Interpretation

“licensed fishing boat” means a boat licensed pursuant to regulation 2 of the *Fisheries Regulations 1938*;

“set net” means any net which is placed, put, fixed, anchored, staked, secured or in any way made stationary or is stationary below high water mark.

Exemption

4. The provisions of this notice do not apply to—

(a) the holder of a professional fisherman's licence operating from a licensed fishing boat which is—

(i) being used in a limited entry fishery declared by notice under section 32 of the Act;

(ii) authorised to be used in that limited entry fishery; and

(iii) being used in accordance with the provisions of the notice declaring the fishery in which the boat is authorised to be used;

(b) the holder of a professional fisherman's licence operating from a licensed fishing boat and the—

(i) licence for that boat is endorsed to permit that boat to be used to take fish by means of a net in the waters specified in Schedule 1 or Schedule 2; and

(ii) the boat is being used in accordance with the provisions of that endorsement;

(c) a person using a—

(i) drop net to take crabs or cherabin;

(ii) hand scoop net to take crabs or cherabin;

(iii) hand dip net or hand trawl net to take prawns; or

(iv) throw net.

Restrictions on net fishing

5. (1) All persons are prohibited from taking, or attempting to take, fish by means of a net in the waters and during the times specified in Schedule 1.

(2) All persons are prohibited from taking, or attempting to take, fish by means of a set net in the waters and during the times specified in Schedule 2.

Determination of position by reference to the Australian Geodetic Datum

6. (1) Where, for the purposes of this notice, it is necessary to determine a position on the surface of the Earth by geographical co-ordinates, that position shall be determined on the Australian Geodetic Datum which is defined by an ellipsoid having a semi-major axis (equatorial radius) of 6,378,160 metres and a flattening of 1/298.25 and fixed by the position of the origin being the Johnston Geodetic Station in the Northern Territory of Australia.

(2) The Johnston Geodetic Station referred to in subclause (1) shall be taken to be situated at 25°56'54.5515" south latitude and 133°12'30.0771" east longitude and to have a ground level elevation of 571.2 metres above the ellipsoid referred to in that subclause.



Objection to the granting of the application may be served on the applicant and the Clerk of Petty Sessions at any time prior to seven days before the date appointed for the hearing.

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
