

SANDALWOOD ACT 1929

SANDALWOOD (LIMITATION OF REMOVAL OF SANDALWOOD) ORDER 1995

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under section 2.

Citation

1. This order may be cited as the *Sandalwood (Limitation of Removal of Sandalwood) Order 1995*.

Limitation

2. (1) The quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during each period to which this subclause applies is limited to a total of 2 200 tonnes.

(2) Subclause (1) applies to—

- (a) the period commencing on 1 July 1995 and ending on 30 June 1996; and
- (b) each succeeding period commencing on 1 July and ending on 30 June.

HEALTH ACT 1911
Shire of Broome
HEALTH BY-LAWS 1995**Preamble**

Under the powers conferred upon it by the Health Act 1911, the Council of the Shire of Broome resolved on the 21st March 1995 to make and submit for confirmation by the Executive Director of Public Health and approval by His Excellency the Governor, the following By-laws.

Citation

These By-laws may be cited as the Shire of Broome Health By-laws 1995.

Incorporation by Reference

2. (i) In this By-law, the "City of Perth Health By-law 1993";
 - (a) means the City of Perth Health By-law 1993 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th October 1993; and
 - (b) does not include any amendments that might be made to that By-law.
- (ii) Subject to the modifications set out in the Schedule, the City of Perth Health By-law 1993 is incorporated with and forms part of the By-laws.

Repeal

The Health By-laws adopted by the Shire of Broome and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th May 1964 with an amendment on the 16th November 1966, 5th August 1988, 23rd December 1988, 21st April 1989, 3rd August 1990, 24th December 1991 and 14th May 1993, are repealed.

SCHEDULE**Modifications to the City of Perth By-law 1993**

1. Amend the title on the cover page and the citation on the first page, by deleting "City of Perth Health By-law 1993" and replacing it with "Shire of Broome Health By-law 1995".
2. Delete the word "clause" wherever it is mentioned in the By-laws and substitute the word "By-law".
3. Delete "City of Perth" wherever it is mentioned in the By-laws and insert in its place, "Shire of Broome".
4. Delete "Controller of Health Services" wherever it occurs in the By-laws and insert in its place, "Principal Environmental Health Officer".
5. Delete "Town Clerk" wherever it occurs in the By-laws and insert in its place, "Shire Clerk".
6. By-law 2 is amended by deleting the following passage, "(No. 31) of 26th March 1969" and inserting in its place, "of 13th May 1964".
- 6A. By-law 14 (2) is amended by deleting the passage "drained into the sewer or treated by an approved chemical method" and inserting in its place the following passage, "of a type approved by the Executive Director, Public Health".
7. Part 3—"Housing and General" is amended in Division 1—"Maintenance of Houses" by deleting the heading "House Maintenance" for By-law 19 and inserting the heading, "Dwelling House Maintenance".
8. By-law 19 is amended by inserting the word, "dwelling" before the word "house" wherever it occurs in the By-law.
9. By-law 27(2) is amended by deleting the passage, "the house or on the site on which the house is located" and insert in its place, "a house connected to the Water Authority of WA water supply and to at least one tap within a house not connected to the Water Authority of WA water supply".
10. By-law 34 is amended in the definition, "licensed transporter" by deleting the passage, "under the Health Act (Liquid Waste) Regulations 1987" and inserting in its place, "by Council".
11. By-law 50 is amended by:
 - a. deleting Section 2 (c) (ii), and
 - b. in Part (3) by inserting after the passage, "Western Australian Fire Brigades Board" the following passage, "and the Western Australian Bush Fire Board".

12. The By-laws are amended by inserting after By-law 53 the following heading and By-laws:

Division 4—Disposal of Trade Refuse from Building Sites

53A. For the purpose of this By-law, the following interpretations shall apply:

“occupier” means a person having the charge, management or control of a building site and where two or more persons share or jointly have the charge, management or control of a building site, then those persons and each of them,

“building site” means premises on which the construction, structural alteration, or demolition of a building or erection is being undertaken.

53B. The “occupier” of a building site shall:

- a. at all times ensure the provision of containers or enclosures approved by an Environmental Health Officer for the deposit of trade and other refuse, whether of light or heavy bulk on the building site.
- b. maintain the building site free from trade and other refuse at all times during the period it shall be a building site by ensuring the use of such containers and enclosures.
- c. take such steps as are necessary to prevent loose materials present on the building site being blown or carried onto properties adjoining the building site.
- d. on completion of construction, structural alteration or demolition of a building or erection, the occupier shall clear the building site of all trade and other refuse to the satisfaction of the local authority and ensure the disposal of such refuse in accordance with the requirements of the local authority.

13. By-law 65 and its associated heading is deleted.

14. By-law 68, the definition of “large animal” is amended by deleting the passage, “includes a pig, sheep or goat” and inserting in its place, “includes a pig, sheep, goat or camel”.

15. By-law 69 (1) is amended by inserting the words, “within the townsite of Broome” after the word “premises” in line one.

16. By-law 69 (2) (e) is deleted.

17. By-law 69 is amended by inserting after Part (3) the following Part:

“(4) the owner of a premises outside the townsite of Broome on which a horse, cow or other large animal is kept shall provide facilities for the keeping of these animals as required by the Principal Environmental Health Officer”.

18. The By-laws are amended by inserting after By-law 69 the following By-law:

“69A The keeping of pigs is prohibited within the townsite of Broome and within all that land contained within a strip 2 kilometres wide surrounding and contiguous to the townsite boundary of Broome”.

19. By-law 71 is amended by deleting Part (a) and inserting the following Part in its place:

“(a) provide in a position convenient to the stable, a receptacle for manure, constructed of a smooth impervious material approved by the Principal Environmental Health Officer and provided with a tight fitting cover”.

20. By-law 72 is amended by deleting the interpretation for “the Prohibited Area”.

21. By-law 73 is deleted with the following By-law inserted in its place:

“73 An owner or occupier of premises within the Broome townsite shall not keep more than 50 pigeons and 12 poultry on any one lot of land”.

22. By-law 75 (1) is amended by inserting after the word “premises” in line one, the words “within the Broome townsite”.

23. Delete Part 5, Division 5—Car Parks.

24. By-law 94 (b) is amended by:

1. deleting Section (i), and
2. renumbering Section (ii) as Section (i).

25. By-law 111 (2) is amended by deleting the passage, “under subclause (3)”.

26. By-law 179 is amended in the interpretation of “offensive trade” by:

1. in Part (b) removing the words “fish marketing premises” and the words, “and fish shops” and,
2. by substituting for Part (e) “marine stores”, the following Part, “premises used for dealing in scrap metal other than by heat for the recovery of metal”, and
3. by deleting “Parts (f) and (g)”, and
4. redesignating “Part (h)” as “Part (f)”, and
5. redesignating “Part (i)” as “Part (g)”.

27. By-law 202 is amended by deleting the interpretation for “fish marketing premises” and the interpretation for “fish shop”.

28. By-law 203 is deleted and the following By-law inserted in its place:
- "203 (1) The occupier of fish curing premises may, for the purposes of sale for consumption otherwise than on the premises, clean, part clean, scale, cut, preserve or expose fish for sale.
- (2) The occupier of a fish curing premises shall not do, or cause, suffer or permit to be done any of the things set out in this By-law which are not permitted to be done in the fish curing premises occupied by him".
29. By-law 204 is deleted and the following By-law inserted in its place:
- "204 (1) The occupier of a fish curing premises shall provide a fish preparation room that shall comply with the following requirements:
- (a) the walls shall be constructed of brick or concrete with the internal surface rendered with a cement steel float finish or other approved material and shall be devoid of holes, cracks and crevices;
- (b) the floor shall be of concrete with a smooth, durable surface and shall be treated with an approved surface hardening process;
- (c) the minimum floor area of fish curing premises, shall be 9 square metres;
- (d) the room shall be furnished with a double bowl stainless steel wash trough of adequate size to accommodate the equipment and utensils used on the premises, connected to a piped supply of hot and cold water;
- (e) tiling shall be provided above troughs, wash hand basins and benches to a height of 450 millimetres, and
- (f) the room shall be flyproofed and provided with ample light and ventilation.
- (2) The fish preparation room of a fish curing premises shall have a selfclosing door.
- (3) The occupier shall ensure that all fish are prepared in the fish preparation room and that room is to be used solely for that purpose.
30. By-law 205 is amended by substituting for the passage "an A Class" or "B Class fish shop, fish marketing premises or" with the following passage, "a".
31. By-law 206 is amended by deleting the passage, "fish shop, fish marketing premises or".
32. By-law 207 is amended by deleting the passage, "fish shop, fish marketing premises or".
33. By-law 208 is amended by deleting the passage, "fish shop, fish marketing premises or".
34. By-law 209 is deleted.
35. By-law 210 is amended by deleting the passage, "fish shop, fish marketing premises or".
36. In Part 10, Division 7, the heading "Marine Stores" is deleted and the following heading inserted in its place, "Premises used for Dealing in Scrap Metal other than by Heat for Recovery of Metal".

That Council under the powers conferred upon it by the Health Act 1911, the Council of the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder resolved on 29 May 1995 to make and submit for confirmation by the Executive Director of Public Health and approval by His Excellency the Governor, the following By-law.

CITY OF KALGOORLIE-BOULDER HEALTH (KEEPING OF HORSES AND STABLES) BY-LAWS 1995

Made by the Council of the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder.

Citation

1. These By-laws may be cited as the *City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder Health (Keeping of Horses and Stables) By-laws 1995*.

Repeal

2. The *Shire of Boulder Stables By-laws** (as amended) and the *Town of Kalgoorlie Stables By-laws*** (as amended) are repealed.

Interpretation

3. In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires—

“certificate of registration” or “certificate” means a certificate of registration under these By-laws;

“City” means the district of the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder;

“Council” means the Council of the City;

“environmental health officer” means an environmental health officer appointed by the Council;

“horse” means a stallion, mare, gelding, pony, colt, ass, or mule and any other animal used for burden, draught, or for riding on;

“shelter” means a building in a yard used for the temporary protection of a horse or a number of horses from inclement weather;

“stable” means a building used for stabling a horse or a number of horses;

“stall” means a compartment within a stable in which a single horse is kept;

“yard” means an area that is fenced in for the purpose of confining a horse or a number of horses.

Keeping of horses prohibited

4. (1) A person shall not keep a horse on any premises—

(a) situated in any of the areas within the City specified in Schedule 1; or

(b) the area of which is less than 759 square metres.

(2) A person who contravenes sub-by-law (1) commits an offence.

Keeping of horses

5. (1) Subject to By-law 4, a person shall not keep a greater number of horses on any premises other than the number specified in Column 2 in the Table in relation to premises of a kind specified in Column 1 in the Table.

(2) A person who contravenes sub-by-law (1) commits an offence.

Stables to be provided

6. (1) A person shall not keep a horse or horses on any premises unless—

(a) a stable is provided for each horse kept on the premises; or

(b) a stall is provided for each horse kept on the premises.

(2) A person who contravenes sub-by-law (1) commits an offence.

Erection of stables and shelters

7. (1) A person who desires to erect a stable or a shelter shall make written application to do so to the Council.

- (2) An application made under sub-by-law (1) is to be accompanied by—
- (a) such plans; specification and other particulars of the stables as may be required by the Council; and
 - (b) if the premises on which a stable is to be erected is situated in a part of the City, other than a part specified in Schedule 2, shall, if any dwelling house on an adjoining premises is located within 80 metres of the proposed site of the stable, lodge with the application written notice from each owner or occupier of those premises stating whether or not they have any objection to the stable being erected.
- (3) A person who objects to the erection of a stable shall, in the written notice given under sub-by-law (2) (b), state the grounds on which such objection is made.
- (4) The Council, upon being satisfied that there are no grounds on which the application ought to be refused, shall approve the application.
- (5) A person who erects or commences to erect a stable or a shelter without the approval of the Council commits an offence.

Stables to be registered

8. (1) A person shall not keep a horse in a stable unless the stable has been registered by the Council.
- (2) An application for the registration of a stable is to be made to the Council in the form of Form 1 in Schedule 3 and accompanied with the required fee as specified in item 1 of Schedule 4.
- (3) The Council, upon being satisfied that the stable has been erected in compliance with the requirements of these By-laws, shall approve the application and issue the applicant with a certificate of registration in the form of Form 2 in Schedule 3.
- (4) A certificate of registration shall, unless it is sooner suspended or cancelled by the Council, remain in force until the 31 July next following its issue.
- (5) A certificate of registration may be renewed annually in the month of July in the manner specified in sub-by-law (2).
- (6) The Council shall renew a certificate of registration upon being satisfied that the stable has been maintained in compliance with these by-laws.
- (7) A person who contravenes sub-by-law (1) commits an offence.

Transfer of certificate

9. (1) The holder of a certificate of registration may apply to the Council in the form of Form 3 in Schedule 3, together with the required fee as specified in item 2 of Schedule 4, for the transfer of that registration to the person named in the application.
- (2) The Council, upon being satisfied that there are no grounds on which the application ought to be refused; shall approve the application and issue to the person named in the application a new certificate of registration in the form of Form 2 in Schedule 3.

Council may cancel, suspend, refuse to renew

10. (1) Subject to this By-law, the Council may cancel, suspend for a fixed period or refuse to renew a certificate on the grounds that the holder has been convicted of an offence against these By-laws.
- (2) If the Council proposes to cancel, suspend or refuse to renew a certificate the Council is to give to the holder of the certificate notice in writing of the proposal and the Council's reasons for the proposal.
- (3) A notice given under sub-by-law (2) is to state that within 14 days after the notice is given, the person to whom it is given may make representations in writing to the Council concerning the matter, and the Council is not to determine the matter without considering any representation received within that period of 14 days.
- (4) If the Council cancels, suspends or refuses to renew a certificate the Council is to give to the holder of the certificate notice in writing of the cancellation, suspension or refusal to renew.

Siting of stables, shelters and yards

11. (1) A stable or shelter shall not be sited within 15 metres of a dwelling house; milking shed; milk-room, or other building used for the preparation or storage of food for human consumption.
- (2) No part of the perimeter fence of a yard shall be sited within 6 metres of a dwelling house; milking shed; milk-room, or other building used for the preparation or storage of food for human consumption.
- (3) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this By-law commits an offence.

Construction of stables and shelters

12. (1) Every stable and shelter shall be constructed, ventilated, drained, paved, and be sited on the premises in accordance with the provisions of this by-law.
- (2) Every stable—
- (a) shall have each wall and roof constructed of an impervious material of a type approved by the Council;

- (b) shall on all sides of the building between the top of the wall and the roof a clear opening of at least 150 millimetre in height;
 - (c) shall have a floor, the upper surface of which—
 - (i) is to be raised at least 75 millimetres above the surface of the ground;
 - (ii) is to be constructed of cement, concrete or other similar impervious finish; and
 - (iii) has a fall of 1 in 100 to a drain;
 - (d) shall have a floor area of not less than 11 square metres.
- (3) Every stall shall have a floor area of not less than 11 square metres and the walls of each stall shall not be less than 3 metres in both height and width.
- (4) Every shelter—
- (a) shall have each wall and roof constructed of an impervious material of a type approved by the Council;
 - (b) shall be of a height of not less than 2.5 metres;
 - (c) shall have at least one side which is completely open and which is not capable of being closed off by any means; and
 - (d) shall have a floor area of not less than 9 square metres.
- (5) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law commits an offence.

Maintenance of stables

13. (1) The holder of a certificate of registration issued under these by-laws shall ensure that every stable to which such registration applies is—

- (a) maintained in a clean condition and when ordered to do so by an environmental health officer shall clean; wash, and disinfect every stable to which the order applies in accordance with the directions contained in the order;
- (b) so far as possible, kept free from flies and other insects by spraying all parts of every stable with a residual insecticide or by use of some other effective means and when ordered to do so by an environmental health officer shall spray every stable to which the order applies with a residual insecticide in accordance with the directions contained in the order;
- (c) provided with a receptacle for manure that is—
 - (i) constructed of impervious material of a type approved by the Council;
 - (ii) provided with a tight-fitting cover which shall remain securely fitted to the receptacle at all times, other than when manure is being deposited or removed or for maintenance purposes;
 - (iii) located outside the stable in a position convenient to the stable; and
- (d) kept free of manure by causing all manure produced in the stable to be collected daily and placed in the receptacle provided for such purpose.

(2) The holder of a certificate of registration issued under these by-laws shall ensure that each receptacle for manure—

- (a) is emptied at least once a week or as often as is necessary to prevent it from becoming offensive; and
- (b) is kept, so far as possible, free from flies and other insects by spraying with a residual insecticide or by some other effective means.

(3) A holder of a certificate of registration who contravenes any of the provisions of sub-by-law (1) or (2) commits an offence.

False statements

14. A person who makes a false statement in connection with an application made under by-law 7, 8, or 9 commits an offence.

Savings

15. (1) Every registration granted by the Council under the former provisions and in force immediately before the commencement of these by-laws, has effect as if granted under these by-laws and notwithstanding any of the provisions in these by-laws, may be renewed or transferred, on application made under these by-laws, at the discretion of the Council subject to such conditions or restrictions, if any, that the Council may deem necessary to impose.



Penalty

16. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with these by-laws is guilty of an offence and is liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100.00 and if the offence is a continuing offence to a penalty of \$10.00 for each day that the offence continues.
