DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (GOLDFIELDS RESIDENTIAL AREAS) (SULPHUR DIOXIDE) POLICY

AND

DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (GOLDFIELDS RESIDENTIAL AREAS) (SULPHUR DIOXIDE) REGULATIONS

The Minister for the Environment has directed the Environmental Protection Authority to conduct a review of the Environmental Protection Policy for the Control of Sulphur Dioxide in the Air Environment of the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Residential Areas (December 1987). This review is proceeding by means of a new Draft Environmental Protection Policy under section 36 (2) of the Environmental Protection Act 1986.

The Environmental Protection Authority has prepared a Draft Environmental Protection Policy and Regulations which extend the current policy area to include the residential areas of the greater Kalgoorlie region. These include the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder, the towns of Coolgardie and Kambalda and the Kurrawang Aboriginal Reserve.

The Policy proposes new, more stringent air quality objectives for sulphur dioxide concentration in the policy area. These objectives define a limit which must not be exceeded, and a standard which it is desirable not to exceed.

The objectives of the Policy are to be achieved by applying conditions on the operating licences of industries which emit sulphur dioxide. These conditions are specified in the Regulations and apply a schedule of air quality standards and limits of increasing stringency which will meet the policy objectives within five years. A procedure is established for review of the Policy in the event that the objectives fail to be achieved.

In accordance with section 26 (d) of the Environmental Protection Act, the Environmental Protection Authority invites submissions from the public.


