1. This notice may be cited as the *Shark Bay Prawn Limited Entry Fishery Amendment Notice 1994*.

2. In this notice the *Shark Bay Prawn Limited Entry Fishery Notice 1993\** is referred to as the principal notice.

“ (4) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (1) paragraph (a), prawns may be taken from the waters described in Item 4 of the Schedule by otter trawl net at any time when the Fishery is open to the taking of prawns during the period 1 March in any year to 31 May in the same year. ”.

"

That part of the Fishery north of 24°45'18" south latitude. "

(No. 2) 1994**

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Radiation Safety (General) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1994*.

**Principal regulations**

2. In these regulations the *Radiation Safety (General) Regulations 1983\** are referred to as the principal regulations.

For amendments to 31 January 1994 see 1992 Index to Legislation of Western Australia, Table 4, p. 216, and Gazette of 4 and 28 May, 11 June and 9 July 1993 and 28 January 1994.]

**Regulation 7A amended**

3. Regulation 7A of the principal regulations is amended—

- (a) in subregulation (1) by inserting after “Schedule VIIA” the following—  
“ , or that is contained in a gaseous tritium light device used in an aircraft, ”;
- (b) in subregulation (2) by deleting “The” and substituting the following—  
“ Subject to subregulation (3), the ”; and
- (c) by inserting after subregulation (2) the following subregulation—  
“ (3) Subregulation (2) (b) and (c) do not apply to a gaseous tritium light device used in an aircraft. ”.

**Regulation 28 amended**

4. Regulation 28 of the principal regulations is amended in subregulation (3)—

- (a) by deleting the fullstop after paragraph (c) and substituting the following—  
“ ; and ”; and
- (b) by inserting after paragraph (c) the following paragraph—  
“ (d) in the case of premises where cobalt telegraphy equipment is present, that the equipment is installed and used in accordance with the requirements set out in Schedule XVI. ”.

**Schedule I amended**

5. Schedule I to the principal regulations is amended in item 1 (1) (f) by deleting “25 (7)” and substituting the following—

“ 25 (3) (a) ”.

**Schedule XVI added**

6. After Schedule XV to the principal regulations the following Schedule is added—

“ **SCHEDULE XVI**

[Regulation 28 (3) (d)]

1. In the Schedule—

“equipment” means cobalt telegraphy equipment;

“treatment room” means a room where the radiation source for any equipment is housed.

2. (1) The treatment room shall have approved structural shielding so that the dose equivalent limit any person (other than a patient receiving treatment) is exposed to does not exceed the limits prescribed by Schedule I.

(2) The structural shielding referred to in subitem (1) shall be—

(a) approved by the Council and qualified expert before the construction of the treatment room; and

(b) reviewed by a qualified expert before any structural alteration to the treatment room or any modification to the equipment.

3. A radiation survey shall be carried out by a qualified expert to ensure that the shielding referred to in item 2 (1) is as approved—

(a) immediately after the equipment is installed and before any patient is treated; and

(b) immediately after any structural alteration to the treatment room or any modification to the equipment.

4. The entrance to the treatment room shall be clearly and permanently labelled with a sign of not less than 15 cm x 15 cm stating "CAUTION—RADIATION" and containing the radiation warning symbol.
5. It shall be possible from outside the treatment room, to observe and converse with a patient who is inside the treatment room.
6. When the radiation beam is in use, a signal shall indicate this clearly to persons inside the treatment room and persons about to enter the treatment room.
7. The radiation source shall be fitted with a source control mechanism so that—
  - (a) if any door or other barrier (such as a light beam) to the treatment room is opened or interrupted, the equipment shall automatically and immediately switch off;
  - (b) the equipment cannot be activated until all barriers to the treatment room are closed; and
  - (c) after the equipment has switched off, as referred to in paragraph (a), it can only be reactivated manually.
8. Only the person receiving treatment shall be in the treatment room while the radiation beam is in use.
9. No person shall enter the treatment room other than as necessary for treatment, for operation or maintenance of the equipment or for other essential activities.
10. A qualified expert shall—
  - (a) be responsible for ensuring the correct operation and calibration of the equipment in accordance with the "Revised code of practice for dosimetry of 2 to 25 MV x-rays, and of caesium-137 and cobalt-60 gamma ray beams" (Physics in Medicine and Biology 1983 Vol. 28, No. 10, pp. 1097-1104) or other approved international protocol; and
  - (b) verify radiation field sizes relevant to radiation beam data at intervals not exceeding 4 weeks.
11. Emergency procedures to be followed in the event of the failure of the source control mechanism shall be established, approved and posted at the treatment control panel.
12. It shall be possible to lock mechanically the source control mechanism in the "safe" position during maintenance.
13. (1) A permanent radiation monitor shall be installed in the treatment room for continuous monitoring of the radiation beam status.
  - (2) The permanent radiation monitor shall provide a visual signal—
    - (a) inside the treatment room; and
    - (b) near the entrance outside the treatment room.
  - (3) The permanent radiation monitor shall have the capacity to provide an audible signal inside the treatment room and this signal shall be used when maintenance or calibration of the equipment is in progress.
14. A permanent radiation monitor used in association with the equipment shall—
  - (a) provide visible warning of a malfunction that may result in an exposed or partly exposed radiation source;
  - (b) provide a warning of high radiation levels which is visible to a person in, or about to enter, the treatment room;
  - (c) have an emergency power supply (i.e. a battery system) which is separate from the power supply to the equipment; and
  - (d) be tested to ensure that it is operating correctly each day before the equipment is used for treatment.
15. (1) A portable radiation survey monitor shall be available on the premises where the treatment room is located and shall be used if any malfunction occurs that may result in an exposed or partly exposed radiation source.
  - (2) The portable radiation survey monitor referred to in subitem (1) shall be calibrated by an approved calibration facility at intervals not exceeding 12 months.
16. The equipment shall be inspected and serviced by an approved person to ensure that the radiation source control mechanism is functioning properly—
  - (a) during replacement of the radiation source; and
  - (b) at intervals not exceeding 3 months.
17. The protective source housing for the equipment shall be—
  - (a) constructed so that, measured in accordance with item 18—
    - (i) when the radiation beam is off, the maximum dose rate in air at one metre from the radiation source does not exceed 0.1 milliGray per hour and the average dose rate in air does not exceed 0.02 milliGray per hour; and

- (ii) when the radiation beam is on, the maximum dose rate in air at one metre from the radiation source does not exceed 0.1% of the useful beam exposure rate at one metre or 10 milliGray per hour, whichever is the greater;

and

- (b) such that the integrity of the protective source housing shielding is preserved in the event of fire.

18. (1) When the radiation beam is off, the maximum dose rate in air shall be measured at 26 points defined by a sphere one metre in radius centred on the radiation source of which—

- (a) 2 points shall be located at the Poles of the sphere and 4 equally spaced points shall be located on the sphere's equator;
- (b) 8 points shall be located at the centres of the spherical triangles formed by connecting the first 6 points; and
- (c) 12 points shall be located at points midway between the first 6 points.

(2) The average maximum dose rate of the 26 points referred to in subitem (1) shall not exceed 0.02 milliGray per hour and no point shall exceed 0.1 milliGray per hour.

(3) When the radiation beam is on, the maximum dose rate in air shall be measured with the beam defining diaphragms closed as far as possible and, if the useful beam aperture is not completely intercepted at that position, the entire useful beam shall be blocked by lead which has an attenuation equivalent to that of the equipment source housing.

19. (1) The radiation source housing, including the radiation beam aperture and other locations likely to be contaminated in the event of a leakage, shall be tested when the radiation beam is off for leakage of radioactive material—

- (a) immediately after the installation of the equipment;
- (b) at intervals not exceeding 12 months; and
- (c) immediately before any maintenance work is carried out in the housing port or collimator assembly.

(2) No maintenance work shall be carried out in the housing port or collimator assembly until the contamination test described in subitem (1) is completed.

20. If the contamination test described in item 19 (1) indicates the presence of free activity of more than 2 000 Bq, the radiation source shall be considered to be leaking and—

- (a) arrangements shall be made for immediate repair to be carried out; and
- (b) the Council shall be notified in writing immediately.

21. Beam collimation shall be carried out using permanent cones or diaphragms which—

- (a) do not transmit more than 2% of the useful beam; and
- (b) comply with the leakage radiation limits set out in item 17 (a).

22. Where a diaphragm is used for beam collimation—

- (a) the diaphragm shall include a light beam providing illumination of not less than 100 lux at a distance of one metre from the light source; or
- (b) the treatment area shall be indicated by a laser alignment system.

23. When the radiation source is in the "on" position and at the usual treatment distance (i.e. source to skin distance or source to isocentre distance), the mechanical axis defining the axis of rotation of the collimating device shall be accurately aligned to within 2 mm of the central axis of the radiation beam for all orientations of the treatment head.

24. The equipment shall have a remotely operated source control mechanism which—

- (a) can function in any orientation of the source housing;
  - (b) automatically and immediately switches the equipment off—
    - (i) at the predetermined end of the exposure; or
    - (ii) if there is a breakdown or interruption of the activating force;
- and
- (c) ensures that the equipment remains switched off, as referred to in paragraph (b), until it is reactivated manually.

25. (1) The equipment and source control mechanism shall be located so that in an emergency the equipment can be turned off with the minimum possible exposure to any person.

(2) Any tools required for turning the equipment off manually shall be mounted in a position near the treatment room entrance that is easily visible and accessible.

26. The source housing and the treatment control panel shall each have a warning device that plainly indicates whether the radiation beam is "on" or "off" and whether the source or shutter is "in transit".

27. (1) The equipment shall have—

- (a) an automatic timer, or an integrated dosimeter, which terminates the treatment after a pre-set time or dose; and
- (b) a back-up timer which is independent of the timer referred to in paragraph (a).

(2) The timers referred to in subitem (1) shall be arranged so that—

- (a) the failure of one timer does not affect the other timer;
- (b) the possibility of accidental communication between the timers is minimized;
- (c) each timer is capable of terminating the radiation exposure by means independent of the other timer;
- (d) the terminating electrical circuits of the 2 timers are kept physically separate;
- (e) each timer counts up from zero so that an over-exposure will give a reading;
- (f) information from the timers is retrievable, including after a power failure;
- (g) the stopping and starting of the timers is controlled by switches activated by the source or shutter so that in the event of failure of the terminating means, a true record of maximum exposure time is obtained;
- (h) the switch controlling the timer referred to in subitem (1) (a) shall operate when the source or shutter—
  - (i) arrives at; and
  - (ii) leaves,the fully "on" position;
- (i) the switch controlling the back-up timer referred to in subitem (1) (b) shall operate when the source or shutter—
  - (i) arrives at; and
  - (ii) leaves,a position where the source is just shielded; and
- (j) the back-up timer referred to in subitem (1) (b) shall terminate the radiation exposure at a time not more than 6 seconds after the termination time for the treatment pre-set on the timer referred to in subitem (1) (a).

(3) The electrical circuits of the equipment shall be arranged so that—

- (a) after each radiation exposure, the tripping mechanism of the back-up timer referred to in subitem (1) (b) must be manually checked and the settings and readings of both timers must be manually returned to zero; and
- (b) it is not possible to set or commence radiation exposure until the sequence referred to in paragraph (a) has been completed.

(4) If treatment is terminated by an event other than the operation of the timer referred to in subitem (1) (a), the equipment shall give or show a signal which clearly indicates this.

28. (1) It shall be impossible for the source control mechanism to be switched on from inside the treatment room.

(2) The source control mechanism shall have a locking device so that it cannot be operated by any unauthorized person.

29. (1) The equipment shall be arranged so that the selection of the mode of treatment and the selection and correct location of wedge filters are identified electrically.

(2) Radiation exposure shall be impossible until the selection made in the treatment room of the mode of treatment and wedge filter has been manually verified at the treatment control panel.

(3) After the verification referred to in subitem (2), the selected mode of treatment and wedge filter shall be displayed on the treatment control panel.

30. (1) A beam stop or counterweight, on the equipment shall not transmit more than 0.1% of the useful beam.

(2) The equipment shall be arranged so that—

(a) the relationship between the useful beam and a beam stop is permanently fixed; or

(b) it has mechanical or electrical stops to ensure that the beam is directed only towards barriers for which useful beam shielding has been provided. ”.

*City of Rockingham*

## Traders By-law

Under the powers conferred upon it by the Local Government Act 1960, the Council of the City of Rockingham resolved on the 22nd day of June 1993 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law—

## Part 1—Preliminary

**Citation**

1. This By-law may be cited as the "City of Rockingham Traders By-law".

**Repeal**

2. The General By-laws of the Rockingham Road Board published in the *Government Gazette* on 10 May 1940 are repealed.

**Application**

3. This By-law applies and has force and effect throughout the whole of the district.

**Definitions**

4. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Act" means the Local Government Act 1960;

"authorised person" means the Town Clerk, any other officer of the City or any other person appointed by the Council to be an authorised person for the purposes of this By-law;

"City" means the municipality of the City of Rockingham;

"community association" has the meaning given to it in section 242(1) of the Act; [Note : the Act defines "community association" to mean, in essence, an institution, association, club, society or body, whether incorporated or not—

(a) the objects of which are of a charitable, benevolent, religious, cultural, educational, recreational, sporting or other like nature; and

(b) the members of which are not entitled or permitted to receive any pecuniary profit from its transactions.]

"Council" means the Council of the City;

"district" means the municipal district of the City;

"food stall" means a stall in, on or from which any perishable food or potentially hazardous food, other than fruit or vegetables, is sold or offered for sale;

"goods" includes wares and merchandise but does not include newspapers;

"hawker" has the meaning given to it in section 217(1) of the Act; [Note : s.217(1) of the Act defines a "hawker", in terms that have been modified slightly, to mean "a hawker, pedlar or other person who ... travels and trades and goes from town to town or [from house to house] soliciting orders for or carrying to sell or exposing for sale any goods ..., but does not include—

- (a) commercial travellers or other persons selling or seeking orders for goods to or from persons who are dealers therein or selling or seeking orders for books or newspapers;
- (b) sellers of vegetables, fish, fruit, newspapers, brooms, matches, game, poultry, butter, eggs, milk or any victuals;
- (c) persons selling or exposing for sale goods in any public market or fair lawfully established, or upon any racecourse, agricultural show ground, or public recreation ground;
- (d) sellers of goods of their own manufacture; and
- (e) persons representing a manufacturer whose goods are sold direct to consumers only not through the medium of a shop".]

"Health By-laws" means the Model By-laws described as Series "A" adopted, and from time to time amended, by the City under the Health Act 1911;

"licence" means a licence issued by the Council under this By-law to hawk, to conduct a stall or to carry out trading in a street or other public place;

"perishable food" means food of a type or in a condition that may spoil;

"potentially hazardous food" means all prepared or cooked food which consists in whole or in part of milk or milk products, eggs, meat, poultry, fish, crustaceans, molluscs, gravy or ingredients capable of supporting rapid and progressive growth of infectious or toxigenic micro-organisms;

"public place" has the meaning given to it in section 6(1) of the Act; [Note : s.6(1) of the Act defines "public place" to include "a street, way, and place which the public are allowed to use, whether the street, way or place is or is not on private property".]

"stall" has the meaning given to it in section 242(1) of the Act; [Note : s.242(1) of the Act defines "stall" to mean a movable or temporarily fixed structure, stand or table in, on or from which goods or services are sold, hired or offered for sale or hire".]

"stallholder" has the meaning given to it in section 242(1) of the Act; [Note : s.242(1) of the Act defines "stallholder" to mean a person in charge of a stall".]

"Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk of the City and includes an acting Town Clerk;

"trading"—

- (a) means—
  - (i) selling or hiring; or
  - (ii) offering for sale or hire, goods or services in a street or other public place; and
- (b) includes—
  - (i) displaying for the purpose of offering for sale or hire; and
  - (ii) inviting offers, soliciting orders or carrying out any other transaction in respect of the sale or hire, of goods and services in a street or other public place; but
- (c) does not include—
  - (i) setting up of a stall; or
  - (ii) conducting a business at a stall, under the authority of a licence or where that stall is an exempt stall under clause 6; and

"vehicle" includes—

- (a) every conveyance, not being a train, boat, aircraft or wheelchair, and every object capable of being propelled or drawn on wheels or tracks by any means;
- (b) where the context permits, an animal being driven or ridden; and
- (c) in particular, a vehicle described in the First Schedule to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

#### Part 2—Licences

##### Hawkers

5. (1) A person must not hawk any goods unless that person—

- (a) is over the age of 18 years; and
- (b) holds a current hawker's licence.

(2) An application for a hawker's licence must be in the form set out in Schedule 1 and must be forwarded to the Town Clerk together with—

- (a) subject to clause 14, the fee and charge (if any) prescribed in Schedule 7; and
- (b) any other information that the Council considers necessary in the circumstances of the case.

(3) A licence granted to a hawker is valid only for the hawking of the goods described in the licence and, in the case of a licence limited to a part of the district, is valid only for that part of the district.

#### **Stallholders**

(1) In this clause, an "exempt stall" means—

- (a) a stall (other than a food stall) at the Rockingham Sunday Markets, the Baldivis Fair, the Rockingham Spring Fair or any other similar community event authorised in writing by the Council; or
- (b) a stall exempted by the Council under subclause (5).

(2) A person must not conduct a stall for the sale or hire of goods, other than an exempt stall, unless that person is—

- (a) over the age of 18 years; and
- (b) the holder of, or an assistant specified in, a current stallholder's licence.

(3) An application for a stallholder's licence must be in the form set out in Schedule 3 and must be forwarded to the Town Clerk together with—

- (a) subject to clause 14, the fee and the charge prescribed in Schedule 7;
- (b) an accurate plan and description of the proposed stall or stalls;
- (c) written particulars of arrangements made in respect of public liability insurance, in the joint names of the applicant and the City, of not less than \$5,000,000; and
- (d) any other information that the Council considers necessary in the circumstances of the case.

(4) A licence granted to a stallholder is valid only for the selling or hiring of the goods described in the licence and, in the case of a licence limited to a site within, or a part of, the district, is valid only for that site or part.

(5) Upon written application made to it, the Council may exempt a person from the requirement under subclause (2) to have a stallholder's licence in respect of a particular stall or stalls.

(6) An exemption granted under subclause (5) must be signed by the Town Clerk and must state—

- (a) details of the stall to which the exemption applies including its location, the goods to be offered for sale or hire and the person or persons to manage and conduct the stall; and
- (b) the period during which the exemption applies.

#### **Traders**

7. (1) A person must not carry on trading in any street or public place unless that person is—

- (a) over the age of 18 years; and
- (b) the holder of, or an assistant specified in, a current trader's licence.

(2) Without limiting the generality of subclause (1), the requirement to hold a current trader's licence applies also to an itinerant food vendor licensed under the Health By-laws.

(3) An application for a trader's licence must be in the form set out in Schedule 5 and must be forwarded to the Town Clerk together with—

- (a) subject to clause 14, the fee and the charge prescribed in Schedule 7;
- (b) an accurate plan and description of any proposed stand, table, structure or vehicle which may be used for the proposed trading;
- (c) written particulars of arrangements made in respect of public liability insurance in the joint names of the applicant and the City, of not less than \$5,000,000; and
- (d) any other information that the Council considers necessary in the circumstances of the case.

(4) A licence granted to a trader is valid only for the trading of the goods or services described in the licence, and in the case of a licence limited to a site within, or a part of, the district, is valid only for that site or part.

**Determination of Application**

8. (1) The Council may refuse to consider an application for a licence which does not comply with the requirements, respectively, of clauses 5, 6 or 7.
- (2) The Council may in respect of an application for a licence—
- (a) refuse the application; or
  - (b) approve the application on such terms and conditions, if any, as it sees fit.
- (3) Without limiting the scope of the Council's discretion under subclause (2), the Council may refuse an application if, in its opinion—
- (a) the application does not conform with the requirements of the Health Act or any other written law;
  - (b) the needs of the district or the part of the district for which the licence is sought are adequately catered for by established shops or by persons to whom licences have been issued;
  - (c) the proposed activity or place of trading is undesirable;
  - (d) the proposed, stand, table, structure or vehicle is unsuitable, in any respect, to the location for which the licence is sought;
  - (e) the gathering of customers would impede pedestrian or vehicle movements or cause conflict with other activities; or
  - (f) the proposed trading location is not provided with sufficient off road parking so as to prevent a traffic hazard or danger to the public.
- (4) Where the Council approves an application for a licence it must—
- (a) issue a licence in the form of Schedules 2, 4 or 6, as the case may be; and
  - (b) specify on the licence the date on which the licence is to expire.

**Length of Licence**

9. A licence is valid until 30 June next after the date on which it was issued unless—
- (a) an earlier date is specified on the licence;
  - (b) in respect of a licence issued in the months May or June, the licence is expressed to expire on 30 June in the following year; or
  - (c) it is sooner cancelled or suspended under this By-law.

**Variation of Licence Conditions**

10. (1) A licensee may apply in writing to the Council to vary or remove any of the terms and conditions of the licence.
- (2) The Council may, in respect of an application made under this clause—
- (a) refuse the application; or
  - (b) approve, in whole or in part, the application on such terms and conditions, if any, as it sees fit.
- (3) Where the Council approves an application under this clause it shall advise the licensee in writing of the variation and the terms and conditions applying in respect of the licence shall be varied accordingly.

**Renewal of Licence**

11. (1) An application for the renewal of a licence must be—
- (a) in writing;
  - (b) accompanied by the licence then in force;
  - (c) subject to clause 14, accompanied by the fee and charges (if any) prescribed by Schedule 7;
  - (d) accompanied by any other information that the Council considers necessary in the circumstances on the case; and
  - (e) served on the Town Clerk at least 3 weeks before the date of expiry of the licence.
- (2) The Council may refuse to consider an application for the renewal of a licence which does not comply with the requirements of subclause (1).
- (3) The Council may in respect of an application for the renewal of a licence—
- (a) refuse the application; or
  - (b) approve the application on such terms and conditions, if any, as it sees fit.
- (4) Without limiting the scope of the Council's discretion under subclause (3), the Council may, in considering an application for the renewal of a licence, take into account any of the matters set out in clause 8(3).
- (5) Where the Council approves an application for the renewal of a licence it must—
- (a) issue a fresh licence in the form of Schedules 2, 4 or 6, as the case may be; and
  - (b) specify on the licence the date on which the licence is to expire.

**Transfer of Licence**

12. A licence issued under this By-law is not transferable.

**Cancellation of Licence**

13. (1) The Council may cancel a licence where the licensee—

- (a) has been convicted during the preceding five years of an offence against—
  - (i) this By-law;
  - (ii) the Health Act; or
  - (iii) any other written law relating to hawkers, stallholders or trading in public places;
- (b) has attempted to transfer or assign the licence;
- (c) no longer carries on the business that is the subject of the licence;
- (d) is not, in the opinion of the Council, a fit and proper person to conduct the business that is the subject of the licence;
- (e) is not regularly carrying on the business for which the licence was granted; or
- (f) has breached a condition of the licence.

(2) Where the Council cancels a licence under subclause (1)—

- (a) the Council must advise the licensee in writing of the cancellation;
- (b) the cancellation takes effect on and from the date on which the licensee is served with the cancellation notice;
- (c) the licensee shall forthwith return the licence certificate to the Town Clerk; and
- (d) the Council shall not be required to refund any part of the fee or charge paid by the licensee in respect of the cancelled licence.

(3) The Council may cancel or suspend a licence if the Council or a State agency, instrumentality or department requires access to or near the place over which a licence applies for the purpose of carrying out works in or in the vicinity of that place.

**Exemption from Fees and Charges**

14. (1) The Council may exempt an applicant for a licence or for a licence renewal from the requirement to pay a fee or charge, or both, where—

- (a) the application relates to a proposed stall or proposed trading and the applicant is a community association;
- (b) the application relates to a proposed food stall at the Rockingham Sunday Markets; or
- (c) the trading is proposed to be carried out in a portion of a street or public place adjoining the normal place of business of the applicant for the licence.

(2) Where—

- (a) a stall is set up by a community association and business is conducted at the stall by or for the purpose of the community association; or
- (b) trading is carried out by a community association for the purposes of that community association,

fees and charges which would otherwise have been imposed by this By-law shall not be payable in respect of that stall, that trading or the licence under which either is set up or carried on respectively.

**Part 3—Licensee Obligations****Obligations of a Licensee**

15. A licensee must—

- (a) ensure that—
  - (i) in the case of a hawker or trader who hawks or trades in, on or from a vehicle—the licence is displayed in a conspicuous place on that vehicle;
  - (ii) in the case of a hawker or trader who does not hawk or trade in, on or from a vehicle—the licence is kept in the possession of the hawker or trader at all times while hawking or trading; and
  - (iii) in the case of a stallholder—the licence is displayed in a conspicuous place on the stall;
- (b) when selling goods by weight, carry and use for that purpose scales tested and certified in accordance with the Weights and Measures Act 1915;
- (c) maintain—
  - (i) in the case of stallholder, the stall and any surrounding area; and
  - (ii) in the case of a trader, any stand, table, structure or vehicle used for the trading and the surrounding area,in good order and condition and free from litter; and
- (d) ensure that the business is conducted at all times in accordance with the provisions of this By-law and the conditions of the licence.

**Prohibitions on a Licensee****16. A licensee must not—**

- (a) apart from trading carried out in a portion of a street or public place adjoining the normal place of business of the licensee, conduct or attempt to conduct business within a distance of 200m of any shop or permanent place of business or services of the kind being hawked or offered for sale or hire by the licensee;
- (b) hawk, conduct a stall or carry on trading between the hours of 7.00 pm and 7.00 am on any Christmas day or Good Friday without obtaining the written consent of Council;
- (c) call the licensee's goods or cause or make any out cry, noise or disturbance likely to be a nuisance or cause annoyance to any person in that vicinity;
- (d) deposit or store any box or basket containing goods under the vehicle of the licensee or upon a roadway or footpath;
- (e) obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on any footpath or roadway;
- (f) act in an offensive manner;
- (g) use, display or permit to be used or displayed any advertisement, placard, poster, streamer, sign or signboard on or about the place specified in the licence other than price tickets or labels on the items with labels not exceeding 200 cm FD in area and relating to the business specified in the licence;
- (h) use or permit to be used any flashing or intermittent lighting apparatus or device on or from the place specified in the licence;
- (i) use or permit to be used any apparatus or device including any flap or shelf as a result of which the dimensions of the stall or vehicle area would increase beyond that specified in the licence;
- (j) in the case of a trader, conduct trade from a public place unless there is adequate off road parking adjacent to the place of trading for the parking of customer's vehicles; and
- (k) in the case of a stallholder, conduct a stall on private property unless there is adequate provision on the private property adjacent to the stall for the parking of customer's vehicles.

**Display of Licence****17. A person shall not display a licence unless—**

- (a) the licence is valid; and
- (b) he or she is the licensee.

**Part 4—Offences and Penalties****Offences and Penalties**

- (1) A person who breaches a provision of this By-law commits an offence.
- (2) Where an offence is committed in or in connection with the conduct of a stall or trading, the maximum penalty, shall upon conviction, being \$1000 or imprisonment for six months or both.
- (3) A person who commits an offence under this By-law, other than an offence referred to in subclause (2) shall be liable upon conviction to—
  - (a) a penalty of \$500; and
  - (b) in addition, if the court thinks fit, a daily penalty during the breach of \$50.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960***Municipality of the City of Mandurah***By-laws relating to Hawkers, Stallholders and Trading in Public Places**

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of Mandurah hereby records having resolved on the 22nd day of June, 1993, to revoke the By-laws to regulate Hawkers published in the *Government Gazette* of 27 October 1960 and to make and submit for confirmation of the Governor the following By-laws:

**Part I—Preliminary****1. Arrangement:**

By-laws are divided into parts as follows—

Part I—Preliminary, by-laws 1-4.

Part II—Licences, by-laws 5-18

Part III—Conduct, by-law 19

Part IV—Offences and Penalties, by-law 20

**2. Citation:**

These By-laws may be cited as the City of Mandurah By-laws relating to Hawkers, Stallholders and Trading in Public Places.

**3. Application:**

These By-laws shall apply and have force and effect throughout the whole of the district of the City of Mandurah.



**4. Definitions:****(1) In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—**

- “The Act” means the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended);
- “authorised officer” means the Clerk of the Council or any Environmental Health Officer, Building Surveyor, or any Ranger employed by the Council or any other person appointed by the Council as an authorised officer for the purpose of these By-laws;
- “charitable organisation” means an institution, association, club, society or body whether incorporated or not, the objects of which are of a charitable, benevolent, religious, cultural, educational, recreational, sporting or other like nature and members of which are not entitled or permitted to receive any pecuniary profit from the transactions thereof;
- “Council” means the Municipality of the City of Mandurah;
- “commercial participant” means any person who is involved in operating a stall or in conducting any trading activity for personal gain or profit;
- “district” means the municipal district of the City of Mandurah;
- “Food handling premises” means any premises where food is stored, kept, prepared, manufactured, processed, cooked, or served, or otherwise dealt with for subsequent sale to the public either directly or indirectly and includes any eating house or food vehicle;
- “Food vehicle” means any vehicle kept or used for the sale or preparation, packing, storing, handling, serving, supplying or conveying for sale of food;
- “hawker” has the same meaning given to it in Section 217 of the Act;
- “licence” means a licence issued pursuant to this By-law to hawk, conduct a stall or carry out trading in a public place as the case may be;
- “proprietor” means the proprietor of any business who solicits order for goods in any street, or who carries and exposes goods for sale in a street or public place, or who sells from a stall and shall include the lessee of a stall;
- “public place” includes a street, way and place which the public are allowed to use, whether the street, way or place is or is not on private property;
- “street” includes a highway and a thoroughfare which the public are allowed to use and includes every part of the highway or thoroughfare, and other things including bridges and culverts, appurtenant to it;
- “stall” means moveable or temporarily fixed structure, stand or table in, on or from which goods, wares, merchandise or services are sold, hired or offered for sale or hire;
- “stallholder” means a person in charge of a stall;
- “trading” means selling or hiring of goods, wares, merchandise or services, or offering goods, wares, merchandise or services for sale or hire, in a street or other public place and includes displaying goods, wares or merchandise for the purpose of offering them for sale or hire, inviting offers for sale or hire soliciting orders or carrying out any other transaction herein, but does not include the setting up of a stall, or the conducting of a business at a stall under the authority of a stallholder’s licence issued under these By-laws.

**Part II—Licences****5. Hawkers:**

- (1) A person shall not hawk any goods, wares or merchandise within the district unless that person holds a current hawker’s licence issued pursuant to these By-laws.
- (2) Every application for a hawkers licence shall be in the form provided in Schedule 1 and shall specify:
- (a) the name and address of the applicant who seeks the licence;
  - (b) the kind of goods, wares or merchandise which the applicant requires to hawk;
  - (c) the type of vehicle, conveyance or means of carriage to be employed in hawking;
  - (d) the period and hours of operation for which the licence is required.
  - (e) where the licence is required for part of the district, the part of the district to which it will apply.
- (3) Every application for a hawker’s licence (other than a renewal) must be accompanied by a certificate signed by a Justice of the Peace certifying that the applicant is of good character and reputation, and is a fit person to exercise the trade of a hawker.
- (4) A licence granted to a hawker is valid for the hawking of goods, wares, merchandise or services therein described only, and in the case of a licence limited to a part of the district, is valid for that part of the district only.

**6. Stallholders:**

(1) Subject to sub-bylaw (2), a person shall not conduct a stall for the sale of goods, wares or merchandise within the district, unless that person is a holder of a current stallholder's licence or is an assistant specified in a current stallholder's licence.

(2) Council may, in its absolute discretion and subject to such conditions as it thinks fit, permit a particular class of stallholder.

(3) Every application for a stallholder's licence shall be in the form provided in Schedule 2 and shall specify:

- (a) the full name and address of the applicant;
- (b) the proposed number and names and addresses of assistants to be engaged by the applicant in conducting the stall pursuant to the licence;
- (c) the location for which the licence is sought;
- (d) the period for which the licence is sought;
- (e) the proposed goods, wares, merchandise or service to be sold or hired from the stall; and
- (f) be accompanied by an accurate plan and description of any proposed stall which may be used for the selling or hiring of goods.

**7. Traders:**

(1) A person shall not carry on trading in any street or public place within the district unless that person is the holder of a current trader's licence or is an assistant specified in a current trader's licence.

(2) Every application for a trader's licence shall be in the form provided in Schedule 3 and shall specify:

- (a) the full name and address of the applicant;
- (b) the proposed number and the names and addresses of assistants to be engaged by the applicant in trading pursuant to the licence;
- (c) the location for which the licence is sought;
- (d) the proposed days and hours of trading;
- (e) the proposed goods, wares, merchandise or services in respect of which trading will be carried on; and
- (f) be accompanied by an accurate plan and description of any proposed stand, table, structure or vehicle which may be used for trading.

**8. Selling of Newspapers:**

The requirement for a valid licence to be held pursuant to these By-laws shall not apply to the selling or offering for sale of newspapers.

**9. Selling of Food**

(1) The requirement for a valid stallholder's or trader's licence shall also apply to the holder of a licence issued by the City of Mandurah to an Itinerant Vendor of Food who conducts a stall or carries on trading in any street or public place within the district.

(2) Council may on application from a person who has been licensed as an itinerant vendor of food within the district of Mandurah; grant an exemption from full payment of fees as prescribed by Schedule 4, and may allow a 50% reduction for any prescribed additional charge on initial issue and renewal of licence to a stallholder or trader.

(3) A person to whom an exemption has been granted in accordance with by-law 9(2) shall—

- (a) not park or stand for more than 10 minutes in any one location within 300 metres of any food handling premises selling a like product.
- (b) enter into an agreement to comply with such requirements and conditions as Council may determine in consideration of an exemption from full payment of licence fees otherwise applicable to stallholders and traders.

**10. Discretion:**

(1) Council may in its discretion under this part grant a licence or refuse to grant a licence or grant a licence subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and for a period of twelve (12) months or less.

(2) Council may refuse to issue a licence and may cancel a licence if the applicant or licensee:

- (a) has been twice convicted during the preceding five (5) years or is twice convicted in the space of five (5) years of an offence against the by-laws of any Local Authority relating to hawkers, stallholders or trading in public places; or
- (b) does not conform with the requirements of the Health Act 1911.

(3) Council may refuse to issue a licence if—

- (a) in its opinion the needs of the district or the portion thereof for which the licence is sought are adequately catered for by established shops or by persons to whom licences have been issued;

- (b) the proposed activity or place of trading is in the opinion of Council undesirable;
- (c) the proposed stand, table, structure or vehicle is in the opinion of Council unsuitable in any respect to the location for which the licence is sought;
- (d) the gathering of customers would impede pedestrian or vehicle movements, or cause conflict with other activities;
- (e) the trading location is not provided with sufficient off-road parking so as to prevent a traffic hazard or danger to the public.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of by-law 10 (3), no licence shall be issued to trade in a public place that is located in any part of a controlled access road or major highway or on any Main Roads Department road within the District of the City of Mandurah.

(5) Where a licensee by reason of illness, accident or other cause is unable to comply with these By-laws, Council may at the request of that licensee issue a permit in writing authorising a person named in the permit to be a nominee to occupy the period of the licensee's inability to comply with the licence or until the expiration of the term of the licence whichever is earlier.

(6) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other Act, Regulation or By-law none of the provisions of these By-laws shall preclude any person from complying with the provisions of the City of Mandurah Town Planning Scheme.

#### 11. Conditions:

Where a licence or exemption has been granted by Council subject to conditions, the person to whom the licence or exemption has been granted shall ensure that the conditions are observed at all times. If any condition is not observed that person commits an offence against these By-laws and the Council additionally or in the alternative to any court proceedings in respect of such offence may exercise the power under by-law 18 to cancel the licence or exemption.

#### 12. Licence Certificate:

Council shall issue to every licensee a licence certificate in the form set out in Schedules 1, 2 or 3 respectively for which the licensee shall pay the sum set out in Schedule 4 which shall be displayed by the licensee hawking, conducting a stall or trading as the case may be while that person is the holder of hawker's, stallholder's or trader's licence under these By-laws but not otherwise.

#### 13. Transfer of Licence:

Subject to By-law 10 (5), a licence issued under these By-laws shall not be transferable to another person.

#### 14. Length of Service:

A licence issued pursuant to these By-laws shall be valid until the 30th day of June next after it is granted or such lesser period as specified in the licence except where the licence is granted in the months of May or June when it shall extend to the 30th day of June in the next year following or such lesser period as specified.

#### 15. Annual Renewal:

Every application for the renewal of a licence for a period of twelve months shall be made annually during the month of June and every application for renewal of a licence for a period less than twelve (12) months shall be made four weeks prior to the expiration date and shall be in writing accompanied by the licence then in force.

#### 16. Fees:

The fees and additional charges to be imposed for an application for registration and for every renewal thereof and for an application to transfer a registration shall be those set out in Schedule 4. No licence is valid until the fees and charges have been paid.

#### 17. Exemption:

1. Notwithstanding provisions of by-law (16) Council may grant without fee or charge, a licence to conduct a stall or to carry on trading in any street or way or on any land for any period specified in such licence if the stall or trading—

- a. is carried on in a portion of a street or public place adjoining the normal place of business of the licence holder.
- b. is carried on by a charitable organisation or group that does not sublet space to, or involve commercial participants in the conduct of a stall or trading activity, and assistants are members of that charitable organisation or group.

#### 18. Cancellation:

(1) Council may by written notice cancel any licence issued under these By-laws for any of the reasons set out in by-law 10 (2) or on the grounds:

- (a) that the licensee is not conducting the business the subject of the licence in a respectable or sober manner;

- (b) that the licensee has assigned the licence without Council permission or no longer carries on the business the subject of the licence;
  - (c) that the licensee is not regularly carrying on the business for which the licence was granted; and
  - (d) that the licensee has breached a condition of the licence.
- (2) Upon cancellation of a licence the holder thereof shall forthwith return the licence certificate issued pursuant to by-law 12 to the Chief Executive Officer/Town Clerk of the Council and shall forfeit fees paid in respect of the licence.

#### Part III—Conduct

19. (1) A hawker while hawking, a stallholder while conducting a stall or a person carrying out trading shall:

- (a) display the licence certificate in a conspicuous place on the vehicle or temporary structure (in the case of a hawker or trader) or on the stall (in the case of a stallholder);
- (b) have the name of the hawker, trader or stallholder (or his assistant/s where appropriate) displayed on the vehicle or stall;
- (c) When selling goods, wares or merchandise by weight, carry and use for that purpose, scales tested and certified in accordance with the provisions of the Weights and Measures Act 1915; and
- (d) in the case of a stallholder, maintain the stall in good order and condition.

(2) A hawker, stallholder or trader shall not:

- (a) attempt to conduct a business within a distance of 300 metres of any shop or permanent place of business that is open for business and has for sale any goods, wares, merchandise or services of the kind being hawked or offered for sale by the stallholder or trader;
- (b) call the licensee's wares or cause or make any outcry noise or disturbance likely to be a nuisance or cause annoyance to any person in that vicinity;
- (c) deposit or store any box or basket containing goods, wares or merchandise under the vehicle of the licensee or upon the roadway or footpath;
- (d) obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on any footpath or roadway;
- (e) act in an offensive manner;
- (f) subject to sub-bylaws (a) and (b) of by-law 19, use, display or permit to be used or displayed an advertisement, placard, poster, streamer, sign or signboard on or about the place specific in the licence other than price tickets or labels on the items with labels not exceeding 200 square centimetres in area and relating to the business specified in the licence;
- (g) use or permit to be used any flashing or intermittent lighting apparatus or device on or from the place specified in the licence;
- (h) use or permit to be used any apparatus or device including any flap or shelf whereby the dimensions of a stall or vehicle are increased beyond any specified in the licence; and
- (i) in the case of a trader conduct trade from a public place unless there is adequate off-road parking adjacent to the place of trading for the parking of customers vehicles.

(3) A person shall not display a licence certificate without being the holder of valid licence pursuant to these By-laws.

#### Part IV Offences And Penalties

20. Penalty Provision:

- (1) Any person failing to do any act directed to be done or doing any act forbidden to be done by these By-laws, or any notice under these By-laws commits an offence.
- (2) Where an offence is committed in respect of a trader or a stall set up in a street or other public place, the maximum penalty shall upon conviction be \$1 000.00 or imprisonment for six (6) months.
- (3) Any person who commits an offence under these By-laws other than an offence dealt with in sub-bylaw (2) of by-law 20, shall upon conviction be liable to:
  - (a) a maximum penalty of \$500.00 and
  - (b) a maximum daily penalty of \$10.00 per day.

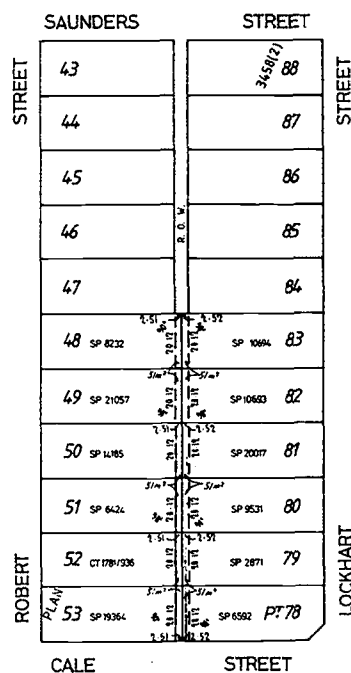

## Citation

1. These by-laws may be cited as the *Water Authority (Charges) Amendment By-laws (No. 3) 1994*.

## Commencement

2. These by-laws come into operation on 1 July 1994.

## By-law 18B inserted

3. After by-law 18A of the *Water Authority (Charges) By-laws 1987\** the following by-law is inserted —

**Residential multi-unit properties — concessional assessment**

- 18B. (1) In this by-law —

“eligible pensioner” has the same meaning as in section 3 (1) of the *Rates and Charges (Rebates and Deferments) Act 1992*;

“registered” in the case of an eligible pensioner who is a tenant, means registered with the Water Authority for the purposes of assessment under this by-law.

- (2) Where land comprises a residential multi-unit property served by a single meter and one or more of those units are occupied by —

- (a) an eligible pensioner who has registered an entitlement under the *Rates and Charges (Rebates and Deferments) Act 1992* before the commencement of the period to which a quantity charge applies; or
- (b) an eligible pensioner who is registered as a tenant with the Water Authority before the commencement of the period to which a quantity charge applies,

then the total charge payable for water usage in respect of that property is to be calculated in accordance with sub-by-law (3).

- (3) When calculating the consumption charge applicable to the units in a multi-unit property, the assessment for each unit occupied by a person describe in sub-by-law (2) (a) or (b) is to be calculated as 50% of the charge that would be payable for the supply —

- (a) of up to and including 150 kl of water supplied to that unit for the consumption year, where the land concerned is in the metropolitan area and charged in accordance with Schedule 1, Division 1, Part 3, item 1 or 2;

- (b) of up to and including —
  - (i) 600 kl of water supplied to that unit for the consumption year, where the land concerned is in the town of Cue, Laverton, Leonora, Meekatharra, Menzies, Sandstone or Wiluna; or
  - (ii) 400 kl of water supplied to that unit for the consumption year, where the land concerned is any other land south of 26° South Latitude,and charged in accordance with Schedule 1, Division 1, Part 3, item 3; or
- (c) of up to and including 600 kl of water supplied to that unit for the consumption year, where the land concerned is land north of 26° South Latitude and charged in accordance with Schedule 1, Division 1, Part 3, item 3,

with the usage calculated by determining the average consumption per unit in the multi-unit property.

(4) The Authority may, after having regard to the circumstances in a particular case, dispense with the requirement in sub-bylaw (2) or (3) for a pensioner to register or be listed prior to the commencement of the period to which a quantity charge applies.

(5) The Authority will supply the person or persons responsible for payment of the account for that multi-unit property with details of each pensioner's name in that property whose charge has been calculated in accordance with sub-bylaw (3).

(6) The person or persons responsible for payment of the account for a multi-unit property must ensure that the benefit of having a charge calculated in accordance with this by-law is passed on to each entitled pensioner in that property to whom it applies.

(7) An eligible pensioner registered for the purpose of this by-law must advise the Authority, in writing, if that pensioner —

- (a) ceases to be an eligible pensioner; or
- (b) ceases to occupy the property which is the subject of the registration.

(8) A person who, in connection with or for the purpose of being eligible to have a charge calculated in accordance with this by-law, gives information that he or she knows or has reasonable cause to believe to be false or misleading commits an offence.

Penalty: \$1 000.

WORKERS' COMPENSATION AND REHABILITATION ACT 1981  
WORKERS' COMPENSATION (COMPENSATION MAGISTRATE'S  
COURT) RULES 1994

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Workers' Compensation (Compensation Magistrate's Court) Rules 1994*.

**Notice of sittings of court**

2. Notice of the times and places at which a compensation magistrate's court may sit is to be given by publishing the notice in the *Gazette*.

**Review officer referring matter to court**

3. (1) If, under section 84ZM of the Act, a review officer refers a matter to a compensation magistrate's court for determination, the review officer is to give to the court, and make available to each party —

- (a) a record of the proceedings before the review officer, including notes of any evidence that has been given before the review officer, and a copy of any document produced in the proceedings that is relevant to the matter;
- (b) a statement of the facts of the matter as found by the review officer; and
- (c) a statement of the reasons for referring the matter and the questions that the review officer believes are required to be determined by the court.

(2) Without limiting the general power of the court to make orders giving directions as to the conduct of the proceedings or to make orders of any other kind, the court may give directions as to —

- (a) the filing of a statement of facts that, although not having been found by the review officer, are agreed between the parties;
- (b) the mode of determining questions of fact that are required to be determined by the court;
- (c) the filing and serving of written submissions.

**Appeal from review officer to court**

4. (1) A party to proceedings before a review officer who appeals under section 84ZN of the Act against a decision or order of the review officer is to make the appeal by lodging with the Director a notice of appeal in accordance with subrule (2).

(2) The notice of appeal is to be in writing and is to state —

- (a) the substance of the decision or order against which the appeal is made;
- (b) the question of law involved that gives rise to the appeal;
- (c) the grounds, briefly but specifically described, on which the appeal is made;
- (d) the appellant's estimate of the time required to hear the appeal; and
- (e) the address at which documents relating to the appeal may be served on the appellant.

(3) The Director, upon receiving the notice of appeal, is to notify the review officer concerned who is to —

- (a) cause a copy of the notice of appeal to be served on each other party to the proceedings from which the appeal arose; and

- (b) give to the compensation magistrate's court, and make available to each party —
- (i) a record of the proceedings before the review officer, including notes of any evidence that has been given before the review officer, and a copy of any document produced in the proceedings that is relevant to the matter;
  - (ii) a statement of the facts of the matter as found by the review officer;
  - (iii) a statement of the reasons for the decision or order against which the appeal is made; and
  - (iv) a certificate verifying that a copy of the notice of appeal has been served on the parties on whom a copy is required by paragraph (a) to be served.

(4) A person served under subrule (3) (a) with the notice of appeal who wishes to participate in the hearing of the appeal may lodge with the court a notice in writing to that effect stating the address at which documents relating to the appeal may be served on the person.

(5) A party to the appeal is to lodge with the court and serve on each other party to the appeal, at least 2 days before the day when the hearing of the appeal is to commence, notice of any submission that is to be made and a list of cases or other authorities to which reference is to be made.

#### Enforcement of Directorate orders

5. An application under section 84ZT of the Act for the enforcement of an order made by a conciliation officer or review officer is to be made in writing lodged with the clerk of the compensation magistrate's court and is to specify the terms of the order and the measures, if any, that have been taken to obtain compliance with it.
