INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS ACT 1979

Industrial Relations Commission Amendment Regulations, 1991

Pursuant to the powers conferred by section 113 of the Industrial Relations Act 1979 and all other powers enabling the Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission hereby makes the following regulations:

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Industrial Relations Commission Amendments Regulations, 1992.
- (2) In these regulations the Industrial Relations Commission Regulations 1985* as amended are referred to as the principal regulations.

By-laws relating to the Clearing and Removal of Trees, Scrub, Undergrowth, Refuse, Rubbish, Vehicle Bodies, Disused Materials and Unightly Items/ Objects from Land

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the Shire of Yilgarn hereby records having been resolved on the 19th day of April 1991, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws—

1. In these By-laws—

“Council” means the Yilgarn Shire Council.

“District” means the district of the Shire of Yilgarn.

2. If there is—

(a) On any vacant land within the district any trees, scrub, undergrowth or rubbish; or

(b) On any land within the district any refuse, rubbish, disused materials or unsightly items/objects whether of the same kind or a different kind from that here specified,

which in the opinion of Council is likely to affect adversely the value of adjoining property, or the health, comfort or convenience of the inhabitants thereof, the Council may cause a Notice under the hand of the Shire Clerk to be served on the owner or occupier of such land requiring him, within the time specified in such Notice, to clear the land of such trees, scrub, undergrowth, or remove such refuse, rubbish, disused materials or unsightly items/ objects from such land.

3. If there is on any land whether vacant or occupied within the district any derelict motor vehicle, or vehicle body or old machinery which, in the opinion of the Council, is likely to adversely affect the value of adjoining property or the health, comfort and convenience of the inhabitants thereof, the Council may cause a Notice under the hand of the Shire Clerk to be served on the owner or occupier of such land requiring him within the time specified in such notice, to remove such vehicles, vehicle bodies or machinery from such land.
4. Where the owner or occupier does not clear the land of such trees, scrub, undergrowth, or remove such refuse, rubbish, disused materials, unsightly items/objects, derelict motor vehicles, vehicle bodies or old machinery, the Council may, without payment of any compensation in respect thereof, clear and remove it and dispose of it at the expenses of, and recover in a court of competent jurisdiction the amount of the expenses from, the owner or occupier to whom the Notice was given.
5. Every owner or occupier of land whom a Notice has been served under By-laws 2 or 3 of these By-laws shall comply with such Notice within the time specified therein or in that time give satisfactory reason why the materials should be retained or be given extra time in which to comply. Any person who fails to comply with the terms of any Notice served under these By-laws commits an offence, and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00) and a daily penalty not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each day on which the offence occurs after the expiry of the Notice.


