Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the North Coast Shark Fishing (Professional) Notice 1993.

Interpretation

- 2. In this notice unless the contrary intention appears-
 - "attended" means within 100 metres of the nearest part of the line;
 - "demersal gillnet" means any net intended or used for the taking of fish that when set is wholly or partially in continuous or intermittent contact with the sea bed;
 - "pelagic gillnet" means any net intended or used for the taking of fish that has a mesh size greater than 114 millimetres and is not a demersal gillnet;
 - "power hauled" means any method or means of hauling a net on board a boat other than solely by hand;
 - "shark longline" means any longline that uses any metal material in the snood;
 - "shark dropline" means any dropline which uses any metal material in the snood; and
 - "snood" means the short line attaching a hook to the main line of any fishing line.

Prohibition on using shark fishing gear

3. All persons, other than the class of persons described in Schedule 1, are prohibited from using, for the purpose of taking or attempting to take fish, from the waters specified in Schedule 2 any equipment of the type specified in Schedule 3.

Exemption

- 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 3-
 - (a) a person who is not operating from a licensed fishing boat may use hand lines, rod reel and lines or one attended set line with metal material in the snood or snoods provided that the line does not have more than 3 hooks or gangs of hooks attached; or
 - (b) a licensed professional fisherman may use gillnets in the Kimberley Gillnet and Barramundi Limited Entry Fishery* if those nets are being used from a fishing unit authorised to be operated in the Fishery and in accordance with the provisions of the notice declaring the Fishery.

Schedule 1

The holder of a professional fisherman's licence using a boat operating under a Fishing Boat Licence, provided that the Fishing Boat Licence is endorsed to permit the use of that boat to take fish from within the waters specified in Schedule 2 using any of the equipment specified in Schedule 3.

All Western Australian waters off the north coast east of 114° 06' east longitude.

 - (ii) Pumping or diversion of water from the Stream Protection Area is not permitted unless with the prior approval of the WAWA and the Council.

 - (iv) If, in the opinion of WAWA and the Council the activities of livestock within the Stream Protection Area are contributing to erosion, pollution of the stream or the degradation of vegetation, the landowner may be required to erect and maintain a fence of satisfactory standard in order to protect the area and exclude livestock therefrom.
 - (v) Cultivation of land or spraying of pesticides or herbicides, or the application of non-nitrogenous fertiliser is not permitted unless with the prior approval of the WAWA and the Council, but the provision does not preclude the carrying out of control for weeds or pests in accordance with the requirements of the Agriculture Protection Board.

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
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
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
