## GAS CORPORATION ACT 1994

**GAS DISTRIBUTION ACCESS ORDER 1998**

Made by the Minister under section 93 (1) (b).

**Citation**

1. This order may be cited as the *Gas Distribution Access Order 1998*.

**Definitions**

2. In this order —

“**eligible person**” means an existing user or a prospective user;

“**threshold amount**” means —

- (a) for the period ending on 31 December 1999, 250 terajoules or more of gas;
- (b) for the period after 31 December 1999 and ending on 31 December 2001, 100 terajoules or more of gas;
- (c) for the period after 31 December 2001 and ending on 30 June 2002, 1 terajoule or more of gas.

**Operation of clause 2 (1) of Schedule 6 to the Act**

3. Until 30 June 2002, the corporation is to make available access under clause 2 (1) of Schedule 6 to the Act to the extent that —

- (a) the person to whom access is to be made available is an eligible person; and
- (b) the gas to be transported —
  - (i) is to be transported to a single metered connection to the gas distribution system; and
  - (ii) is to be for consumption on a site on which at least the threshold amount is to be consumed in a period of 12 consecutive months.

- (2) After 30 June 2002, the corporation is to make available access under clause 2 (1) of Schedule 6 to the Act to any eligible person.

**Revocation**

4. The *Gas Distribution Access Order 1996\** is revoked.

## EDUCATION ACT 1928

**EDUCATION AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1998**

Made by the Minister for Education.

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Education Amendment Regulations 1998*.

**Commencement**

2. These regulations come into operation on the later of the day on which they are published in the *Gazette* and the day on which the *Equal Opportunity Amendment Act (No. 3) 1997* (other than section 4) comes into operation.

**Regulation 246 amended**

3. Regulation 246 (5) of the *Education Regulations 1960\** is amended by deleting “, other than by the teacher attaining the retiring age,”.

The University of Western Australia Site By-laws

The University of Western Australia in pursuance of the University of Western Australia Act 1911, hereby makes the following amendments to the University of Western Australia Site By-laws for the purpose of regulating the terms and conditions which such lands may be visited or used, and the conduct of such persons when on or upon such lands.

The second schedule of the By-laws to read as follows—

## ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT 1986

**ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (ABRASIVE BLASTING)  
REGULATIONS 1998**

Made by the Governor in Executive Council on the recommendation of the Environmental Protection Authority.

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Environmental Protection (Abrasive Blasting) Regulations 1998*.

**Interpretation**

2. In these regulations —

“**abrasive blasting**” means cleaning or abrading the surface of an object using an abrasive material propelled by compressed air, water or steam or by a wheel;

“**aquatic environment**” means any watery environment including marine, estuarine and riverine environments;

“**blasting chamber**” means a fully enclosed structure in which abrasive blasting is carried on;

“**dry abrasive blasting**” means abrasive blasting during which no water is added to the abrasive material or the propellant;

“**operator**” means a person carrying on abrasive blasting;

“**waste material**” means used abrasive, abraded material, waste generated by cleaning an object prior to blasting, and any other waste products created during abrasive blasting, including waste collected in a dust extractor, settling pond or tank, or holding sump;

“**wet abrasive blasting**” means abrasive blasting during which water is added to the abrasive material or its propellant or is used as the propellant;

“**wet scrubber**” means a device in which water or other liquid is used to remove particulate matter from a gas stream.

(2) In these regulations a reference to abrasive blasting being carried on “**in the open**” is a reference to abrasive blasting being carried on other than in a blasting chamber.

### **Prohibition on the use of certain materials**

3. An operator must not use —

- (a) any material containing 2% or more free silica (crystalline silicon dioxide) in abrasive blasting; or
- (b) corrosion inhibitors containing chromate, nitrate or nitrite in wet abrasive blasting.

### **Blasting chambers to be used if possible**

4. An operator must carry on all abrasive blasting in a blasting chamber unless such a chamber cannot reasonably be used because of the size, shape, position or location of the object being blasted.

### **Blasting chambers**

5. An operator must ensure that a blasting chamber —

- (a) is completely sealed; or
- (b) is fitted with a mechanical ventilation and dust extraction system which is operating so that —
  - (i) no visible dust escapes from the blasting chamber;
  - (ii) all air from the blasting chamber passes through the ventilation and dust extraction system before being discharged into the environment; and
  - (iii) air discharged into the environment does not contain any visible dust or more than 50 milligrams of particulate matter per cubic metre.

(2) If the ventilation and dust extraction system for a blasting chamber includes a wet scrubber the operator must ensure that —

- (a) waste water from the scrubber is drained into, and contained in, settling tanks or ponds until all particulate matter has settled out; and
- (b) the settling ponds or tanks are emptied as often as necessary to ensure their efficient operation.

### **Abrasive blasting in the open**

6. An operator must not carry on abrasive blasting in the open unless it is carried on in such a manner that no visible dust escapes from the premises at which the blasting is carried on (or if there are no defined boundaries to the premises, no such dust escapes onto any place to which the public has access).

### **Abrasive blasting in or near aquatic environments**

7. (1) This regulation only applies to abrasive blasting operations which involve the use or removal of organotin or other heavy metal protective coatings.

(2) An operator must not carry on abrasive blasting in or near an aquatic environment unless the size, shape, position or location of the object being blasted makes it impracticable to move the object out of, or away from, that environment.

(3) An operator carrying on abrasive blasting in or near an aquatic environment must ensure that all water which may contain waste material is drained into, and contained in, an impervious holding sump until it is disposed of in accordance with regulation 8.

(4) An operator must ensure that —

- (a) any overflow from the holding sump will drain into a soakwell; and
- (b) the holding sump and soakwell are emptied as often as necessary to ensure their efficient operation.

**Waste disposal**

8. An operator must ensure that —
- (a) all waste material is cleaned up at the conclusion of each abrasive blasting operation;
  - (b) no waste material escapes from the premises at which the blasting is carried on (or if there are no defined boundaries to the premises, no waste material escapes onto any place to which the public has access); and
  - (c) all waste material is disposed of at an appropriate landfill site or waste treatment facility the occupier of which holds a licence under Part V of the Act in respect of that site or facility.

**Offences and penalties**

9. A person who contravenes any of these regulations commits an offence.

Penalty: \$200.

**Repeal**

10. The *Sandblasting Operations Regulations* are repealed.

## ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT 1986

**ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1998**

Made by the Governor in Executive Council on the recommendation of the Environmental Protection Authority.

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Environmental Protection Amendment Regulations 1998*.

**Commencement**

2. These regulations come into operation on the day on which the *Unleaded Petrol Repeal Act 1995\** comes into operation.

**Regulation 17 repealed and regulations substituted**

3. Regulation 17 of the *Environmental Protection Regulations 1987\** is repealed and the following regulations are substituted —

“

**Interpretation**

17. (1) In this Part —

“**ASTM**” followed by a designation refers to the test method having that designation that is published by the American Society for Testing and Materials in the “1995 Annual Book of ASTM Standards”;

“**IP**” followed by a designation refers to the test method having that designation that is published by the Institute of Petroleum in the “Standard Methods for Analysis and Testing of Petroleum and Related Products 1995”;

“**petrol**” means a liquid fuel or mixture of fuels of a kind used in internal combustion spark ignition engines but does not include aviation fuel;

“**unleaded petrol**” means petrol that contains —

- (a) not more than 0.013 grams of lead per litre; and
- (b) not more than 0.0013 grams of phosphorus per litre.

- (2) For the purposes of this Part the amount of lead in petrol is the amount —

- (a) determined in accordance with IP 352/84; and
- (b) corrected to 15 degrees Celsius.



(3) For the purposes of this Part the amount of phosphorous in petrol is the amount —

- (a) determined in accordance with ASTM D 3231 - 94; and
- (b) corrected to 15 degrees Celsius.

#### **Sale of petrol — offences**

**18.** (1) A person shall not sell petrol containing more than 0.20 grams of lead per litre.

Penalty: \$200.

(2) A person shall not sell as unleaded petrol any substance which is not unleaded petrol.

Penalty: \$200.

#### **Defences**

**19.** (1) In proceedings for an offence against regulation 18 (1) or (2) it is a defence for the person charged to prove that the petrol was sold for use —

- (a) in a vehicle participating in a racing event or contest at a place that is not a road; or
- (b) in a vehicle being tested at a place which is not a road.

(2) In proceedings for an offence against regulation 18 (1) it is a defence for the person charged to prove that —

- (a) the person purchased the petrol with a warranty referred to in regulation 20 (1) (a); and
- (b) at the time of the alleged offence the petrol was in the same state as when it was purchased.

(3) In proceedings for an offence against regulation 18 (2) it is a defence for the person charged to prove that —

- (a) the person purchased the petrol with a warranty referred to in regulation 20 (1) (b); and
- (b) at the time of the alleged offence the petrol was in the same state as when it was purchased.

#### **Warranties**

**20.** (1) A person who purchases petrol for resale may demand from the vendor a warranty in writing that —

- (a) the lead content of the petrol does not exceed 0.20 grams per litre; or
- (b) the petrol is unleaded petrol.

(2) A vendor shall not —

- (a) fail or refuse to provide a warranty demanded under subregulation (1); or
- (b) provide a warranty under subregulation (1) that is false or misleading in any respect.

Penalty: \$200.
