5.19 Heritage Conservation and Preservation

5.19.1 Purpose and Intent

The purpose and intent of the provisions in this clause is, with a view to securing the amenity of the Scheme Area, to provide for:

- (a) conservation of places of cultural heritage significance;
- (b) designation of conservation areas;
- (c) conservation of the natural beauties of an area, including places of the kind referred to in clause 11 of the First Schedule of the Act.
- (d) the preservation of particular trees, trees of a particular species, trees of a particular height or girth or both, or trees belonging to a particular group of trees which the Council considers ought to be preserved, and for the purpose of these provisions the word “trees” includes shrubs and other perennial plants of species specified in the decision or declaration of the Council.

5.19.2 Heritage List

- (a) The Council shall prepare and maintain a heritage list which list shall be drawn from the Council's Municipal Heritage Inventory which has been prepared pursuant to Section 45 of the Heritage of Western Australia Act 1990 (as amended);
- (b) The Council shall keep copies of the Municipal (Heritage) Inventory with the Scheme documents for public inspection during normal office hours.

5.19.3 Classification of Conservation Area

- (a) The Council may classify an area of land to be a conservation area where in the opinion of the Council special planning control is required for the purpose of the cultural heritage conservation of the whole or any part of the area or any place or thing within the area.
- (b) The boundaries of a conservation area classified pursuant to subclause 5.19.3 (a) and any subsequent modifications, shall be shown on the Scheme Map.
- (c) The Council shall adopt for each conservation area a policy statement which shall comprise:
 - (i) a map showing the exact boundaries of the area;
 - (ii) where appropriate a list of any of the specific places of cultural significance within the area;
 - (iii) a statement of the area's significance;
 - (iv) objectives for the conservation of the area; and
 - (v) where appropriate a statement of cultural significance and conservation objectives for any place of significance within a conservation area.
- (d) In dealing with any matters which may affect a conservation area, including any application for development approval, Council shall have regard to the policy statement adopted for the area pursuant to subclause (c).
- (e) The procedure for the Council's classification of a conservation area, adoption of a policy statement, amendment or rescission of a classification or of a policy statement, or any other matter referred to in the preceding subclauses shall be as follows:
 - (i) the Council shall notify in writing, the Heritage Council of Western Australia, and each owner of land affected by the proposal or use other method(s) to ensure widespread notice of the proposal;
 - (ii) the Council shall invite submissions to be made within a period of not less than 21 days from the date of notification under item (i);
 - (iii) the Council shall consider any submission made and resolve to adopt with or without amendments or reject the proposal after consideration of such submission; and
 - (iv) the Council shall forward its final adoption to the Commission, the Heritage Council of Western Australia, and each owner of land affected by the proposal or use other method(s) to ensure widespread notice of the adoption.

5.19.4 Application for Development Approval

Notwithstanding any other provisions of the Scheme to the contrary, the approval of the Council is required for the following development on or in relation to any place or object within the Municipal (Heritage) Inventory or a conservation area, or any tree on the Register of Trees:

- (a) the clearing, excavation or filling of any land;
- (b) the lopping, felling, removal, killing or causing of irreparable damage to any tree;
- (c) the erection of any fence;
- (d) the commencement or carrying out of any renovation, modification, refitting, decorating or demolition of any building; or
- (e) the alteration or removal of any building or object or part thereof.

5.19.5 Referral to Other Authorities

In considering any application that may affect a conservation area or individual entry in the Municipal (Heritage) Inventory, the Council shall, where such land the subject of the application is:

- (a) affected by resolution under Clause 32 of the Metropolitan Region Scheme;
- (b) a declared planning control area; and/or
- (c) reserved under the Metropolitan Region Scheme;

obtain the Western Australian Planning Commission's approval as required under the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

The Council may solicit the views of the Australian Heritage Commission, the Heritage Council of Western Australia and/or any other relevant body, and take those views into account when determining the application.

5.19.6 Heritage Assessment

Notwithstanding any existing assessment on record, Council may require a heritage assessment to be carried out prior to the determination of the application for Development Approval in respect of any development proposed in a conservation area or individual entry listed on the Municipal (Heritage) Inventory.

5.19.7 Formalities of Application

In addition to the application formalities prescribed in subclause 5.19.4 and any formalities or requirements associated with development applications contained in any other provision of the Scheme, the Council may require an applicant for development approval where the proposed development may affect a place of cultural heritage significance or a conservation area to provide one or more of the following to assist the Council in its determination of the application:

- (a) street elevations drawn to a scale not smaller than 1:100 showing the proposed development and the whole of the existing development on each lot immediately adjoining the land the subject of the application, and drawn as one continuous elevation;
- (b) side and rear elevations of the proposed development, drawn to a scale of not smaller than 1:100;
- (c) in addition to a site plan, a plan of the proposed development site showing existing and proposed ground levels over the whole of the land the subject of the application, and the location, type, and height of all existing structures and of all existing vegetation exceeding 2 metres in height or on the Register of Trees, and marking any existing structures and vegetation proposed to be removed; such plan shall be drawn to the same scale as the site plan.
- (d) an assessment of the cultural heritage significance of any existing buildings and the development site according to any policy guidelines adopted by the Council;
- (e) a detailed schedule of all finishes, including materials and colours of the proposed development, and unless the Council exempts the application from the requirement or any part of it, also the existing developments on the subject lot and on each lot immediately adjoining the subject lot; and
- (f) any other information which the Council indicates that it considers relevant.

5.19.8 Agreements
