“

Proposals of prescribed class

2C. For the purposes of section 38 (1) and (3) of the principal Act, a proposal which involves a significant —

- (a) discharge of waste; or
- (b) emission of noise, odour or electromagnetic radiation,

into the environment is a proposal of a prescribed class.

”

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (ELECTIONS — OWNERS AND OCCUPIERS ROLL) REGULATIONS 1996

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Local Government (Elections — Owners and Occupiers Roll) Regulations 1996*.

Forms

2. In these regulations a reference to a Form followed by a designation is a reference to the form so designated in Schedule 1.

Nomination of co-owners or co-occupiers — s. 4.31

3. (1) A nomination under section 4.31 (1) (e), (f) or (g) of the Act is to be made in writing and —

- (a) in the case of a nomination by a body corporate, be signed by an officer of the body corporate; or
- (b) in any other case, be signed by all or a majority of the owners or occupiers of the property.

(2) A nomination for the purposes of section 4.31 (1) of the Act remains in force until —

- (a) if the nomination is expressed to be for a limited period, the end of that period;
- (b) an enrolment eligibility claim made by the nominee expires or is rejected;
- (c) the CEO is notified in writing that the body corporate has, or all or a majority of the owners or occupiers of the property have, cancelled the nomination; or
- (d) the nominee ceases to be eligible to be nominated.

Enrolment eligibility claim — s. 4.32 (1)

4. An enrolment eligibility claim under section 4.32 (1) of the Act is to be made in the form of Form 1.

Register — s. 4.32 (6)

5. The register referred to in section 4.32 (6) of the Act is to be kept in the form and manner determined by the CEO.

Notice of acceptance or rejection of enrolment eligibility claim — s. 4.32 (6)

6. A notice given under section 4.32 (6) of the Act is to be —
- (a) if the enrolment eligibility claim is accepted, in the form of Form 2; or
 - (b) if the enrolment eligibility claim is rejected, in the form of Form 3.

Appeal to Electoral Commissioner — s. 4.32 (8) and 4.35 (4)

7. An appeal under section 4.32 (8) or 4.35 (4) of the Act is to be made in the form and manner determined by the Electoral Commissioner.

Confidentiality

8. Details of a person's date of birth and telephone number provided in an enrolment eligibility claim are confidential and the CEO, and any person to whom that information is disclosed in accordance with this regulation, must ensure that those details are not used or disclosed to any person other than for the purpose of preparing electoral rolls for the relevant district or ward or as otherwise required or permitted by law.

Delivery of documents

9. (1) Where a person is required by these regulations to give a document to another person the document may be delivered, posted, faxed or sent by any other electronic means (so long as it is capable of being printed in its entirety, including a signature) to that other person.

(2) If a document is faxed it is taken to have been received when the fax machine of the person to whom it was sent generates a paper copy of the document.

(3) If a document is sent by other electronic means it is taken to have been received when the person to whom it was sent causes a paper copy of the document to be generated.

Retention of documents

10. A local government must keep —
- (a) an enrolment eligibility claim form —
 - (i) if the claim is accepted, for 2 years after the claim expires; or
 - (ii) if the claim is rejected, for 2 years after it is rejected;
 - (b) a copy of a notice of acceptance for 2 years after the enrolment eligibility claim to which it relates expires; and
 - (c) a copy of a notice of rejection for 2 years after the claim was rejected.

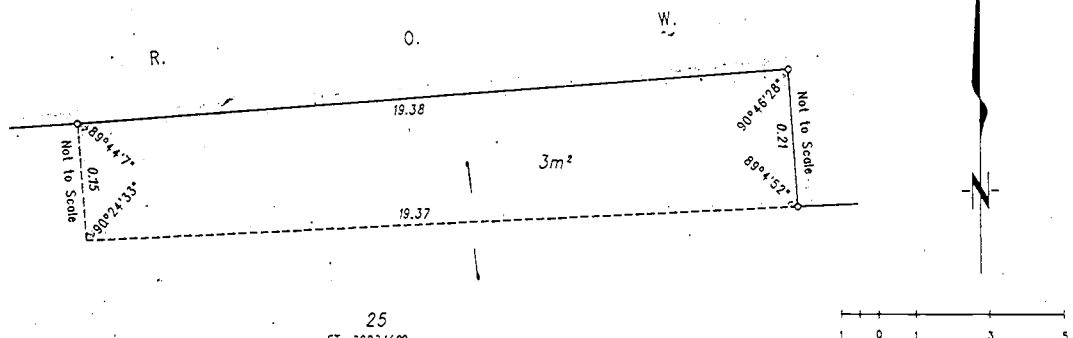

LG601**BUSH FIRES ACT 1954***Shire of Chittering*

Notice to All Owners and Occupiers of Land

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act you are hereby required, on or before 31st October, 1996 to establish firebreaks clear of all flammable material and thereafter maintain such firebreaks clear of all flammable materials up to and including 12th April, 1997.

Hazard Reduction—

Landowners are advised that inspections of properties shall be carried out prior to 15 October each year and Orders for Hazard Reduction will be served by 1 November each year requiring that the necessary work be undertaken prior to 15 November.

Failure to comply with Hazard Reduction Orders will result in the work being undertaken by Council or the local Bush Fire Brigade at the landowners expense.

Hazard reduction may be effected by stocking, clearing, slashing, burning or firebreaks to the Fire Control Officers satisfaction.

Rural—

- (a) Zone 4—Wannamal not less than a three (3) metre wide firebreak and Zone 6—South not less than a two (2) metre firebreak around all buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas situated on the land not more than 20 metres from the perimeter of these areas and around the entire property boundary or strategically positioned on the property according to a plan agreed to by the Fire Control Officer for the area and recorded by the Shire of Chittering.

If the local Fire Control Officer does not approve the proposed alternative firebreak plan the landowner may appeal to the Chief Fire Control Officer. If agreement is not reached the firebreak must be installed around the perimeter as above.

- (b) Where the construction of firebreaks may cause hardship or be impractical the landowner may appeal to a Fire Control Officer for the area for a variation subject to any approved variation being recorded by the Shire of Chittering.
- (c) For unimproved land, unless approval is granted for alternative locations as items (a) or (b) three (3) metre firebreaks shall be positioned so as to divide the land into areas not in excess of 120 hectares each completely surrounded by a firebreak.

Special Rural Subdivisions

Landowners or Occupiers shall—

- (a) Clear firebreaks not less than two (2) metres completely surrounding and not more than twenty (20) metres from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas situated on the land.
- (b) Install access (three (3) metre wide gate) on fences meeting the perimeter fence of the subdivision (where there is not a bridle trail on the perimeter) to allow access for firebreak maintenance machinery on each such lot joining the subdivision perimeter.
- (c) Landowner/Occupier not wishing to conform to Section (B) will clear firebreaks not less than two (2) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of their land, as well as precautions detailed in Section (A).

Bindoon, Wannamal and Muchea townsites—

- (a) Lots greater in area than 2 hectares used for grazing purposes or in agricultural pursuits the landowner or occupier shall clear firebreaks—
 - (i) not less than two (2) metres wide inside and along those portions of the boundaries of all cleared or part cleared land having common boundaries with land of other owners or with public roads.
 - (ii) not less than two (2) metres wide immediately surrounding all buildings and haystacks and fuel storage areas situated on the land.
- (b) All other lots shall have firebreaks around the perimeter of all buildings cleared of all flammable material to a width not less than two (2) metres and in the case of vacant land the firebreak shall be on the perimeter of the property.

If it is considered impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply direct to the Bush Fire Control Officer for the area in which the land is situated not later than 15th October, 1995 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions.

When permission has been obtained from the Fire Control Officer to provide firebreaks in alternative positions it is your responsibility to advise the Council in writing that such approval was given.

If permission is not granted by the FCO to vary the requirements, you shall comply with this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$40.00 nor more than \$400.00 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Wannamal (Zone 4)—

Burning is prohibited in this area from 1st December, 1996 to 14th February 1997.

Burning is allowed with a permit between 19th October, 1996 and the commencement date of the Prohibited Burning Time (1st December) and after the end of the Prohibited Burning Time 14th February, 1997 to 12 April, 1997 subject to specified conditions obtainable at Shire Offices and issue of a burning permit obtainable from Fire Control Officers.

Shire of Wagin

FIREBREAK NOTICE

Notice to all Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Wagin

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act you are hereby required on or before the 1st day of November and thereafter up to and including the 31st day of March the following year, to have a firebreak clear of all inflammable material in accordance with the following.

(1) RURAL LAND

- (a) Firebreaks at least 2.5 metres wide shall be cleared of all inflammable material at a distance of 20 metres from the perimeter of all buildings and haystacks, or groups of building and haystacks and shall completely encircle such buildings and haystacks; and
- (b) The area between the buildings and haystacks and the firebreak mentioned in (a) above shall be cleared of all inflammable material by the 15th December.

FUEL STORAGE SITES

- (c) The land within a perimeter of 6 metres outside the external boundary of the land normally occupied by any drums or tanks used for the storage of fuel, or the foundations or supports of any structure supporting such drums or tanks, whether containing fuel or not, shall be cleared of all inflammable material.

FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT

A readily mobile operational fire fighting unit containing a minimum of 400 litres of water on standby and available for inspection is required during the period 1st November to 31st March of each year.

HARVESTING

A person shall not operate or suffer the operation of a grain harvesting machine or any machine used for swathing, baling or slashing of stubble or hay in any crop during the prohibited burning times unless;

1. One hand held water filled fire extinguisher (minimum capacity 7.5 litres) is filled in a readily accessible position on the machine.
2. A readily mobile fire fighting unit of a minimum of 400 litre capacity powered by an engine driven pump is in attendance in or adjacent to the entrance of the paddock being harvested.

HARVEST BANS AND OTHER BANS

Guidelines for vehicle and machinery movement bans including bans on the operation of internal combustion engines.

DEFINITIONS

The following definitions shall apply to the guidelines on the ban of vehicle and machinery movement and the operation of internal combustion engines under Regulations 38A and 38B of the Bush Fires Act.

Laneway/Roadway (non gazetted)

A laneway/roadway is defined as having a trafficable surface, free of all inflammable material, a minimum of four metres wide. Overhanging vegetation has to be pruned back so as not to come into contact with parts of a vehicle.

Yard

A yard is defined as an area, more than four metres wide, with a constructed, trafficable surface, free of all inflammable material save life standing trees.

Mobile Fire Fighting Unit

A mobile fire fighting unit is defined as having a minimum water carrying capacity of four hundred (400) litres, fitted with a hose and pump capable of delivering water through an adjustable nozzle in the spray and jet configurations.

Harvest Ban

A ban on the operation of all grain harvesting machines including swathing, baling or slashing machines within the Shire of part of the Shire and during a time, as specified in a notice or broadcast (Reg 38A).

A ban on the Movement of all vehicles and Machines and the Operation of Internal Combustion Engines

A ban on the movement of all vehicles and machinery and the operation of internal combustion engines within a Shire of a part of a Shire and during a time as specified in a notice or broadcast (eg 38A and B) with the exception of the movement of vehicles and machinery on made gazetted roads, laneways and yards. The following activities are permitted provided these comply with specified conditions.

Permitted Activities

1. Loading and offloading of grain, fertiliser and feed is only permitted on sites which are clear of all inflammable material save life standing trees to a radius of at least 50 metres with a laneway access. A mobile fire fighting unit shall be in attendance at all times.
2. Water carting for stock and domestic purposes provided it is accompanied by a mobile fire fighting unit, or alternatively, the water carting vehicle acts as the mobile fire fighting unit and meets minimum specifications.
3. All necessary travel to and from and within piggeries, sheep or cattle feed lots, provided this is undertaken with a mobile fire fighting unit in attendance.
4. All necessary carting of livestock, provided that such a vehicle is accompanied by a mobile fire fighting unit.
5. Activities which received specific exemptions from Council or a Chief Bush Fire Control Officer.

CHRISTMAS DAY

A Harvest Ban and a ban on the movement of all vehicles and machines and the operation of Internal Combustion engines is imposed on Christmas Day each year.

All other activities or operations may only be undertaken during Total Vehicle and Machinery Movement Bans and Bans on the Operation of Internal Combustion Engines after approval has been granted by Council. Approval has to be sought on an individual basis. Approval may be subject to specified conditions. It should be noted that approval may not be granted.

(2) TOWN LAND

- (a) Where the area of land is 0.202 hectares (half an acre) or less all inflammable material on the land shall be removed from the whole of the land; and
- (b) Where the land exceeds 0.202 hectares (half an acre) in area, firebreaks at least 2 metres wide shall be cleared of all inflammable material immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

GENERAL

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land or any other provisions required by this notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than 30th October, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative

positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Inflammable Material" is defined for the purpose of this Order to include bush (as defined in the Bushfires Act), timber, boxes, cartons, paper and like inflammable materials, rubbish and also any combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees, or growing bushes and plants in gardens, or lawns.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not more than \$1000, or a penalty of \$80 may be incurred by issue of an infringement notice, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirement of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Notice to Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Nannup

All owners and occupiers of land in the Shire of Nannup are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this order.

This work must be completed by—

- 1st December, 1996, in townsites,
- 15th December, 1996, in rural areas.

This work must be maintained throughout the summer months until the close of the restricted burning period in 1997.

A copy of this notice, including additional information and a list of Fire Control Officers, appears in Councils Information Booklet which is enclosed with all rate notices.

1. ALTERNATIVE MEASURES

- (a) If it is considered impractical for any reason, to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material, as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council by no later than the 1st November each year for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative measures to abate the fire hazards on the land. Any such application must bear the signature of the Fire Control Officer for the area signifying this agreement to this variation. If permission is not granted, you shall comply with the requirements of this Notice. Applications for alternative measures must be renewed each year.
- (b) Strategic Firebreak Plans submitted by a Bush Fire Brigade must be agreed to at a properly constituted Bush Fire Brigade Meeting. Brigade Strategic Firebreak Plans, Amendments and Renewals must be submitted to Council by 31 August each year. Plans must be approved by Council's Bush Fire Advisory Committee and ratified by Council. Brigade Strategic Firebreak Plans must be renewed as above each year.

2. MINIMUM STANDARDS

The requirements of this order are considered to be the minimum standard of fire prevention work required to protect not only individual properties but the district generally. In addition to this order Council may issue special orders to owners/occupiers if hazard removal is considered necessary in some specific areas.

3. PENALTIES

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of this notice may be issued with an infringement notice fine of \$80.00 or prosecuted with an increased maximum fine of \$1,000.00. Council may also carry out the required works at the owner/occupier's expense.

4. INSPECTIONS

Inspections of Firebreaks and hazard reductions will be carried out by an authorised officer on or after the specified work completion dates.

5. CONTIGUOUS HOLDINGS

Contiguous holdings of land which are owned and/or occupied by the same owner or occupier shall be treated as one holding of land for the purpose of this notice.

6. FIRE HAZARDS

Where in the opinion of an Authorised Officer or the Area Fire Control Officer the land contains an amount of inflammable material which is considered hazardous, the land owner shall clear such hazard upon service of a notice requiring such works to be carried out.

7. YOUR RESPONSIBILITY**(i) Rural Land**

- (a) For the purposes of this Order rural land means all land located within the Shire of Nannup that is zoned rural pursuant to Council's Town Planning Scheme, however, does not include land being used for commercial plantation purposes.
- (b) Firebreaks clear of all inflammable material not less than 2 metres wide shall be constructed inside and within 20 metres of the boundary of each property where land adjoining that boundary is predominantly pasture or crops.
- (c) Trafficable firebreaks clear of all inflammable material and not less than 3 metres wide shall be constructed inside and within 20 metres of the boundary of each property where the land adjoining that boundary is predominantly trees, bush or scrub.
- (d) Firebreaks not less than 2 metres wide shall be constructed within a perimeter of 20 metres of all homesteads, buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas on the land.

(ii) Special Rural Land

- (a) Special Rural land means rural holdings of and within the Shire of Nannup zoned as Special Rural under the Shire's Town Planning Scheme.
- (b) Firebreaks clear of all inflammable material not less than 2 metres wide shall be constructed inside and within 6 metres of the boundary of each property where land adjoining that boundary is predominantly pasture or crops.
- (c) Trafficable firebreaks clear of all inflammable material and not less than 3 metres wide shall be constructed inside and within 6 metres of the boundary of each property where the land adjoining that boundary is predominantly trees, bush or scrub.
- (d) All inflammable material except for live standing trees and live garden plants shall be cleared within a 20 metre radius of all buildings.
- (e) Where a special rural subdivision is protected by strategic firebreak measures it shall be the responsibility of all landowners abutting the strategic firebreaks to maintain that portion of the firebreak which adjoins the boundary of their property, or runs through their property.

(iii) Urban Land

- (a) Urban land means land within the Shire of Nannup which is within the townsite or is within any area which is sub-divided for residential purposes.
- (b) Where the area of land is less than or equal to 2024m² (approx. 0.5 acre) all inflammable material shall be removed from the whole of that land, with the exception of live, standing trees and live garden plants.
- (c) Where the area of land exceeds 2024m² (approx. 0.5 acre) firebreaks not less than 2 metres wide shall be constructed inside and within 6 metres of the external boundaries of the land.
- (d) All inflammable material except for live standing trees and live garden plants shall be cleared within a 20 metre radius of all buildings.

(iv) Plantations

- (a) A plantation is any area of planted pine trees or eucalyptus species exceeding 3 hectares.
- (b) All plantations require Planning Approval from Council prior to development. Council may require plantation fire protection measures to be fulfilled as a condition of Planning Approval.
- (c) Firebreaks not less than 15 metres wide, shall be constructed on the boundaries of plantations or on such alternative location as may be agreed between the Local Government Council and the plantation owner.
Boundary firebreaks shall consist of area 15 metres wide cleared of all flammable material and—
 - * the outer 10 metres having no overhanging tree branches for a vertical clearance of at least 10 metres.
 - * trees may not be planted closer than 15 metres to the outer edge of the firebreaks.
- (d) Internal firebreaks clear of all inflammable material and not less than 6 metres wide shall be constructed surrounding compartments of approximately 30 hectares.
All internal firebreaks must be maintained in a trafficable condition and trees on both sides of the breaks progressively pruned to a minimum height of 4 metres to allow unrestricted access to maintenance and fire fighting equipment and so as to maintain an effective width of firebreak.
- (e) Where power lines pass through, or near plantation areas, additional obligations are required by the state power authority. Plantation owners and/or managers should consult Western Power for advice on their responsibilities.

(v) Camp Fires—

(Bush Fires Act Section 25 (1a), (1aa), (1b), (1c), (1d) and (2)).

- (a) Lighting of fires in the open air for the purpose of camping or cooking is prohibited in the Shire of Nannup during the prohibited burning period each year.
- (b) Areas which are set aside for cooking by the State Authority or Local Authority responsible for the care, control or management of the land are excluded from Clause 7 (v)(a) above providing properly constructed cooking facilities are provided.

- (c) The provisions of Section 25 (1c) and 25 (1aa) of the Bush Fires Act 1954 shall be complied with in relation to a fire lit pursuant to Clause 7 (v)(b) above.

- (b) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed immediately surrounding all buildings.
- (c) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed between 10 and 20 metres distant from and surrounding all haystacks.
- (d) Stored fuel, oil and flammable materials shall be protected from fire as prescribed in the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act 1961 and the Flammable Liquids Regulations 1967 and which include that a firebreak 6 metres wide will be provided immediately surrounding storage areas.

GENERAL

If for any reason it is considered by the owner or occupier of land that it is impractical to comply with the requirements of this notice a request may be made to the Council to approve alternative fire protection measures. Such application shall be accompanied by a sketch or drawing of the proposed variations and should be lodged at the Council Offices not later than 31 October 1996.

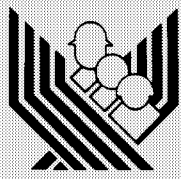
