Notice No. 696

FD 149/75

Made by the Minister under section 32.

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the Abalone Limited Entry Fishery Amendment Notice 1995.

Principal notice

2. In this notice the Abalone Limited Entry Fishery Notice 1992* (Notice No. 542) is referred to as the principal notice.

Clause 14 amended

3. Clause 14 of the principal notice is amended—

- (a) in subparagraph 14 (b) (ii) by deleting "1,000" and substituting "660";
- (b) in paragraph 14 (c) by repealing the paragraph and substituting the following paragraph—
 - (i) a person authorised to operate in Zone 2 shall not take more than—
 - (i) a combined total of 5,000 kilograms meat weight of Greenlip and Brownlip abalone in any year;
 - (ii) a combined daily total of 175 kilograms whole weight of Greenlip and Brownlip abalone when operating in the waters described in Item 6 of Schedule 1; or
 - (iii) 1,000 kilograms whole weight of Roe's abalone in any year; and".

Clause 17 amended

HEALTH**HE301****HOSPITALS AND HEALTH SERVICES ACT 1927****HOSPITALS (SERVICES CHARGES) REGULATIONS 1984****HOSPITALS (SERVICES CHARGES FOR MAGNETIC RESONANCE IMAGING) DETERMINATION 1995**

Made by the Minister for Health under section 37 (3) (af) of the Act and regulations 5 (2) (d) and 5 (3).

Citation

1. This determination may be cited as the *Hospitals (Services Charges for Magnetic Resonance Imaging) Determination 1995*.

Interpretation

2. Unless the contrary intention appears, a word or phrase to which a meaning is attributed by, or by virtue of its use in, the *Hospitals (Services Charges) Regulations 1984** has the same meaning when it is used in this determination.

Application

3. This determination applies to Royal Perth Hospital and Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital.

Charges payable in respect of magnetic resonance imaging

4. The charges payable in respect of any magnetic resonance imaging service rendered by the hospitals referred to in clause 4 in respect of —

(a) the following classes of patients —

- (i) compensable in-patients;
- (ii) ineligible in-patients;
- (iii) compensable out-patients;
- (iv) ineligible out-patients;
- (v) compensable same day patients;
- (iv) ineligible same day patients;

and

(b) any other service rendered to a patient for the purposes of research,

are the appropriate charges set out in the Schedule.

Notice of revocation

5. The *Hospitals (Services Charges for Magnetic Resonance Imaging) Determination 1994** is revoked.

NURSES ACT 1992

NURSES CODE OF PRACTICE 1995

Issued by the Nurses Board of Western Australia under section 9 of the Act with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Introduction

A. Guidelines for the standards expected of nurses should be considered in the context of the profession's role in the community.

B. The general community and the nursing profession have the right to expect that nurses —

- (i) can function in diverse settings, respond to changing needs and provide quality service; and
- (ii) contribute to and encourage community involvement in policy-making, planning, services and allocation of resources in relation to health care.

C. A nurse's work should be approached from the position that nursing care is client focussed, paying particular attention to the client's level of independence and approval. The nurse should be responsive to the wishes and requirements of the individuals and groups with whom the nurse works and the community in which the nurse works.

D. The nurse is one of the members of a multi-disciplinary health care team. Matters not within a nurse's control may affect the care provided by the nurse and the circumstances of each case must be taken into account when considering whether the conduct of a nurse was acceptable in that case.

Citation

1. This Code may be cited as the *Nurses Code of Practice 1995*.

Application to bodies corporate

2. Where a body corporate is registered as a nurse, this Code applies to the body corporate and to each member of the body corporate who is a nurse.

Nursing care for clients' individual needs

3. (1) A nurse should provide the client with the opportunity to be involved in the assessment, planning and provision of nursing care by, where practicable —

- (a) informing the client of the client's right to participate in decisions affecting the client's nursing care;
- (b) providing to the client relevant information about the client's nursing care or proposed care; and
- (c) taking into account the client's beliefs and customs.

- (2) A nurse should abide by the client's wishes in relation to nursing care or proposed care where it is reasonable and practicable to do so.

- (3) A nurse who is caring for a client who is in a vulnerable physical or emotional state should ensure, to the extent practicable, that no unfair advantage is taken of the client.

Records

4. (1) Any record made by a nurse in relation to the nursing care of a client should be accurate, legible and comprehensive and should contain current information that is relevant to the ongoing care of the client.

(2) Any record made by a nurse for any other nursing purpose should be accurate, legible, comprehensive, current and relevant to the matter for which the record is being made.

Confidentiality

5. (1) A nurse should respect the privacy of clients and treat as confidential information obtained in a professional capacity.

(2) Confidential or private information about a client should not be disclosed by a nurse to any other person without the client's consent, unless permitted or required by law to do so.

(3) When communicating confidential or private information to a person who is authorized to receive the information, a nurse should do so in a manner and place that minimizes the risk of the information also being communicated to other persons.

Avoiding and reporting below standard nursing care

6. (1) A nurse should ensure that the client's health and safety is not adversely affected by a matter relating to the nurse's personal health and which is known to the nurse.

(2) If a nurse becomes aware that nursing care being provided, or about to be provided, to a client —

(a) is inadequate or inappropriate; or

(b) may adversely affect the rights, health or safety of the client,

the nurse should make the situation known to a person who has the authority to make a further assessment of the care provided or to be provided and who can take steps to rectify the situation.

Conscientious objection

7. (1) If a nurse —

(a) has a conscientious objection to, and is unwilling to perform or participate in, a nursing procedure; and

(b) would be expected to perform or participate in the procedure were it not for the conscientious objection,

the nurse should notify the nurse's client, employer, or principal, as the case may be, of the objection and the unwillingness to perform or participate in the procedure.

(2) The nurse should give the notice as soon as is reasonably practicable after the likelihood of the nurses's being required to perform or participate in such a procedure becomes known to the nurse.

Working within competence

8. (1) A nurse should ensure that the nurse's competence is commensurate with the practice requirements for the nurse's current nursing role.

(2) A nurse should not undertake the provision of nursing services beyond the nurse's competence.

(3) When delegating tasks to other carers, a nurse should ensure that the carers are competent for the delegated tasks.

Gifts

9. A nurse who provides nursing services to a client should not accept for those services any thing other than remuneration in the usual manner but if, in the opinion of the nurse, the thing is a token gift with a nominal value then the nurse may accept it.

Promotion of goods and services

10. A nurse who promotes any goods or any nursing services should not, in relation to the promotion of the goods or services —

- (a) make a statement that the nurse knows, or should reasonably know, is false in a material particular; or
- (b) make a statement or act in a manner that the nurse knows, or should reasonably know, is misleading or deceptive or is likely to mislead or deceive.

Dealings with nursing colleagues

11. (1) A nurse should treat the nurse's colleagues with courtesy.

(2) A nurse should take opportunities to assist in the professional development and education of colleagues.

(3) A nurse should, where relevant, provide guidance and support to nursing students.

Awareness of laws relating to nurses

12. A nurse should ensure that the nurse is informed in relation to Commonwealth and State laws affecting nurses and the practice of nursing, including subsidiary legislation, common law and professional codes of practice and ethics that may be in force from time to time.

Conflicts of interest

13. (1) A nurse should disclose to the nurse's client, employer or principal, as the case may be, any conflict of interest that the nurse has or may have if the nurse provides a nursing service to a person.

(2) A nurse should not provide or continue to provide a nursing service to 2 or more persons if to do so would or may give rise to a conflict of interest adverse to the interests of any one of those persons unless the persons have been fully informed of the nature and implications of the conflict and consent to the nurse providing or continuing to provide the service.

Conduct generally

14. A nurse should conduct herself or himself —

- (a) in a way which will maintain public trust and confidence in the nursing profession;
- (b) so as to show respect and care for people and property; and
- (c) so as not to discredit the reputation of the nursing profession.

POISONS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (NO. 2) 1995

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Poisons Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1995*.

Regulation 2 amended

2. Regulation 2 of the *Poisons Regulations 1965** is amended by deleting the definition of "SUSDP" and substituting the following definition —

“SUSDP” means the STANDARD FOR THE UNIFORM SCHEDULING OF DRUGS AND POISONS NO. 9 issued by the Australian Health Ministers' Advisory Council, adopted on the recommendation of the National Drugs and Poisons Schedule Committee and published by the Australian Government Publishing Service, Canberra —

- (a) as amended by AMENDMENT NO. 1 adopted on the recommendation of the National Drugs and Poisons Schedule Committee as effective on 18 December 1994; and
- (b) as amended by AMENDMENT NO. 2 adopted on the recommendation of the National Drugs and Poisons Schedule Committee as effective on 22 March 1995;

POISONS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (NO. 3) 1995

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Poisons Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 1995*.

Commencement

2. These regulations come into operation on 1 June 1995.

Regulation 2 amended

3. Regulation 2 of the *Poisons Regulations 1965** is amended in the definition of "SUSDP" —

- (a) by deleting "and" after paragraph (a); and

(b) after paragraph (b) by adding the following —

and

- (b) as amended by AMENDMENT NO. 3 adopted on the recommendation of the National Drugs and Poisons Schedule Committee as effective on 1 June 1995;

POISONS ACT 1964

POISONS (SCHEDULED SUBSTANCES) AMENDMENT ORDER 1995

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under section 21.

Citation

1. This order may be cited as the *Poisons (Scheduled Substances) Amendment Order 1995*.

Commencement

2. This order comes into operation on the day it is published in the *Government Gazette*.

Appendix A amended

3. Appendix A to the *Poisons Act 1964** is amended —

- (a) in the Second Schedule —

- (i) in the item commencing “ASPIRIN” by deleting

“(c) in tablets or capsules each containing 325 mg or less of aspirin as the only therapeutically active constituent other than an effervescent agent when —

- (i) packed in blister or strip packaging or in containers with a child resistant closure;
- (ii) in a primary pack containing not more than 25 tablets or capsules;”

and substituting the following —

“

- (c) in tablets or capsules containing no other therapeutically active constituent except an effervescent agent when —

- (i) packed in blister or strip packaging or in a container with a child-resistant closure;

- (ii) in a primary pack of not more than 25 tablets or capsules, each containing 325 mg or less of aspirin, or in a primary pack of not more than 16 tablets or capsules, each containing 500 mg or less of aspirin;

”;

- (ii) by deleting the item commencing “BROMPHENIRAMINE” and substituting the following item —

“

BROMPHENIRAMINE in oral preparations containing one or more of the following substances —

- (a) an antitussive other than codeine or dihydrocodeine;
- (b) an expectorant;
- (c) phenylephrine;
- (d) pseudoephedrine,

except in preparations for the treatment of children under 2 years of age.

”;

- (iii) by deleting the item commencing “CHLORPHENIRAMINE” and substituting the following item —

“

CHLORPHENIRAMINE in oral preparations containing one or more of the following substances —

- (a) an antitussive other than codeine or dihydrocodeine;
- (b) an expectorant;
- (c) phenylephrine;
- (d) pseudoephedrine,

except in preparations for the treatment of children under 2 years of age.

”;

- (iv) by deleting the item commencing “DEXCHLORPHENIRAMINE” and substituting the following item —

“

DEXCHLORPHENIRAMINE in oral preparations containing one or more of the following substances —

- (a) an antitussive other than codeine or dihydrocodeine;
- (b) an expectorant;
- (c) phenylephrine;
- (d) pseudoephedrine,

except in preparations for the treatment of children under 2 years of age.

”;

- (v) by deleting the item commencing "DICOPHANE";
- (vi) by deleting the item commencing "DIPHENHYDRAMINE" and substituting the following item —

“

DIPHENHYDRAMINE —

- (a) in primary packs of not more than 10 doses, for the prevention or treatment of motion sickness; or
- (b) in oral preparations containing one or more of the following substances —
- (i) an antitussive other than codeine or dihydrocodeine;
- (ii) an expectorant;
- (iii) phenylephrine;
- (iv) pseudoephedrine,

except in preparations for the treatment of children under 2 years of age.

”;

- (vii) by deleting the item commencing "DIPHENYLPYRALINE" and substituting the following item —

“

DIPHENYLPYRALINE in oral preparations containing one or more of the following substances —

- (a) an antitussive other than codeine or dihydrocodeine;
- (b) an expectorant;
- (c) phenylephrine;
- (d) pseudoephedrine,

except in preparations for the treatment of children under 2 years of age.

”;

- (viii) by deleting the item commencing "DOXYLAMINE" and substituting the following item —

“

DOXYLAMINE in oral preparations containing one or more of the following substances —

- (a) an antitussive other than codeine or dihydrocodeine;
- (b) an expectorant;
- (c) phenylephrine;
- (d) pseudoephedrine,

except in preparations for the treatment of children under 2 years of age.

”;

- (ix) by deleting the item commencing "GUAIPHENESIN" and substituting the following item —

“

GUAIPHENESIN in oral preparations for therapeutic use.

”;

- (x) by deleting the item commencing "HUMAN CHORIONIC GONADOTROPHIN";
- (xi) by deleting the item commencing "LUTEINISING HORMONE";
- (xii) in the item commencing "PARACETAMOL" in paragraph (b) (ii), before "labelled", by deleting "is";
- (xiii) in the item commencing "PHENIRAMINE" by deleting paragraph (c) and substituting the following paragraph —
- "
- (c) in oral preparations containing one or more of the following substances —
- (i) an antitussive other than codeine or dihydrocodeine;
- (ii) an expectorant;
- (iii) phenylephrine;
- (iv) pseudoephedrine,
- except in preparations for the treatment of children under 2 years of age.

- (xiv) by deleting the item commencing "PHENOL" and substituting the following item —

- (i) an antitussive other than codeine or dihydrocodeine;
- (ii) an expectorant;
- (iii) phenylephrine;
- (iv) pseudoephedrine,
- except in preparations for the treatment of children under 2 years of age.
- ”;

- (xvi) by deleting the item commencing "THENYLDIAMINE" and substituting the following item —

THENYLDIAMINE —

- (a) in nasal preparations for topical use; or
- (b) in oral preparations containing one or more of the following substances —

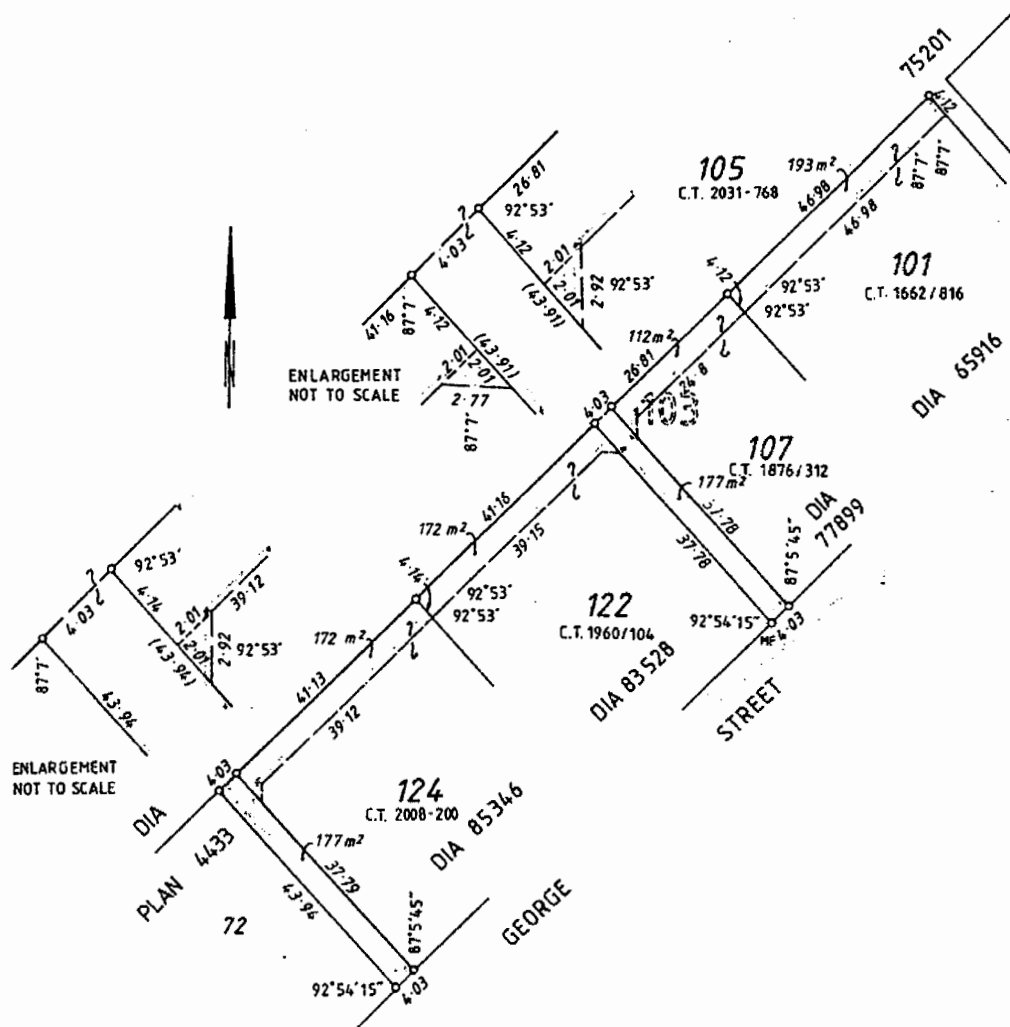

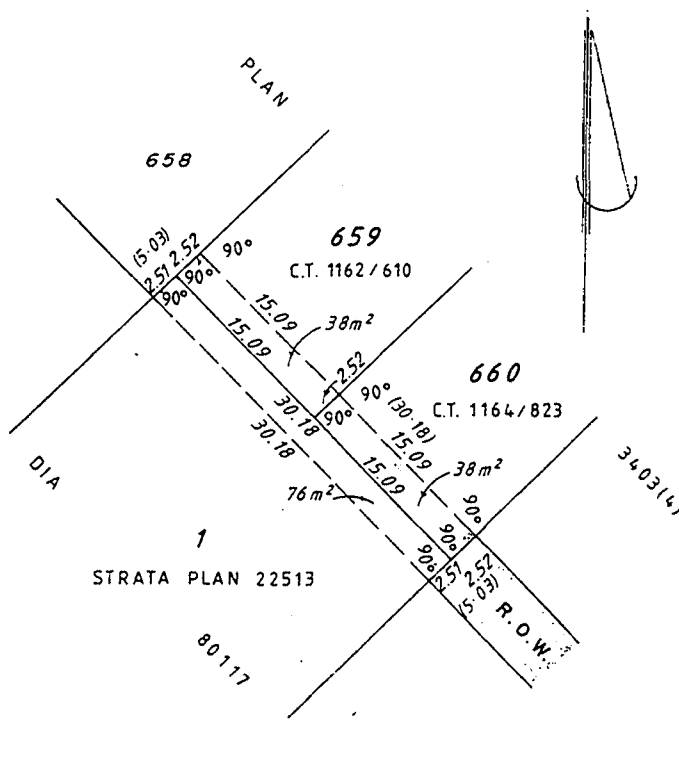

- 6.9.6 An Outline Development Plan may include other supporting plans, maps, diagrams, illustrations and a written statement to further demonstrate the proposal.
- 6.9.7 Council, shall require the following actions to be taken to ensure that the Outline Development Plan is advertised to allow public participation and that submissions from the public on any aspect of the Outline Development Plan are to be considered prior to the adoption and implementation of the Plan.
- (a) The Council may require the proponent of the Outline Development Plan to give notice or may itself at the expense of the proponent give notice of the proposed Outline Development Plan by any one or more of the follow means—
 - (i) written notice to such owners of land as the Council stipulates;
 - (ii) place notice signs on the land in positions required by Council;
 - (iii) the advertisement of the progressed Outline Development Plan in newspapers to the requirements of Council; and
 - (iv) other means of notification specified by Council.
 - (b) Council shall prescribe the form and content of advertisements to ensure that the existence of a plan, the identity of the land affected by the plan and the right and time period for the public to lodge submissions with Council on any aspect of the plan for consideration.
 - (c) The time period for the advertisement of the plan and receipt of submissions shall be specified on all notices but shall not be less than 28 days from the date of the first notification nor less than 21 days from the date of the last notification.
 - (d) In resolving to proceed with the advertising of an Outline Development Plan, Council may refer the plan to any authority it considers may provide comments or additional information.
 - (e) Council shall consider any submissions received within the specified time as part of the consideration of the Outline Development Plan.
 - (f) With reference to any submissions received, Council may resolve—
 - (i) to reject the plan;
 - (ii) to approve it as advertised and/or without modification;
 - (iii) to approve a modified plan; and
 - (iv) to stipulate conditions which Council would impose on any development or would seek to have imposed on any subdivision in accordance with the Plan.
- 6.9.8 Once Council resolves to approve an Outline Development Plan for land with potential for subdivision it shall as soon as practicable send to the State Planning Commission—
- (a) a copy of the Outline Development Plan including any modifications;
 - (b) details of any conditions;
 - (c) a precis of any submissions or responses received within the stipulated time together with the Council's decisions in respect thereof;
- and a request of the Commission to endorse and adopt the Plan as the basis for approving future subdivisions within the Plan area.
- 6.9.9 The Outline Development Plan and any associated modifications are to be available at the Council Offices for public inspection.
- 6.9.10 Where Council is requested to amend the Scheme to zone land Special Development, Council may choose to advertise the amendment at the same time as an Outline Development Plan so that submissions received on each can be considered and any decision made will have regard to both the Scheme Amendment and the Outline Development Plan.
- 6.9.11 Council shall have regard to the procedure outlined in paragraphs 6.9.7-6.9.9 when resolving to deal with the Outline Development Plan concomitant with a Scheme Amendment.
- 6.9.12 An Outline Development Plan may be amended in whole or in part by a subsequent ODP made in accordance with the provisions of clauses 6.9.7 and 6.9.8.
- 6.9.13 In considering an application for any development, other than a building dealt with by the Residential Planning Codes, the Council shall have regard to—
- (a) local amenity;
 - (b) the suitability of the site in relation to the existing or proposed road hierarchy of the locality;
 - (c) the effect of the development on existing and proposed supply services in the neighbourhood; and
 - (d) the provision of an Outline Development Plan for the land.
- 6.9.14 Where there is any discrepancy between the provisions of this section and any other provisions of the Scheme, the provisions of this section shall prevail.

FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS DUTY AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1995

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Financial Institutions Duty Amendment Regulations 1995*.

Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the *Financial Institutions Duty Regulations 1984** are referred to as the principal regulations.

[* Published in Gazette of 20 January 1984 at pp. 126-8.
For amendments to 24 February 1995 see 1993 Index to
Legislation of Western Australia, Table 4, p. 78.]

Regulation 5 amended

3. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting after subregulation (3) the following subregulations —

“

(4) Where an account with a registered financial institution has been closed as a result of —

- (a) the closure or amalgamation of a branch or branches of that registered financial institution;
- (b) any conversion, updating or relocating of data processing systems within that registered financial institution; or
- (c) the loss of a customer's electronic banking card,

the crediting of a new account kept by that registered financial institution in the same customer's name by the transferring of the proceeds, other than closing interest, of the account which was closed is prescribed under section 10 (4) (r) of the Act as a receipt to which the Act does not apply.

(5) A receipt to an internal pay-roll clearing account of —

- (a) an amount which represents salaries or wages which are to be credited to accounts in Western Australia kept by registered financial institutions in the names of employees of the person from whom, or which, that amount was received; or
- (b) an amount paid in settlement of credit granted to an employer by the crediting of amounts representing salaries or wages to accounts in Western Australia kept by registered financial institutions in the names of employees of that employer,

is prescribed, under section 10 (4) (r) of the Act as a receipt to which the Act does not apply.

(6) In subregulation (5) “internal pay-roll clearing account” means an account kept by a registered financial institution, other than in the name of another person, solely for the purpose of facilitating the payment of salaries and wages to accounts kept by that or any other registered financial institution in the names of employees of the persons from whom, or which, the salaries and wages are received.

”

4. Regulation 7C of the principal regulations is repealed.

Regulation 7I inserted

5. After regulation 7H of the principal regulations the following regulation is inserted —

“

Prescription under section 14 (5)

7I. An amount paid out of a short term dealing account kept in the name of a certified short term dealer other than an amount paid —

- (a) by that certified short term dealer in the course of short term dealing; or
- (b) to the credit of another account, other than an exempt account, kept in Western Australia by a registered financial institution in the name of that certified short term dealer,

is a prescribed amount for the purpose of section 14 (5) of the Act.
