The boundary parts of Rushton Road (both sides) Albany Highway (both sides) and Fremantle Road (both sides), are included within the optional area, while the boundary parts of Mills Road West (both sides) and Gosnells Road (both sides) are excluded from the optional area.

EAST WAIKIKI PRIMARY SCHOOL

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From Read Street at a point adjacent to the northern arm of Frome Way, in an eastnortheasterly direction from this point to and along Frome Way to Breaden Drive, south along Breaden Drive to Norring Street, in an eastnortheasterly direction between Raby Court, Lara Court, Greta Court and Rydal Court to the north and Tanby Place, Windale Place and Toora Place to the south to and across Linville Avenue and Willmott Drive to Grange Drive, continuing in a general northeasterly direction along Grange Drive to Ennis Avenue, in a general southerly direction along Ennis Avenue to Willmott Drive, west along Willmott Drive to Gngangara Drive, in a general westerly direction along Gngangara Drive to Read Street and northnorthwest along Read Street to a point adjacent to the northern arm of Frome Way.

The boundary parts of Frome Way (both sides), Ennis Avenue (west side), Willmott Drive (north side) and Read Street (east side) and the boundary streets of Grange Drive (south side) and Gngangara Drive (north side) are included within the area for East Waikiki Primary School, while the boundary parts of Breaden Drive (both sides) are excluded from the area for East Waikiki Primary School.

The following is an optional area for East Waikiki, Charthouse, Koorana and Warnbro Primary Schools:

The area bounded by Gngangara Drive (south side), Read Street (east side), Safety Bay Road (north side), Ennis Avenue (west side), and Willmott Drive (south side).

FOREST CRESCENT PRIMARY SCHOOL

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From the junction of Warton Road and Forest Lakes Drive, northwest along Forest Lakes Drive to Murdoch Road, northwest along Murdoch Road to Yale Road, southeast along Yale Road to the locality boundary between Canning Vale and Thornlie, southeast along this boundary to Warton Road, and northeast along Warton Road to Forest Lakes Drive.

The boundary parts of Forest Lakes Drive (both sides), Yale Road (both sides) and Warton Road (northwest side) and the boundary street of Murdoch Road (southwest side) are included within the area for Forest Crescent Primary School.

The following is an optional area between Forest Crescent and Canning Vale Primary Schools:

From the intersection of Nicholson Road and Ranford Road, southeast and south along Ranford Road to Warton Road, northeast along Warton Road to the locality boundary between Canning Vale and Thornlie, northwest along this boundary to the railway line, southwest along the railway line to the northern extension of Nicholson Court, south to and along Nicholson Court and its extension to Nicholson Road and south along Nicholson Road to Ranford Road.

The boundary parts of Ranford Road (both sides) and Nicholson Road (east side) and the boundary street of Nicholson Court (both sides) are included within the optional area, while the boundary parts of Warton Road (both sides) are excluded from the optional area.

The following is an optional area between Forest Crescent and Huntingdale Primary Schools:

From the junction of Ranford Road and Southern River Road, northeast along Southern River Road to Gay Street, northwest along Gay Street and its extension to Warton Road, southwest along Warton Road to Ranford Road and southeast along Ranford Road to Southern River Road.

The boundary parts of Southern River Road (both sides), Warton Road (both sides), Ranford Road (both sides) and the boundary street of Gay Street (both sides), are included within the optional area.

FORRESTDALE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From the intersection of Ranford Road and Warton Road, southwest along Warton Road to Forrest Road, west along Forrest Road to a point due north of the western arm of Murdoch Way, due south from this point to Thomas Road (Anketell), east, northeast and east along Thomas Road to the Birriga Drain, north and east along the Birriga Drain to Kargotich Road, northeast along Kargotich Road to Rowley Road, east along Rowley Road (and including the feeder street of Lentara Place)

to Hopkinson Road, north from this point to Forrest Road, west and northwest along Forrest Road to Twelfth Road, northnortheast along Twelfth Road to Armadale Road, west along Armadale Road to a point coinciding with the extension of Brigade Road, northeast from this point to and along Brigade Road and its extension to Lake Road, northeast along Lake Road to Ranford Road, and northwest along Ranford Road to Warton Road.

The boundary parts of Warton Road (southeast side, between Ranford Road and Nicholson Road), (both sides, between Nicholson Road and Forrest Road), Forrest Road (western section, both sides), (eastern section, south and southwest side), Armadale Road (south side), Ranford Road (both sides) and the boundary streets of Murdoch Way (both sides) and Twelfth Road (both sides) are included within the area for Forrestdale Primary School, while the boundary parts of Thomas Road (both sides), Kargotich Road (both sides), Rowley Road (both sides), Hopkinson Road (both sides), Lake Road (both sides) and the boundary streets of Lentara Place (both sides) and Brigade Road (both sides) are excluded from the area for Forrestdale Primary School.

The following is an optional area between Forrestdale and Marri Grove Primary Schools:

From the junction of Hopkinson Road and Rowley Road, west along Rowley Road (and including Lentara Place) to Kargotich Road, southwest along Kargotich Road to the Birriga Drain, in a general easterly direction along the Birriga Drain to Hopkinson Road, and north along Hopkinson Road to Rowley Road.

The boundary parts of Rowley Road (both sides), Kargotich Road (both sides), Hopkinson Road (both sides) and the boundary street of Lentara Place (both sides) are included within the optional area.

The following is an optional area between Forrestdale and Willandra Primary Schools:

The area bounded by Ranford Road, Lake Road, the locality boundary between Westfield and Armadale and the local authority boundary between the cities of Armadale and Gosnells.

The boundary parts of Ranford Road (both sides) and Lake Road (both sides) are included within the optional area.

Any child living outside the main catchment area or the optional areas for Forrestdale Primary School and whose area of residence is served by a bus to Forrestdale Primary School, will not be excluded from attending that school. In the event, however, that any such service is discontinued, transport to Forrestdale Primary School will become a parental responsibility.

FORRESTFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL

The boundary between Forrestfield Primary School and Woodlupine Primary School and Early Childhood Education Unit is as follows:

From the intersection of Tonkin Highway and Hale Road, in a general northeasterly direction along Hale Road to Hawtin Road and northnortheast along Hawtin Road to Sultana Road East.

The boundary parts of Hale Road (south and southeast sides) and Hawtin Road (east side) are included within the area for Forrestfield Primary School.

The following is an optional area for Forrestfield, Dawson Park and Woodlupine Primary Schools and Woodlupine Early Childhood Education Unit:

From the intersection of Tonkin Highway and Hale Road, northeast along Hale Road to Cypress Road, northwest along Cypress Road and its extension to Roe Highway, southwest along Roe Highway to Tonkin Highway, and southeast along Tonkin Highway to Hale Road.

The boundary parts of Hale Road (northwest side), Roe Highway (southeast side) and Tonkin Highway (northeast side) are included within the optional area, while the boundary street of Cypress Road (both sides) is excluded from the optional area.

GOSNELLS PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following is an optional area between Gosnells Primary School and East Maddington Primary School:

From the eastern extremity of Rushton Road, northwest along Rushton Road to Ellis Brook, in a general westerly direction along Ellis Brook to Mills Road West, northwest along Mills Road West to Gosnells Road, west along Gosnells Road to Albany Highway, south along Albany Highway to Fremantle Road, west along Fremantle Road to the railway line, southeast and south along the railway line to the Seaforth Senior Citizens' Centre and east from this point to Canning Mills Road.

The boundary parts of Rushton Road (both sides) Albany Highway (both sides) and Fremantle Road (both sides), are included within the optional area, while the boundary parts of Mills Road West (both sides) and Gosnells Road (both sides) are excluded from the optional area.

HELENA VALLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From the junction of Katharine Street and Frederic Street, northeast and east along Frederic Street and its extension to Coulston Road, southsoutheast along Coulston Road to Marriott Road, due east from this point to the locality boundary between Boya and Darlington, and due south from this point to the Helena River.

The boundary parts of Coulston Road (both sides) and the boundary street of Frederick Street (south side) are included within the area for Helena Valley Primary School.

JANDAKOT PRIMARY SCHOOL

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From the junction of Hammond Road and Forrest Road, southeast along Forrest Road to Semple Court, northeast, north and east along Semple Court and its extension to the Kwinana Freeway, north along the Kwinana Freeway to Berrigan Drive, northeast and north along Berrigan Drive to the southern arm of Glendale Crescent, east from this point to the southwest perimeter of Jandakot Airport, northwest along the Airport perimeter to Berrigan Drive, in a general northerly direction along Berrigan Drive to Hope Road, west along Hope Road to Karel Avenue, northeast and north along Karel Avenue to the proposed Roe Highway, northeast along the proposed Roe Highway to the western extension of Leeming Road, east to and along Leeming Road to Johnston Road, south along Johnston Road to Acourt Road, south and east along Acourt Road to Warton Road, southwest along Warton Road to Forrest Road, west along Forrest Road to a point due north of the western arm of Murdoch Way, due south from this point to Rowley Road, west along Rowley Road to Lyon Road, south along Lyon Road to Rowley Road, west along Rowley Road to Frankland Avenue, north, west, north, west and north along Frankland Avenue to Russell Road, northeast and north along Russell Road to Hammond Road, and north along Hammond Road to Forrest Road.

The boundary parts of Forrest Road (western section, south side), Kwinana Freeway (east side), Roe Highway (south side), Leeming Road (south side), Rowley Road (north side), Lyon Road (both sides), and the boundary streets of Frankland Avenue (both sides) and Hammond Road (both sides) are included within the area for Jandakot Primary School, while the boundary parts of Berrigan Drive (both sides), Glendale Crescent (both sides), Hope Road (both sides), Karel Avenue (both sides), Johnston Road (both sides), Warton Road (both sides), Forrest Road eastern section, both sides), Murdoch Way (both sides), Russell Road (both sides), and the boundary streets of Semple Court (both sides) and Acourt Road (both sides), are excluded from the area for Jandakot Primary School.

KELMSCOTT PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following is an optional area between Kelmscott and Westfield Park Primary Schools:

From the junction of Railway Avenue and Westfield Road, southwest along Westfield Road to Cammillo Road, southeast along Cammillo Road to Railway Avenue, and north along Railway Avenue to Westfield Road.

The boundary parts of Westfield Road (southeast side) and Railway Avenue (both sides), are included within the optional area, while the boundary parts of Cammillo Road (both sides) are excluded from the optional area.

KOORANA PRIMARY SCHOOL

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From the junction of Safety Bay Road and Warnbro Sound Avenue, south along Warnbro Sound Avenue to the locality boundary between Port Kennedy and Warnbro, east along this boundary to Ennis Avenue, north along Ennis Avenue to Safety Bay Road and west along Safety Bay Road to Warnbro Sound Avenue.

The boundary parts of Warnbro Sound Avenue (east side), Ennis Avenue (west side) and Safety Bay Road (south side) are included within the area for Koorana Primary School.

Children attending Government schools in Year 7 in 1994 and living within the area for Koorana Primary School, may complete their primary education at their 1993 school or may transfer to Koorana Primary School.

Children in Years 1 to 6 inclusive in 1994 (Years 1 to 7 inclusive thereafter) and living within the area for Koorana Primary School, shall attend Koorana Primary School, except that younger siblings of year 7 (1994) children shall have the option of remaining with any Year 7 siblings who elect to complete their primary education at their 1993 school. These younger siblings will be required, however, to transfer to their zoned school after 1994.

The following is an optional area for Koorana, Charthouse, East Waikiki and Warnbro Primary Schools:

The area bounded by Gngangara Drive (south side), Read Street (east side), Safety Bay Road (north side), Ennis Avenue (west side) and Willmott Drive (south side).

LANDSDALE AREA

Until a primary school is established in Landsdale, children of primary-school age resident in that locality shall attend either Wanneroo Junior Primary School or Wanneroo Primary School, except that:

Landsdale children who in 1993, attended either Alinjarra, Illawarra or Marangaroo Primary School, or any Government school in Girrawheen or Koondoola, may continue to attend that school. This concession shall extend to younger siblings.

MARRI GROVE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From the intersection of Forrest Road and Eleventh Road, southeast along Eleventh Road to the railway line, south along the railway line to the branch railway line south of Bishop Road, northwest and west along this railway line to Hopkinson Road, north along Hopkinson Road to Rowley Road, continuing in a northerly direction to Forrest Road, and northeast along Forrest Road to Eleventh Road.

The boundary street of Hopkinson Road (both sides) (except between the southern and northern arms of Rowley Road) is included within the area for Marri Grove Primary School, while the boundary parts of Eleventh Road (both sides) and Forrest Road (both sides) are excluded from the area for Marri Grove Primary School.

The following is an optional area between Marri Grove and Byford Primary Schools:

From the junction of Eleventh Road and the South Western Highway, south along the South Western Highway to Norman Road, west along Norman Road to the railway line, north along the railway line to Eleventh Road and east along Eleventh Road to the South Western Highway.

The boundary parts of Eleventh Road (south side), the South Western Highway (west side) and the boundary street of Norman Road (both sides) are included within the optional area.

The following is an optional area between Marri Grove and Forrestdale Primary Schools:

From the junction of Hopkinson Road and Rowley Road, west along Rowley Road (and including Lentara Place) to Kargotich Road, southwest along Kargotich Road to the Birriga Drain, in a general easterly direction along the Birriga Drain to Hopkinson Road, and north along Hopkinson Road to Rowley Road.

The boundary parts of Rowley Road (both sides), Kargotich Road (both sides), Hopkinson Road (both sides) and the boundary street of Lentara Place (both sides) are included within the optional area.

NORTH TOM PRICE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The boundary between North Tom Price Primary School and Tom Price Primary School is as follows: The Dampier-Paraburdoo railway line.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1994 and thereafter and living west of the railway line shall attend North Tom Price Primary School, except as follows:

- (a) Children from the caravan park shall attend Tom Price Primary School.
- (b) Children currently (1993) attending North Tom Price Primary School and living outside the area for that school shall have the option of remaining there or of transferring to Tom Price Primary School.

This concession shall be extended to younger siblings, but will not apply to new families moving to the town of Tom Price after the end of the 1993 school year, or to families sending children to school for the first time. Children of such families will be required to attend the school within whose area they reside.

The following is an optional area between Tom Price and North Tom Price Primary Schools:

North Road and Milpera Street and all streets to the north thereof which are east of the railway line.

SOUTH BALLAJURA PRIMARY SCHOOL

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From the junction of Cassowary Drive and Illawarra Crescent South, northeast along Illawarra Crescent South to Shearwater Terrace, east along Shearwater Terrace to Pelican Parade, northeast and east along Pelican Parade to Kingfisher Avenue, north along Kingfisher Avenue as far as No 116, northeast from this point to the locality boundary between Ballajura and Cullacabardee, southeast along this boundary to the locality boundary between Ballajura and Whiteman, south along this boundary to Marshall Road, west along Marshall Road to Weir Road, north along Weir Road to Cassowary Drive, and west and northwest along Cassowary Drive to Illawarra Crescent South.

The boundary parts of Pelican Parade (south side), Kingfisher Avenue (both sides), Marshall Road (both sides), Cassowary Drive (both sides) and the boundary street of Weir Road (both sides) are included within the area for South Ballajura Primary School, while the boundary parts of Illawarra Crescent South (both sides) and the boundary street of Shearwater Terrace (both sides) are excluded from the area for South Ballajura Primary School.

Children attending Government schools in Year 7 in 1994 and living within the area for South Ballajura Primary, may complete their primary education at their 1993 school or may transfer to South Ballajura Primary School.

Children in Years 1 to 6 inclusive in 1994 (Years 1 to 7 inclusive thereafter) and living within the area for South Ballajura Primary School, shall attend South Ballajura Primary School.

SOUTH LAKE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From the intersection of Karel Avenue and the proposed Roe Highway, west along the alignment of the proposed Roe Highway to the Kwinana Freeway, south along the Kwinana Freeway to the railway line, southwest along the railway line to Forrest Road, southeast along Forrest Road to Semple Court, northeast, north and east along Semple Court and its extension to the Kwinana Freeway, north along the Kwinana Freeway to Berrigan Drive, northeast and north along Berrigan Drive to the southern arm of Glendale Crescent, east from this point to the southwest perimeter of Jandakot Airport, northwest along the Airport perimeter to Berrigan Drive, in a general northerly direction along Berrigan Drive to Hope Road, west along Hope Road to Karel Avenue, and northeast and north along Karel Avenue to the proposed Roe Highway.

The boundary parts of the Roe Highway (south side), Kwinana Freeway (northern section, east side) (southern section, west side), Forrest Road (northeast side), Hope Road (both sides), Karel Avenue (both sides), Glendale Crescent (both sides), Berrigan Drive (both sides), and the boundary street of Semple Court (both sides), are included within the area for South Lake Primary School.

TOM PRICE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following is an optional area between Tom Price and North Tom Price Primary Schools:

North Road and Milpera Street and all streets to the north thereof which are east of the railway line.

WARNBRO PRIMARY SCHOOL

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From the Indian Ocean at a point coinciding with the westerly extension of Hokin Street, east from this point to Hokin Street, northeast along Hokin Street to Safety Bay Road, east along Safety Bay Road to Warnbro Sound Avenue, south along Warnbro Sound Avenue to the locality boundary between Port Kennedy and Warnbro, and east along this boundary to Ennis Avenue.

The boundary parts of Safety Bay Road (south side) and Warnbro Sound Avenue (west side) are included within the area for Warnbro Primary School, while the boundary street of Hokin Street (both sides) is excluded from the area for Warnbro Primary School.

The boundary parts of Hale Road (north and northwest sides) and Hawtin Road (west side) are included within the area for Woodlupine Primary School and Early Childhood Education Unit.

3. A person who has been granted approval under Sub-by-law (2) hereof to keep sheep may keep the sheep on the premises only while they are the occupiers thereof;
4. A person who has been granted approval under the Sub-by-law (2) hereof to keep sheep may keep the sheep on the premises only for the time period approved by the Council;
5. The local authority may cancel the approval granted to an occupier under Sub-by-law (2) hereof upon receipt of substantial complaints relating to the keeping of the said sheep;
6. This By-law operates and has effect on the whole of the district of the Town of Bassendean; and
7. This By-law has effect notwithstanding By-law 28 (A) of this part.

Keeping of Poultry

29A Interpretation—

In this By-law the term “Poultry” shall include fowls, bantams, peafowls, turkeys, geese and ducks and other domestic fowls.

- (a) The occupier of any premises shall not keep more than twelve (12) poultry without the written approval of the Local Authority.
- (b) The occupier of any premises shall not keep any rooster, except with the written approval of the Local Authority.

- (c) All structures used to house poultry, shall be of sound construction, the frame work and roost being of smooth sealed materials, the roof and walls to be constructed of galvanised iron, colourbond or other approved material and the floor to be constructed of concrete or other approved material which provides a smooth impervious finish laid with a fall of 1 in 50 to the front.
- (d) The occupier of any premises shall not keep poultry within 9 metres of any dwelling house.
- (e) All poultry shall be continually confined within required enclosures.
- (f) The occupier shall maintain all enclosures, within which poultry are kept in a clean condition at all times. The occupier, when directed in writing by the Environmental Health Officer, shall at any time clean, disinfect or carry out such work as directed on the structures.
- (g) All food stored for feeding poultry shall be kept in fly and vermin proof containers and the surrounding area kept in a clean condition at all times. The occupier, when directed in writing by the Environmental Health Officer, shall at any time clean, disinfect or carry out such work as directed on the structures.
- (h) Poultry faeces and other waste is to be disposed of in such a manner that it is inaccessible to flies or vermin.
- (i) A person who has been granted approval under this By-law to keep poultry may only keep the poultry on the premises for which the approval was granted.
- (j) The Local Authority may cancel or revoke at any time in writing, any approvals issued under these by-laws.

By-law Relating to Parking Facilities

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 19th July 1993, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following amendments to the abovementioned By-law as published in the *Government Gazette* on 17 August 1990.

1. Clause 3 is amended by the introduction of the following definition—
 - “ “Built up area” means—
 - the territory contiguous to and including any road—
 - (a) on which there is provision for lighting by means of street lamps; or
 - (b) which is built up with structures devoted to business, industry or dwelling houses at intervals of less than 100 metres for a distance of one half kilometre or more; or
 - (c) beyond a sign indicating “BUILT-UP AREA” erected at the roadside to face drivers approaching a development consisting of dwelling houses, or business or industrial structures. ”
2. Part 8—Obstructing Vehicles is amended by deleting clauses 76 and 77 and substituting the following—
 - “ 76.1 A vehicle which is parked in any portion of a public place wherein vehicles may not lawfully be parked is deemed to be causing an obstruction.
 - 76.2 A person shall not park a vehicle in a public place so as to obstruct any portion of that place.
 - 77. A person shall not park a vehicle or any combination of vehicles that, together with any projection on, or load carried by, the vehicle or combination of vehicles, is more than eight metres in length or three metres in width—
 - (a) on a carriageway in a built up area, for any period exceeding one hour;
 - (b) on a carriageway outside a built up area, except in a truck bay or other areas set aside for the parking of service vehicles;
 - (c) on a car park or reserve, except in a truck bay or other area set aside for the parking of service vehicles. ”

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960
City of Rockingham
Street Performers By-law 1993

Under the powers conferred upon it by the Local Government Act 1960, the Council of the City of Rockingham resolved on 24 August 1993 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law—

Citation

1. This By-law may be cited as the *City of Rockingham Street Performers By-law 1993*.

Definitions

2. In this By-law, unless the context requires otherwise—

“Act” means the Local Government Act 1960;

“authorised officer” means an officer of the Council authorised by the Town Clerk;

“City” means the municipality of the City of Rockingham;

“Council” means the Council of the City;

“licence” means a licence issued under this By-law;

“licence holder” means a person who holds a valid licence;

“perform” includes play a musical instrument, sing, mime, dance, give an acrobatic or aerobic display or entertain but does not include public speaking;

“permitted area” means the area or areas, specified in a licence, in which the licence holder may perform;

“permitted time” means the time or times, specified in a licence, during which the licence holder may perform;

“street” has the same meaning as it has in the Act;

[Note : the Act defines “street” to include—

“ a highway; and

a thoroughfare;

which—

the public are allowed to use;

and includes every part of the highway or thoroughfare, and other things including bridges and culverts, appurtenant to it”]; and

“Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk or Acting Town Clerk of the City.

Application

3. This By-law applies only with respect to the area set out in Schedule 1.

Requirement For a Licence

4. A person must not perform in a street unless he or she is the holder of a valid licence.

Application For a Licence

5. An application for a licence is to be in the form set out in Schedule 2 and is to be forwarded to the Town Clerk.

Determination of an Application

6. The Town Clerk or an authorised officer may, in respect of an application for a licence—

(a) refuse the application; or

(b) approve the application on such terms and conditions, if any, as he or she thinks fit.

Issue of Licence

7. When an application is approved under cl.6, the Town Clerk or an authorised officer is to issue to the applicant, upon payment of a fee of \$5.00, a licence in the form of Schedule 3.

Variation to Licence Conditions

8. (1) The Town Clerk may from time to time by notice in writing to a licence holder vary—

(a) the permitted area;

(b) the permitted time; or

(c) both the permitted area and the permitted time.

(2) The Town Clerk or an authorised officer may direct a licence holder to move from a permitted area to another area.

Length of the Licence

9. A licence is valid for a period of three months after the date on which it was issued unless it is sooner cancelled under this By-law.

Cancellation of a Licence

10. (1) The Town Clerk may cancel a licence if, in his or her opinion—

(a) the licence holder has breached a condition of the licence or a provision of this By-law;

(b) the volume of sound caused by the licence holder in connection with the performance adversely affects the enjoyment, convenience or comfort of other persons in the street; or

(c) the licence holder is not a fit and proper person to hold a licence.

- (2) Where the Town Clerk cancels a licence under subclause (1)—
 - (a) the Town Clerk must advise the licence holder in writing of the cancellation;
 - (b) the cancellation takes effect on and from the date on which the licence holder is served with the cancellation notice;
 - (c) the licence holder must forthwith return the licence certificate to the Town Clerk; and
 - (d) the City shall not be required to refund any part of the fee paid by the licence holder in respect of the cancelled licence.

Transfer of Licence

11. A licence issued under this By-law is not transferable.

Obligations on a Licence Holder

12. A licence holder—

- (a) must comply with the terms and conditions of the licence and with any variation or direction given under cl.8;
- (b) must ensure that his or her licence is kept in his or her possession at all times while performing and must produce it forthwith upon being required to do so by the Town Clerk or an authorised officer;
- (c) must not perform in any street wearing dirty, torn or ragged clothing;
- (d) must not act in an offensive manner; and
- (e) must not place, install, erect, play or use any musical instrument, compact disk player, cassette player, loud speaker or amplifier in any part of the street—
 - (i) other than the permitted area; and
 - (ii) unless the musical instrument, loud speaker or amplifier is specified in the licence.

Offences and Penalties

13. A person who fails to comply with any provision of this By-law commits an offence and on conviction is liable to a penalty of not more than \$500.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960

The Municipality of the Shire of Busselton

By-law Relating to the Conduct of Proceedings and the Business of Council

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the tenth day of February, 1993 to revoke the Standing Orders By-laws published in the Government Gazette on 23 August 1962, 10 November 1970, 26 June 1981, 24 July 1981, 19 March 1982 and 29 November 1985 and 4 May 1990, and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law.

PART I—PRELIMINARY

Standing Orders

1. The proceedings and business of the Council shall be conducted according to this By-law, the clauses of which shall be referred to as "the Standing Orders".

Interpretation

2. In this By-law—

"Act"—means the Local Government Act 1960, and amendments;

"Chairperson"—includes any member presiding at any meeting of the council in a manner prescribed by the Act;

"Clause"—means a clause of the By-law;

- "Clerk"—means the Shire Clerk or Acting Shire Clerk;
- "Committee"—means any Standing or Occasional Committee appointed in accordance with the Act;
- "Council"—means the Council of the Shire of Busselton;
- "Councillor"—means a member of the Council;
- "Elector"—means a person whose name is registered as an elector on the electoral roll of the Shire of Busselton municipal district or a ward of the district;
- "Meeting"—includes any Ordinary or Special Meeting of the Council or a Committee held in pursuance of the Act and convened as therein required;
- "Member"—means the President or a Councillor of the Shire of Busselton;
- "Minutes"—means Minutes of the Council or a Committee of the Council;
- "Municipality"—means the municipality of the Shire of Busselton;
- "Negated"—means lost on a vote of the Members of the Council or of a Committee as the case may be;
- "Officer"—means a person employed by the Council to attend meetings of the Council or a committee of the Council and as required be responsible for organising and arranging all matters relating to the holding of such meetings.
- "President"—includes in the absence of the President, the Deputy President or in that persons absence the member chosen to preside at any meeting of the Council.

PART II—MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL

Kind of Meetings

4. Meetings of the Council and Committees shall be of two kinds, "ordinary" and "special". Ordinary meetings are those called at such place and at such times as Council, from time to time, appoints for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Council. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be specified in the notice convening the meeting. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting has been called.

Calling of Meetings

5. (1) The President may convene a meeting of the Council as often as the President thinks fit by notice in writing signed by the President or the Clerk and sent to each Councillor before the meeting.

(2) If the President refuses or neglects to call a meeting of the Council after receiving a request for that purpose signed by at least three Councillors, those Councillors may call a meeting of the Council by serving a notice in writing signed by them stating the business to be transacted, on each of the other members of the Council at least 7 days before the time of commencement of the meeting.

Notice of Meetings

6. Subject to Clause 7(4), notice of all meetings of the Council shall be given to members of the Council in writing and shall be signed by the President or the Clerk and shall state the place, date and hour of holding the meeting, and shall state the business to be transacted. The notice shall be served on each of the members of the Council at least 48 hours before the time of the commencement of the meeting provided that the period of time prescribed in Clause 5(2) is given in respect to a meeting called in a notice signed by three or more Councillors.

Services of Notices

7. A notice of meeting shall be served on each Councillor—

- (1) by delivering it to the Councillor personally; or
- (2) by delivering it to the Councillor's usual place of abode or business; or
- (3) by sending it to the Councillor by post or electronic mail at the Councillor's usual place of abode or business and a notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served at the time when in the ordinary course of post it would have reached the address to which it was sent;
- (4) Notwithstanding the requirement that a notice of meeting shall be in writing, a notice concerning a Special Meeting may be given in a person to person telephone call to the President and each of the Councillors before the holding of the meeting.

Notice of Adjourned Meeting

8. When a meeting of the Council is adjourned to a day and hour other than the next ordinary meeting of the Council, notice of the adjourned meeting shall, if time permits, be sent in the manner provided in clause 7 of this By-law to each member, specifying the nature of the business to be transacted.

Failure to Receive Notice Not to Invalidate Proceedings

9. Failure to receive a notice shall not affect the validity of any ordinary or special meeting of the Council so long as all reasonable steps have been taken to serve such notice.

President to Preside

10. The President if present, shall preside at all ordinary and special meetings of the Council and in the President's absence, or if after being present the President retires, the Deputy President shall preside but if the Deputy President is not present, or after being present retires, then one of the members chosen by majority vote of the members then present shall preside.

Quorum

11. Except in cases where the Minister for Local Government may have reduced the number necessary to form a quorum due to vacancies in at least half the offices of members of the Council, the numbers of members of the Council necessary to form a quorum—

- (a) where the total number of members is an even number, is one half of that total;
- (b) where the total number of members is an odd number, is the integer nearest to, but greater than, one half of that total.

Quorum Must Be Present

12. The Council shall not transact business at a meeting unless a quorum is present.

Absence of Quorum

13. If at any meeting a quorum be not present within half an hour after the time appointed for that meeting, the President or in the President's absence the Deputy President or in the Deputy President's absence the majority of the members present, or any one member, if only one be present, or the Clerk or Officer if no member be present, may adjourn the meeting to any date not later than seven days from the date of the adjournment.

Absence of Quorum during Meeting

14. If at any time during any meeting of the Council a quorum is not present the Chairperson shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of five minutes, and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of that period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the Chairperson shall adjourn it to some future date.

Names Recorded

15. At any meeting at which there is not a quorum of members present, or at which the Council is counted out for want of a quorum the names of the members then present shall be recorded in the minute book.

Business

16. No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Council other than that specified in the notice relating thereto except—

- (1) matters which the Act permits to be dealt with without notice;
- (2) matters which this By-law permits to be dealt with without notice.

Recordings of Proceedings Prohibited

17. A person shall not use any visual or vocal electronic device or instrument to record the proceedings of the Council unless that person has been given permission by the Chairperson to do so.

PART III—BUSINESS AT MEETINGS*Division 1—Order of Business***Order of Business**

18. The order of business at meetings of the Council shall, unless altered by Council resolution to that effect, be as nearly as practicable as follows, that is to say—

- (1) Apologies and leave of absence;
- (2) Opening Prayer;
- (3) Confirmation of Minutes;
- (4) Announcements by the Chairperson without discussion;
- (5) Declarations of members and officers interest;
- (6) Petitions and memorials;
- (7) Business from previous meeting (consideration of any business left over from the previous meeting);
- (8) Reports of Committees;
- (9) Reports of Officers;
- (10) Reports of Councillors (Councillors to report only on meetings or functions attended as a duly appointed representative of Council and then only Council related business to be mentioned);
- (11) Motions of which notice has been given;
- (12) Notice of motion for consideration at the following meeting;
- (13) Questions without notice;
- (14) General Business;
- (15) Questions from Public; and
- (16) Closure.

Order of Business at Special Meeting

19. The order of business at any Special Meeting shall be the order in which that business stands in the notice of the meeting unless the Council, by resolution, alters the order of business to that effect.

Unacceptable Business

20. If the Chairperson is of the opinion that any motion or business proposed to be made or transacted at a meeting is disrespectful, it shall be competent either before or after the same is brought forward, to declare that the motion or business shall not be entertained. Provided always that it shall be competent for any member of the Council to move dissent from the declaration made from the Chair, and in the event of the same being carried by a majority of the members present the business referred to shall thereupon be entertained but not otherwise.

Business at Adjourned Meeting

21. At an adjourned meeting of the Council, no business shall be transacted other than such as shall have been specified on the notice of the meeting of which it is an adjournment, and which remains undisposed of, save and except in the case of an adjournment to the next ordinary meeting of the Council, when the business undisposed of at the adjourned meeting shall have the precedence at such ordinary meeting of the Council.

Division 2—Minutes

22. Except as provided for in clause 21, the minutes of any preceding meeting of the Council, whether ordinary or special, not previously confirmed shall be submitted and confirmed at meetings of the Council and no discussion thereon shall be permitted except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and each page of the said minutes shall then, if found to be correct, be signed and dated by the Chairperson.

Minute Book

23. The fixing of the minutes into a book shall be sufficient recording of the minutes in the minute book.

Reading of Minutes may be Dispensed With

24. The reading at the next meeting of the Council of the minutes of a previous meeting may be dispensed with when members have been supplied with copies of the minutes at least two days before the holding of the next meeting of Council.

*Division 3—Questions***Definition "Question"**

25. In clauses 26 to 30 inclusive, the expression 'question' means a request for information or an enquiry.

Questions and Answers to be Brief

26. Every question and answer shall relate to the business of Council, be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible and no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

Questions from Members

27. A member may ask a question requesting general information as to the work or procedure of the Council. If the answer to the question at the meeting at which it is asked cannot be given, the Clerk or officer shall arrange for—

- (1) the answer to be submitted to the next meeting of the appropriate committee; or
- (2) the answer to the question is to be given to the member prior the next ordinary meeting of Council with a copy being provided to all other members of the Council who indicate at the time that they also require a copy.

Public Question Time

28. Public Question time shall be held prior to the closure of the Council meeting. Duration of question time shall not exceed one half hour or such other extended period as the Council, by resolution, may allow and the questions shall consist of:

- (1) those relating to matters on the Notice Paper for the particular meeting which will have precedence over all other questions; and
- (2) those relating to matters concerning the municipality but which have not been listed on the notice paper.

29. Questions from the public shall be directed through the Chair with the chairperson having the discretion of accepting or rejecting a question, the right to nominate a member or Officer to answer and requiring the question to be in writing.

30. If the answer to the question cannot be given at the meeting it was asked, the Clerk or Officer shall cause an answer to be given not later than the next ordinary meeting of the Council.

*Division 4—Minutes of Committees***Report to Council**

31. (1) Each Committee shall cause to be prepared minutes of its proceedings and transactions, which shall be entered in a Minute Book, and submitted to the next ordinary meeting of the Council, including recommendations to Council numbered consecutively.

(2) Committee minutes shall be confirmed prior to consideration by Council. Members of the Committee concerned are only to vote upon the matter. Upon confirmation, the minutes shall be signed by the Chairperson of the meeting to which they relate, or in the absence of the Chairperson of the Committee, by a Committee member present and voting on the confirmation of the Committee minutes.

Items to be Numbered

32. The minutes of every Committee shall be divided into items, which shall be numbered consecutively.

Minutes to be Sent Out

33. The minutes of every Committee shall be presented at the next meeting of the Council following the Committee meeting and shall be sent to each member of the Council before the scheduled commencement time of the Council meeting at which they will be presented.

Presentation and Consideration of Recommendations

34. (1) The recommendations contained in the Committee minutes shall be presented to the council by the Chairperson of each Committee concerned, or in the Chairperson's absence, a member of the Committee in the form of a motion "That the recommendations contained in the minutes of the Committee be received".

(2) During the consideration by the Council of a recommendation of a Committee, members may, through the President, question the Chairperson or any member of the Committee upon any matter arising directly out of, or having relevance to, the recommendations.

Adoption of Recommendations

35. A recommendation made by or contained in the minutes of a Committee may be—

- (1) adopted by the Council; or
- (2) rejected by the Council and replaced by an alternative resolution; or
- (3) amended or modified and adopted with such amendments or modifications; or
- (4) referred back to the Committee for further consideration.

Recommendations become Resolutions

36. If the Council adopts a recommendation or recommendations contained in the minutes of a Committee, without amendment or modification, the recommendation or recommendations so adopted shall be deemed to be a resolution or resolutions of the Council as the case may be.

Division 5—Notice of Motions

Notices of Motion to be in Writing

37. (1) Unless the Act or this By-law otherwise provides, a member may only bring forward at a meeting such business as is referred to in clause 38 in the form of a motion of which notice has been given, in writing, to the Clerk.

(2) Notice of motion shall be given to the Clerk either—

- (a) at the last previous Council meeting, or
- (b) at least seven clear days before the meeting at which it is to be brought forward.

Subject of Notice of Motion

38. Every notice of motion shall relate to business affecting the constitution, administration or condition of the Municipality or the Council, and the Chairperson shall rule out of order any motion which does not comply with this clause.

Motion to Lapse

39. Every such motion as is mentioned in Clause 37 shall lapse unless—

- (1) the member who gave notice thereof, or some other member authorised by the member, in writing, is present to move the motion when called on; or
- (2) the Council by resolution agrees to defer consideration of the motion to a later stage or date.

Division 6—Deputations and Committee Presentations

Deputations

40. (1) Persons wishing to make deputations to a meeting of the Council or a Committee of the Council shall in the first instance make a request to the Clerk outlining the subject matter to be raised by the deputation. On receiving such a request the Clerk shall notify the President or Chairperson of the appropriate Committee who may elect to invite the deputation to attend.

(2) A deputation shall not exceed five in number and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Council or a committee of the Council, except in reply to questions from members of the Council or committee.

Committee Presentations

41. (1) Members of the public may attend meetings of Council Committees except on such occasions as the relevant Committee by resolution, directs otherwise.

(2) After the meeting of the Committee has been formally constituted and the business concerning the declaration of members and officers interest disposed of, the Committee Chairperson may extend an invitation to persons from the public present to address the Committee on any item listed in the notice paper.

(3) Persons electing to address the Committee on an item in the notice paper must first state their name, identify the item on the notice paper and demonstrate to the Committee that they have an interest in the item as a result of being—

- (a) the applicant or a consultant or representative of the applicant.
- (b) a person representing an organisation or a group of persons involved with the application.
- (c) an adjoining neighbour of the applicant.
- (d) such other persons as the Chairperson or Committee may determine as having a direct or indirect interest in the item on the notice paper.

(4) Persons speaking to an item on the notice paper will be limited to a period of five minutes unless the Committee signifies without debate that an extension of time not exceeding ten minutes is warranted.

(5) Members of the committee may, through the Chairperson, question persons addressing the Committee on the item in the notice paper but no debate or general discussion will be permitted.

(6) The Committee may, by resolution (which may be moved without notice) bring forward and deal with the item listed in the notice paper immediately following the conclusion of that persons address to the Committee.

PART IV—CONDUCT OF MEETINGS

Division 1—Rules of Debate

Members to Address the Chairperson

42. (1) Any member moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereof shall, except where prevented by sickness or physical disability rise and address the Chairperson.

(2) After a meeting of the Council has been formally constituted and the business thereof commenced, a member of the Council shall not enter, leave or withdraw from such meeting without first paying due respect to the Chair by deferring to the Chairperson.

Titles to be Used

43. A speaker, in referring to any other member present, shall designate that person by the title of President or Councillor, as the case may be.

Priority of Speaking

44. Where two or more members indicate their intention to speak at the same time, the Chairperson shall decide which of them is entitled to priority.

Chairperson to be Heard

45. Whenever the Chairperson indicates an intention to speak during a debate, any member then speaking or offering to speak shall cease speaking and all other members shall be silent so that the Chairperson may be heard without interruption.

Chairperson to Take Part in Debates

46. Subject to the provisions of this By-law, it shall be competent for the Chairperson to move or second motions as well as to take part in a discussion upon any motion or business before the meeting provided that the Chairperson shall address the meeting before the right of reply is exercised.

Speaking Twice/Right of Reply

47. Except where this clause is suspended under clause 49, a member shall not speak twice on the same motion except—

- (1) in reply, upon an original motion of which the member was the mover;
- (2) in reply, upon an amendment last debated of which the member was the mover;
or
- (3) by way of personal explanation, in accordance with clauses 57, 58 and 59.

Speaking in Reply

48. A member speaking in reply shall not introduce any new matter and shall be confined strictly in responding to and answering previous speakers.

Suspension

49. The Council may, by resolution moved without notice, suspend the operation of clause 47 hereof, and thereupon such clause shall be suspended until such time as the Council shall, by similar resolution, otherwise decide.

No Speech After Certain Events

50. No member shall speak on any motion or amendment—

- (1) after the mover has replied; or
- (2) after the question has been put.

Mover and Seconder have Spoken

51. A member moving a motion or amendment after obtaining a seconder, shall speak first to the motion or amendment but the seconder may reserve speaking to the motion or amendment to a later stage in the debate provided the seconder so indicates after the mover has spoken to the motion or amendment.

Limit of Speeches

52. A member shall not speak on any motion or amendment or in reply for a longer period than five minutes without the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate.

An extension shall not be permitted under this clause beyond a total of ten minutes.

*Division 2—Point of Order***Point of Order to be Heard**

53. A member when addressing the Chairperson shall not be interrupted except upon a Point of Order in which event the member shall cease speaking and be seated if necessary until the member raising the Point of Order has been heard thereon and the question of order has been disposed of whereupon the member so interrupted may if permitted proceed.

Acceptable Points

54. A member expressing a difference of opinion with or contradicting a speaker shall not be recognised as raising a point of order. The following shall be recognised as breaches of order—

- (a) Discussion of a question not before the Council.
- (b) The use of offensive or insulting language.
- (c) the violation of any Standing Order of the Council.

A member raising a point of order shall specify the ground upon which the point of order is raised.

Precedence to Questions of Order

55. Notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law to the contrary, all questions of order at any time arising shall, until decided, suspend the consideration and decision of all other business.

Rulings by Chairperson

56. The Chairperson, when deciding a point of order or practice, shall give a decision, and argument or comment shall not be permitted thereon and the decision shall be final in that particular case unless a majority of members then present, vote upon a motion, moved without discussion, dissent therefrom.

*Division 3—Personal Explanation***Personal Explanation**

57. A member shall not speak on any matter, other than the matter before Council at any particular point unless it is to make a personal explanation.

A member making a personal explanation shall confine it to a succinct explanation of a material part of the member's former speech which may have been misunderstood and to the explanation itself and shall not avert to matters not strictly necessary for that purpose or seek to strengthen the member's former argument by any new matter or by replying to other members.

Personal Explanation—Member to be Heard

58. A member making a personal explanation of matters referred to by any member then speaking shall be entitled to be heard forthwith if the member then speaking consents at the time, but if the member who is speaking declines to give way the explanation must be offered at the conclusion of the speech.

Ruling on Questions of Personal Explanation

59. The ruling of the Chairperson on the admissibility of a personal explanation shall be final and conclusive and shall not be open to discussion or dissent.

*Division 4—Motions***Substance of Motion to be Stated**

60. Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state its substance before the member addresses the Council thereon and, if so required by the Chairperson shall put the motion or amendment in writing.

Motions and Amendments to be Seconded

61. A motion or amendment shall not be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless seconded.

Nominations for Positions of President and Deputy President,

62. A nomination for the position of President or Deputy President need not be seconded, it being permissible for a nominee for these positions to be self-nominated.

Member may Require Motion to be Read

63. Any member may require the motion or business under discussion to be read for the member's information at any time during a debate, but not so as to interrupt any other member whilst speaking.

Permissible Motions During Debate

64. When a motion is under debate, no further motion shall be moved except a motion—

- (1) that the motion be amended;
- (2) that the Council do adjourn;

- (3) that the debate be adjourned;
- (4) that the motion be now put;
- (5) that the Council proceed behind closed doors;

Division of Motions

65. The Chairperson may, or the Council by resolution without debate, may order a complicated motion to be divided and put in the form of two or more motions.

Withdrawal of Motions

66. A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover with the consent of the Council which shall be signified without debate and it shall not be competent for any member to speak upon the motion or amendment after the mover has asked consent for its withdrawal, unless that consent is refused.

Limitation of Withdrawal

67. A motion shall not be withdrawn until any amendment proposed thereto has been withdrawn or negated.

No Digression

68. A member shall not speak otherwise than upon the motion then before the Council, except to make a personal explanation.

Division 5—Amendments

Nature of Amendments

69. An amendment to a motion shall not negate the motion.

Amendments to Relate to Motion

70. Every amendment to a motion must be relevant to the intention of the motion.

One Amendment at a Time

71. Only one amendment shall be discussed at a time, but as often as an amendment is lost, another amendment may be moved, before the original motion is put to the vote, except that where an amendment is carried, one further amendment to the original motion as amended, and no more, may be moved.

Amended Motion Treated as Original Motion

72. Where an amendment is carried the original motion as amended shall, for the purposes of subsequent debate, and subject only to clause 71, be treated as an original motion.

Division 6—Voting

All Members to Vote

73. At every meeting of the Council, every member present in the Chamber shall vote when a motion is put except—

- (1) where the Act otherwise provides, or
- (2) in the matter of confirmation of Committee Minutes,

and if any Member who is entitled to vote fails to do so the Chairperson shall call upon the member to vote.

Equality of Votes

74. Where there is any equal division of votes upon any motion it shall be resolved in the negative.

Method of Taking the vote

75. The Chairperson shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative and may do so as often as is necessary to enable the Chairperson to form and declare an opinion as to whether the affirmative or the negative has the majority. Voting shall be by a show of hands except where a member is prevented by physical disability which precludes compliance.

Division May be Called

76. Upon the result of the voting in clause 75 being declared, any member may call for a division.

Division Procedure

77. Upon a division being called for the Chairperson shall order that a division be taken and after the lapse of one half minute from the giving of the order no member shall be permitted to enter or leave the Council Chamber until after the division has been taken.

Division—How Taken

78. The division shall thereupon be taken by those voting in the affirmative passing to the right of the Chair and those voting in the negative to the left of the Chair.

Recording of Voting

79. The names of members who voted on the motion on which there is a division shall be recorded in the minutes, together with details of whether they voted in the affirmative or the negative together with the names of the members who abstained from voting by reason of clause 73(1).

*Division 7—Motion that Meeting be Closed***Motion that the Meeting be Closed**

80. (1) A member may, on the conclusion of any motion or business, and prior to Council proceeding to the next item of business, move without notice that the meeting of the Council be now closed.

(2) On a motion that the meeting be closed, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second the motion. No other debate shall be allowed.

When Motion Lost

81. If a motion that the meeting of the Council be closed is lost, a similar motion shall not be moved until the next item on the notice paper have been concluded, or alternatively any other items, not exceeding two, as nominated by the Chairperson as having precedence over any other items of business.

Who may Move Motion

82. (1) A member who has not spoken on the motion then before the Council may move that the meeting be closed.

(2) A member shall not, at the same meeting of the Council, move or second more than one motion that the meeting be closed.

Procedure—Business Undisposed Of

83. On a motion that the meeting be closed being carried, any business specified in the notice paper remaining undisposed of shall have precedence at the next ordinary meeting of the Council.

*Division 8—General***Rescission of Resolution**

84. (1) The Council may, at the same meeting at which it is passed, rescind or alter a resolution if all members of the Council who were present in the Council Chamber at the time the resolution was passed are also present in the Council Chamber at the time the rescission or alteration is proposed.

(2) The Council may, at a meeting after that which it was passed, rescind or alter a resolution—

- (a) where notice of motion to rescind or alter is not given, if a motion to that effect is carried by an absolute majority of the members of the Council; or
- (b) where the member intending to propose the rescission or alteration has through the Clerk given written notice of intention to each of the other members of the Council at least seven (7) days before the meeting, if a motion to that effect is carried by the majority of the members voting on the proposal at the meeting; but not otherwise.

(3) The written notice required by sub clause 84(2)(b) must set out clearly the member's reasons in seeking the rescission or alteration of a resolution passed by the Council.

Negatived Motions

85. A motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived by the Council except those motions provided for in Clause 64 or where otherwise provided within the By-law, shall not again be entertained within a period of three months, except with the approval of the Council.

Suspension of Standing Orders

86. In cases of urgent necessity any Standing Order of the Council may be suspended on a motion of the Council.

Motion for Suspension of Standing Orders

87. Any member moving the suspension of a Standing Order shall state the reason for the motion, but discussion thereon shall not otherwise take place.

Production of Documents

88. (1) Any member is entitled to require at a meeting the production of any of the documents of the Council relating to the motion or business specified in the notice relating to the meeting.

(2) On giving to the Clerk not less than four ordinary working hours notice a member is entitled to have laid on the Council table for the duration of a meeting any document or record of the Council, and the Clerk or Officer, on receiving that notice, shall take all reasonable steps to lay the document on the Council table at the commencement of the meeting.

PART V—DEBATE ON PERMISSIBLE MOTIONS

Division 1—That Council do Adjourn

That Council Do Adjourn

89. (1) A member may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other member or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Council do now adjourn, and that motion shall state the time and date to which the adjournment is to be made.

(2) On a motion to adjourn, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second, and the mover of the motion (if any) which was then under debate may speak for not more than five minutes, but no other debate shall be allowed.

Limit to Further Motion

90. Where a motion for the adjournment of the Council is negatived, no similar motion shall be moved until both the business then under discussion, and the next item on the notice paper, have been disposed of.

Who May Move Motion

91. (1) A member who has not spoken on the motion or business then before the Council may move the adjournment of the Council.

(2) A member shall not, at the same sitting of the Council, move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the Council.

Resumption of Adjourned Meeting

92. On a motion for the adjournment of the Council being carried, the debate on the motion or business (if any) under debate when the adjournment motion was moved shall be continued immediately upon the Council resuming after the adjournment.

Names of Speakers to be Recorded

93. On a motion for the adjournment of the Council being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject (if any) under consideration at the time of the adjournment and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject but this clause does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

Date and Time to be Specified

94. The Chairperson on a motion for adjournment being carried shall adjourn the meeting to such time and date as the motion specifies, or where no time and date is specified to such time and date as the Chairperson shall then declare.

Division 2—That the Debate be Adjourned

Motion for Adjournment of Debate

95. (1) A member may, at the conclusion of a speech of any other member, move without notice that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same meeting or to a subsequent meeting of the Council.

(2) On a motion that the debate be adjourned, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second, and no other debate shall be allowed, but if the question then before the Council is a recommendation from a Committee, the Chairperson of the Committee concerned, or in the Chairperson's absence a member thereof, may speak for not more than five minutes.

Who May Move for Adjournments

96. (1) A member who has not spoken on the motion or business then before Council may move the adjournment of the debate.

(2) A member shall not, at the same sitting of the Council, move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the same debate.

Speaker on Resumption of Adjourned Debate

97. On resuming an adjourned debate, the member who moved its adjournment shall be entitled to speak first.

Names of Speakers Recorded

98. On a motion for the adjournment of a debate being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under debate and they shall not be permitted to speak on any resumption of the debate on that subject, but this clause does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

Counting Out of Council During Debate of Motion

99. Where the debate on any motion, moved and seconded, is interrupted by the Council being counted out, that debate may, on a motion at a subsequent meeting without notice, be resumed from the point it was so interrupted.

*Division 3—That the Motion be Now Put***That The Motion be Now Put**

100. A member may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other member, move without notice and without comment that the motion under consideration be now put and upon that motion being formally seconded it shall immediately be voted upon, without debate.

Who may Move

101. A motion that the motion under consideration be put shall be moved by a member who has not already spoken on the motion.

Right of Reply

102. When it is decided by the Council that the motion under consideration be put, the mover of the motion under consideration shall, if debate has ensued and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply for not more than five minutes before the motion is put, but subject thereto the motion shall be at once put.

Motion and Amendment Included

103. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the motion be put, the motion to be so put includes the substantive motion as well as any amendment thereto.

*Division 4—That Council Proceed Behind Closed Doors***That Council Proceed Behind Closed Doors**

104. Ordinary, Special and Committee meetings of the Council shall be open to the public except on the following occasions and on such other occasions as the Council or Committee by resolution which may be moved without notice, directs otherwise—

- (a) matters of a personal nature touching the conduct in employment of an officer or employee of the Council or the relationship or contract with the Council of an officer or employee;
- (b) consideration of legal advice;
- (c) any matter which in the opinion of the chairperson requires consideration of the personal private affairs of a person in circumstances likely to cause unreasonable embarrassment to that person if the consideration did not occur behind closed doors.

Business Behind Closed Door

105. (1) After the carrying of a resolution under clause 104 of this By-law, the business at that meeting of the Council or Committee shall not be open to the public but shall proceed behind closed doors, until the Council or Committee by resolution decides that the meeting shall be open to the public.

(2) Upon the carrying of such a resolution, the Chairperson shall direct all persons other than members and officers of the Council to leave the Council Chambers and every person shall forthwith comply with such direction.

(3) Any person failing to comply with a direction pursuant to subclause (2) of this clause commits an offence and may, with the use of reasonable force if necessary, be removed from the Council Chambers.

(4) While a resolution made under this clause is enforced, the operation of clause 47—Speaking Twice/Right of Reply shall be suspended, unless the Council or Committee, by resolution, otherwise determines.

(5) Any resolution mentioned in this subclause may be moved without notice.

Confidential Matters

106. (1) All matters and questions considered or discussed by the Council or a Committee of the Council behind closed doors shall be treated as strictly confidential and shall not, without the authority of the Council or of the Committee (as the case may be), be disclosed to any person other than the members or officers of the Council (and in the case of officers only as far as may be necessary for the performance of their duties).

(2) Any report, document or correspondence which is to be placed before Council or any Committee and which is in the opinion of the Clerk or Officer of a confidential nature may at the Clerk or Officers discretion be marked as such and shall then be treated as strictly confidential and shall not without authority of the Council be disclosed to any person other than the President, Councillors or officers of the Council.

PART VI—DISTURBANCE AND BREACH OF ORDER**No Adverse Reflection on Council**

107. A member other than stating an objective personal opposition to a Council decision or part of a Council decision, shall not comment adversely upon a resolution of the Council, except on a motion that the resolution be rescinded or amended.

No Adverse Reflection on Member and Council Officer

108. A member, shall not comment adversely upon the character or actions of another member or a council officer or be disrespectful in any way to another member or Council officer.

Record of Words Spoken

109. A member who is of the opinion that particular words used by another member are in contravention of clause 108 may make a written record immediately upon them being used and require the Clerk to enter that record in the minutes of the meeting.

Demands for Withdrawal

110. If any member commits a breach of clauses 107 or 108 the Chairperson may require the member unreservedly to withdraw any offending comment and to make a satisfactory apology, and if the member declines or neglects to do so the Chairperson may direct such member to cease speaking and may call on the next speaker.

Disturbance by Members or Persons of the Public

111. (1) A member shall not make any undue noise or disturbance or converse aloud while any other person is addressing the Council, excepting—

- (a) to raise a point of order, or
- (b) to call attention to want of a quorum.

(2) A person, not being a member, shall not at any meeting of the Council interrupt the proceedings of the Council.

(3) Any person interrupting the proceedings of the Council shall, when so directed by the Chairperson, forthwith leave the Council Chambers.

Continued Irrelevance, etc.

112. The Chairperson may call the attention of the Council to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a member and may direct that member, if speaking, to discontinue speaking, and thereupon the member shall cease speaking and be seated.

Respect for Chairperson and Speaker

113. When the Chairperson is putting any motion a member shall not walk out of or into the Chamber and shall not, whilst any member is speaking pass between the speaker and the chair.

Chairperson to Preserve Order

114. The Chairperson shall preserve order and may call any member to order whenever, in the Chairperson's opinion, there is cause for so doing.

Members may Direct Attention to Breaches of Order

115. Every member shall be entitled to direct the attention of the Chairperson to an infraction of the Standing Orders by the Chairperson, any other member, or to draw the attention of the Chairperson to any matter of which the latter may take notice under clause 112.

Retraction or Apology on any Matter

116. Whenever the Chairperson is of the opinion that any motion, amendment or other matter before the council is out of order in accordance with the Standing Orders, the motion, amendment or matter shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in the meeting by any member is similarly decided to be out of order in accordance with the Standing Orders, that member shall be called upon by the Chairperson to make such explanation, retraction or apology as the case may require.

Continued Breach of Order

117. When a member persists in any conduct which the Chairperson decides is out of order in accordance with the Standing Orders, or refuses to make any explanation retraction or apology required by the Chairperson under clause 110 and 116 the Chairperson may direct that member to refrain from taking any further part in the then meeting of the Council other than complying with the pecuniary interest and voting provisions of the Local Government Act.

Serious Disorder

118. (1) If at a meeting of the council the Chairperson is of the opinion that, by reason of disorder or otherwise, the business of the Council cannot effectually be continued, the Chairperson may adjourn the meeting for a period of not more than fifteen minutes.

(2) Where after any proceeding under subclause (1) of this clause the Chairperson is again of the opinion that the business of the Council cannot effectually be continued, the Chairperson may close or adjourn the meeting.

PART VII—COMMITTEES/GENERAL*Division 1—Standing Committees***Appointment of Standing Committees**

119. The Council may appoint Standing Committees to perform any duty which may be lawfully delegated by the Council to a Standing Committee.

Composition of Committees

120. (1) Each Standing Committee shall comprise of such members of the Council as may be decided upon by the Council at the first meeting held after the annual elections each year provided that the number of members of a Committee shall be less than one half of the total number of members of the Council.

(2) In the event of a member not being able to attend a meeting of a Committee to which the member has been appointed, the member will endeavour to arrange for the appointed deputy to attend in the member's stead.

Appointment of Deputies

121. The Council may appoint a member or members thereof to be the deputy or deputies, as the case may be, to act on behalf of a member of a Standing Committee provided that a Committee member is not appointed deputy for another member of the same Committee. Where two or more deputies are so appointed they shall have seniority in the order determined by the Council.

Attendance by Members as Observers

122. In addition to the right to attend meetings of Standing Committees to which they are appointed, members have the right to attend other Standing Committee meetings as an observer. Members attending as observers may also be permitted by the Chairperson of the Committee to speak on any matter under consideration by the Committee, but shall not be entitled to vote.

Term of Office

123. Subject to Clause 124 the members of each Standing Committee shall hold office until the commencement of the first meeting of the Council held after the next annual election or until the termination of the Councillor's term of office whichever occurs first.

Council may Change Membership

124. The Council may, by resolution, abolish a Committee or change the membership of any Committee or appoint substitutes for members absent pursuant to leave granted by the Council.

*Division 2—Occasional, Committees***Appointment of Occasional Committees**

125. The Council may appoint Occasional Committees to perform any duty which may be lawfully entrusted by it to a Committee.

Number of Members

126. An Occasional Committee may comprise of such members of the Council as may be decided upon by the Council provided that the number of members of a Committee shall be less than one half of the total number of members of the Council.

Attendance by Members as Observers

127. In addition to attending meetings of Occasional Committees to which they are appointed, members are entitled to attend other Occasional Committee meetings as an observer. Members attending as observers may also be permitted by the Chairperson of the Committee to speak on any matter under consideration by the Committee, but shall not be entitled to vote.

Standing Committee not to Interfere

128. A Standing Committee shall not interfere in any matter which has, for the time being, been entrusted to an Occasional Committee.

Details of Appointment

129. An Occasional Committee shall not be appointed, except on a motion setting out—
- (a) the duties proposed to be entrusted to such Committee;
 - (b) the number of members intended to constitute the Committee; and
 - (c) the names of the members to be appointed to the Committee.

*Division 3—General***Calling of Meetings**

130. The Clerk or Officer shall call a meeting of any Committee when requested to do so by the Chairperson or any two members of that Committee.

Standing Orders to Apply *Mutatis Mutandis*

131. Except in so far as they limit the number of times a member may speak, these Standing Orders shall be observed at meetings of Committees to the extent to which they are capable of being applied with or without adaption, but the Chairperson of a Committee has a deliberative and, in the case of equality of votes, has a casting vote.

Quorum of Committee

132. At any meeting of a Committee the number of members necessary to form a quorum—

- (1) where the total number of the members of the Committee is an even number, is one half of that total; or
- (2) where the total number of the members of the Committee is an odd number, is the integer nearest to but greater than one half of the total.

Representation on Public Bodies

133. Whenever it becomes necessary to nominate a member of the Council to represent the Council on a public body or State instrumentality, that nomination shall be by resolution of the Council.

Meetings of Electors

134. (1) The Standing Orders apply, so far as is practicable, to any meeting of electors but, where there is any inconsistency between the provisions of this By-law and the provisions of the Act, the latter shall prevail.

(2) A person who is not an elector is not entitled to vote at a meeting of electors, and may not take part in any discussion at that meeting, unless the meeting, by a motion, requests the person to do so.

Meetings of Ratepayers

135. (1) The Standing Orders apply so far as is practicable to any meeting of ratepayers but where there is any inconsistency between the provisions of this By-law and the provisions of the Act, the latter shall prevail.

(2) A person who is not a ratepayer is not entitled to vote at a meeting of ratepayers and may not take part in any discussion at that meeting unless the meeting by a motion requests the person to do so.

Petitions

136. (1) Apart from those petitions to the Governor and others specifically prescribed under the Act (which shall be in the form prescribed therein) petitions and requests to Council of a general nature will be received by Council, provided that the intention and legibility of the petitions and requests are clear.

(2) Every petition shall be respectful and temperate in its language and not contain language disrespectful to the Council.

(3) A petition must—

- (a) Contain the names, addresses and signatures of the petitioners;
- (b) Have the name and address of the person who lodged the petition with the Council shown at the top of each page thereof.

Cases Not Provided for in Standing Orders

137. The Chairperson shall decide all questions of order, procedure, debate or otherwise, in respect of which no provision or insufficient provision is made in this By-law.

Decisions of the Chairperson

138. All decisions of the Chairperson shall be final unless a majority of the members then present, by resolution made forthwith and without discussion dissent therefrom.

Penalty

139. Any person committing a breach of these Standing Orders is liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00).

Enforcement

140. The Chairperson is authorised and empowered to enforce the Standing Orders.

LAND TAX ASSESSMENT ACT 1976

LAND TAX ASSESSMENT AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1993

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Land Tax Assessment Amendment Regulations 1993*.

Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the *Land Tax Assessment Regulations 1976** are referred to as the principal regulations.

For amendments to 25 November 1993 see 1992 Index to Legislation of Western Australia, Table 4, p. 151.]

Regulation 6 inserted

3. After regulation 5 of the principal regulations the following regulation is inserted —

“

Payment of land tax where notice of assessment issued

6. (1) In this regulation unless the contrary intention appears —

“**additional tax**” means additional tax assessed under section 25 of the Act;

“**arrears**” (“Ar” in the formulas) means the sum, as at the time a relevant assessment is issued, of —

- (a) any land tax shown on a notice of assessment, or notice of amended assessment, issued in a year of assessment prior to the year of assessment in which the relevant assessment is issued, and due and payable;
- (b) any unpaid additional tax;
- (c) any interest assessed under section 38 (3) of the Act and unpaid;
- (d) any penalty assessed under section 39 of the Act and unpaid;
- (e) any charge imposed under subregulation (5) or (6) and unpaid; and
- (f) any law costs referred to in the definition of “land tax” in section 5 (1) of the Act and unpaid;

“**assessed amount**” means the total amount of land tax (including arrears) shown on a relevant assessment as payable under the Act;

“**discountable amount**” (“DA” in the formulas) means any land tax (but not additional tax, interest, penalties, charges or law costs) shown on a relevant assessment but not shown on a notice of assessment, or notice of amended assessment, issued in a year of assessment

prior to the year of assessment in which the relevant assessment is issued;

“residual amount” (“RA” in the formulas) means the assessed amount less arrears and less the discountable amount;

“relevant assessment” means a notice of assessment, or a notice of amended assessment, issued by the Commissioner after the coming into operation of this regulation.

(2) A taxpayer may discharge a liability to pay an assessed amount by paying in accordance with one of the 3 options in subregulations (3), (4) and (5).

(3) A taxpayer may discharge a liability to pay an assessed amount by making one payment, within 45 days after the service by post of the relevant assessment, of the amount calculated according to the following formula:

$$\text{Amount payable} = Ar + RA + 0.97DA .$$

(In this regulation referred to as “option 1”.)

(4) A taxpayer may discharge a liability to pay an assessed amount by making 2 payments as follows:

(a) A first payment, to be made within 45 days after the service by post of the relevant assessment, of an amount calculated according to the following formula:

$$\text{First payment} = Ar + \frac{RA + DA}{2} .$$

(b) A second payment, to be made within 110 days after the service by post of the relevant assessment, of an amount calculated according to the following formula:

$$\text{Second payment} = \frac{RA + DA}{2} .$$

(In this regulation referred to as “option 2”.)

(5) A taxpayer may discharge a liability to pay an assessed amount by making 3 payments as follows:

(a) A first payment, to be made within 45 days after the service by post of the relevant assessment, of an amount calculated according to the following formula:

$$\text{First payment} = Ar + \frac{1.04(RA + DA)}{3} .$$

(b) A second payment, to be made within 110 days after the service by post of the relevant assessment, of an amount calculated according to the following formula:

$$\text{Second payment} = \frac{1.04(RA + DA)}{3} .$$

(c) A third payment, to be made within 175 days after the service by post of the relevant assessment, of an amount calculated according to the following formula:

$$\text{Third payment} = \frac{1.04(RA + DA)}{3} .$$

(In this regulation referred to as “option 3”.)

(6) If the sum of payments made by a taxpayer within 45 days after the service by post of a relevant assessment ("the sum paid") is less than the amount payable under option 1 but greater than —

- (a) the first payment under option 2, then the sum paid shall be deducted by the Commissioner from the assessed amount and the remainder shall be paid by the taxpayer when the second payment under option 2 would otherwise have been payable;
- (b) the first payment under option 3 but less than the first payment under option 2, then the sum paid shall be deducted by the Commissioner from the assessed amount and the remainder, plus a charge of 4% of the sum of the discountable amount and the residual amount, shall be divided into 2 equal amounts —
 - (i) the first to be paid by the taxpayer when the second payment under option 3 would otherwise have been payable; and
 - (ii) the second to be paid by the taxpayer when the third payment under option 3 would otherwise have been payable.

(7) If —

- (a) the sum of payments made by a taxpayer within 45 days after the service by post of a relevant assessment is less than the first payment under option 3; or
- (b) the taxpayer fails to make a payment when it is due,

the amount of land tax remaining unpaid at that time becomes due and payable immediately and section 39 of the Act applies accordingly.

(8) The amounts to be paid under subregulation (4), (5) or (6) (b), are each to be a multiple of 5 cents and, where that results in the amounts being unequal, the first payment shall be the greater amount.

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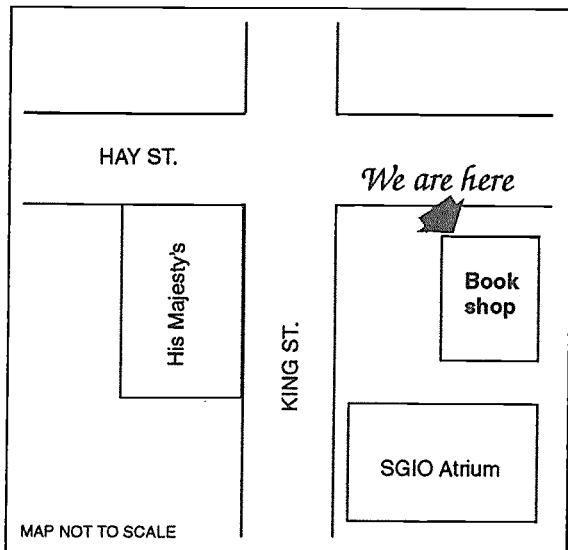
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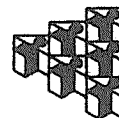
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
