(4) Without limiting the generality of subregulation (2), the Executive Director may require an application for a licence to pull or remove sandalwood on or from —

(a) any part of an area of land described in the Table to regulation 7 (1); or

(b) any part of land to which regulation 8 (1) applies,

to be accompanied by evidence of the lawful authority to clear the land.

”.

Regulation 4 amended

4. Regulation 4 (2) of the principal regulations is amended by deleting “12 months” and substituting the following —

“ 5 years ”.

Regulation 7 amended

5. Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is amended —

(a) by deleting “A licence” and substituting the following —

“ (1) Subject to subregulation (2), a licence ”;

(b) by deleting “regulation” and substituting the following —

(c) by inserting after subregulation (1) the following subregulation —

HEALTH ACT 1911*Shire of Northampton*

Stables By-laws

Pursuant to the provisions of the Health Act 1911, the Shire of Northampton, being a local authority within the meaning of the Health Act, records having resolved on 15 September 1995 to make and submit for confirmation by the Executive Director of Public Health and approval by His Excellency the Governor the following By-laws.

Citation

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Shire of Northampton Stables By-laws.

Application

2. This by-law shall apply and have operation in the townsites of Northampton, Port Gregory, Binu and Kalbarri and in the locality of Horrocks Beach.

Repeal

3. The Health By-laws of the Shire of Northampton, the adoption of which was published in the *Government Gazette* on 16 April 1964, are amended in PART I—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS by repealing by-laws 26, 27 and 28.

Interpretation

4. In these by-laws, unless the context requires otherwise—

“Act” means the Health Act 1911 and amendments thereto;

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Northampton;

“Environmental Health Officer” means any Environmental Health Officer appointed by the Council under the Act;

“Horse” means any stallion, mare, gelding, pony, colt or foal and includes any ass, mule, donkey and any other animal used for burden, draught or for riding on;

“House” has the same meaning as is given to it in the Act;

“Person” and words applying to any person or individual includes a corporation;

“Premises” includes land (whether or not appurtenant to a building), building or part thereof, or tent, stall or other structure, whether permanent or temporary;

“Stable” means a building capable of being enclosed in which a horse is accommodated or kept;

“Stall” means a compartment within a stable in which a single horse is kept;

“Yard” means an area where horses are temporarily contained by a fence or rails.

Keeping of horses prohibited

5. (1) A person shall not keep a horse on any premises within the townsites of Northampton, Port Gregory, Binu and Kalbarri and the locality of Horrocks Beach unless the premises—

(a) has an area of not less than 4 000m²;

(b) contains a stable with a stall for each horse kept on the premises; and

(c) are registered with Council under these by-laws.

5. (2) A person who contravenes sub-by-law (1) commits an offence.

Keeping of horses

6. (1) Subject to by-law 5 a person shall not keep a greater number of horses on any premises than the number specified in the Table below.

Area of Premises	Number of Horses
4 000m ² —6 000m ²	3
Over 6 000m ²	As approved by Council

6. (2) A person who contravenes sub-by-law (1) commits an offence.

Erection of stables

7. (1) A person who desires to erect a stable shall make written application to Council in the form of an application for planning consent under the relevant town planning scheme.

7. (2) An application made under sub-by-law 6.1 shall be accompanied by—

(a) such plans, specifications and other particulars as may be required by the Council; and

(b) if there is a house on an adjoining premises within 80 metres of the proposed site of the stable, a written notice from each owner or occupier of those adjoining premises stating whether or not they have any objection to the stable being erected.

7. (3) A person who objects to the erection of a stable shall, in the written notice given under sub-by-law 7. (2) (b), state the grounds on which such objection is made.

7. (4) Upon receipt of such application the Council shall cause the premises to be inspected by an Environmental Health officer who shall report upon the compliance with these by-laws.

7. (5) The Council shall consider all reports and objections before deciding the application for planning consent.

7. (6) Upon an application for planning consent for a stable being approved the applicant shall obtain a building licence before the erection of the stable is commenced.

Premises to be registered

8. (1) A person shall not keep a horse on any premises unless the premises have been registered by the Council.

8. (2) An application for the registration of premises is to be made to the Council in the form of Form 1 in the Schedule and accompanied by the required fee as specified in item 1 of the Schedule.

8. (3) The Council, upon being satisfied that the stable has been erected in compliance with the requirements of these By-laws, shall approve the application and issue the applicant with a certificate of registration in the form of Form 2 in the Schedule.

8. (4) A certificate of registration shall, unless it is sooner suspended or cancelled by the Council, remain in force until the 30 June next following its issue.

8. (5) A certificate of registration may be renewed annually in the month of June in the manner specified in sub-by-law 7.2.

8. (6) The Council shall renew a certificate of registration upon being satisfied that the stable has been maintained in compliance with these by-laws.

8. (7) A person who contravenes sub-by-law 8.(1) commits an offence.

Transfer of certificate

9. (1) The holder of a certificate of registration may apply to the Council in the form of Form 3 in the Schedule, together with the fee specified in item 2 of the Schedule, for the transfer of that registration to the person named in the application.

9. (2) The Council, upon being satisfied that there are no grounds on which the application should be refused, shall approve the application and issue to the person named in the application a new certificate of registration in the form of Form 2 in the Schedule.

Council may cancel, suspend, refuse to renew

10. (1) Subject to this by-law, the Council may cancel, suspend for a fixed period or refuse to renew a certificate on the grounds that the holder has been convicted of an offence against these by-laws.

10. (2) If the Council proposes to cancel, suspend or refuse to renew a certificate the Council is to give to the holder of the certificate notice in writing of the proposal and the Council's reasons for the proposal.

10. (3) A notice given under sub-by-law 10.(2) is to state that within 14 days after the notice is given, the person to whom it is given may make representations in writing to the Council concerning the matter and the Council is not to determine the matter without considering any representation received within that period of 14 days.

10. (4) If the Council cancels, suspends or refuses to renew a certificate the Council is to give the holder of the certificate notice in writing of the cancellation, suspension or refusal to renew.

Siting of stables and yards

11. (1) No part of a stable shall be sited within 15 metres of any dwelling house or other building used for the preparation or storage of food for human consumption.

11. (2) No part of the perimeter fence of a yard shall be within 15 metres of any dwelling house or other building used for the preparation or storage of food for human consumption.

11. (3) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law commits an offence.

Construction of stables

12. (1) Every stable shall be constructed, ventilated, drained, paved and be sited on the premises in accordance with the provisions of this by-law.

12. (2) Every stable—

- (a) shall have each wall and roof constructed of an impervious material of a type approved by the Council;
- (b) shall have on all sides of the building between the top of the wall and the roof a clear opening of at least 150 millimetres in height;
- (c) shall have a floor constructed of cement, concrete or other similar impervious finish, the upper surface of which is at least 75 millimetres above the surface of the surrounding ground and has a fall of 1 in 100 to a drain;
- (d) shall have a floor area of not less than 11 square metres.

12. (3) Every stall shall have a floor area of not less than 11 square metres and walls of not less than 3 metres in both height and width.

12. (4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law commits an offence.

Maintainance of stables

13. (1) The holder of a certificate of registration issued under these by-laws shall ensure that every stable to which such registration applies is—

- (a) maintained in a clean condition and when ordered to do so by an Environmental Health Officer shall clean, wash and disinfect every stable to which the order applies in accordance with the directions contained in the order;
- (b) so far as possible, kept free from flies and other insects by spraying all parts of every stable with a residual insecticide or by use of some other effective means and when ordered to do so by an Environmental Health Officer shall spray every stable to which the order applies with a residual insecticide in accordance with the directions contained in the order;
- (c) provided with a receptacle for all wastes including manure and soiled bedding that is—
 - (i) constructed of an impervious material of a type approved by the Council;
 - (ii) provided with a tight fitting cover which is kept closed except when waste is being deposited or removed or the receptacle is being cleaned and maintained; and
 - (iii) located outside and convenient to the stable.
- (d) kept free of manure and soiled bedding by causing all wastes produced in the stable to be collected daily and placed in the receptacle provided for such purpose.

13. (2) The holder of a certificate of registration issued under these by-laws shall ensure that each receptacle for wastes—

- (a) is emptied at least once each week or as often as is necessary to prevent it becoming offensive; and
- (b) is kept, so far as is possible, free from flies and other insects by spraying with a residual insecticide or by some other effective means.

13. (3) A holder of a certificate of registration who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law commits an offence.

False statements

14. A person who makes a false statement in connection with an application made under these by-laws commits an offence.

Savings

15. (1) Every approval granted by Council under legislation in force immediately prior to the commencement of these by-laws has effect as if granted under these by-laws. Notwithstanding any of the provisions of these by-laws an approval may be renewed or transferred, on application made under these by-laws, at the discretion of the Council. The Council may impose on any approval such conditions or restrictions as it may deem necessary.

Penalty

16. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with these by-laws commits an offence and upon conviction is liable to a penalty not exceeding \$200 and if the offence is a continuing offence to an additional penalty of \$20 for each day that the offence continues.

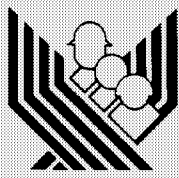
