





 - (c) three shall be representatives from the Western Australian Farmers Federation Inc;
 - (d) 26 shall be persons actively engaged in, or affected by or associated with landuse in the district:
- (2) Subject to this clause, each appointed member shall hold office for such period not exceeding 3 years as is specified in the instrument of this appointment and is eligible for reappointment.
- (3) The Minister may grant leave of absence to an appointed member on such terms and conditions as the Minister determines.
- (4) The Minister may terminate the appointment of an appointed member for inability, inefficiency or misbehaviour.
- (5) If an appointed member-
 - (a) is or becomes an undischarged bankrupt or person whose property is subject to an order or arrangement under the laws relating to bankruptcy;
 - (b) has his appointment terminated by the Minister, pursuant to subclause (4);
 - (c) is absent, except on leave duly granted by the Minister, from 3 consecutive meetings of the committee of which he has had notice;
 - (d) resigns his office by written notice addressed to the Minister, the office of that appointed member becomes vacant.

Proceedings of the committee

- 6. (1) The committee shall hold its meetings at such place on such days and at such intervals as the committee shall from time to time determine.
- (2) At any meeting of the committee-
 - (a) a majority of the members constitute a quorum;
 - (b) the Chairperson will preside and where he or she is absent from the meeting the members may appoint one of their number to preside at that meeting;
 - (c) each member present is entitled to a deliberative vote; and
 - (d) where the votes cast on any question are equally divided the Chairperson, or the presiding member in terms of paragraph (b), shall have a casting vote.
- (3) The committee shall cause accurate minutes to be kept of the proceedings at its meetings.
- (4) To the extent that it is not prescribed, the committee may determine its own procedure.



Under section 37 (1) of the Environmental Protection Act 1986, I Peter Foss, Minister for the Environment, hereby issue a certificate to amend the boundaries of the Environmental Protection (Gnangara Mound Crown Land) Policy 1992 and associated Miscellaneous Plan No. 1814 as recommended to me by the Environmental Protection Authority and pursuant to the Environmental Conditions of Approval for the Route Alignment for Perth to Darwin National Highway and Fast Transit Route, and Excision of Land from State Forest No. 65 and Priority 1 Source Protection Area for Urban Development (issued 25 October 1994).

I have perused the Environmental Protection Authority's report and recommendations regarding the Ellenbrook Urban Rezoning, Subdivision and Development (EPA Bulletin 642, August 1992) and the subsequent public submissions and believe the excision of this land from the approved policy area (Map 1) is of minor importance and in accordance with the Environmental Conditions of Approval established for the development under section 45 of the Environmental Protection Act 1986. Accordingly, I have asked the Environmental Protection Authority to amend the approved policy by making the minor change and submit the amended policy, together with a report thereon, to me for my further consideration.

 - (b) the name and address of the licensee of the boat specified on the licence;
 - (c) the licence number;

 - (e) the period for which the licence is valid;
 - (f) the type of gear permitted to be used;

- (g) the total time gear unit allocation of the boat specified on the licence;
- (h) for licences issued or renewed in respect of Zone 1 and Zone 3—the temporary time gear unit allocation and suspended time gear units of the boat specified on the licence;
- (i) the monthly allocation of gillnet month or longline month;
- (j) the minimum mesh size of net which may be used;
- (k) the maximum depth in meshes of the net which may be used;
- (1) the zone or zones in which the boat may operate; and
- (m) any conditions imposed on the licence. ".

Clause 8 amended

- 7. Clause 8 of the principal notice is amended by deleting subclause (3) and substituting the following—
 - "(3) Unless otherwise authorised in writing by the Minister a person shall not carry on board a boat or use from a boat in the Fishery any gillnet or longline that is in excess of that boat's gillnet month or longline month allocation."

8. Clause 12 of the principal notice is repealed and the following clause substituted—

"Suspension of time gear units-Zone 1 and Zone 3

- 12. (1) On 1 June 1995, the total time gear unit allocation of licences issued or renewed in respect of Zone 1 and Zone 3, shall be reduced by suspending 20% of the total time gear units of each of those licences.
- (2) If the result of the calculation in subclause (1) is not a whole number, any fraction of, or greater than, half is rounded upwards, and any other fraction is rounded downwards, to a whole number.
- (3) Subject to subclause (4), suspended time gear units shall continue to be endorsed in respect of the licence on which they were first endorsed.
- (4) If the temporary time gear unit allocation of a licence issued in respect of Zone 1 or Zone 3 is wholly transferred, the suspended time gear units shall be cancelled.

The Council of the City of Rockingham under the powers conferred upon it by the Local Government Act 1960 resolved on 28th June 1994, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law-

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

Citation

1. This By-law may be cited as the City of Rockingham Parking By-law 1995.

2. The Shire of Rockingham Parking Stations By-law, as published in the Government Gazette of 28 February 1986 and as amended from time to time, is repealed.

Definitions

- 3. In this By-law unless the context requires otherwise—
 - "Act" means the Local Government Act 1960;
 - "appointed place" means a place appointed by the Council to which vehicles causing an obstruction may be removed;
 - "annual pass" means a pass issued by the Council under clause 12;
 - "AS" means Australian Standard published by the Standards Association of Australia;
 - "authorised person" means a person appointed by Council to administer this By-law;
 - "authorised vehicle" means a vehicle authorised by the Council, or an authorised person, to stand or park on a road or in a parking station, which is designated by signs to be used for parking by authorised vehicles only;
 - "carriageway" means a portion of a road that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, and includes the shoulders, and areas including embayments at the side or centre of the carriageway, used for the standing or parking of vehicles. Where a road has two or more of those portions divided by a median strip, the expression means each of those portions separately;
 - "City" means the City of Rockingham;
 - "coin" means any coin which is legal tender under the Currency Act 1965 (Commonwealth):
 - "Council" means the Council of the City of Rockingham;
 - "cycle" means any wheeled vehicle that is designed to be propelled solely by human
 - "driver" means any person driving, or in control of, a vehicle or animal;
 - "footpath" includes a path used by, or set aside or intended for use by, pedestrians or both pedestrians and cyclists;

"median strip" means-

- (a) any physical provision, dividing a road to separate vehicular traffic proceeding in opposing directions or to separate 2 one-way carriageways for vehicles proceeding in opposing directions in parking stations; or
- (b) any physical provision, including a traffic island, designed to separate parked cars from vehicle movement areas;
- "motorcycle" means a motor vehicle designed to travel on two wheels and does not include a motorcycle to which a side-car is attached;
- "Municipality" means the municipality of the City of Rockingham:
- "omnibus" means a passenger vehicle equipped to carry more than 8 adult persons and used to carry passengers for separate fares;
- "owner" of a vehicle means the person who is the holder of the requisite vehicle licence under the Road Traffic Act 1974 in respect of that vehicle, or, if the vehicle is not licensed under that Act, the person who owns the vehicle or is entitled to its possession;
- "park" means to permit a vehicle, whether attended or not, to remain stationary, except for the purpose of—
 - (a) avoiding conflict with other traffic or pedestrians;
 - (b) complying with the provisions of any law; or
 - (c) immediately picking up or setting down persons or goods,

and "parking" has a correlative meaning;

"parking facilities" includes land, buildings, shelters, parking spaces and other facilities open to the public generally for the parking of vehicles and signs, notices and facilities used in connection with those things;

"parking region" means the whole of the district of the Municipality except-

- (a) approaches to bridges, subways and traffic lights; and
- (b) any other road that may from time to time come under the control of the Main Roads Department or the Commissioner of Police;
- "parking space" means a section or part of a road, reserve or parking station which is marked or defined by painted lines, symbols, inscriptions or signs for the purpose of indicating where vehicles may stand or park;
- "parking station" means any land, building or other structure providing for the purpose of accommodating vehicles with or without charge but does not include a private garage;
- "property line" means the boundary between the land comprising a street and the abutting land;
- "quarterly pass" means a pass issued by the Council under clause 12;
- "public reserve" includes parklands, squares, reserves, beaches and other lands, included in or adjoining the district, and set apart for the use and enjoyment of the inhabitants of the district and includes parks and other lands acquired for public purposes, and vested in or under the care, control or management of the Council;
- "road" means any road, street, land, thoroughfare or similar place open to or used by the public within the parking region and includes all of the land lying between the property lines, including the street verge and footpath;
- "Road Traffic Act" means the Road Traffic Act 1974;
- "service vehicle" means a vehicle specifically designed, constructed and used primarily for the conveyance of goods but does not include service type vehicles being used for private purposes;
- "sign" means a traffic sign, mark, structure or device placed or erected on or near a road or within a parking station or a reserve for the purpose of regulating, guiding or directing the parking of vehicles;
- "stand" in relation to a vehicle, means to stop the vehicle and permit it to remain stationary, except for the purpose of—
 - (a) avoiding conflict with other traffic or pedestrians; or
 - (b) complying with the provisions of any law,

and "standing" has a correlative meaning;

"street" has the same meaning as "road";

- "street verge" means that portion of a street which lies between the portion of a street that is improved, paved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic and the nearest property line;
- "taxi" means a vehicle licensed under the Taxi-Car Control Act 1985;
- "ticket issuing machine" means a machine which-
 - (a) is operated by the insertion of coins;
 - (b) issues a ticket to indicate the period of parking; and
 - (c) is installed by the Council at any place;

"tour coach" means any vehicle licensed as a tour coach which is hired or chartered for the specific purpose of sightseeing or tourism;

"Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk of the City; and

"vehicle" includes-

- (a) every conveyance, not being a train, vessel or aircraft, and every object capable of being propelled or drawn, on wheels or tracks, by any means; and
- (b) where the context permits, an animal being driven or ridden.

Application of By-law

- 4. (1) The whole of the Municipality is constituted as the parking region.
- (2) This By-law applies throughout the parking region to all parking stations and parking facilities other than a parking facility or parking station which—
 - (a) is neither owned, controlled nor occupied by the Municipality; or
 - (b) although owned by the Municipality, is leased to another person.

Vehicle classification

- 5. For the purpose of this By-law, vehicles are divided into classes as follows-
 - (a) omnibuses;
 - (b) service vehicles;
 - (c) motorcycles;
 - (d) taxis:
 - (e) tour coaches: and
 - (f) all other vehicles not otherwise classified.

Application of signs and kerb colours

- 6. (1) Where the standing or parking of vehicles in a street is regulated by a sign then, for the purposes of this By-law, the sign is to apply to that part of the street which—
 - (a) lies beyond the sign;
 - (b) lies between that sign and the next sign; and
 - (c) is that side of the carriageway of the street nearest to the sign.
- (2) For the purposes of this By-law a sign may prohibit or regulate parking or standing by the use of any symbol or other traffic control device in accordance with AS.1742.11.
- (3) For the purpose of more easily identifying a part of a street or area on which parking is prohibited or restricted, the Council may in addition to the use of signs paint, with a colour corresponding to the particular parking restriction or prohibition, one or more faces of a kerb abutting that part of the street or area.

Appointment of authorised persons

7. The Council may appoint a person as an authorised person for the purposes of this Bylaw, including the service of notices under sections 669C and 669D of the Act.

Impersonation of authorised person

8. A person who is not an authorised person must not in any way assume the duties of an authorised person.

Obstruction of authorised person

9. A person must not in any way obstruct or hinder an authorised person in the execution of any duty under this By-law.

PART 2—PARKING STATIONS

Establishing parking stations

- 10. (1) A Parking station may be-
 - (a) constituted;
 - (b) varied from time to time; and
 - (c) indicated by a sign or signs,

by resolution of the Council.

- (2) The Council, in respect of a parking station and in a manner that is consistent with this By-law, may prescribe—
 - (a) permitted times and conditions of parking or standing;
 - (b) classes of vehicles permitted to park or stand; and
 - (c) the manner of parking or standing.

Fees for parking stations

11. The fees payable for the standing and parking of a vehicle in a parking station are as set out in Schedule 1.

Quarterly and annual passes

- 12. (1) The Council may issue to a person, upon payment of the fee set out in Schedule 1-
 - (a) a quarterly pass which enables the person to whom it is issued to park, without payment of any further fee, at any parking station operated by the City for 3 months from the date of issue; or
 - (b) an annual pass which enables the person to whom it is issued to park, without payment of any further fee, at any parking station operated by the City for 12 months from the date of issue.
- (2) A pass issued by the Council under this clause is not to be used by any person other than the person to whom it is issued.

Display of tickets or passes

- 13. (1) In this clause "permitted period" means the period stated on the ticket issuing machine during which the parking of a vehicle is permitted only upon the purchase of a parking ticket.
- (2) A person shall not stand or park a vehicle in a parking station equipped with a ticket issuing machine during any permitted period unless—
 - (a) a valid quarterly pass showing the date of issue; or
 - (b) a valid annual pass showing the date of issue; or
 - (c) an unexpired parking ticket applicable to that parking station showing the date, expiry time and the number (if any) printed on the ticket,

is displayed inside the vehicle and is clearly visible to and able to be read by an authorised person from outside the vehicle at all times while the vehicle remains standing or parked in the parking station.

(3) The Council may by resolution declare that the provision of this clause shall not apply during periods or on particular days specified in that resolution.

Defacing a parking ticket or pass

- 14. A person shall not display in a vehicle—
 - (a) a ticket purchased from a tick et issuing machine; or
 - (b) an annual pass; or
 - (c) a quarterly pass,

if that ticket has been altered, added to or defaced in any way in an attempt to avoid payment of the prescribed fee.

Restrictions and time limits in parking stations

- 15. (1) A person shall not stand a vehicle on any part of a parking station—
 - (a) if the standing of a vehicle on that part is prohibited by a sign; or
 - (b) during a period in which the standing of vehicles on that part is prohibited by a sign.
 - (2) A person shall not park a vehicle on any part of a parking station-
 - (a) if the parking of vehicles on that part is prohibited by a sign;
 - (b) during a period in which the parking of vehicles on that part is prohibited by a sign; or
 - (c) where that part is a parking space and a sign on or adjacent to the parking space sets that space apart for the standing or parking of vehicles of a different class.
- (3) A person shall not park a vehicle on any part of a parking station for more than the maximum time specified by a sign.

Standing or parking outside parking space

16. A person shall not stand or park a vehicle in a parking station, other than within a parking space.

Special event parking

- 17. (1) For the purposes of this clause—
 - (a) "special event" means any even or occurrence considered by the Council to be special or likely to attract a substantial number of persons driving vehicles; and
 - (b) "parking station" includes a p art of a parking station.
- (2) The Council may by the use of a sign set aside, for any period specified on the sign, a parking station for the parking of vehicles by persons attending a special event.
- (3) A person shall not park or stand a vehicle in a parking station set aside under subclause (2) during the period for which it is set aside unless a ticket purchased from the Council with respect to the special event is clearly visible to and readable by an authorised person from outside the vehicle.
- (4) During the period referred to in subclause (2) the provisions of clauses 15(1)(b), 15(2)(b) and 15(3) are not to apply to the parking station.

Behaviour in parking stations

- 18. (1) A person shall not remain in or on a parking station after having been directed to leave that parking station by an authorised person or a Police Officer.
 - (2) A person shall not loiter in a parking station.
- (3) A person shall not drive in a parking station in a direction other than the direction indicated by an arrow.

Council may lock parking stations

- 19. (1)At the expiration of the hours of operation of a parking station the Council may lock the parking station or otherwise prevent the movement of any vehicle within, to or from it.
- (2) Where a vehicle is locked in a parking station, the Council is not responsible for any loss of or damage to that vehicle or its accessories or contents or for any other loss, claim or liability.

Selling and hiring in parking stations

20. No person shall at or on any part of a parking station sell, hire, give away, offer or expose for sale or hire anything of any nature, unless that person has the written permission of the Council to do so.

Authorised spaces in parking stations

- 21. (1) The Council may, by the use of a sign, set aside any parking station or any space in a parking station for the parking of a vehicle by a person authorised by the Council.
 - (2) Where the Council authorises a person under subclause (1), the Council—
 - (a) is to issue a written permit to the person; and
 - (b) may revoke the permit at any time.
- (3) A person shall not park or stand a vehicle in a parking space set aside under this clause unless a permit issued with respect to the vehicle is displayed inside the vehicle and is clearly visible to and readable by an authorised person examining the permit from outside the vehicle.

Damage to a ticket issuing machine or a parking station

- 22. A person shall not remove, damage, deface or misuse any or any part of a-
 - (a) ticket issuing machine; or
 - (b) a parking station,

or attempt to do any such act.

Use of coins in ticket issuing machines

23. A person shall not insert or cause to be inserted or attempt to insert into the coin slot of a ticket issuing machine anything other than the coin appropriate to that slot.

Operating ticket issuing machines

24. A person shall not operate or attempt to operate a ticket issuing machine except in accordance with the operating instructions appearing on the ticket issuing machine.

Affixing signs and notices

25. A person shall not without the permission of the Council affix any board, sign, placard, notice or other thing to or paint or write upon any part of, a parking facility or parking station.

PART 3-PARKING ON ROADS

Establishing and amending the Parking Scheme

26. The Council, in a manner that is consistent with this By-law, may by resolution constitute, determine, vary and indicate by signs—

- (a) prohibitions;
- (b) regulations; and
- (c) restrictions,

on the parking and standing of vehicles of a specified class or classes on any road or part of a road in the parking region at all times or at specified times.

Standing or parking contrary to signs

- 27. (1) A person shall not stand a vehicle on a road or part of a road—
 - (a) if that road or part of the road is set apart for the standing of vehicles of a different class;
 - (b) upon which the standing of vehicles is prohibited at all times by a sign; or
 - (c) upon which the standing of vehicles at that time is prohibited by a sign.
 - (2) A person shall not park a vehicle on a road or part of a road—
 - (a) if that road or part of the road is set apart for the parking of vehicles of a different class;

- (b) upon which the parking of vehicles is prohibited at all times by a sign; or
- (c) upon which the parking of vehicles at that time is prohibited by a sign.
- (3) A person shall not stand or park a vehicle on any part of a road, whether or not that part is marked as a parking space, for more than the maximum time specified by a sign.

Occupied parking spaces

28. A person shall not stand or park or attempt to stand or park a vehicle in a parking space in which another vehicle is standing or parking.

Median strips and traffic islands

29. A person shall not stand or park a vehicle on any part of a road so that any portion of the vehicle is—

- (a) on a median strip;
- (b) adjacent to a median strip otherwise than in a parking space or metered space; or
- (c) on, or within 9 metres of any portion of a carriageway bounded on one or both sides by a traffic island.

Parking position on road

- 30. (1) A person shall not stand or park a vehicle or permit a vehicle to stand or park on any road otherwise than—
 - (a) parallel to the kerb and as close to the kerb as practical;
 - (b) headed in the direction of the movement of traffic on the part of the road on which the vehicle is parked;
 - (c) wholly within a parking space if the part of the road upon which the vehicle is standing or parked is provided with parking spaces.
- (2) A person shall not stand or park a vehicle in a parking space which is not set out parallel to a kerb otherwise than wholly within that parking space.

Parking near fire hydrants and pillar boxes

- 31. (1) A person shall not stand or park a vehicle on a road so that any portion of the vehicle is within 1 metre of a fire hydrant or fire plug, or of any sign or mark indicating the existence of a fire hydrant or fire plug.
- (2) A person shall not stand or park a vehicle within 3 metres of a public post box, unless the vehicle is being used for the purpose of collecting postal articles from the post box.

Traffic obstructions

- 32. A person shall not stand or park a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is-
 - (a) in front of a right of way, passage or private drive or so close to one as to deny vehicles reasonable access to, or egress from, the right of way, passage or private drive;
 - (b) upon an intersection except adjacent to a carriageway boundary that is broken by an intersecting carriageway;
 - (c) within six metres of the nearest property line of any road intersecting the road on the side on which the vehicle is standing or parked;
 - (d) alongside any hoarding, scaffolding, obstacle or impediment to traffic; or
 - (e) on or over a footpath or a place of refuge for pedestrians.

Double parking

33. A person shall not stand or park a vehicle on a road so that portion of the vehicle is between any vehicle which is parked or standing on a carriageway of that road and the centre of that road.

Verge parking

- 34. (1)A person shall not stand or park a vehicle on a street verge where signs prohibit the standing or parking of vehicles on that verge.
- (2) A person, not being the owner or occupier of the land abutting on to a street verge, shall not without consent of that owner or occupier, drive, park of stand a vehicle upon that verge.

Bus stops, pedestrian and children's crossings

- 35. (1) A person shall not stand a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is within 9 metres of the departure side of—
 - (a) a bus stop—unless that vehicle is an omnibus taking up or setting down passengers; or
 - (b) a pedestrian or children's crossing established on a road.
- (2) A person shall not stand a vehicle on a road so that any portion of the vehicle is within eighteen metres of the approach side of—
 - (a) a bus stop—unless that vehicle is an omnibus taking up or setting down passengers; or
 - (b) a pedestrian or children's crossing.

(3) A person shall not permit a vehicle to stand or park in a parking space which is set aside for use by omnibuses except for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers to or from such vehicle.

No parking within one hour

36. A person having parked a vehicle in a road where parking is restricted as to time, shall not park the vehicle again in that road on that day unless it has first been removed from the road for at least 1 hour.

Direction to move vehicle

37. A person shall not permit a vehicle to stand or park in any part of a street, if any authorised person or Police officer directs the driver of such vehicle to move it.

Loading zones

- 38. (1) A person shall not permit a vehicle to stand or park in a parking space which is at that time set aside for use by service vehicles carrying commercial goods unless some person is actively engaged in loading or unloading commercial goods to or from the vehicle, and in any case not for a period longer than 15 minutes.
- (2) In this clause, "commercial goods" means an article or collection of articles weighing at least 10kg of which the content is at least 0.3 cubic metres.
- (3) A parking space may be set aside for use by service vehicles by a sign marked "Loading Zone" or by other means.

Repairs to vehicles

- 39. A person shall not park a vehicle on any portion of a street-
 - (a) for the purpose of effecting repairs to it, other that the minimum repairs necessary to enable the vehicle to be moved to a place other than a road; or
 - (b) if the vehicle is exposed for sale.

PART 4—STANDING AND PARKING GENERALLY

Cycle parking and standing

40. A person shall not park or stand any cycle in a parking space.

Authorised parking

41. A person shall not, without the permission of the Council or an authorised person, stand or park a vehicle other than an authorised vehicle in an area designated by signs for the parking of authorised vehicles only.

Private property

42. A person shall not stand or park or permit a vehicle to stand or park on land which is not a road or parking facility without the consent of the owner or person in occupation of such land.

Service vehicle parking

- 43. A person shall not park a service vehicle-
 - (a) on a street verge for more than 4 hours consecutively; or
 - (b) on a street verge for the purpose of repairing, servicing or cleaning that vehicle.

Overlength vehicle parking

44. A person shall not stand a vehicle or any combination of vehicles that, together with anything in or on that vehicle or vehicles is more than 8 metres in length on a carriageway for any period exceeding 1 hour during any 24 hour period.

Chalking of tyres

- 45. (1) An authorised person may mark the tyres of a parked vehicle with chalk or any other non-indelible substance for any purpose connected with or arising out of that authorised person's duties and powers.
- (2) A person shall not remove, or attempt to remove, a mark made by an authorised person so that the purpose of the affixing of such mark is defeated or likely to be defeated.

Parking on reserves

46. A person shall not stand or park a vehicle in a public reserve, other than within a parking facility on that reserve, without the permission of the Council or an authorised person.

PART 5—REMOVAL OF VEHICLES CAUSING OBSTRUCTIONS

Lawfully parked vehicles

A vehicle that is parked in any portion of a public place in which vehicles may lawfully be parked does not cause an obstruction, unless—

- (a) the vehicle is so parked for any period exceeding 24 hours, without the consent in writing of the Town Clerk or authorised person; or
- (b) the vehicle is so parked during any period in which the parking of vehicles is prohibited or restricted by a sign.

Unlawfully parked vehicles

48. A vehicle which is parked in a public place or part of a place where vehicles may not lawfully be parked is deemed to be causing an obstruction.

Obstruction of public places

49. A person shall not park a vehicle in a public place so as to cause an obstruction.

Removal of vehicles

- 50. (1) Where an authorised person or Police Officer finds a vehicle causing an obstruction that person or Officer—
 - (a) may remove the vehicle or cause the vehicle to be removed; and
 - (b) may use such force as is necessary to enter the vehicle for the purpose of so removing it; and
- (2) An authorised officer or Police Officer who removes a vehicle or causes a vehicle to be moved is to take it, or cause it to be taken, to an appointed place.

Recording of vehicles in appointed places

- 51. Where an authorised person or Police Officer places a vehicle in an appointed place, that person or Officer is to enter in a register to be provided by the Council for that purpose—
 - (a) details of the time and date;
 - (b) a description of the vehicle; and
 - (c) the place from which it was removed,

and shall notify the Town Clerk.

Notification to owner

52. Where a vehicle is removed to an appointed place, the Town Clerk is to notify, in writing, the last known owner of the vehicle about the removal of that vehicle.

Recovery of removed vehicles

- 53. (1) A person may recover a vehicle from an appointed place, after paying to the Town Clerk—
 - (a) the cost incurred by the Council in removing the vehicle to the appointed place;
 - (b) the sum of \$10 per day or part of a day that the vehicle has remained in the appointed place.
- (2) A person who removes a vehicle from an appointed place without complying with the provisions of this clause commits an offence.

Sale of removed vehicles

- 54. Where a vehicle placed in an appointed place has not been recovered by the owner or person entitled to it within one month from the day upon which it was placed there, the Council may—
 - (a) cause the vehicle to be offered for sale by public auction or by public tender;
 - (b) accept the best offer made; and
 - (c) where no offer is made for the purchase of the vehicle, dispose of the vehicle.

Indemnity

55. A person is not entitled to any claim, by way of damages or otherwise, against an authorised person, member of the Police Force, or the Council in respect of any vehicle seized and dealt with under this Part or against any person who purchases a vehicle sold by the Council under clause 54.

Application of sale proceeds

- 56. (1) The proceeds of the sale of a vehicle sold under the provisions of clause 54 shall be applied by the Council—
 - (a) firstly, in meeting the costs of the sale; and
 - (b) secondly, in meeting the cost and sum referred to in clause 53(1),

and these sums are to be paid into the Municipal Fund.

- (2) Any surplus of the proceeds of the sale are to be paid by the Council into its Trust Fund, and may be paid within 10 years, to any person who satisfies the Council that they were the owner of the vehicle at the time of its sale by the Council.
- (3) Any amounts under subclause (2) may, if not paid to the owner within 10 years, be paid into the Municipal Fund on the condition that the Council shall repay it from that Fund to a person claiming and establishing his right to the repayment.

Recovery of costs where sale proceeds insufficient

57. Where the proceeds of the sale of any vehicle sold under clause 54, after deduction of the monies authorised to be applied by the Council by clause 56, do not cover the costs of the removal, custody and sale or disposal of that vehicle, the Council may recover the balance of these costs from the owner of that vehicle in a court of competent jurisdiction.

PART 6—OFFENCES AND MODIFIED PENALTIES

Offences

58. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with a provision of this By-law commits an offence and is liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$80.

Modified penalties

- 59. (1) The offences listed in the third column of the table set out in Schedule 2 are offences in relation to which a modified penalty may be imposed.
- (2) The amount appearing in the fourth column of the table set out in Schedule 2 directly opposite an offence is the prescribed modified penalty payable in respect of that offence if dealt with under this Part.

Notice to owner to identify driver

60. A notice served under section 669C(2) of the Act in respect of an offence alleged to have been committed against this By-law is to be in or to the effect of the form set out in Schedule 3.

Infringement notice

61. An infringement notice served under section 669D(2) of the Act in respect of an offence against this By-law is to be in or to the effect of the form set out in Schedule 4.

Notice to driver

62. Subject to clause 61, an infringement notice served under section 699D of the Act in respect of an offence alleged to have been committed against this By-law is to be in or to the effect of the form set out in Schedule 5.

Withdrawal notice

63. A notice sent under section 669D(5) of the Act withdrawing an infringement notice served under that section in respect of an offence alleged to have been committed against this By-law is to be in or to the effect of the form set out in Schedule 6.

Removal of notice

Darking Station

64. A person other than the driver of a vehicle must not remove from that vehicle any notice affixed to or on it by an authorised person or a member of the Police Force.




