## PLANT DISEASES ACT 1914

## PLANT DISEASES AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (NO. 5) 1994

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Plant Diseases Amendment Regulations (No. 5) 1994*.

**Schedule 1 amended**

2. Schedule 1 to the *Plant Diseases Regulations 1989\** is amended —

(a) in Part A in the item commencing "Jackfruit" in column 5 by deleting "4," and substituting the following —

" 4/50 "; and

(b) in Part B after item 49 by adding the following item —

"

50. The conditions of entry into the State for Jackfruit (fruit) from any other State or Territory are that the fruit is allowed into the State only if —

(a) the skin of the fruit is unbroken; and

(b) each individual fruit is inspected, and certified as having unbroken skin, by an authorized officer of the Department of Agriculture in the State or Territory in which the fruit originated.

## PLANT DISEASES ACT 1914

## PLANT DISEASES AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (NO. 7) 1994

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Plant Diseases Amendment Regulations (No. 7) 1994*.

**Commencement**

2. These regulations come into operation on the day on which sections 13 and 17 of the *Plant Diseases Amendment Act 1993* come into operation.

**Principal regulations**

3. In these regulations the *Plant Diseases Regulations 1989\** are referred to as the principal regulations.

**Part 4A inserted**

4. The principal regulations are amended after regulation 19G by inserting the following Part —

“

Part 4A — Private inspection and treatment premises

*Division 1 — Prescribed standards (s. 22B (1))*

**Premises for inspection of imported potential carriers**

**19H.** For the purposes of section 22B (1) (a) of the Act, premises for the inspection of imported potential carriers must have —

- (a) a secure quarantine area of a size approved as suitable for the type and volume of the imports to be stored;
- (b) a weather-proof inspection area with natural or artificial light of not less than 600 lux intensity; and
- (c) a white topped inspection bench of a size approved as suitable for the type and nature of the imports to be inspected.

**Premises for treatment of potential carriers**

**19I.** For the purposes of section 22B (1) (a) of the Act, premises for the treatment of any potential carriers must have —

- (a) for fumigation —
  - (i) approved facilities and equipment to maintain and monitor gas at the appropriate concentrations;
  - (ii) approved chemical heating facilities;
  - (iii) approved fans to disperse and circulate any chemicals; and
  - (iv) a secure quarantine area;
- (b) for spraying —
  - (i) approved spraying and safety equipment; and
  - (ii) a secure quarantine area; and
- (c) for disinfestation treatments —
  - (i) if the disinfestation treatment is cold disinfestation, approved facilities which are adequate to keep the temperature within the required range, and approved temperature monitoring equipment;

- (ii) for all types of disinfestation treatments, facilities and equipment approved as suitable for the type of treatment carried out; and
- (iii) a secure quarantine area.

#### **Premises for cleaning of potential carriers**

**19J.** For the purposes of section 22B (1) (a) of the Act, premises for carrying out the cleaning of any potential carriers must have —

- (a) a secure quarantine and cleaning area of a size approved as suitable for the cleaning to be carried out, which is constructed of concrete or bitumen and which drains to an approved sump; and
- (b) an approved sump which is free draining to a below ground holding tank and is connected to deep sewerage, a leach drain or a secure settling pond.

#### **Premises where potential carriers are handled for experimental or laboratory purposes**

**19K.** For the purposes of section 22B (1) (a) of the Act, premises where potential carriers are handled for experimental or laboratory purposes must have —

- (a) approved facilities to dispose of residues and discarded containers; and
- (b) a secure quarantine and testing area.

#### **Premises registered as a propagation house for tissue cultured apple/grape plants**

**19L.** (1) For the purposes of section 22B (1) (a) of the Act, premises registered as a propagation house for tissue cultured apple/grape plants must have —

- (a) secure quarantine facilities allowing apple/grape plants to be kept separate from other apple/grape material;
- (b) for grape plants, facilities to maintain the humidity in which the grape plants are kept.

(2) For the purposes of section 22B (1) (b) of the Act, the person in whose name the propagation house is registered shall ensure —

- (a) that a register recording the names and addresses of purchasers of imported apple or grape plants is established and maintained; and
- (b) that grape plants are kept or stored in an atmosphere of at least 95% humidity.

#### **Premises for quarantine clearance**

**19M.** (1) For the purposes of section 22B (1) (a) of the Act, premises for the disposal of waste potential carriers, and for the quarantine clearance of passengers and crew, arriving in Western Australia by air, sea, rail or road must have —

- (a) an approved quarantine area and white topped bench for the inspection of baggage, with lighting of not less than 600 lux intensity;

- (b) signs of an approved type and number to advise persons that they are subject to quarantine restrictions; and
- (c) approved facilities for the disposal of waste potential carriers.

(2) For the purposes of section 22B (1) (b) of the Act, the person in whose name the quarantine premises are registered shall ensure that, prior to arrival, advice is given to persons who are about to enter Western Australia that those persons are subject to Western Australia's quarantine laws, and that their baggage and other possessions may be subject to inspection when they arrive in Western Australia.

*Division 2 — Manner of conduct in relation to registered premises (s. 22B (1) (b))*

**Conduct in relation to registered premises**

**19N.** For the purposes of section 22B (1) (b) of the Act, the person in whose name private treatment and inspection premises are registered shall ensure that, in relation to those registered premises, —

- (a) the public does not have access to inspection and quarantine areas without permission of the registered person or nominated staff members;
- (b) access to a propagation house is restricted to nominated staff members;
- (c) a person is nominated to control the inspection or quarantine area, or both, and that the nominated person is an approved person;
- (d) potential carriers under quarantine are physically separated from other goods;
- (e) any instructions issued by an inspector are complied with as soon as is practicable;
- (f) the Director General is notified immediately, in writing, of any changes in ownership of, or planned modifications to, the premises;
- (g) accurate records are kept of quarantined potential carriers which have come into, been treated, etc. at or left, the premises;
- (h) staff receive training of an approved type;
- (i) staff are appropriately licensed to use fumigants or treatments which are in fact used, and facilities for the use of those fumigants or treatments are, where necessary under any other written law, approved for those purposes by the appropriate authorities; and
- (j) fungicides with activity against apple scab or downy mildew are not applied in a propagation house, and shall give a written undertaking not to apply any such fungicide in any propagation house registered in that person's name.

*Division 3 — Application for registration (s. 22B (2))*

**Form of application for registration**

**19O.** For the purposes of section 22B (2) (a) of the Act, an application for registration of private inspection and treatment premises must include the following prescribed details, to be completed by the owner or occupier—



- (a) the name of the applicant;
- (b) the address and the postal address of the premises;
- (c) the telephone number and facsimile number of the premises;
- (d) the functions for which the registration is sought;
- (e) the proposed imports;
- (f) the name of a person who is to be nominated as responsible for the operation of the quarantine area or the inspection area, or both;
- (g) acknowledgment by the applicant that —
  - (i) it is understood that if registration is granted, it is subject to the prescribed standards and prescribed manner of conduct being met for the duration of the registration, and that an inspector may at any time during the registration period inspect the premises to ensure that the standards and manner of conduct are being met and maintained; and
  - (ii) the Director General may cancel the registration if the standards and manner of conduct are not being met and maintained;
- and
- (h) the signature of the applicant and the date of the application.

#### Prescribed application fee

**19P.** (1) For the purposes of section 22B (2) (b) of the Act and subject to subregulation (2), the annual fee for —

- (a) an application for registration of private treatment and inspection premises is \$76; and
- (b) an application to renew an existing registration of private treatment and inspection premises is \$38.

(2) If private treatment and inspection premises which are the subject of an application for registration are already registered by the Australian Quarantine and Inspection Service of the Commonwealth for the purposes of similar overseas quarantine functions, the application fee in subregulation (1) (a) is \$38.

#### Regulation 20B inserted

**5.** The principal regulations are amended after regulation 20A by inserting the following regulations —

“

#### Infringement notices

**20B.** (1) The offences described in Schedule 8 are prescribed for the purposes of section 35 of the Act and the amount appearing in the final column of that Schedule, directly opposite an offence, is the prescribed penalty in respect of that offence, if dealt with under that section.

(2) Form No. 10 in Schedule 3 is prescribed, under section 35 (3) of the Act, as the form of an infringement notice.

(3) Form No. 11 in Schedule 3 is prescribed, under section 35 (7) of the Act, as the form of a notice of withdrawal of an infringement notice.

”

- (b) more than 10 prescribed abalone.

(2) Subject to regulation 15L (2) and without limiting subregulation (1) (b), a person in charge or control of a boat shall not cause or permit any persons to have in their possession in the boat, when the number of abalone in each person’s possession is aggregated, more than 30 prescribed abalone.

(3) Subregulations (1) and (2) apply irrespective of the period over which the abalone were taken.

(4) A person who contravenes subregulation (1) or (2) commits an offence.

Penalty: \$1 000.

(5) In this regulation —

“prescribed abalone” means Brownlip Abalone (*Haliotis conicopora*), Greenlip Abalone (*Haliotis laevis*) or any combination of those 2 species of abalone.

**When possession limits for abalone do not apply**

**15L.** (1) A person does not commit an offence under regulation 15K (1) if —

- (a) the abalone were in the person's possession at the person's principal place of residence;
- (b) the abalone in the person's possession were purchased bona fide by the person or any other person;
- (c) the abalone were in the person's possession in connection with the operation of a processing establishment under Part IIIB of the Act and, at the time of possession of the abalone, the person held a processor's licence authorizing the processing of abalone; or
- (d) at the time of possession of the abalone the person was authorized under a licence to take abalone in the Fishery.

(2) A person does not commit an offence under regulation 15K (2) if —

- (a) the abalone in the possession of the persons in the boat were purchased bona fide by them or any other person; or
- (b) at the time of possession of the abalone the person was in a boat authorized under a licence to be used in the Fishery for the taking of abalone, and the abalone were taken by a person authorized under a licence to take abalone in the Fishery.

(3) In this regulation —

“**Fishery**” means the Abalone Limited Entry Fishery declared under the *Abalone Limited Entry Fishery Notice 1992*;

“**licence**” means a licence issued in accordance with the *Abalone Limited Entry Fishery Notice 1992*.

**Presumption of possession**

**15M.** If an Inspector finds abalone that the Inspector reasonably suspects are the subject of an offence under regulation 15K, and the Inspector is unable at the time of finding the abalone to determine who is in possession of them, any person —

- (a) in charge of, or using, a refrigerator, freezer, icebox, bucket, bag or any other means of holding or storing abalone; or
- (b) in the case of an offence under regulation 15K (1), in a vehicle,

in which the abalone are found shall be deemed to be in possession of them.

  - (c) to prevent a business agent from receiving a fee for arranging an assignment, sub— tenancy or new lease of business premises when the business agent is entitled to receive a fee for negotiating the sale of a business conducted from those premises;
  - (d) to correct an anomaly in the calculation of leasing fees for lease terms greater than 3 years;
  - (e) to increase an Auctioneers' fees where the property is not sold.
3. The Fees set out in the schedule to the Real Estate and Business Agents (Remuneration) Notice 199 I shall be amended as follows:—
  - (a) Item 1(3) under the heading "Hotel freeholds, leases, plant, furniture, ingoing, goodwill and trading stock" be deleted in full.

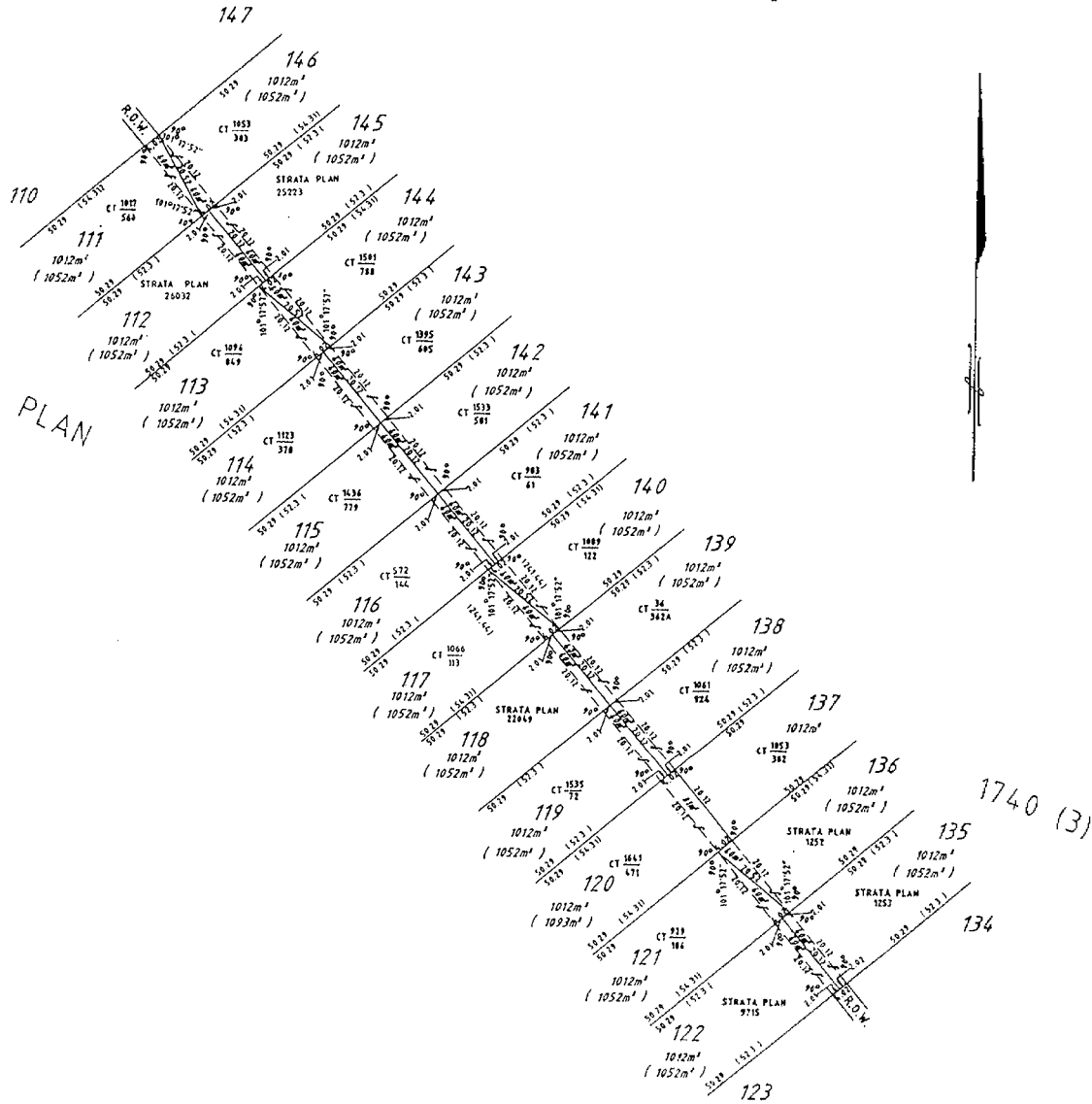

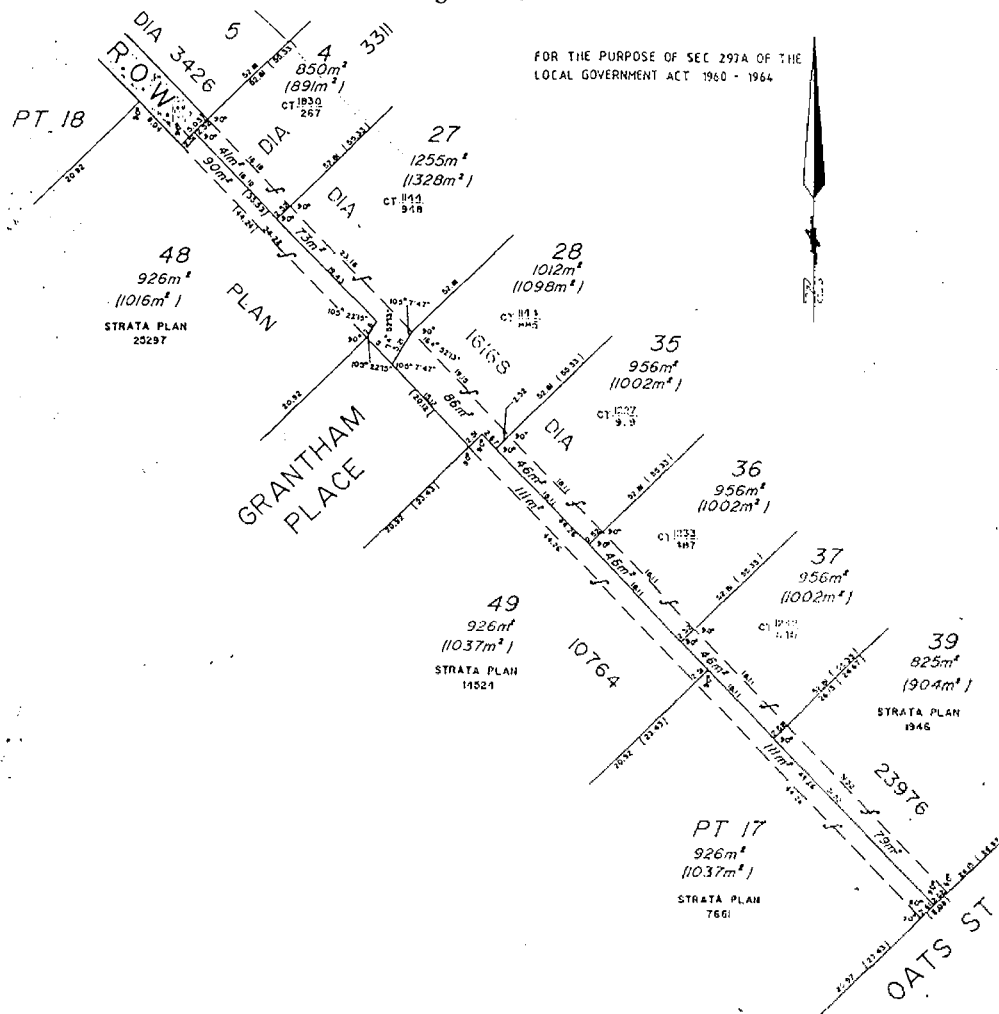

During the period from 1st October 1994 to 31st March 1995 inclusive, have firebreaks at least two (2) metres wide in such positions as are necessary to completely surround the perimeter of any homestead, building, fuel installation (including drums), haystack (where such a haystack is situated within 200 metres of any homestead, building, fuel installation) or group of such structures or installations.

#### 4. HARVESTING

A fully operational mobile fire fighting unit complete with a container with at least 400 litres minimum capacity of water is to be readily available to any paddock being harvested. A fully operational plough, tillage or cultivator equipment is to be readily available, and in close proximity, to any paddock being harvested. The responsibility to supply these units being that of the landholder.

**YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES:****Rural Land.**

- (a) Trafficable firebreaks, clear of all inflammable material and not less than three (3) metres wide shall be constructed inside and within 15 metres of the boundary of all land where an area of land of more than one (1) hectare of predominantly trees, bush or scrub adjoin that boundary.
- (b) Trafficable firebreaks, clear of all inflammable material and not less than three (3) metres wide shall be constructed as close as is reasonably practicable around the surrounds of all buildings.

- (b) Where in the opinion of the Shire Ranger or the area Fire Control Officer the land contains an amount of inflammable material which is considered hazardous the land owner shall clear such hazard upon service of a notice requiring such works to be carried out.
- (c) All conditions relating to "special rural" land contained in the Shire of Manjimup Town Planning Scheme No 2, and amendments, must be complied with.

**Special Residential Land.**

- (a) All inflammable material save for live standing trees shall be cleared within a twenty (20) metre radius of all buildings.
- (b) Where in the opinion of the Shire Ranger or the area Fire Control Officer the land contains an amount of inflammable material which is considered hazardous the land owner shall clear such hazard upon service of a notice requiring such works to be carried out.
- (c) All conditions relating to "special residential" land contained in the Shire of Manjimup Town Planning Scheme No 2, and amendments, must be complied with.

**Townsite Land**

[Residential, Commercial, Industrial and Deferred Urban whether occupied or not]

For the purpose of this notice a "plantation" shall be defined as land upon which any pine or eucalyptus species of tree being planted of an area exceeding eight (8) hectares. "Boundary" shall mean parcels of plantation land under separate ownership, lease or any form of contractual or financial arrangement whatsoever. You shall:

#### **Pine and Eucalyptus Plantations.**

1. Construct trafficable firebreaks not less than ten (10) metres wide around and immediately inside all external boundaries of such land.
2. Construct trafficable firebreaks not less than six (6) metres wide within the plantation so as to sub divide the plantation into compartments, each not exceeding twenty eight (28) hectares.
3. Trees within two (2) metres of the edge of any firebreak to be pruned so that vehicular access along the firebreak is not impeded by branches.
4. A map of each plantation showing roads, firebreaks access and water points shall be lodged with this Council prior to 1st December 1994.

#### **Power Lines.**

Where power lines pass through any land, S.E.C. regulations must be strictly adhered to.

The requirements of this "Firebreak Notice" are considered to be the minimum standard of fire prevention work necessary to adequately protect not only individual properties but the district generally. In addition to the requirements of this order, Council may issue separate orders to owner/occupiers if additional fire hazard reduction work is considered necessary in some specific circumstances.
