack" means a large amount of mown straw or grass stacked or stored in the open.
 - (g) "Prohibited Burning Period" means a period from and including 15th December in any year until and including 28th February in the following year.

- (h) "Restricted Burning Times" means a period from and including 2nd November in any year until and including 14th December in the same year and a period from and including 1st March in any year until and including 12th April in the same year.
- (i) "Rural Land" means land within the district that is not townsite land.
- (j) "Special Rural land" means small rural holdings zoned as Special Rural under Town Planning Schemes.
- (k) "Urban Land" means land within the district that is within the boundaries of a townsite.

(2) Rural Land

You shall clear all inflammable material firebreaks at least 2 metres wide.

- (a) A firebreak not less than 2 metres wide must be constructed within a perimeter of 20 metres of all homesteads, buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas on the land.
- (b) In the case of haystacks, the firebreak must not be closer than 6 metres of the haystacks.
- (c) Where the area of land exceeds 120 hectares additional firebreaks so as to divide the land into areas of not more than 120 hectares which are completely surrounded with a firebreak.

(3) Special Rural Land

The owners of all existing small rural holdings zoned as Special Rural under Town Planning Schemes must maintain clear of all inflammable material, a firebreak of not less than 2 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.

(4) Urban Land

(Residential, Commercial and Industrial Land within a townsite or within any area subdivided for residential purposes).

- (a) Where the area of land is 2 024 m² or less, remove all inflammable material on the land except, living trees, shrubs, and plants from the whole of the land.
- (b) Where the area of land exceeds 2 024 m² clear of all inflammable materials, firebreaks of at least 2 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

(5) Fuel and/or Gas Depots

In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquid or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or supports are constructed, you shall maintain the land clear of all inflammable materials and clear a firebreak not less than 2 metres wide within a perimeter of 20 metres of all homesteads, buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas on the land.

(6) Pine and Eucalypt Plantations

Firebreaks not less than 15 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which pines and eucalypts are planted; and not less than 15 metres in width along those portions of pine and eucalypt plantations which enjoy a common boundary with a road reserve; and not less than 6 metres in width in such positions that no part or compartment of a pine or eucalypt plantation shall exceed 28 hectares in an area.

Internal trafficable and trees on both sides of firebreaks progressively pruned to a minimum height of 4 metres to allow unrestricted access to maintain for fire fighting equipment.

(7) Protea Plantations

Firebreaks not less than 15 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which Protea are planted. Not less than 5 metres in width along those portions of Protea plantations which enjoy a common boundary with a road reserve, and not less than 5 metres in width in such positions that no part or compartments of Protea plantations shall exceed 28 hectares in an area.

- (8) (a) If the owner or occupier considers it impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material from land as required by these by-laws the owner or occupier may apply in writing to the Council not less than 14 days prior to the commencement of the firebreak period for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land.
 - (b) On receiving such an application, the Council may refuse the same or may grant permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land and may set out in the notice granting such permission the time and the manner in which the alternative firebreaks are to be established and maintained and the owner or occupier shall thereupon comply with the requirements of the notice.

- (9) On failure of compliance with these by-laws by any owner or occupier of land within the Municipality of the Shire of Busselton, the Council may by its workmen or servants enter the land and carry out all works and do all things necessary as would have been required pursuant to these by-laws by the owner or occupier thereof to comply with these by-laws and to charge to the owner or occupier thereof the Council's reasonable costs in so doing.
- (10) Any owner or occupier committing an offence under these by-laws is liable to a fine of \$1 000 and in addition shall pay the costs incurred by the Council in performing the works pursuant to By-law (9) of these by-laws.

The Municipality of the Shire of Perenjori

By-laws relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades

By-laws relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades appearing in the *Government Gazette* on 1 November 1940 and as amended in the *Gazette* of 19 May 1943 for Shire of Perenjori are hereby revoked.

Establishment of Brigade

- 1. (a) By resolution, the Council may establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire brigade under the provisions of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* and Regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the Brigade. Details of the Brigade and its officers shall be entered in the register of Bush Fire brigades held by the Council.
- (b) A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or for any specific area thereof.

Appointment of Officers

- 2. The council shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade.
- 3. Members of the Brigade shall elect a person to act as Secretary to the Brigade and shall inform the Council accordingly.
- 4. The Council may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purposes of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain.

Powers and Duties of Officers

5. The powers and duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the $Bush\ Fires\ Act\ 1954$ and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and Regulations.

Membership of Brigade

- 6. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire brigade may consist of the following-
 - (a) subscribing members; and
 - (b) fire fighting members;

- (2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who being interested in forwarding the objects of the brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the brigade at the following rates—
 - owner or occupier of land within the brigade area—minimum subscription of \$20.00.
 - (ii) other persons—minimum subscription of \$10.00.
- (3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able bodied persons over fifteen years who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon; and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.
- (4) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable by fire fighting members and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Council.
- (5) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance

7. The expenditure incurred by the Council in the purchase of equipment payment for services and generally for the purpose of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Council and records of such expenditure shall be maintained in accordance with Municipal audit requirements.

Meetings of Brigades

8. Meetings will be held as necessary.


