CONSERVATION AND LAND MANAGEMENT**CM401****CONSERVATION AND LAND MANAGEMENT ACT 1984****PROPOSALS TO AMEND MANAGEMENT PLAN No. 15 FOR THE
FITZGERALD RIVER NATIONAL PARK**

The Department of Conservation and Land Management in conjunction with the National Parks and Nature Conservation Authority advises that two amendments to the Fitzgerald River National Park Management Plan, 1991-2001, are available for public comment. The CALM Act requires any amendment to a management plan to be available for public comment for a period of at least two months.

Fitzgerald River National Park lies on the central south coast of Western Australia. It is one of the largest and most biologically significant national parks in Australia, with highly diverse flora, numerous rare species of flora and fauna, and extensive natural landscapes. The Park is one of Australia's twelve international biosphere reserves.

The first amendment concerns a proposal for horse-riding in the Bremer Bay area. It is proposed to designate a bridle trail route in the Bremer Bay area along existing roads which traverse the National Park.

The second amendment concerns a review of fire management for the wilderness zone. In accordance with the Management Plan, 1991-2001, a review of fire management provisions in the wilderness zone was undertaken in 1995. In view of the high nature conservation values of the National Park and the complexity of the issues, recommendations from the review will be dealt with through a formal public review process.

Comments on the proposed amendments are invited until 31 December 1996.

"60. A councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall—

 - (a) State its substance before addressing the Council thereon.
 - (b) Put the motion or amendment in writing, if so required by the Mayor, either of his own volition or at the request of a councillor or staff member.
 - (c) State clearly the reasons for the motion or amendment when it is contrary to the recommendation recorded in the council or committee agenda and include such reasons in the motion or amendment."
 5. Local law 124 is deleted and replaced as follows—

"124. When a member of a council or committee specifically requests that there be recorded—

 - (a) his or her vote; or
 - (b) the vote of all members present,

on a matter voted on at a meeting of the council or committee, the person presiding is to cause the vote or votes, as the case may be; to be recorded in the minutes."

1. Insert after "Division 4—Maintenance of Structures" in PART VI—BUILDINGS the following Division 5—Fire and Smoke Detectors—

Division 5—Fire and Smoke Detectors

6.19 FIRE AND SMOKE ALARMS

An automatic fire and smoke detection and alarm system, designed to ensure the occupants are given adequate warning so they can evacuate the building in an emergency, must be installed in all new Class 1a single residential buildings.

6.20 An automatic fire and smoke detection and alarm system must—

- (a) consist of a system of self-contained smoke alarms in accordance with Clause 6.21; or
- (b) comply with Australian Standard AS1670, except that Clause 2.4(a) of that standard only applies to heat detectors;
- (c) heat detectors which comply with Australian Standard AS1670 may be used in kitchen areas where the installation of smoke detectors would be likely to cause false alarms.

6.21 SELF CONTAINED SMOKE ALARMS

A system consisting of self-contained smoke alarms must comply with the following—

- (a) In a Class 1a building, self-contained smoke alarms must be installed in suitable locations on or near the ceiling—
 - (i) in every bedroom and associated hallway; and
 - (ii) on each storey.
- (b) self-contained smoke alarms must—
 - (i) comply with Australian Standard AS3786; or
 - (ii) be listed in the SSL Register of Accredited Products; and
 - (iii) be connected to the consumer mains power.

6.22 LOCATION OF SMOKE DETECTORS

Smoke detectors must be—

- (a) wherever possible, surface mounted and outside air-handling ducts, unless a point sampling system with maximum sensitivity level of 0.5% smoke obstruction per metre is used;
- (b) located at natural collection points for hot smoke having regard to the ceiling geometry and its effects on the migratory path;
- (c) situated not more than 1.5 metres horizontal distance from smoke doors or fire doors; and
- (d) of the photo-electric type if installed within ducts or atmospheres contaminated with dust particles less than 1 micrometre in size and other particles likely to operate an ionisation type detector.

6.23 THRESHOLD LEVELS

Sampling systems must comply with Australian Standard AS1670, with response times and alarm thresholds maintained at minimum levels and no alarm delay permitted on the highest alarm threshold utilised.

6.25 The setting of alarm threshold levels for addressable detectors used within intelligent systems must not exceed the sensitivity levels nominated in—

- (a) Australian Standard AS1668.1; and
- (b) Australian Standard AS1603 Parts 1, 4 and 6."

2. In Division 1—Preliminary of PART VI—BUILDINGS insert the following definition in the appropriate alphabetical position—

"Class 1a single residential buildings" means and includes—

- (a) a detached house; or
- (b) one or more attached dwellings, each being a building, separated by a fire-resisting wall, including a row house, terrace house, town house, or villa unit."
