“**Ord River area**” means the area bounded by a line starting from the intersection of Victoria Highway and Ivanhoe Road, then heading in a generally north north-westerly direction along Research Station Road to its intersection with Stock Route Road, then in a generally easterly direction following Stock Route Road to its intersection with Weaber Plains Road, along Weaber Plains Road in a generally northerly direction to its intersection with Carlton Hill Station Road, then in a generally west north-westerly direction along Carlton Hill Station Road to the Carlton Hill Station homestead, then in the direction of 281° for 9.5 kilometres to the Old Dip Yard, then in a generally northerly direction following the eastern boundary fence of the No. 7 Bore paddock for 14.4 kilometres to where the fence abuts the Onslow Hills, then due north for 7.2 kilometres, then due west for 5.3 kilometres to the point where the northern boundary fence of Buffalo Tank paddock abuts the Onslow Hills, then generally westerly and north westerly along the northern boundary fence of Buffalo Tank paddock for 15 kilometres to the point where the fence ends in mud flats, then in the direction of 290° for 5 kilometres to Mount Connection, then from there along a straight line to the point where an east-west line passing through Scott Point on Adolphus Island intersects with the high water mark on the eastern side of the Ord River, then due west to the high water mark on the western side of the East Arm of Cambridge Gulf, then from there along a straight line to Limpet Hill, then due south for 20.5 kilometres to Wedge Hill, then in the direction of 130° for 10.7 kilometres to the western boundary fence of Goose Hill Station, then generally in a southerly direction along the western boundary fence of Goose Hill Station for 6.7 kilometres to Parry Creek, Kununurra Road, then in a generally north-easterly direction along the southern boundary fence of Goose Hill Station parallel to Parry Creek, Kununurra Road for 2 kilometres to the main access road gate for Goose Hill Station, then due south for 9.8 kilometres, then due east to Parry Creek, Kununurra Road, then along Parry Creek, Kununurra Road in a southerly direction to its intersection with the Victoria Highway, then from there to the starting point at the intersection of Victoria Highway and Ivanhoe Road;

“Ord River area waters” means any waters within the Ord River area.

Bag limit for barramundi in Ord River area

30G. For the purposes of section 50 of the Act, the bag limit in respect of barramundi taken from the Ord River area waters is one barramundi.

Possession limit for barramundi in Ord River area

30H. (1) For the purposes of section 51 (1) of the Act, the maximum quantity of barramundi that a person may be in possession of in the Ord River area, other than at the person’s principal place of residence, is one barramundi.

(2) Regulation 16 (2) and (3) apply for the purpose of determining the number of barramundi in a person’s possession.

Schedule 2 amended

Made by the Minister for Fisheries under section 10B of the Act.

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the *South Coast Herring Fishery Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme Notice 1997*.

Interpretation

2. In this Notice—

“herring” means the species *Arripis georgianus* commonly called Australian herring or herring;

“authorisation” means a fishing boat licence which is endorsed to authorise the holder to use a net to fish for herring in the South Coast Herring Fishery on a beach specified on that licence;

“committee” means the Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme Committee of Management established on 20 January 1997 under s. 11 of the Act;

“South Coast Herring Fishery” means the fishery comprised of those persons holding fishing boat licences which are endorsed to authorise the holder to use a net to fish for herring on specified beaches, between Hopetown and Augusta on the south coast of Western Australia;

“scheme” means the South Coast Herring Fishery Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme established in clause 3.

Establishment of Fisheries Adjustment Scheme

3. There is established a fisheries adjustment scheme in respect of the South Coast Herring Fishery to be known as the South Coast Herring Fishery Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme.

Objective

4. The objective of the scheme is to reduce the number of persons fishing in the fishery by reducing the number of authorisations to commercially fish for herring by use of nets on Drage's Beach on the south coast of Western Australia.

The fishery to which this scheme applies

5. The fishery to which this scheme applies is those persons holding fishing boat licences which are endorsed to authorise the holder to operate in the South Coast Herring Fishery.

Who may offer to surrender an authorisation

6. Any person who is the holder of an authorisation which entitles the holder to take herring from Drage's Beach is entitled to offer the surrender of the authorisation.

Manner of operation

7. The manner of operation of the scheme shall be—

- (a) invitations for offers to surrender authorisations shall be made in accordance with section 10C(4) of the Act;
- (b) any offer shall be submitted to the committee assisting the Minister in the administration of the scheme in the form approved by that committee;
- (c) the committee shall forward any offers to the Minister as soon as practicable after the close of the period within which an offer may be made;
- (d) the committee may advise the Minister whether to accept or decline any offer or to make a counter offer;
- (e) the Minister shall respond to any offer in accordance with section 10(5) of the Act after considering any advice of the committee.

Duration of scheme

8. This scheme shall operate for the period from the date of commencement of this notice until 30th June 1998.

Terms of the scheme

9. The terms of the scheme are that—

- (a) provided that the objective specified in clause 4 will be attained, compensation in an amount agreed between the Minister and the holder of an authorisation shall be paid for the surrender of an authorisation; and
- (b) a person who surrenders an authorisation as described in (a) shall retain any proprietary rights in the fishing boat and fishing gear to which the authorisation relates.

FINANCE BROKERS CONTROL ACT 1975

EXCEPTION UNDER SECTION 5(2)

I, Douglas James Shave MLA, Minister for Fair Trading and Minister for the time being responsible for the administration of the Finance Brokers Control Act 1975 (the 'Act') being satisfied that, apart from the provisions of the Act, adequate safeguards exist against loss to others by defalcation, hereby except each of the persons described in the Schedule (the 'Agent') from the definition of 'finance broker' for the purposes of the Act upon the following terms and conditions—

1. The exception shall apply only while the Agent continues to—
 - hold a licence and triennial certificate as a real estate and business agent under the *Real Estate and Business Agents Act 1978*;
 - be an agent of St. George Bank Limited ('the Bank') for the purpose of arranging mortgage loans secured over residential real estate property.
2. The exception is limited to—
 - the arranging of mortgage loans with the Bank; and
 - such mortgage loans being secured over real estate property listed for sale by the Agent or sold by the said agent as a conjunctional sale with another real estate agent.
3. No monies advanced by the Bank will be received by the Agent on behalf of a borrower.
4. The agent will not approve loans on behalf of the Bank.
5. The Agent will disclose to intending borrowers the amount of any commission payable to it by the Bank in relation to the borrowers loan.
6. The role of the Agent in arranging loans with the Bank is limited to publicising the products and services of the Bank and upon request of a prospective borrower introducing that person to the Bank.

"37 (1) In clause 37 the term "Event" means—

- (a) concert;
- (b) fete, market, gala or fair;
- (c) show, festival or exposition;
- (d) exhibition;
- (e) gymkhana;
- (f) circus;
- (g) animal obedience training classes or competition;
- (h) sporting fixture or athletics competition;
- (i) wedding; or
- (j) any other social gathering or occurrence taking place on a reserve and likely to involve the attendance of more than 30 people.

- (2) (a) Any person wishing to organise, arrange or hold an Event on a reserve must apply in writing to Council to enter into an agreement with the Council for hiring the reserve.
- (b) The Council may require such information in support of an application under clause 37(2)(a) as it thinks fit.
- (3) No person shall organise, arrange or hold an Event on a reserve unless that person has entered into an agreement with the Council for hiring the reserve, and then only in accordance with any conditions set out in the agreement.
- (4) An Event shall be prohibited if it—
- (a) involves the display or performance of—
- (i) lions, tigers, leopards, other great cats, elephants, bears, giraffes, monkeys or apes; or
- (ii) any other type of animal which, in the opinion of Council, is either dangerous or wild by nature;
- (b) otherwise, in the opinion of Council, would constitute a danger or nuisance to persons residing in the vicinity of the reserve or likely to resort to the reserve during the times when it is proposed to hold the Event.
- (5) An agreement for hiring a reserve shall be in a form prepared by the Council and may be subject to such conditions as the Council thinks fit, including payment of a hiring fee and a bond and the provision of an indemnity to the Town of Victoria Park.
- (6) If the Council is satisfied that a person who has entered into an agreement for hiring a reserve has breached or permitted or authorised the breach of any condition set out in the agreement or any other provision of the Local Laws, the Council may terminate the agreement by notice in writing to that person.
- 38 A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Local Laws commits an offence.
- Penalty:
- (a) \$5000.00; and
- (b) If the offence is of a continuing nature, \$500.00 in respect of each day or part of a day during which the offence continues.
- 39 It shall be lawful for any officer or servant of the Council or any member of the Police Force to remove from any park or public reserve—
- (a) any person suspected on reasonable grounds of having contravened or failed to comply with any of these Local Laws; and
- (b) any employee, servant or agent of a person suspected on reasonable grounds of having contravened or failed to comply with clause 37 of these Local Laws.”

The purpose of the Main Street Plaza Precinct is to permit the development of office and/or residential uses contingent upon the provision of an integrated car parking and landscaping facility.
- 1.2 For the purposes of this Schedule 'Land Owners' refers to any registered proprietor of land in the Main Street Plaza Precinct.

2. DEVELOPMENT

- 2.1 No development, except for maintenance of existing buildings, shall be approved by the Council until a Design Layout Plan and an Implementation Strategy for the Precinct has been adopted by the Council.
- 2.2 All development shall conform with the Design Layout Plan and the Implementation Strategy adopted by the Council for the Precinct.
- 2.3 For the purposes of Table 1—Zoning Table of the Scheme, the following shall apply—
 - (a) Single House, Grouped Dwelling, Multiple Dwelling, Offices, Consulting Rooms or Consulting Rooms : Group Practice—“P”;
 - (b) Medical Centre, Personal Services or Reception Centre—“AA”; and
 - (c) All other Use Classes—Not Permitted.

3. DESIGN LAYOUT PLAN

The Design Layout Plan shall specify the following—

- 3.1 The works required on public land (which may include but is not limited to, the number and location of parking bays, street lighting, street furniture, public utilities and landscaping);

- 3.2 The maximum development permitted on private land, including—
- (a) A maximum Plot Ratio for commercial uses = 1.0;
 - (b) A minimum Front Setback = 3.0m;
 - (c) A minimum Rear Setback = 8.4m (ground floor), 2.0m (first floor);
 - (d) A maximum Building Height = 2 storeys or 6.0m;
 - (e) A minimum On-Site Parking Ratio = 1 bay per 100m² of site area plus 1 bay per dwelling where considered appropriate by the Council; and
 - (f) An Advertising Signage Strategy for the whole Precinct.

4. IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

- 4.1 The Implementation Strategy shall address, to the satisfaction of the Council, the following—
- 4.1.1 An equitable method of funding, allocating and payment of the costs of all works required in implementing the Design Layout Plan to all landowners within the Precinct;
 - 4.1.2 The method of development, including any staging and timing of the works proposed under the Design Layout Plan; and
 - 4.1.3 Calculations of the costs of all works specified in the Design Layout Plan and shall clearly state the assumptions used to arrive at the cost calculations.
- 4.2 Once the Implementation Strategy is adopted, the Council shall periodically reassess it, and if necessary, adjust the costs of all works specified, at a minimum of every six months, without re-advertising them, but shall always make such adjustments including the assumptions used available for public inspection during normal business hours.
- 4.3 Where there is a dispute between the Council and any landowner in relation to the costs calculated for any item in the Implementation Strategy, the matter may be determined by Arbitration in the manner provided by the Commercial Arbitration Act 1985 prior to the payment of contributions required by the Implementation Strategy.
- 4.4 Where costs in the Implementation Strategy are determined by arbitration to be different from those calculated and adopted by the Council at any time, then the Council shall adjust the cost items of the Implementation Strategy so that they conform with such determinations made by arbitration.

5. PROCEDURE

5.1 Adoption of the Design Layout Plan and the Implementation Strategy

- 5.1.1 Prior to the adoption by the Council of the Design Layout Plan and the Implementation Strategy which shall cover the entire Precinct, the Council shall (if it resolves that the proposed Design Layout Plan or the Implementation Strategy may be considered appropriate in the circumstances) ensure that one or more (as determined by the Council) of the provisions specified hereunder are invoked—
- (a) One or more notices, not less than 1 metre by 1.5 metres each and readable from the street, explaining the proposed Design Layout Plan and the proposed Implementation Strategy, shall be displayed in a prominent position on the land for a period of not less than three weeks. The notice shall also state that comments may be lodged with the Council before a specified date, being not less than three weeks after the first display of the notice.
 - (b) All landowners within the Precinct shall be invited, by registered mail, to comment on the Design Layout Plan and the Implementation Strategy.
 - (c) The Council shall advertise or cause to be advertised in a newspaper circulating in the District, notice of its intention to consider the proposed Design Layout Plan and the proposed Implementation Strategy; the advertisement shall state that comments may be lodged with the Council before a specified date, being not less than three weeks after the first publication of the notice.
 - (d) The Council may use any other methods or media to ensure widespread notice of the proposal.
- 5.1.2 The Council shall after the date stated in the notices, consider all comments received on the proposed Design Layout Plan and the proposed Implementation Strategy and adopt, adopt with modifications or refuse the Design Layout Plan and the Implementation Strategy within 120 days.

5.2 Amendments

Amendments to the Design Layout Plan or the Implementation Strategy shall require approval of the Council. In considering an amendment to either the Design Layout Plan or the Implementation Strategy, the Council may require that such amendment be advertised for comment in accordance with the provisions of the abovementioned sub-clause 5.1.1.

6. APPEALS

- 6.1 If a landowner is dissatisfied with the Council's decision in regard to Clause 5.1.2, the landowner may appeal pursuant to Clause 1.6.1 of the Scheme.
- 6.2 If after the time period referred to in Clause 5.1.2 the Council has not made a decision, approval of the Design Layout Plan or the Implementation Strategy may be deemed refused for the purposes of giving the landowner a right of appeal pursuant to Clause 1.6.1 of the Scheme."

2. Inserting a new Clause 1.3.7 in Part 1 of the Scheme Text as follows—

"1.3.7 MAIN STREET PLAZA PRECINCT

No person shall carry out development within the Main Street Plaza Precinct except in accordance with Schedule 10 of the Scheme. Where any other provision of the Scheme is inconsistent with a provision of Schedule 10 of the Scheme, the provisions of Schedule 10 shall prevail."
