Each Brigade shall hold an Annual General Meeting at which a Captain, First Lieutenant, Second Lieutenant, Secretary and/or Treasurer and such additional officers as deemed necessary shall be elected. The Council shall be notified annually of the names of officers elected.

2.3 Duties of Officers

Duties of all Brigade Officers and Members shall be as detailed in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 (as amended).

(a) Captains and Lieutenants

The Captain shall have full control over the members of the brigades whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firefighters. In the absence of the Captain, the 1st Lieutenant, the 2nd Lieutenant or Senior Officer of the Brigade present at the fire, shall exercise all the powers and duties of the Brigade Captain.

(b) Secretary and/or Treasurer

Shall be responsible for administration in accordance with section 2.5 of the By-laws.

(c) Equipment

The Captain shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purpose of the Brigade. 11. A call by a player indicating a winning split or full house in a game will be accepted if it is made by the player at any time prior to the conclusion of the calling back of the numbers for that split game or game (as the case may be).

Time when a call by a player made

12. A call by a player indicating a winning split or full house is not a valid call unless the call is acknowledged by the person calling the numbers or by a spotter.

498.

(b) where a sample from a horse is found to contain a substance described in this Rule in excess of maximum quantity or ratio appearing opposite the substance then the horse shall be deemed to have had administered to it a drug or drug capable of producing that substance:

Substance	Maximum Quantity or Ratio.
Arsenic	0.3 micrograms per millilitre total in urine.
Carbon Dioxide	35.0 millimoles of Total Carbon Dioxide per litre in plasma.
Cortisol	250 ng/ml in plasma, 1,000 ng/ml in urine.
Dimethyl Sulphoxide	15.0 micrograms per millilitre in urine or 1.0 micrograms per millilitre in plasma.
Nandrolone	Free and conjugated 5A—estrane—3B, 17A—diol to 5 (10)— estrene—3B, 17A—diol in urine at a ratio of 1.
Theobromine	2.0 micrograms per millilitre in urine.
