**AGRICULTURE AND RELATED RESOURCES PROTECTION ACT 1976**

Agriculture Protection Board,  
South Perth, 17 December 1996.

Pursuant to Section 37 of the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976, the Agriculture Protection Board hereby lists the classes of animals that are for the time being the subject of a declaration made under Section 35 of that Act, together with the matters specified pursuant to subsection (2) of that Section in relation to each class.

## ANIMALS

## Table A

(Managed Native Animals)

Table A: Native pest animals—Category A7. A management programme for each species outlines the area and conditions under which controls may be applied. Programmes are for the whole of the State or as indicated for each species.

Agile Wallaby (*Macropus agilis*). Municipal districts of the Shires of Wyndham-East Kimberley, West Kimberley, Halls Creek and Broome.

Euro (*Macropus robustus*).

Emu (*Dromaius novaehollandiae*).

Galah (*Cacatua roseicapilla*)

Little Corella (Kimberley) (*Cacatua sanguinea sanguinea*). Shires of Wyndham-East Kimberley and Derby-West Kimberley.

Little Corella (Pilbara-Murchison & northern wheatbelt) (*Cacatua sanguinea westralensis*). Shires of Carnarvon, Greenough, Irwin, Mingenew, Perenjori and Three Springs.

Long-billed corella (northern & central wheatbelt) (*Cacatua pastinator butleri*). Shires of Irwin, Mingenew, Morawa, Mullewa, Perenjori and Three Springs.

Long-billed corella (Lake Muir) (*Cacatua pastinator pastinator*). Shires of Boyup Brook, Cranbrook and Manjimup.

Maned Goose or Wood Duck (*Chenonetta jubata*). South-west and Eucla Divisions, excluding those municipal districts within the Perth Metropolitan Region.

Port Lincoln Ringneck, or twenty-eight parrot (*Barnardius zonarius*). South-west Division, excluding those municipal districts within the Perth Metropolitan Region and the Cities of Albany, Bunbury and Mandurah.

Red-capped Parrot, or W.A. king parrot (*Purpureicephalus spurius*). Municipal districts of the Shires of Bridgetown-Greenbushes, Capel, Chittering, Donnybrook-Balingup, Harvey, Kalamunda, Manjimup, Mundaring, Murray, Plantagenet, Serpentine-Jarrahdale, Swan, and the City of Armadale.

Wedge-tailed Eagle (*Aquila audax*).

Western Rosella (*Platycercus icterotis*). Municipal districts of the Shires of Bridgetown-Greenbushes, Capel, Cranbrook, Donnybrook-Balingup, Manjimup, Plantagenet and Serpentine-Jarrahdale.

Western Silveryeye (*Zosterops lateralis gouldii*). South-west Division.

(2) If the principal of a school exempts a student at the school from complying with any requirement of the school's school dress code then the principal must —

- (a) ensure that a written record is made of —
  - (i) each requirement of the school dress code that the student is exempt from complying with;
  - (ii) the period of time for which each exemption has effect; and
  - (iii) the ground on which each exemption was given;
- (b) ensure that a parent of the student receives a copy of the record; and
- (c) ensure that each of the student's teachers is informed of the contents of the record.

”

**DOG ACT 1976***Municipality of the Shire of Northampton***DOG BY-LAWS**

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 16 June 1995 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws.

**Citation**

1. These By-laws may be cited as the Shire of Northampton Dog By-laws 1995.

**Interpretation**

2. (1) In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Act” means the Dog Act 1976.

“Authorised Person” means a person who is authorised under Section 29 of the Act.

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Northampton.

“District” means the Municipality of the Shire of Northampton.

“Environmental Health Officer” means the person for the time being employed as Environmental Health Officer by the Council.

“Fence” where used in the By-laws shall include walls and screen walls.

“Public Building” has the meaning given to it in Section 173 of the Health Act 1911.

“Public Place” includes a street, way and place which the public are allowed to use whether the street, way or place is or is not on private property.

“Public Reserve” has the meaning given to it in Section 6 of the Local Government Act 1960.

“Regulations” means the Dog Regulations, 1976.

“Shire Clerk” means the person for the time being employed as the Clerk of the Council.

“Street” includes the highway, road, lane, thoroughfare, carriageway or similar place, or part thereof, which is within the Municipality, which the public are allowed to use and includes every part of the highway, road, lane, thoroughfare, or similar place and other things including the street verge, footpath, bridges and culverts appurtenant to it.

2. (2) Words and expressions used in these By-laws have the same meanings respectively given to them in and for the purpose of the Act unless the context otherwise requires or unless it is so otherwise provided herein.

**Impounding of Dogs**

3. (1) Council may establish and maintain such pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Act or these By-laws as it deems necessary.

3. (2) Charges in relation to the seizure and maintenance of a dog in accordance with Section 29 (4) of the Act, and fees payable in relation to a dog having been destroyed at the request of its owner are specified in the First Schedule attached hereto.

3. (3) The pound or pounds maintained by Council for the detention of dogs seized shall be attended by an authorised person at such times and on such days as determined from time to time by Council.

3. (4) A person liable for the control of a dog, as defined in Section 3 (1) of the Act, is not excused from liability under the provisions of the Act, Regulations or these By-laws by virtue of the payment of fees or charges prescribed therein for the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog.

3. (5) A dog seized by an officer authorised by the Council may be placed in a pound.

3. (6) Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other officer authorised by the Council shall, in accordance with Section 29 (8) of the Dog Act, if the dog is wearing a registration tag, or the owner is otherwise readily identifiable, notify such person that the dog has been impounded in accordance with the requirements of the Act.

3. (7) If the owner or the person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of the dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then, subject to By-law 3. (8), upon payment of the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.

3. (8) Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of an authorised person the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. An authorised person may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or Council in respect of delivery of a dog in good faith.

**Dog Exercise Areas**

4. The lands specified in the Seventh Schedule of these By-laws are designated as dog exercise areas for the purpose of the Act. The exercising of dogs in dog exercise areas is subject to the provisions of the Act.

**Prohibited Places**

5. A person liable for the control of a dog, as provided for in Section 3 (1) of the Act, shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places, unless that person is blind or partially blind and is accompanied by a bona fide guide dog or is a guide dog trainer—

- (a) a public building;
- (b) a shop or other business premises, not being where dogs are sold or treated for illness or injury;
- (c) Chinamans Beach Kalbarri between the boat ramp and Chinamans Point;
- (d) Blue Holes Beach Kalbarri between 100 metres north of the carpark and 100 metres south of the carpark;
- (e) Red Bluff Beach between 200 metres north of the carpark and 200 metres south of the carpark;
- (f) Port Gregory Beach south of the jetty;
- (g) Horrocks Beach south of the boat ramp;
- (h) Northampton Town Park being Part Lot 27 Hampton Road Northampton;
- (i) Northampton Recreation Oval being part of Reserve 23432 Harvey Road Northampton;
- (j) Kings Park being Lots 8 & 9 of 198 Hampton Road Northampton.

**Fouling of Streets and Public Places and Reserves**

6. A person liable for the control of a dog who permits the dog to excrete on any street or other public place or public reserve or other land within the district without the consent of the occupier commits an offence unless the excreta is removed forthwith and disposed of either on private land with the consent of the occupier or in such other manner as the Council approves.

**Fencing Requirements**

7. (1) The owner or occupier of premises within the district on which a dog is kept shall—

- (a) ensure that the means exist on the premises for effectively confining the dog within the premises; and
- (b) cause the portion of the premises on which the dog is kept to be fenced in a manner capable of confining the dog to that portion in accordance with the provisions of this by-law.

7. (2) Every part of a fence used to confine a dog shall be of a type, height and construction which, having regard to the breed, age, size and physical condition of the dog, shall be capable of preventing the dog, at all times, from passing over, under or through it.

7. (3) Where a gate forms part of a fence, the gate shall—

- (a) be kept closed at all times when the dog is kept on the premises;
- (b) be fitted with an effective self-closing mechanism;
- (c) be fitted with an effective self-latching mechanism attached to the inside of the gate;
- (d) be fitted with a mechanism which enables the gate to be locked.

**Maximum Number of Dogs**

8. The owner or occupier of premises situated within the district shall not, unless the premises have been granted exemption pursuant to Section 26 (3) of the Act, keep or permit to be kept on those premises more than two dogs over the age of three months.

**Application for Kennel Establishment Licence**

9. (1) An application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule and shall be accompanied by—

- (a) a plan showing the details and specifications of all kennels and yards appurtenant thereto and showing the distances from the kennels to the boundaries of the land the subject of the application and all buildings on the land;
- (b) such other information as the Council in any case requires.

9. (2) A person seeking the issue of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall—

- (a) give notice of the proposed use of the land in writing to the owners and occupiers of all adjoining land and premises;
- (b) advertise the intention to do so in a newspaper having circulation in the area at least 30 days before application is made to Council.

9. (3) The letter of notification and the advertisement required in By-law 9. (2) shall specify that any submissions regarding the application for the establishment of kennels are to be lodged with the Shire Clerk within 30 days of the date of the letter or the advertisement.
9. (4) Council may not approve or register a kennel until it has considered any objection to the establishment, operation and maintenance of the kennel upon the premises.
9. (5) A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in the form of the Fourth Schedule.
9. (6) The fees payable for the initial application, registration and renewal of a licence are specified in the First Schedule.
9. (7) A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall remain valid for a period of 12 months from the date of issue thereof.
9. (8) A person seeking the renewal of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall make application to the Council in the form of the Third Schedule.
9. (9) Council shall not permit the establishment or maintenance of a kennel which would adversely affect the environment, be a nuisance to other residents, or be detrimental or prejudicial in any way.
9. (10) A licence for an approved kennel establishment, once issued, is not transferable.

### **Construction of Kennels**

10. The occupier of premises licensed as an approved kennel establishment shall ensure that the dogs in the establishment are kept in kennels and yards appropriate to the breed or kind in question and in accordance with the following requirements—

- (a) each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto which is capable of retaining the dog within its confines;
- (b) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 20 metres from any boundary of the land the subject of the licence;
- (c) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 20 metres from any other building;
- (d) the internal and external walls of each kennel shall be of concrete, brick, stone, or other material approved by Council;
- (e) the roof of each kennel shall be constructed of impervious material;
- (f) the lowest internal height of the kennel shall be at least two metres from the floor;
- (g) all painted external surfaces of the kennel shall be kept in good condition and well painted;
- (h) all gates shall be provided and fitted with proper catches or other means of securing or fastening such gate;
- (i) each yard for a kennel shall be securely fenced with a fence not less than two metres in height constructed of material approved by Council;
- (j) the upper surface of a kennel floor shall be at least 100mm above the finished surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a surface having a fall of not less than 1:100 to a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped in accordance with Council requirements;
- (k) all floor washings shall pass through the drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the requirements of the Health Act 1911;
- (l) the floor area of each kennel shall be not less than 2.5 square metres for every dog over the age of three months kept therein;
- (m) the yard of any kennel or group of kennels shall be not less than twice the area of the kennel or group of kennels;
- (n) all kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition and shall be cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by the authorised person or Environmental Health Officer;
- (o) every approved kennel establishment shall be provided with reticulated water in the form of a supported stand pipe and hose for the hosing down of kennels and yards.

### **Duties of the Licence Holder**

11. The holder of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall—

- (a) maintain the establishment in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition;
- (b) dispose of all refuse, faeces and food waste daily in a manner approved by the Environmental Health Officer;
- (c) take all practical measures for the destruction of fleas, flies and other vermin.

**Penalties**

12. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of these By-laws is, upon conviction, liable to a penalty not exceeding \$200 for each offence.

**Modified Penalties**

13. (1) The offences described in the table set out in the Second Schedule are prescribed pursuant to Section 45A of the Act as offences in relation to which a modified penalty applies and the amount appearing in that table directly opposite an offence is the prescribed modified penalty payable in respect of that offence if dealt with pursuant to this sub-by-law.

13. (2) Where an authorised person has reason to believe that a person has committed an offence of the kind described in the Second Schedule a notice may be served on that person in the form contained in the Fifth Schedule, in this by-law referred to as "an Infringement Notice", informing that person that if the person does not wish to have a complaint of the alleged offence heard and determined by a court the person may pay to Council, within the time therein specified, the amount prescribed as a modified penalty.

13. (3) An infringement notice may be served on an alleged offender personally or by posting it to that persons address as ascertained from the person at the time of or immediately following the occurrence giving rise to the allegation of the offence or as recorded by Council pursuant to the Act.

13. (4) Where a person who receives an Infringement Notice fails to pay the prescribed penalty within the time specified as allowed by Council the person is deemed to have declined to have the allegation dealt with by way of a modified penalty.

13. (5) An alleged offender on whom an Infringement Notice has been served may, within the time specified in the Notice or within any further time as in any particular case is allowed by Council, send or deliver to the Council the amount of the prescribed penalty, with or without a reply as to the circumstances giving rise to the allegation, and the Council may thereupon—

- (a) appropriate that amount in satisfaction of the penalty and issue an acknowledgment; or
- (b) withdraw the Infringement Notice and refund the amount so paid.

13. (6) An Infringement Notice may, whether or not the prescribed penalty has been paid, be withdrawn by the Council by sending Notice in the form contained in the Sixth Schedule to the alleged offender at the address specified in the Notice to the persons last known place of residence or business and in that event any amount received by way of modified penalty shall be refunded and any acknowledgment of the receipt of that amount shall for the purpose of any proceedings in respect of the alleged offence be deemed not to have been issued.

13. (7) Where a person does not contest an allegation that the person committed an offence of the kind to which this by-law applies, the production of an acknowledgment from the Council that the modified penalty has been paid to the Council is a defence to a charge of the offence in respect of which the modified penalty was paid.

**Citation**

1. This By-law may be cited as the *Town of Narrogin By-law Relating to the Keeping of Bees*.

**Interpretation**

2. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—

“the Act” means the Local Government Act 1960

“the Council” means the Council of the Town of Narrogin

“Municipality” means the Municipality of the Town of Narrogin.

**Prohibited Activities**

3. Subject to clause 4 no person shall keep bees on any land within the Municipality without first having obtained written permission of the Council;
4. No more than two hives of bees may be kept on any land zoned for residential purposes within the Municipality;
5. If, in the opinion of Council a nuisance arises because of the keeping of bees, the Council may withdraw permission by service of a notice. The keeping of bees seven (7) days after permission has been withdrawn by service of a notice, shall be deemed to constitute an offence.

**Penalties**

6. Any person failing to do any act directed to be done or by doing any act forbidden to be done by this By-law, or any notice issued under this By-law, commits an offence and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty commensurate with the Act, Section 190(7)(d)(i) and (ii).

**BY-LAWS RELATING TO SWIMMING POOLS**

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 17th day of April, 1996, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws.

**Interpretation**

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires—
  - “Article” includes money.
  - “Attendant” means an employee of the Council performing any duties on or in connection with the Pool premises.
  - “Council” means the Council of the Shire of Carnamah.
  - “Pool Manager” means the Manager or other person appointed for the time being by the Council to have the control and management of the Pool premises shall include the assistant Manager.
  - “Pool Premises” means the places or premises provided for the purpose of swimming by the public in water specifically provided and known as the Carnamah Swimming Pool and Eneabba Swimming Pool and includes any changerooms or toilets appurtenant thereto.
  - “Shire Clerk” means the Shire Clerk or Acting Shire Clerk of the Shire of Carnamah.

**Use and Control of Pool Premises**

2. The Pool premises shall be open for use of the public during such hours and periods as the Council may from time to time by resolution appoint, the Council reserving to itself the right to refuse admission to any person at any time.
3. The Pool premises or any part thereof may at any time at the direction of the Council be set aside for the use of certain persons to the exclusion of others.

4. The Pool Manager may temporarily suspend admittance to or clear the Pool premises or any part thereof of any person or persons if in his opinion such action is necessary or desirable.
5. No person, other than an officer, employee or invitee of the Council, shall enter the Pool premises without first having paid to an Attendant the prescribed charge or produced to an Attendant a valid period ticket.
6. No person using the Pool premises shall fail to comply with any direction of the Pool Manager given in relation to such use.
7. No person shall obstruct the Pool Manager in his control of the Pool Premises and of persons therein.
8. The Pool Manager shall refuse admission to or remove or cause to be removed from the Pool Premises any person who, in the opinion of the Pool Manager, is guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws or who, by his past or present conduct, is deemed by the Pool Manager to be undesirable and any such person shall, upon the request of the Pool Manager, forthwith withdraw from the Pool Premises.
9. Any person who has been refused admission to the Pool Premises or who is aggrieved by any action of the Pool Manager may appeal to the Council by letter addressed to the Shire Clerk against such action and the Council may give such direction in the matter as it thinks fit.
10. No person shall enter or depart from any part of the Pool Premises except by means of the respective entrances or exits set apart for such purposes.
11. No male above the age of four years shall enter any part of the Pool Premises set apart for the exclusive use of females and no female above the age of four years shall enter upon any part of the Pool Premises set apart for the exclusive use of the males.
12. No person shall enter or attempt to enter any toilet cubicle on the Pool Premises that is already occupied.
13. No person shall dress or undress on the Pool Premises except in a changeroom provided for that purpose.
14. No person shall be in the Pool Premises unless properly attired in a costume so as to preserve public decency. Any person who in the opinion of the Pool Manager is not properly attired may be directed by the Pool Manager to forthwith withdraw from the Pool Premises.
15. No person shall enter or be in the Pool premises while in an intoxicated condition.
16. No person shall bring alcohol into the Pool Premises or consume alcohol in the Pool Premises, except with the written approval the Council.
17. No person affected or appearing to the Pool Manager to be affected or suffering from any infectious, contagious or offensive disease or skin complaint shall enter any changeroom or enter or remain in any pool on the Pool Premises.
18. No person shall deposit any filth or rubbish on the Pool Premises except in a rubbish receptacle provided for that purpose.
19. No person shall consume any food, drink or confectionery in or within two metres of the edge of any Pool on the Pool Premises.
20. No person shall smoke tobacco or any other substance in or within two metres of the edge of any pool on the Pool Premises.
21. No person shall disfigure or write upon any part of the Pool Premises.
22. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly or riotous manner or use indecent, obscene or abusive language or gamble on the Pool Premises.
23. No person shall climb up or onto any fence, wall, partition or roof of the Pool Premises.
24. No person shall wastefully use fresh water in the Pool Premises.
25. No person shall expectorate in the Pool Premises or commit any nuisance therein.
26. No person shall damage, interfere with or use improperly any part of the Pool Premises or the furniture or fittings therein.
27. No person shall in any way annoy or interfere with any other person in the Pool Premises.
28. No person shall cause or permit any dog other than a registered guide dog or other animal to enter or remain in any part of the Pool Premises.
29. No person shall approach or enter any pool on the Pool Premises without first having thoroughly cleansed and washed himself in one of the showers provided and the Pool Manager may direct a person not to approach, enter or remain in any pool if in his opinion that person is dirty or unfit to use a pool.
30. No person shall—
  - (a) use soap in any part of the Pool Premises other than in the shower baths or toilet facilities;
  - (b) use any detergent, oil or other substance in any pool in the Pool Premises if the substance may discolour, contaminate or render turbid the water therein or if in the opinion of the Pool Manager the substance is unfit for use in such pool;

- (c) foul or pollute the water in any shower or pool on the Pool Premises;
- (d) bring into or place on any part of the Pool Premises any chemical substance, liquid or powder;
- (e) wilfully or negligently break, injure, damage, destroy or tamper with any equipment, or other property of the Council on the Pool Premises.

**Coaching**

31. (a) No person shall for profit teach, coach or train any other person in any pool on the Pool Premises without the prior written permission of the Council.
- (b) The Council may grant such permission subject to conditions and may at any time withdraw such permission.

**Depositing of Articles and Lost Property**

32. A person may deposit with the Pool Manager or an Attendant any article for safe keeping subject to the following terms and conditions and any person making such a deposit shall be deemed to agree that such conditions shall be applicable thereto—

- (a) Should any article deposited be damaged, destroyed, lost or stolen, neither the Council nor its officers shall be in any way liable for any such damage, destruction, loss or theft, howsoever occurring.
  - (b) Should any article deposited not be reclaimed within three months from the date of the deposit, the Council or a person duly authorised in that behalf by the Council may sell or otherwise dispose of the article and shall be under no liability to the owner or depositor thereof by reason of such sale or disposal and may apply the proceeds of any sale as the Council sees fit.
33. (a) The Pool Manager shall keep a Lost Property Register.
- (b) Any person who finds any article which has been left in the Pool Premises shall forthwith deliver it to the Pool Manager or Attendant.
- (c) Upon receipt of such an article, the Pool Manager or Attendant shall forthwith take charge thereof and enter or cause to be entered in the Lost Property Register a description of the article together with the time and date of its receipt and the name of the finder.
- (d) Upon receiving satisfactory proof of ownership of any such article from a person, the Pool Manager or Attendant may deliver the article to that person and upon delivery that person shall by way of acknowledging receipt of the article sign his name and enter his residential address in the Lost Property Register.

34. Neither the Council nor any officer or employee of the Council shall be in any way responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person in the Pool Premises or for any article damaged or destroyed in or about the Pool Premises.

**Fees**

35. The Council shall by resolution prescribe from time to time the charges to be imposed for admission to, use of, and services rendered in connection with the Pool Premises.

**Penalty**

36. A person who breaches or fails to comply with any provisions of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable upon conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction to a penalty not exceeding five hundred dollars.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960***The Municipality of the Shire of Quairading***BY-LAWS RELATING TO MANAGEMENT OF THE QUAIRADING DISTRICT  
MEMORIAL SWIMMING POOL**

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 21st day of December 1995 to revoke the following by-laws and amendments thereto—

By-law for the management of the Quairading District Swimming Pool published in the *Government Gazette* 24/11/1958;

Amendment to By-law published in the *Government Gazette* 3/7/1963;

and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

1. In these by-laws, subject to the context—

“Council” means the Quairading Shire Council.

“Manager” means the Manager of the Quairading District Memorial Swimming Pool appointed for the time being by the Quairading Shire Council or other authorised persons having control of the pool and pool premises.

“Pool” means the Quairading District Memorial Swimming Pool and all land, structures and buildings pertaining thereto.

**Hours of Admission**

2. The pool shall be open for public use for such periods and at such times as the Council may in its absolute discretion from time to time decide, and such periods and such times shall be clearly indicated upon a notice board at the entrance to the said pool.

**Admission**

3. A. No person shall, without the express permission of the Council or the Manager, enter the pool except through the authorised constructed entrance and upon payment of the appropriate admission charge.

B. No child under 7 years of age shall be admitted to the pool premises unless accompanied and supervised by a responsible person at all times.

All children who have not achieved Stage 4 in the Education Swimming Program or equivalent are classed as non swimmers and therefore must not use the main pool unless they are supervised and accompanied in the water by a responsible person at all times whilst in the main pool.

The person deemed to be responsible will be determined by the Manager.

4. All persons wishing to obtain a season admission pass granting admission to the pool for any one stipulated season may obtain such pass on application to the Manager upon payment of the appropriate fee. The season pass shall be offered for inspection to the Manager when used to obtain admission to the pool. Season passes are not transferable and such a ticket may be used only by the person in whose name the same is issued. A list of all current season pass holders shall be kept at the pool and the Manager shall refuse admission to any person seeking entry by using any such pass if the Manager reasonably believes that the person so seeking admission is not the person to whom such a pass was issued.

**Charges for Admission**

5. Fees and charges for admission to and use of the pool as provided for in these By-laws may be fixed from time to time by the Council.

**Costume**

6. All persons shall appear in public on the pool premises sufficiently clad to preserve decency and current public health standards.

7. No person shall dress or undress into or from their bathing costume except in the changerooms or enclosure provided.

8. Should any person appear in public in such a condition as to be in the opinion of the Manager, indecently or unsuitably clad for swimming, the Manager shall direct the person to take appropriate measures to be attired in a more suitable bathing costume.

**Offences**

9. No person shall enter the pool whilst in an intoxicated condition and whether such condition is induced by liquor, drugs or otherwise, and no person shall bring on to the pool premises any spirits, drugs, or intoxicating liquors.

10. No person shall use any soap in any part of the pool premises other than in the shower recesses/wash basins provided.

11. No person shall in any part of the pool premises behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly, riotous or indecent manner, swear or use any indecent, obscene, offensive or abusive language or gamble.

12. No person shall climb up to or onto any portion of the roof, fences, walls, partitions or other portion of the pool premises.

13. No person shall in the changerooms or elsewhere in the pool premises, wastefully use the water or leave any taps running.
14. No person shall spit in the pool or on the concourse or any other part of the pool premises or in any way commit any nuisance on or in any part of such premises.
15. No person whilst in the pool shall use any substance or preparation whereby the water thereof may become discoloured or rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers.
16. No person shall take foodstuffs or drinks into the changerooms.
17. No person shall foul or pollute the water in any shower, bath or in the pool, or soil, defile, damage, injure, destroy, use improperly, disfigure or write in or upon any changerooms, closet or compartments or other part of the pool premises or any furniture or other item of equipment.
18. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently injure or improperly use or interfere with any taps, locks, valves, lockers or other fittings or appliances in or about the pool.
19. No person shall deposit litter of any description on or in or about the pool.
20. No person being the owner of any dog or animal, excluding persons who are blind or partially blind, or deaf or partially deaf, and trainers accompanied by a genuine 'guide dog' or hearing dog, shall cause or allow such dog or animal to enter the pool.
21. No male person shall enter any portion of the pool premises set apart exclusively for females and no females shall enter any portion of the pool premises set apart exclusively for males, nor shall any person enter or attempt to enter any changeroom or other compartment which is already occupied without the consent of the occupier.
22. No person shall smoke tobacco products in the pool premises or the pool surrounds.
23. No person upon the pool premises, shall in any way interfere with any other person, nor throw, push nor attempt to throw or push any person into the pool, or throw any stones, sticks or any other matter or item, to the annoyance of any other person using the pool.
24. No person or group of persons shall play any ball games or take any action whatsoever which shall in any way limit the enjoyment of other users of the pool at such time or times as the pool premises shall be in general public use; provided that this clause shall not apply to the playing of any games or aquatic sports specially organised and conducted on the pool premises by any club or person at such time or times as shall be approved by the Manager or Council.
25. A. No person shall whilst suffering from any infectious skin ailment or contagious disease, or whilst in an unclean condition, enter or use or attempt to enter or use the pool or the pool premises.  
B. No person shall enter the pool whilst in an unclean condition without first using the cleansing shower provided on the premises in which the use of soap is permitted.

#### **Valuables**

26. Persons entering the pool premises may deposit valuables with the Manager but under no circumstances whatever will Council or its employees accept liability should such valuables or any of them be lost, stolen, damaged or otherwise interfered with whilst in the custody of the Manager.
27. Every person using the pool premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Manager.
28. No person shall in any way obstruct, interfere or hinder the Manager in his performances of his duties to maintain control of the pool.

#### **Lost Property**

29. A. Every person finding in the pool any article which may have been left or lost therein shall immediately deliver the same to the Manager who shall thereupon register a description of such article and all particulars relating thereto in a book which shall be kept for that purpose and any person claiming any such article and who satisfies the Pool Manager that he or she is the lawful owner of the lost article shall have such article returned upon signing for same in the lost property book.  
B. The Manager shall report to the Shire Clerk upon his or her request regarding lost property and produce the said book for inspection by the Shire Clerk.  
C. Council shall not under any circumstances incur any liability in respect of articles lost or left in the pool premises or stolen from any person whilst on the pool premises.  
D. All articles left in the pool and not claimed within a period of two months, after the pool season closure, shall be disposed of by the Council in any manner it thinks proper.

#### **Carnivals**

30. A. Any person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival held at the pool premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during such carnival and shall be bound to ensure that there is no overcrowding and that no damage is done to the buildings or fencing or any other portion of the pool or the pool premises, and further, that these by-laws be strictly observed by all competitors, officials, and spectators attending such carnival.

B. At all swimming carnivals held at the pool the competitors shall wear proper and approved bathing costumes.

C. Every person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival shall pay to Council in respect to such carnival a sum to be fixed from time to time by Council.

#### **Coaching**

31. A. No person shall for reward or profit teach, coach or train any other person in the pool premises except with the consent in writing of Council.

B. Council may in its absolute discretion give such consent or apply such conditions as it deems fit and Council may at its absolute discretion at any time withdraw such consent or conditions.

#### **Enforcement of By-laws**

32. A. Any person offending against any of the provisions contained in these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$200.

B. A person who infringes any of the provisions of these by-laws or who commits any breach thereof may be summarily removed from the pool or the pool premises by the Manager or may be arrested by the Manager, and given into the custody of a police officer.

C. The Manager or other person for the time being in charge of the pool premises may refuse to admit any person who shall have been convicted of wilfully disobeying, infringing or breaching any of the provisions of these by-laws until such times as Council may decide that such person shall be admitted.

D. The Council may issue a written direction to the Manager that any person named in such direction shall not be admitted to the pool or to the pool premises and whilst such direction remains in force the Manager shall not admit such person to the pool or pool premises and such person shall not with knowledge that such direction is in force enter or attempt to enter the pool.
