Suspension of Section 25

Bush Fires Board,
Perth.

It is hereby notified that I, Graham Edwards, administering the Bush Fires Act 1954, hereby revoke all previous orders under section 25B of the said Act with relation to the Gnowangerup, Borden and Ongerup Rubbish Disposal Sites situated on locations specified below and pursuant to the powers contained in section 25B of the said Act, approve the suspension of the operations of section 25 that relate to a fire to be lit, or which is lit, for the purpose of destroying garden refuse or rubbish or any like purpose of destroying garden refuse or rubbish or any like purpose during the declared Prohibited and Restricted Burning Times on land set aside for the purpose in the Municipal District of the Shire of Gnowangerup. This notice shall have effect until revoked and is issued subject to the following specified conditions—

Specified Conditions

Gnowangerup Rubbish Disposal Site situated on Reserve 22741 Strathavon Road

1. That the area of the dump as located on the above Reserve be burnt within the constructed perimeter firebreaks.

2. Two signs to be erected and maintained at the entrance of the site, warning of prohibition of unauthorised lighting of fires and to inform the public that dumping in any other places is prohibited.
3. All burning of rubbish to be confined to the constructed trench area.
4. Fires to be lit only by the Shire Councils rubbish collecting contractors or such persons as specifically authorised to do so by the Shire Clerk.
5. That burning on the dump be carried out only between Monday and Thursday in any week, inclusive, between the hours of 1030 and 1530.
6. The site to be checked for fire safety at 1700 hours on each day when burning has been carried out.
7. At least two men, equipped with a fire unit be constantly in attendance during the burning operations.
8. The Shire Clerk or the Chief Fire Control Officer for the Shire to be informed each day when burning is to be carried out.
9. No fire to be lit on land subject to this suspension on a day for which the fire danger forecast issued by the Bureau of Meteorology in Perth in respect of the locality is "Extreme" or "Very High".

Specified Conditions

Borden Rubbish Disposal Site situated on Location 5176

1. All bush and grass, save standing live trees, to be removed from the site area the perimeter firebreaks.
2. A sign to be erected and maintained at the entrance of the site, warning of prohibition of unauthorised lighting of fires and to inform the public that dumping in any other place is prohibited.
3. That burning on the dump be carried out only between Monday and Thursday in any week, inclusive, between the hours of 1800 and 2000.
4. That a Fire Control Officer nominated by the Shire, be in attendance with a fire unit when burning is being carried out.
5. No fires to be lit on land subject to this suspension on a day for which the fire danger forecast issued by the Bureau of Meteorology in Perth in respect of the locality is "Extreme" or "Very High".

- (a) one unbranded sheep, lamb, calf (under 70 kilograms), goat or deer carcass is the equivalent of one unit of unbranded meat;
- (b) one unbranded pig carcass is the equivalent of 3 units of unbranded meat; and
- (c) one unbranded cow, bull, heifer or steer carcass is the equivalent of 8 units of unbranded meat.

(4) In subregulation (3) “carcass” means a whole carcass or such portions of a carcass that together would comprise a whole carcass.

Transportation of unbranded meat

4D. A person shall not transport, or cause or permit to be transported, unbranded meat in a district unless the person is a primary producer who has first obtained a permit in respect of that transportation in the form set out in Schedule E from the local authority of that district.

INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS COMMISSION AMENDMENT REGULATIONS
1991

Pursuant to the powers conferred by section 113 of the Industrial Relations Act 1979 and all other powers enabling the Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission hereby makes the following regulations:

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Industrial Relations Commission Amendments Regulations, 1991.

(2) In these regulations the Industrial Relations Commission Regulations 1985* as amended are referred to as the principal regulations.

*[*Published in the Government Gazette 28 February 1985 at pages 3-50 and see amendments published in the Government Gazette on 16 August 1985, 1 November 1985 and 19 August 1988.]*

2. Regulation 32 of the principal regulations is amended by repealing the existing regulation and substituting the following regulation:

" 32. In this Part of these regulations the terms "Chairman", "Department", "Chief Executive Officer", to this "teacher" and "Tribunal" shall, unless the context otherwise requires, have the same meaning as that attributed to those terms in Division 1 of Part II A of the Act. "

3. Regulation 34 of the principal regulations is amended:

(a) by repealing subregulations (2) and (3) and substituting the following subregulations—

" (2) A notice of appeal shall clearly and concisely set out the grounds of the appeal and shall be signed by the appellant or his agent provided that said agent has been duly authorised by the filing of a warrant in accordance with Form 27.

(3) An appeal under section 78(1)(b)(i) of the Act shall be filed within 14 days of the date on which the notice given under the Education Act Regulations, 1960 of the decision with respect to which the appeal is filed or lodged, is served or deemed to have been served on the appellant. "

(b) by repealing subregulations (6) and (7) and substituting the following subregulations—

" (6) Notwithstanding subregulations (3) and (5) of this regulation, where a teacher is employed in a remote locality or is temporarily absent from his school, he may file or lodge notice of an appeal by facsimile transmission within the time prescribed in subregulation (3) or (5) as the case requires, if notice of appeal is filed in accordance with subregulation (1) within 7 days next following the last day under subregulation (3) or (5), as the case requires, and an appeal so filed shall be deemed to have been filed or lodged within the time prescribed by subregulations (3) and (5).

(7) The appellant shall upon the return to him of the stamped copy of the notice of appeal serve or cause to be served a copy of the notice on the Chief Executive Officer. "

4. Regulation 35 of the principal regulations is amended by repealing the existing regulation and substituting the following regulation:

“ 35. For the purposes of the interpretation of that term in subsection (1) of section 80 of the Act—

“efficiency” shall be determined by having regard for the position to be filled and the experience, qualifications, diligence and conduct of the teacher; but shall not include experience in an acting capacity. ”

5. Regulation 38 of the principal regulations is amended by repealing the existing regulation and substituting the following regulation:

“ 38. Subject to (8) hereof, the following shall apply to all appeals brought pursuant to section 78(1)(b)(i) of the Act.

(1) Upon the appellant filing a Declaration of Service (Form 2) in respect of an appeal instituted pursuant to section 78(1)(b)(i) of the Act, the Clerk to the Tribunal shall forward the details of the appeal/s to the employer.

(2) On receipt of the document pursuant to 1. hereof, the employer within 7 days shall file in the Registry a statement and documents which shall include the following: the relevant details of the position under appeal, the date of vacancy of the position, the date advertised, a copy of the relevant advertisement/s, the date applications closed, details of the selection process including the membership of any selection panel and the criteria used for selection; and a summary statement of the employment record of each appellant and of the recommended applicant.

(3) Copies of the statement and documents filed pursuant to 2. hereof shall be forwarded within the same 7 days by the employer to each appellant against the decision to promote.

(4) Each party to an appeal (i.e. each appellant and the respondent employer) shall serve on the other parties a written statement of evidence to be produced at the hearing in support of the appeal or the recommendation as the case may be.

Such statements shall not include any material or information which was not available to the selection panel which made the decision.

(5) Service of such statements shall be effected at least four working days prior to the date set down for hearing the appeal.

(6) Three copies of the statement of evidence of each party as per 4. hereof is to be received by the Registry of the Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission (4th Floor, 815 Hay Street, Perth) at least four working days prior to the date set down for hearing the appeal.

(7) The procedure during the hearing of an appeal will be as follows:

The respondent employer shall briefly state its case; and shall include reference to the application of the criteria used in making the selection decision to the recommended applicant and to any appellant for the position.

The respondent employer is expected to call the chairperson of the selection panel or a person directly involved in the selection decision and the recommended applicant to give evidence. The recommended applicant will be expected to verify the statement of evidence submitted in accordance with 4. hereof. The appellants shall be entitled to cross-examine. The respondent employer shall be entitled only to re-examine on matters arising.

The case for the respondent employer shall then be closed.

The parties should regard all documents and statements of evidence filed in the Registry as read for the purposes of the hearing and part of the record. In presenting its case, a party to the appeal may refer the Tribunal to matters considered of particular relevance in such documents.

In the presentation of the appeal/s to the Tribunal, each appellant is expected to verify the statement of evidence submitted in accordance with 4. hereof and to make submissions going to the specific grounds relied upon for the appeal.

The respondent employer may cross-examine an appellant who gives sworn evidence and any such appellant may deal with matters arising.

The case/s for the appellant/s shall then close.

(8) The Tribunal may waive any of the requirements of this Regulation or vary the procedure at any time. ”

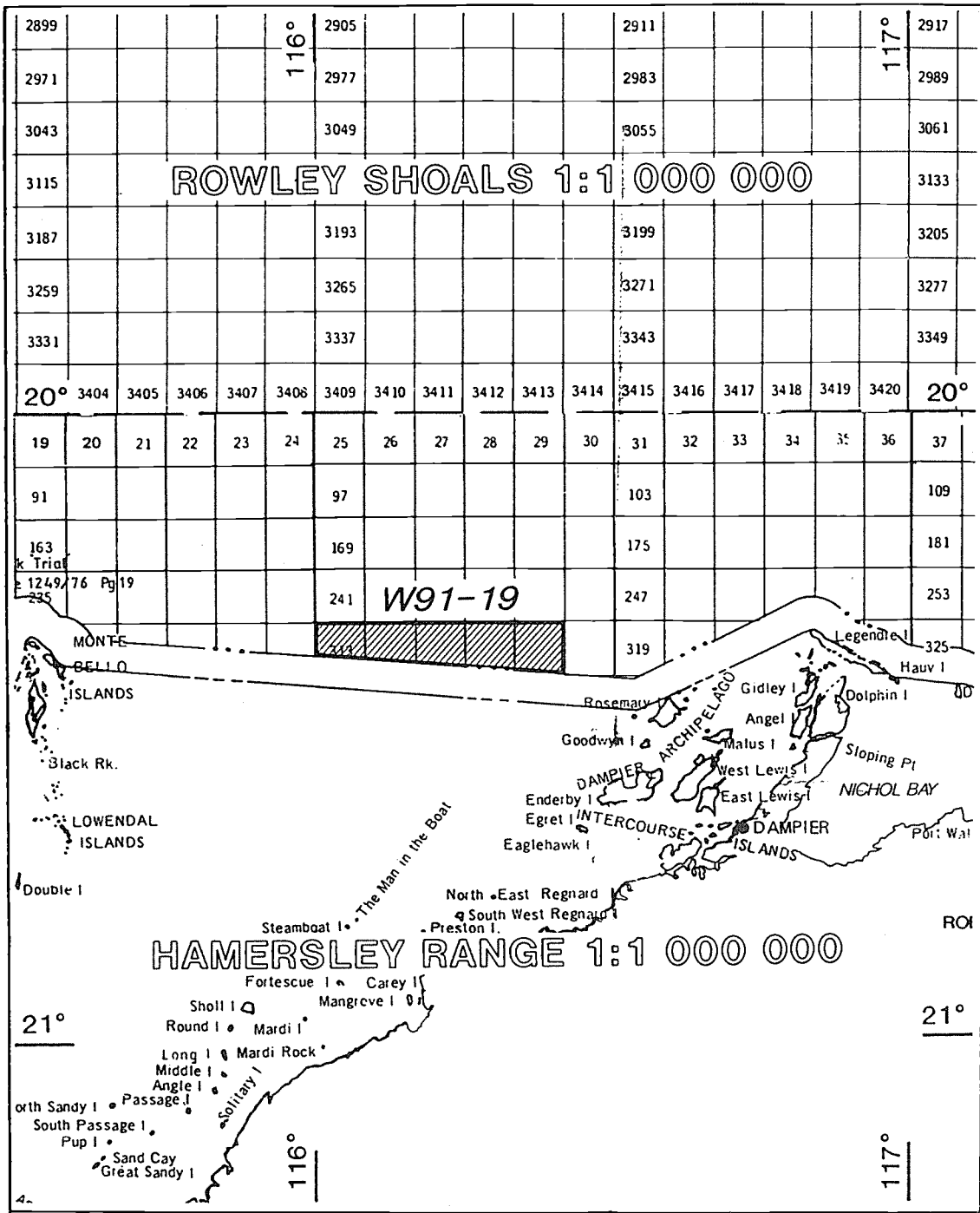

APPLICATIONS FOR AREAS W91-13 TO W91-18 AND W91-20 TO W91-22

Applications for the award of a permit over the above areas W91-13 to W91-18 and W91-20 to W91-22 are required to be made in the approved manner, submitted in duplicate and should be accompanied by:—

(a) Details of—

- (i) the applicant's assessment of the petroleum potential of the area, including a geological and geophysical review and technical assessment of the area, and the concepts underlying the proposed exploration program;
- (ii) the applicant's minimum guaranteed proposal (in terms of operational activity and indicative minimum expenditure) for data evaluation, seismic surveying activities and exploration wells to be drilled, on the basis that none of the wells drilled encounters significant hydrocarbons, for each year of the first three years of the permit term. This proposal, to be known as the minimum guaranteed 'dry hole' work program, should only include work expected to involve a substantial exploration component—appraisal work should not be included;
- (iii) the applicant's proposal (in terms of operational activity and indicative minimum expenditure) for data evaluation, seismic surveying activities and exploration wells to be drilled, for each of the remaining three years of the permit term. This proposal, to be known as the 'secondary' work program, should only include work expected to involve a substantial exploration component—appraisal work should not be included.

(b) Particulars of—

- (i) the technical qualifications of the applicant and of its employees;
- (ii) the technical advice available to the applicant;
- (iii) the financial resources available to the applicant, including evidence of the applicant's ability to fund the work program proposed, a statement of other exploration plans and commitments over the next six years, and a copy of the latest annual report for each applicant company;
- (iv) where relevant, the viability of the consortium lodging the application, including evidence that a satisfactory settlement has been, or can be, reached on a Joint Operating Agreement (a copy of a Heads of Agreement dealing will generally suffice);
- (v) the percentage participating interest of each party to the application; and
- (vi) the business address for service of notices in respect of each applicant.

- (c) Such other information as the applicant wishes to be taken into account in consideration

of the application including, for example, past performance in offshore exploration either in Australia or overseas; past performance and future intentions as to the sourcing of goods and services to be used in operations; evidence of recent willingness to apply for 'frontier' exploration areas, such as previously unavailable areas, deeper water prospects, hostile environments; proposals to improve technical capabilities through research to be undertaken in Australia or overseas, and, in the case of foreign companies, proposals to transfer technology and skills to Australians.

- (d) A fee of \$3000, (non refundable) payable to the Commonwealth of Australia through an Australian bank or by bank cheque, is required for each area (see section 21 (1) (f) of the Petroleum (Submerged Lands) Act 1967).

Further details of the modified work program bidding system outlined above, including the criteria for assessment of applications and the conditions to apply following the award of a permit, are available from the Director, Petroleum Division, Department of Mines in Perth and from the Petroleum Division, Department of Primary Industries and Energy in Canberra.

It should be noted that any income derived in the future from the recovery of petroleum from these areas will be subject to the Commonwealth Government's Resources Rent Tax.
