TOBACCO CONTROL (EXEMPTION) NOTICE (No. 12) 1992

Made by the Minister for Health under section 14 after consultation with the Minister for Sport and Recreation.

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the *Tobacco Control (Exemption) Notice (No. 12) 1992*.

Exemption

2. Subject to the conditions set out in clause 3, competitors, and persons officially supporting or directly assisting competitors, in the motor racing events known as the National Australian Sprintcar Title ("the Title") to be held in Western Australia in late January or early February 1993 are exempted from the operation of sections 5 and 8 of the *Tobacco Control Act 1990* in respect of the Title.

Conditions

3. The conditions subject to which the exemption referred to in clause 2 is granted are that—

- (a) any trademark or brand name of a tobacco product shall be displayed only—
 - (i) on the uniforms of the competitors, and of the persons officially supporting or directly assisting the competitors, in the Title;
 - (ii) on the motor vehicles participating in the Title;
 - (iii) on the official motor vehicles used exclusively for the transport of the competitors and the persons referred in subparagraph (i); and
 - (iv) when incidentally or accidentally present in photographs used to publicize the Title;
- (b) any trademark or brand name of a tobacco product, or any tobacco advertisement, shall be accompanied by the health warning—
 - (i) "SMOKING CAUSES LUNG CANCER"; or
 - (ii) "SMOKING CAUSES HEART DISEASE",
together with the statement "Health Authority Warning";
- (c) the area exclusively devoted to the display of the health warning referred to in paragraph (b) and the statement "Health Authority Warning" shall be not less than 25% of the area devoted to the display of the trademark or brand name or tobacco advertisement referred to in that paragraph;

- (d) the health warning referred to in paragraph (b) shall—
- (i) appear directly beneath the trademark or brand name or tobacco advertisement referred to in that paragraph and directly adjacent to the statement "Health Authority Warning";
 - (ii) appear in white Helvetica Bold capitals on a black background; and
 - (iii) occupy, together with the statement "Health Authority Warning", not less than 80% of the area devoted to the display of that health warning and that statement;
- and
- (e) the letters of the statement "Health Authority Warning" shall—
- (i) appear in Helvetica Medium capitals and Helvetica Medium lower case type; and
 - (ii) not exceed half the height of the letters used for the health warning referred to in paragraph (b).

The Old Swan Brewery Precinct has been entered in the Register of Heritage Places maintained under the Heritage of Western Australia Act 1990 ("Act"). Perth Lots 1034 and 1035 form part of the Precinct. The two lots are connected by Perth Lots 1036 and 1037.

1. Subject to Item 2 of this Order, the provisions of Part VIII and XV of the Local Government Act 1960, the Town Planning and Development Act 1928, the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act 1959, the Metropolitan Region Scheme and the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972, and all subsidiary legislation (as that term is defined in section 5 of the Interpretation Act 1984) made under any one or more of those provisions and all codes of practice, standards, and other legislative requirements arising from the operation of, or method of implementation of, those provisions (each such provision, subsidiary legislation, code of practice, standard, and other legislative requirement being referred to in this Order as a "Relevant Provision") will not apply to Perth Lots 1034, 1035, 1036 or 1037.
2. A Relevant Provision will have effect in relation to the use, planning or development of Perth Lots 1034, 1035, 1036 or 1037 if the approval of the Heritage Council of Western Australia has not been obtained in respect of that use, planning or development or if any condition on which that approval was given is not complied with.
3. In this Order "development" in relation to land includes:
 - (a) any demolition, erection, construction, alteration of or addition to any building or structure on or in the land;
 - (b) the carrying out on the land of any excavation, landscaping or other works."

 - (a) to provide an incentive to the conservation of the Brewery Buildings;

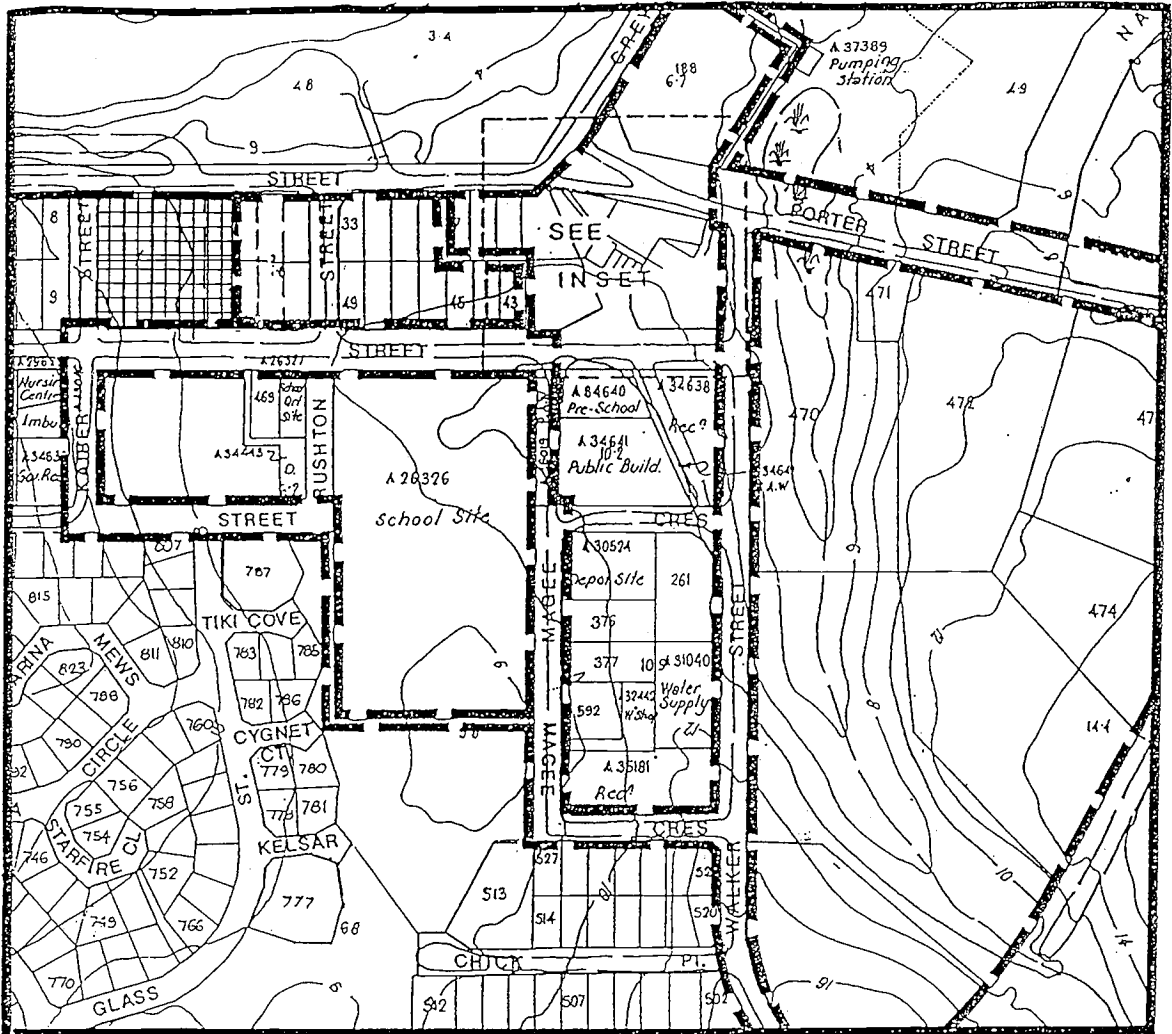

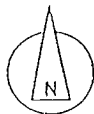

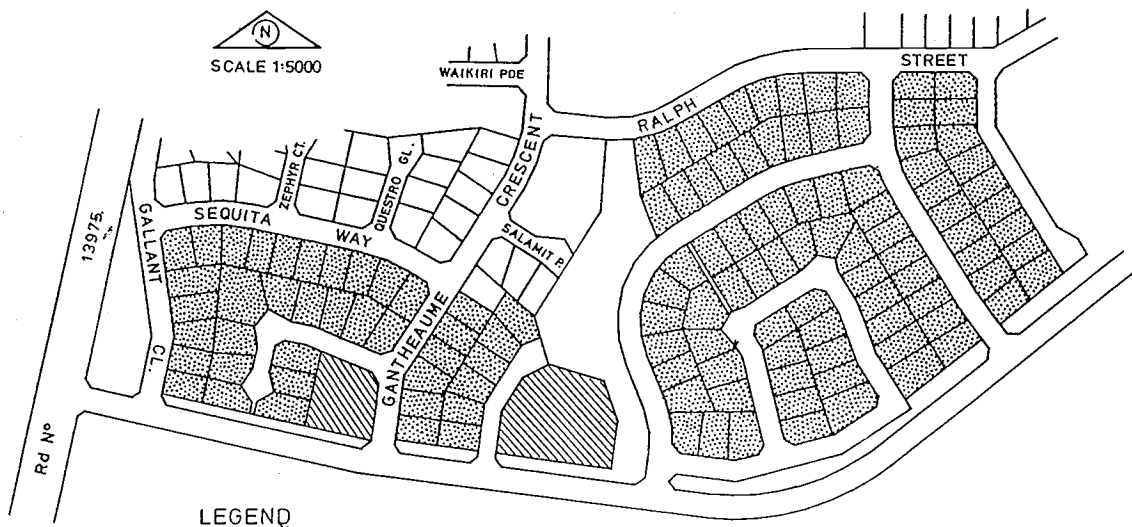
