City of Rockingham

FENCING BY-LAW

The Council of the City of Rockingham under the powers conferred upon it by the Local Government Act 1960 resolved on 1992 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law—

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

Citation

1. This By-law may be cited as the City of Rockingham Fencing By-law.

Repeal

2. The Fencing By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of 11 March 1983 are repealed.

Interpretation

3. In this By-law, unless the context requires otherwise—

“AS” means Australian Standard published by the Standards Association of Australia;

“building surveyor” means a building surveyor of the City;

“City” means the Municipality of the City of Rockingham;

“Council” means the Council of the City;

“dangerous” in relation to a fence means—

(a) an electrified fence (other than a fence in respect of which a licence under Part 3 of this By-law has been issued and is current);

(b) a fence containing barbed wire (other than a fence erected and maintained in accordance with this By-law); or

(c) a fence containing exposed broken glass, asbestos fibre or any other harmful projection or material,

and includes a fence which through lack of maintenance or repair becomes a dangerous fence;

“District” means the municipal district of the City;

“dividing fence” means a fence that—

(a) separates adjoining lots whether or not the fence is on the common boundary of those lots; or

(b) is on or near the boundary of a lot;

“electrified fence” means a fence carrying or designed to carry an electric charge;

“fence” means any structure, including a retaining wall, used or functioning as a fence irrespective of where it is located;

“frontage” means the boundary line between a lot and the street upon which that lot abuts;

“height” in relation to a fence means the vertical distance between—

(a) the top of the fence at any point; and

(b) the ground level or, where the ground levels on each side of the fence are the same, the higher ground level, immediately below that point

“Industrial Zone” means any part of the District other than a “Residential Zone” or a “Rural Zone”;

“lot” means a lot as defined by s.2 of the Town Planning and Development Act 1928;

“Principal Building Surveyor” means the City’s Principal Building Surveyor;

“Residential Zone” means any land within the District which, under the Scheme, is zoned—

(a) “Residential SR3”, “GR4” or “GR5”;

(b) principally for residential purposes; or

(c) “Development Zone” and the predominant use of that land is of a residential nature as determined in accordance with the Comprehensive Development Plan for that Development Zone;

“retaining wall” means any structure which prevents the movement of soil in order to allow ground levels of different elevations to exist adjacent to one another;

“Rural Zone” means any land within the District which, under the Scheme, is zoned—

(a) “Residential Deferred”, “Rural” or “Special Rural”;

(b) principally for rural purposes; or

(c) "Development Zone" and the predominant use of that land is of a rural nature as determined in accordance with the Comprehensive Development Plan for that Development Zone;

"Scheme" means the City of Rockingham Town Planning Scheme No. 1 as amended or substituted from time to time;

"setback area" means that portion of a lot situated between the street alignment and the building line as prescribed by the Scheme; and

"Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk of the City.

PART 2—GENERAL

Dividing Fences in a Residential Zone

4. (1) A person shall not, without the written consent of the Council, erect or commence to erect in a Residential Zone—

(a) on or near a boundary behind the building line, a dividing fence higher than 1800 mm; or

(b) in front of the building line a fence higher than 1000 mm.

(2) A fence higher than 1000 mm shall not be erected in front of the building line in a Residential Zone unless—

(a) the length of the fence on the front boundary does not exceed three-quarters of the total length of the front boundary and the remaining portion of the fence is set back a minimum distance of not less than 450 mm from the front boundary; and

(b) the fence on each side of the driveway into a lot across the front boundary is angled into the lot for a distance of not less than 1500 mm along the frontage to a distance of not less than 1500 mm from the frontage in order to provide appropriate splayed lines of vision for a motorist using the driveway for access to a road, street or way—in accordance with the diagram set out in the 5th Schedule.

Dividing Fences in an Industrial Zone

5. A person shall not, without the written consent of the Council, erect or commence to erect a dividing fence in an Industrial Zone.

Fences Within Front Setback Areas

6. A person shall not, without the written consent of the Council, erect or commence to erect a fence higher than 1000 mm within the front setback area of a lot within the District.

Fencing Materials

7. (1) A person shall not, without the written consent of the Council, erect or commence to erect a fence—

(a) using either sheet metal or previously used materials;

(b) of impervious material in any place where, in the opinion of the Council, it may act as a barrier to, or restrict in any way whatsoever, the normal flow of storm water or other watercourse in, on or over land; or

(c) which is or is likely to become dangerous.

(2) An application to the Council for consent to erect a fence using sheet metal or previously used materials must be in writing and accompanied by a plan and specifications and whatever other information may be required by the Council to satisfy it that the sheet metal or material is of an acceptable quality and appearance and is to be maintained adequately.

Retaining Walls

8. (1) A person shall not, without the written consent of the Council, erect or commence to erect a retaining wall on or near a boundary line.

(2) An application for consent to erect a retaining wall shall—

(a) where the wall is less than 450 mm in height, be made in writing to the Council; and

(b) where the wall is equal to or greater than 450 mm in height, be made in writing to the Council in the form of a building licence application in accordance with the Building Regulations 1989.

Barbed Wire Fences

9. A person shall not erect or commence to erect a fence wholly or partly of barbed wire except—

(a) in a Rural Zone—for the purpose of controlling stock;

(b) in an Industrial Zone—but only if no barbed wire is used below a height of 1800 mm; or

(c) in any other part of the District—with the written consent of the Council which may be given only if no barbed wire is used below a height of 1800 mm.

Maintenance of Fences

10. (1) For the purposes of this clause, "disrepair" includes dangerous, neglected, ruinous, dilapidated, unsightly or prejudicial to the amenity of the locality.

(2) An owner or occupier of land on which a fence is erected shall maintain the fence in good condition and so as to prevent it from falling into disrepair.

(3) Where, in the opinion of the Council, a fence is in a state of disrepair or is otherwise in breach of a provision of this By-law, the Principal Building Surveyor may give notice in writing to the owner or occupier of the land upon which the fence is erected requiring the owner or occupier to modify, repair, paint or maintain the fence within the time stipulated in the notice.

(4) Where an owner or occupier of land who has been given notice under sub-clause (3), fails to comply with the requirements of the notice, the Council may enter the land and carry out the work specified in the notice and recover the costs and expenses incurred by it in so doing from the owner or occupier in a court of competent jurisdiction.

General Discretion of the Council

11. (1) The Council may consent to the erection or retention of a fence which does not comply with one or more of the requirements of this By-law.

(2) In determining whether to grant its consent for the erection or retention of a fence on any land, the Council may consider, in addition to any other matter that it is authorised to consider, whether the erection or retention of the fence might have an adverse effect on—

- (a) the safety, convenience or use of any other land;
- (b) the safety or convenience of any person;
- (c) the orderly and proper planning of the locality; and
- (d) the amenities of the locality.

PART 3—ELECTRIFIED FENCES**Requirement for a Licence**

12. (1) A person shall not—

- (a) erect or retain an electrified fence other than in accordance with a licence issued under this Part; or
- (b) alter an electrified fence without first obtaining the written consent of the Council.

(2) A licence for an electrified fence shall not be issued—

- (a) in respect of premises within a Residential Zone; and
- (b) unless the fence complies with AS 3129, 1989.

Licence Application

13. (1) An application for a licence to erect or retain an electrified fence shall be—

- (a) made either—
 - (i) by the owner of the land; or
 - (ii) with the written consent of the owner, by the occupier, of the land;
- (b) made in writing and addressed to the Town Clerk;
- (c) accompanied by—
 - (i) a plan clearly identifying both the land and the location on that land on which the electrified fence is, or is to be, erected;
 - (ii) plans and specifications of the electrified fence; and
 - (iii) any other plan or information that the Council may require to enable the application to be determined; and
- (d) forwarded to the Town Clerk together with a licence fee of \$50.00.

(2) Upon receipt of an application for a licence, the Council may—

- (a) grant the application subject to such conditions as it thinks fit;
- (b) require the applicant to forward to it such further information as the Council may require to enable the application to be determined; or
- (c) refuse to grant the application.

(3) A licence granted by the Council shall be—

- (a) in the form of the 4th Schedule;
- (b) signed by the Town Clerk; and
- (c) issued upon and subject to the following conditions, namely, that the licence holder shall—
 - (i) display the licence in a prominent position on the land or premises on which the electrified fence has been erected;
 - (ii) upon the request of a building surveyor produce to him or her the licence;

- (iii) within 14 days of a change in the ownership or occupation of the land or premises in respect of which the licence has been granted, notify the Town Clerk in writing of the details of that change or those changes; and
- (iv) obtain the written consent of the Council prior to the commencement of any alteration, addition or other work relating to or affecting the electrified fence.

Transfer of a Licence

14. (1) An application for the transfer of a licence shall be—
- (a) made either—
 - (i) by the owner of the land; or
 - (ii) with the written consent of the owner, by the occupier, of the land, in respect of which the licence was granted;
 - (b) made in writing and addressed to the Town Clerk;
 - (c) signed by the proposed transferee of the licence and the holder of the licence; and
 - (d) forwarded to the Town Clerk together with a licence transfer fee of \$30.00.
- (2) Upon receipt of an application for the transfer of a licence, the Council may—
- (a) grant the application subject to such conditions as it thinks fit;
 - (b) require the applicant to forward to it such further information as the Council may require to enable the application to be determined; or
 - (c) refuse to grant the application.
- (3) Where the Council grants an application for the transfer of a licence—
- (a) an endorsement to that effect, signed by the Town Clerk, shall be completed on the licence in accordance with the form set out in the 4th Schedule; and
 - (b) the licence shall be subject to the conditions set out in clause 13 (3) (c).

Cancellation of a Licence

15. The Council may, at any time during the currency of a licence, cancel the licence if—
- (a) the licence holder has ceased to be the owner or occupier of the land or premises upon which the electrified fence was erected;
 - (b) the licence holder has been convicted of an offence against this By-law in respect of the electrified fence;
 - (c) the licence holder has procured the issue of the licence by means of any false or misleading statement or conduct;
 - (d) for safety, environmental, town planning or other reasons the Council considers that the electrified fence should not be retained;
 - (e) the Council considers that the electrified fence does not comply with AS 3129, 1989; or
 - (f) the Council considers that the holder of the licence has, during the currency of the licence, by reason of his or her conduct or on any other grounds become unsuitable or has ceased to be a fit and proper person to hold a licence.

PART 4—MISCELLANEOUS

Sufficient Fences

16. (1) In this clause "sufficient fence" means a sufficient fence for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act 1961.
- (2) Subject to sub-clause (3), a sufficient fence—
- (a) in a Residential Zone is a dividing fence constructed and maintained in accordance with the specifications and requirements set out in the 1st Schedule;
 - (b) in an Industrial Zone is a dividing fence constructed and maintained in accordance with the specifications and requirements set out in the 2nd Schedule; and
 - (c) in a Rural Zone is a dividing fence constructed and maintained in accordance with the specifications and requirements set out in the 3rd Schedule.
- (3) Where a fence is erected on or near the boundary between—
- (a) a Residential Zone and an Industrial Zone, a sufficient fence is a dividing fence constructed and maintained in accordance with the specifications and requirements set out in the 1st Schedule;
