#### BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

The Municipality for the Shire of Cuballing

By-law relating to the establishment, maintenance and equipment of Bush Fire Brigades.

In pursuance of the power conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 21 May 1992 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws—

1. The By-law of the Shire of Cuballing relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades, published in the *Government Gazette* of 3 January 1947 and amended in the *Government Gazette* of 31 August 1962 is hereby revoked.

### 2. Bush Fire Brigades

#### 2.1 Establishment of Brigades

- (a) By resolution, the Council may establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954, and Regulations thereunder. The Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws and a name shall be given to the Brigade. Details of the Bush Fire Brigade shall be held by the Council.
- (b) A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or any specified area thereof.

#### 2.2 Appointment of Officers

Each Brigade shall hold an Annual General Meeting at which a Captain, First Lieutenant, Second Lieutenant, and such additional Lieutenants as deemed necessary, Equipment Officer, Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected. The Council shall be notified annually of the names of Officers by way of "Form 12" contained in the second schedule of these by-laws.

#### 2.3 Duties of Officers

Duties of all Brigade Officers and Members shall be as detailed in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954.

(a) Captains and Lieutenants

The Captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the Captain, the 1st Lieutenant, the 2nd Lieutenant or Senior Officer of the Brigade present at the fire, shall exercise all the powers and duties of the Brigade Captain.

(b) Secretary and/or Treasurer

Shall be responsible for administration in accordance with section 2.5 of these by-laws.

(c) Equipment Officer

The Equipment Officer shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purpose of the Brigade. The equipment shall be kept at a depot approved by the Brigade Captain where, if possible, fire units can easily be called upon. If there is more than one such depot in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

#### 2.4 Brigade Membership

- (a) The membership of the Bush Fire Brigade consists of fire fighting members.
- (b) Fire fighting members shall be those persons (being members of either sex and) 15 years of age and over, and willing to render service when possible at any bush fire and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule of these by-laws.
- (c) The enrollment of persons as fire fighting members shall in every case, be subject to the approval of the Council.

## 2.5 Administration Responsibilities

- (a) Meetings
  - (i) Brigade meetings shall be held as required, with a minimum quorum of four Brigade members to be present. The Councils Bush Fire Control Officer shall table the minutes of the meeting at the next following Fire Advisory Committee Meeting.
  - (ii) An Officer of the Council may be present at any meeting of a Bush Fire Brigade.
  - (iii) The Brigade Secretary shall provide the Shire Clerk with advice of meetings at least seven days prior to the date of the meeting.

## (b) Membership

The Brigade Secretary shall maintain a register of all members and resignations of such members for the Brigade.

(c) Secretary and/or Treasurer

Is responsible for all Brigade Administration matters which will include the following—

- (i) Taking of Brigade Minutes.
- (ii) Maintaining Brigade Membership records.
- (iii) Detailing revenue from all sources and expenditure made by the Brigades.
- (iv) Receiving and answering correspondence as necessary.

## 3. Bush Fire Control Officers

## 3.1 Appointment

- (a) At the Annual General Meeting of each Bush Fire Brigade, one brigade member may be nominated to the Bush Fire Advisory Committee to serve as the Fire Control Officer until the next following Annual General Meeting.
- (b) The Council may appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with section 38 of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and such officers shall be issued with a Certificate of Appointment by the Council.
- (c) At a meeting of the Bush Fires Advisory Committee, the delegates present shall nominate to Council the names of Officers to the positions of Bush Fire Control Officers and Fire Weather Officer and Deputy.

## 3.2 Powers

The Council retains the express authority to appoint, determine and restrict the Powers of Bush Fire Control Officers. Such appointment will be in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe an area over which the Bush Fire Control Officer shall have jurisdiction. Each Fire Control Officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and Regulations.

## 4. Finance

The expenditure incurred by Council in the purchase of equipment, payment for services and generally for the purpose of the Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Council and records of such expenditure shall be maintained in accordance with municipal audit requirements.

#### WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT 1950

WILDLIFE CONSERVATION (FAUNA OF NINGALOO MARINE PARK)
NOTICE 1992

Made by the Minister under section 14.

#### Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the Wildlife Conservation (Fauna of Ningaloo Marine Park) Notice 1992.

#### Interpretation

- 2. In this notice-
  - "fished" means taken by a method authorised under the Fisheries Act 1905;
  - "general use area" means all waters classified as a general use area under the *Ningaloo Marine Park (Classified Waters) Notice 1991* published in the *Gazette* on 31 May 1991 at pp. 2648-49;
  - "Ningaloo Marine Park" means all waters reserved as Marine Park Reserve No. 2 under section 13 of the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984* by an Order in Council published in the *Gazette* on 3 April 1987 at p. 1239;
  - "open season" has the same meaning as in section 6 of the Act;
  - "recreational area" means all waters classified as a recreational area under the *Ningaloo Marine Park (Classified Waters) Notice 1991* published in the *Gazette* on 31 May 1991 at pp. 2648-49;
  - "sanctuary area" means all waters classified as a sanctuary area under the Ningaloo Marine Park (Classified Waters) Notice 1991 published in the Gazette on 31 May 1991 at pp. 2648-49.

## Declaration of an open season in respect of certain fauna

3. Subject to clauses 5 and 6, an open season in respect of the fauna referred to in the Schedule is declared in the recreational area and the general use area of the Ningaloo Marine Park.

### Restriction on taking fauna in a sanctuary area

4. No person shall take any fauna by any means in or from a sanctuary area of the Ningaloo Marine Park unless that fauna is taken in accordance with the Act.

## Restrictions on taking fauna in a recreational area or a general use area

- 5. (1) Subject to clause 5(2), no person shall take any fauna by any means in or from the recreational area or general use area of the Ningaloo Marine Park unless that fauna is taken in accordance with the Act.
  - (2) Subject to clause 6, no person shall take any fauna referred to in the Schedule by any means in or from the recreational area or the general use area of the Ningaloo Marine Park unless that fauna is fished in accordance with the *Fisheries Act 1905*.

## Application of clause 5(2)

- 6. Clause 5(2) shall not apply to those fauna which are known as-
  - (a) Rhincodon typus (whale shark); and
  - (b) Manta birostris (manta ray),

of the class Chondrichthyes referred to in item 2 of the Schedule.

#### Cancellation

7. The Wildlife Conservation (Fauna of Ningaloo Marine Park) Notice 1991 published in the Gazette on 20 September 1991 at pp. 4861-62 is cancelled.

- 1. All species of the class Osteichthyes (boney fish).
- 2. All species of the class Chondrichthyes (cartilaginous fish).

## **Environmental Protection**

#### **EP301**

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT 1986**

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (KWINANA) (ATMOSPHERIC WASTES) REGULATIONS 1992

Made by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council.

#### Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Environmental Protection (Kwinana) (Atmospheric Wastes) Regulations 1992.

## Interpretation

- 2. In these regulations
  - (a) "equivalent aerodynamic diameter", in relation to a particle, means the diameter of a spherical particle of a density of 1 000 kilograms per cubic metre which exhibits the same aerodynamic behaviour as the first-mentioned particle;
    - "µg/m<sup>3</sup>", when used in relation to the measurement of an atmospheric waste, means the concentration of that waste in micrograms per cubic metre of dry air at 0 degrees Celsius and one atmosphere pressure (101.325 kilopascals);
    - "the policy" means the Environmental Protection (Kwinana) (Atmospheric Wastes) Policy 1992 approved under the Environmental Protection (Kwinana) (Atmospheric Wastes) Policy Approval Order 1992 and set out in the Schedule to that order;
    - "total suspended particulates" means inert particles each having an equivalent aerodynamic diameter of less than 50 micrometres;

and

(b) unless the contrary intention appears, other words and expressions have the same respective meanings as they have in the policy.

## Definition of "atmospheric waste"

- 3. (1) For the purposes of paragraph (a) of the definition of "atmospheric waste" in clause 3 (1) of the policy, sulphur dioxide is a prescribed kind of gaseous substance.
- (2) For the purposes of paragraph (b) of the definition of "atmospheric waste" in clause 3 (1) of the policy, total suspended particulates are a prescribed kind of particulate substance.

## Ambient air quality standards and ambient air quality limits for atmospheric wastes

- 4. For the purposes of clause 6 of the policy
  - (a) the ambient air quality standard and ambient air quality limit for the concentration of sulphur dioxide in the relevant portion of the environment over an area referred to in the second column of Schedule 1 are the standard and limit (expressed in µg/m³) specified in relation to that area in the third and fourth columns respectively of that Schedule when averaged over the period of time specified in the fifth column of that Schedule;
  - (b) the ambient air quality standard and ambient air quality limit for the concentration of total suspended particulates in the relevant portion of the environment over an area referred to in the second column of Schedule 2 are the standard and limit (expressed in µg/m³) specified in relation to that area in the third and fourth columns respectively of that Schedule when averaged over the period of time specified in the fifth column of that Schedule.

## Prescribed licence conditions for industrial premises in Policy Area

- **5.** (1) For the purposes of section 62 (1) (h) of the Act the following conditions are prescribed as conditions that may be specified in a licence issued in respect of industrial premises in the Policy Area
  - (a) a condition that the occupier of the premises shall control the discharge of a specified atmospheric waste from specified industrial sources within those premises so as to ensure that the quantities of the waste so discharged comply with the relevant determination;
  - (b) a condition that the occupier of the premises shall
    - control the discharge of a specified atmospheric waste from specified industrial sources within those premises so as to achieve compliance with the relevant determination within a specified period and in accordance with a specified compliance programme;
    - (ii) take specified measures for the purpose of achieving, or monitoring the extent of, compliance with the relevant determination; and
    - (iii) furnish to the Chief Executive Officer, at specified intervals of time, a report on the progress being made towards compliance with the relevant determination.
  - (2) In subclause (1) —

<sup>&</sup>quot;specified" means specified in the licence concerned.

# ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (KWINANA) (ATMOSPHERIC WASTES) POLICY APPROVAL ORDER 1992

MADE by the Minister under section 31 (d).

## Citation

1. This order may be cited as the *Environmental Protection (Kwinana)* (Atmospheric Wastes) Policy Approval Order 1992.

## Approval and commencement of environmental protection policy

- 2. The environmental protection policy set out in the Schedule
  - (a) is approved; and
  - (b) shall have the force of law on and from the day on which this order is published in the Gazette.

## ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT 1986

# ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (KWINANA) (ATMOSPHERIC WASTES) POLICY 1992

APPROVED by the Minister under section 31 (d).

## Citation

1. This policy may be cited as the *Environmental Protection (Kwinana)* (Atmospheric Wastes) Policy 1992.

## Purposes of policy

- 2. The purposes of this policy are
  - (a) to provide for ambient air quality standards and ambient air quality limits for the concentration of atmospheric wastes in the relevant portion of the environment; and
  - (b) to establish a programme which may be used to control the discharge of atmospheric wastes from industrial sources so that those ambient air quality standards and ambient air quality limits can respectively be achieved and complied with.

## Interpretation

3. (1) In this policy, unless the contrary intention appears —

## "atmospheric waste" means —

- (a) a gaseous substance of a kind prescribed by the regulations;
- (b) a particulate substance of a kind prescribed by the regulations; or
- (c) a combination of substances referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b):
- "determination" means a determination under clause 7 (3);
- "industrial source" means a point or area within industrial premises in the Policy Area from which an atmospheric waste is discharged into the air environment;
- "limit" means the concentration of an atmospheric waste which shall not be exceeded;
- "plan" means Department of Land Administration Miscellaneous Plan 1705 —
  - (a) a representation of which is set out in Schedule 1; and
  - (b) a copy of which is available for inspection at the head office of the Environmental Protection Authority in Perth;
- "Policy Area" means the area described in clause 4 (a);
- "redetermination" means a redetermination under clause 12 (1) or 13 (2);
- "relevant determination", in relation to an atmospheric waste, means the determination or redetermination, as the case requires, that provides for the maximum permissible quantities of that waste to be discharged from significant industrial sources;
- "relevant portion of the environment" means the portion of the environment referred to in clause 4 (b);
- "significant industrial source" means an industrial source from which the discharge of an atmospheric waste is, in the opinion of the Chief Executive Officer, such as to affect or to be likely to affect the relevant portion of the environment;
- "standard" means the concentration of an atmospheric waste which it is desirable not to exceed;
- "the regulations" means the regulations made under the Act to implement this policy.

- (2) A reference in this policy to
  - (a) Area A, is a reference to those portions of the Policy Area that are coloured pink on the plan;
  - (b) Area B, is a reference to those portions of the Policy Area that are
    - (i) located within the red border depicted on the plan but not located within Area A; or
    - (ii) located outside the red border depicted on the plan and zoned for industrial purposes from time to time under
      - (A) the Metropolitan Region Scheme within the meaning of the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act 1959; or
      - (B) a town planning scheme under the Town Planning and Development Act 1928;
  - (c) Area C, is a reference to those portions of the Policy Area not located within Area A or Area B.

## Application

- 4. This policy applies to -
  - (a) the area within the districts of the municipalities of the City of Cockburn, the Town of Kwinana and the City of Rockingham, as delineated and shown bordered in red on the map set out in Schedule 2; and
  - (b) that portion of the environment comprising a layer of air 5 metres thick
    - (i) immediately above, and immediately surrounding, the external surfaces of any residential premises situated within Area B or Area C; or
    - (ii) otherwise immediately above the surface of the Policy Area.

## Beneficial use to be protected

5. Any lawful human activity within the relevant portion of the environment which is conducive to the health, welfare, convenience, comfort or amenity of persons within the relevant portion of the environment is declared to be a beneficial use to be protected under this policy.

# Ambient air quality standards and ambient air quality limits for atmospheric wastes

6. (1) Subject to subclause (2), the ambient air quality standards and ambient air quality limits for the concentration of an atmospheric waste in the relevant portion of the environment that are intended to provide an acceptable level of protection for the beneficial use identified and declared under clause 5 are the standards and limits specified from time to time in respect of that atmospheric waste in the regulations.

(2) Within the boundaries of industrial premises in respect of which a licence is in force, the concentration of an atmospheric waste shall, for the purposes of this policy, be taken to exclude the contribution to that concentration made by the discharge, if any, of that atmospheric waste from industrial sources located within those boundaries.

## Determination of maximum permissible quantities of atmospheric wastes to be discharged

- 7. (1) Subject to clause 6 (2), the Chief Executive Officer may, in respect of each atmospheric waste, develop a procedure for determining the maximum permissible quantities of that waste to be discharged from industrial sources so that the ambient air quality standards and ambient air quality limits specified in respect of that waste under clause 6 can, in the opinion of the Chief Executive Officer, be achieved and complied with.
- (2) Without limiting the generality of subclause (1), in developing a procedure under that subclause the Chief Executive Officer may make allowance for any additional quantities of an atmospheric waste that may in the future be discharged from industrial sources.
- (3) The Chief Executive Officer may, subject to subclause (4), determine the maximum permissible quantities of an atmospheric waste to be discharged from significant industrial sources in accordance with the procedure developed in respect of that waste under subclause (1).
  - (4) Before making a determination, the Chief Executive Officer shall
    - (a) consult with persons representing such industries or industrial premises as the Chief Executive Officer considers may be affected by the determination; and
    - (b) take into account any views expressed by persons so consulted.
  - (5) A determination may provide for
    - (a) maximum permissible quantities expressed as a discharge rate (in units of mass per unit of time) or as a discharge concentration (in units of mass per unit of volume at specified reference conditions);
    - (b) maximum permissible quantities that
      - (i) are constant;
      - (ii) vary in a specified manner under specified conditions;
      - (iii) are expressed on a statistical basis;

and

- (c) more than one set of maximum permissible quantities, but in such a case shall also specify
  - (i) the set of maximum permissible quantities that is for the time being in force; and
  - (ii) the circumstances in which, and the method by which, a different set of maximum permissible quantities may be brought into force,

for the purposes of this policy.

(6) The Chief Executive Officer shall cause notice in writing of a determination to be served on each occupier of industrial premises in the Policy Area affected by the determination.

## Achievement of standards and compliance with limits

8. Without limiting the powers of the Chief Executive Officer under the Act in relation to the prevention, control or abatement of pollution, achievement of the ambient air quality standards and compliance with the ambient air quality limits specified in respect of an atmospheric waste under clause 6 may be brought about by requiring occupiers of industrial premises in the Policy Area to comply with the relevant determination.

## Requirement for compliance with relevant determination in pollution abatement notice or licence

- 9. (1) For the purposes of clause 8, in addition to any other requirements or conditions imposed by the Chief Executive Officer under the Act, the Chief Executive Officer may require
  - (a) under a pollution abatement notice; or
  - (b) as a condition of a licence prescribed under section 62 (1) (h) of the Act,

an occupier of industrial premises in the Policy Area to control the discharge of a specified atmospheric waste from specified industrial sources within those premises so as to ensure that the quantities of the waste so discharged comply with the relevant determination.

(2) In subclause (1) —

"specified" means specified in the pollution abatement notice or licence concerned.

## Time may be allowed for compliance with relevant determination

- 10. (1) If the Chief Executive Officer is satisfied that it is not practicable for an occupier of industrial premises in the Policy Area to control the discharge of an atmospheric waste from industrial sources within those premises so as to comply immediately with the relevant determination, the Chief Executive Officer may
  - (a) after consultation with the occupier, determine the period within which, and the manner in which, compliance with the relevant determination is to be achieved; and
  - (b) in addition to any other requirements or conditions imposed by the Chief Executive Officer under the Act, require the occupier under a pollution abatement notice or as a condition of a licence prescribed under section 62 (1) (h) of the Act
    - (i) to control the discharge of the atmospheric waste from those industrial sources so as to achieve compliance with the relevant determination within a specified period and in accordance with a specified compliance programme;

- (ii) to take such other measures (including the undertaking of monitoring and the installation of equipment) as are specified for the purpose of achieving, or monitoring the extent of, compliance with the relevant determination; and
- (iii) to furnish to the Chief Executive Officer, at such intervals of time as are specified, a report on the progress being made towards compliance with the relevant determination.
- (2) If the Minister is satisfied that it is not practicable for an occupier of industrial premises in the Policy Area to control the discharge of an atmospheric waste from industrial sources within those premises so as to comply immediately with the relevant determination, the Minister may direct the Chief Executive Officer to exercise, in respect of that occupier, the powers conferred by subclause (1) (a) and (b) to the satisfaction of the Minister.
  - (3) In subclause (1) —

"specified" means specified in the pollution abatement notice or licence concerned.

## Occupiers to undertake monitoring

- 11. (1) Where significant industrial sources are located within particular industrial premises in the Policy Area, the Chief Executive Officer may, as a condition of a licence under section 62 (1) (e) of the Act, require the occupier of those premises to carry out a specified monitoring programme to monitor
  - (a) the quantity (expressed as a discharge rate (in units of mass per unit of time) or as a discharge concentration (in units of mass per unit of volume at specified reference conditions)) of an atmospheric waste discharged from such of those sources, together with such other characteristics of that discharge, as are specified, and the volume and effects of that discharge; and
  - (b) the concentration of an atmospheric waste at specified locations in the relevant portion of the environment.
  - (2) In subclause (1) —

"specified" means specified in the licence concerned.

## Redetermination of maximum permissible quantities

- 12. (1) The Chief Executive Officer may, with the approval of the Minister, and shall, if the Minister so directs, redetermine the maximum permissible quantities of an atmospheric waste to be discharged from significant industrial sources in accordance with
  - (a) the procedure developed in respect of the atmospheric waste under clause ? (1); or
  - (b) where that procedure has been modified under subclause (3), the procedure as so modified.
- (2) Before approving or directing a redetermination under subclause (1), the Minister shall
  - (a) consult with persons representing such industries or industrial premises as the Minister considers may be affected by the redetermination; and


- (b) take into account any views expressed by persons so consulted.
- (3) Before making a redetermination under subclause (1), the Chief Executive Officer may modify the procedure developed in respect of the atmospheric waste under clause 7 (1) and for that purpose has the same powers and is subject to the same requirements as applied in relation to the development of the procedure.
- (4) Clause 7 (4), (5) and (6) applies to and in relation to a redetermination under subclause (1) as if that redetermination were a determination.

## Review where standards or limits are exceeded

- 13. (1) The Chief Executive Officer may, if the ambient air quality standards, and shall, if the ambient air quality limits, specified in respect of an atmospheric waste under clause 6 are exceeded at any location in the relevant portion of the environment, review the relevant determination.
- (2) As a result of a review conducted under subclause (1), the Chief Executive Officer may redetermine the maximum permissible quantities of the atmospheric waste to be discharged from significant industrial sources in accordance with
  - (a) the procedure developed in respect of the atmospheric waste under clause 7 (1); or
  - (b) where that procedure has been modified under subclause (3), the procedure as so modified.
- (3) Before making a redetermination under subclause (1), the Chief Executive Officer may modify the procedure developed in respect of the atmospheric waste under clause 7 (1) and for that purpose has the same powers and is subject to the same requirements as applied in relation to the development of the procedure.
- (4) Clause 7 (4), (5) and (6) applies to and in relation to a redetermination under subclause (2) as if that redetermination were a determination.



- 14. The Chief Executive Officer shall make available for public inspection at the head office of the Environmental Protection Authority in Perth the following information
  - (a) details of procedures developed under clause 7 (1) (including any modifications under clauses 12 (3) or 13 (3));
  - (b) details of determinations and redeterminations;
  - (c) details of determinations under clause 10 (1) (a);
  - (d) copies of reports furnished under clause 10 (1) (b) (iii);
  - (e) results of monitoring required under clause 11 (1) (b);
  - (f) details of the ambient concentration of an atmospheric waste within the relevant portion of the environment in every case giving rise to a review under clause 13 (1).

### NOTICE PURSUANT TO SECTION 33

Shire of Murray

Notice to Owners and/or Occupiers of Land Firebreak Order—1992-93

Important information relating to your responsibility as a landholder in the Murray Shire.

With reference to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this order.

This work must be carried out on or before the 30th day of November, 1992 or within fourteen days of the date of your becoming owner or occupier should this be after the 30th day of November, 1992 and thereafter up to and including the 26th day of April, 1993.

#### 1. Rural Land

- 1.1 To have a firebreak clear of all flammable materials, not less than two (2) metres wide and within fifty (50) metres of all boundaries of land abutting gazetted roads, railway reserves and Department of C.A.L.M. land boundaries, as well as land abutting "Special Rural" and "Urban lands".
- 1.2 Have firebreaks not less than two (2) metres wide so far as to surround all buildings, sheds, haystacks and fuel/depots/storage areas. The inner perimeter of such firebreaks to be within twenty (20) metres of the buildings, sheds, haystacks and fuel/depots/storage areas.
- 2. Special Rural Land—(Other than Rural as Previously Described)
  - 2.1 Where the area of land is 2024 sq. metres (approximately 1/2 acre) or LESS, remove all flammable material on the land except living standing trees, from the whole of the land.
  - 2.2 Where the area of land EXCEEDS 2024 sq. metres (1/2 acre), provide firebreaks of at least 2 metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land. Where several adjoining lots are held or used by the owner/occupier, the firebreaks may be provided inside and along the external boundaries of the group or lot and the requirements of items 2.1 and 2.2 shall be maintained throughout the summer months until the expiration of the restricted burning period, i.e. 26th April, 1993.

## 3. Urban Land

(Residential, Commercial and Industrial land within a townsite or within any area subdivided for residential purposes).

In respect of land owned or occupied by you within any townsite or any area subdivided for other purposes, you shall:

- 3.1 Where the area of land is 2024 sq. metres (approximately ½ acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living standing trees, from the whole of the land.
- 3.2 Where the area of land exceeds 2024 sq. metres (1/2 acre), provide firebreaks as in section 2.2. Inspection of firebreaks will be carried out in all areas of the Shire by an authorised officer.

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of this order may be issued with an infringement notice (penalty \$80.00) or prosecuted (of penalty not more than \$1 000.00), and additionally, Council may carry out the required work at cost to the owner or occupier.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to comply with the provisions of this order, you may make a written application for variation to the Shire Clerk which must reach him not less than two weeks prior to the date by which the firebreak is required to be established.

No such application will be considered unless it bears the signature of the Fire Control Officer of the area signifying his agreement to the variation. If the application is not approved by the Shire Clerk, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

N.B.—Islands in River Systems:

Owners and/or occupiers of Island Locations are required on or before November 30, 1992 and thereafter up to and including 26th April, 1993, to have a firebreak clear of all flammable material at least 2 metres wide immediately inside all boundaries of land.

## 4. Canal System Locations

The requirements of section 3. Urban Land, apply where the area of land is 2024 sq. metres or less and is subject to owners and/or occupiers complying with the following requirements:

(i) Undeveloped (vacant) lots shall not be ploughed, rotary hoed or cultivated in order that land remains stabilised and not become subject to erosion by wind and water.

## 5. Fuel and Gas Depots

In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquid, or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or supports are constructed, you shall maintain the land clear of all flammable materials.

#### 6. Hardwood Softwood Plantations

Plantations established since the 30th November, 1984, are required to provide firebreaks:

- 6.1 Not less than 20 metres wide around the perimeter of each plantation;
- 6.2 Not less than 10 metres wide along those portions of the plantations which abut a used
- 6.3 Not less than 10 metres vertical clearance, in width in such a position that no part or compartment of the plantation exceeds 30 hectares in area; AND
- 6.4 All firebreaks must be maintained in trafficable condition and trees on both sides of breaks progressively pruned to a minimum height of 4 metres to allow unrestricted access of maintenance and fire fighting-equipment and so as to maintain an effective width of firebreak.

Special Notice to Landowners and Occupiers

The Council forwards a copy of this Firebreak Order with rate assessments each year; the notice is also published in the Coastal District Times. The aim of the Council is to eliminate destructive bushfires and to this end, some areas of the Shire are subject to a District Fire Protection Plan where large-scale hazard removal and roadside burning is carried out by the Shire's Bush Fire Brigades and Council workforce.

Special Orders—Section 33

The requirements of this order are considered to be the minimum standard of fire prevention work required to protect not only individual properties but the district generally. In addition to the requirement of this order, Council may issue separate special orders on owners or occupiers if hazard removal is considered necessary.

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
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
