LG401***BUSH FIRES ACT 1954**

(Section 33)

SHIRE OF GINGIN

NOTICE TO OWNERS AND OCCUPIERS OF LAND IN THE SHIRE OF GINGIN

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the Second (2nd) day of November 1998, and thereafter up to and including the Fifteenth (15th) day of May 1999, to have undertaken fire control measures as detailed below on all land owned or occupied by you.

CLEARING METHODS

Firebreaks and Fire Hazard Reduction Zones may be constructed by one or more of the following methods:

Ploughing, cultivating, burning, scarifying, chemical spraying, slashing/mowing, or other Council approved method.

TOWNSITES

While certain boundary firebreaks are not now required, the following action needs to be taken:

Where the area of land is less than 2023 m² (½ acre), reduce all flammable material, except live standing trees, from the whole of the land by the Second (2nd) day of November 1998, by one of the methods mentioned above, to the satisfaction of the Local Authority.

Where the area of land is in excess of 2023 m² (½ acre) clear firebreaks of not less than 2.5 metres wide inside all external boundaries and vertically clear so as to allow vehicle access around the perimeter of each individual lot.

RURAL RESIDENTIAL ZONES and RURAL INDUSTRIAL ZONES

Firebreaks, not less than 2.5 metres wide, are required inside all external boundaries and 3.5 metres wide around any buildings. Firebreaks are to be maintained vertically clear so as to allow emergency vehicle access at all times. Where a lot boundary adjoins a farming property, a firebreak 3.5 metres wide is required. Common fence lines are to be constructed predominantly of non flammable material and kept free of scrub re-growth. All grasses not currently under cultivation or grazed by stock shall be reduced to a maximum height of 100 millimetres. Owners of unoccupied lots are to ensure there is a further 5 metre *fire hazard reduction zone* immediately inside the external firebreak.

RURAL CONSERVATION and RURAL LIVING ZONES

Firebreaks, not less than 2.5 metres wide and vertically clear, shall be provided inside all external boundaries and 3.5 metres wide around all buildings. Where a boundary adjoins a rural zone a firebreak not less than 3.5 metres wide shall be installed immediately inside that boundary. Boundaries which carry through areas of high conservation value remnant vegetation, may require firebreaks of lesser width. Grasses not currently under cultivation or grazed by stock shall be reduced to parcels not exceeding five hectares and divided by *fire hazard reduction zones* of not less than 5 metres in width.

RURAL AREAS

Firebreaks, not less than 3.5 metres wide and vertically clear, so as to allow vehicle access on the firebreak, shall be provided immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and immediately surrounding all erected buildings. If there is any land on which bush has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether it is intended to burn the bush or not), firebreaks not less than 20 metres wide are required immediately surrounding the bush.

TREE PLANTATIONS

On properties where there are tree plantations consisting of 3 hectares or more, but less than 10 hectares of trees, planted in one grouping, clear firebreaks not less than 10 metres wide immediately around the external perimeter of the plantation are required. All other external boundaries of the land must conform to the general rural firebreak requirement. Plantations greater than 10 hectares must conform to the Bush Fire Service 1997/98 guidelines, as modified where necessary by Council's appointed officers.

FUEL DEPOTS

Firebreaks not less than 3.5 metres wide shall be provided so as to completely surround the perimeter of land occupied by drums used for the storage of flammable liquids, whether the drums contain flammable liquid or not, including any land on which ramps for holding the drums are constructed.

ALTERNATE ALIGNMENTS

In some instances, e.g. rocky outcrops or watercourses, construction of firebreaks to the aforementioned specifications may not be viable. Variations to the specifications of firebreaks must be approved, in consultation with a Council appointed officer, on or before 2nd November 1998.

BARBECUES AND INCINERATORS

Gas or electric barbecues are permitted at any time. Solid fuel barbecues and incinerators are prohibited on days of VERY HIGH or EXTREME fire danger. Your Local Fire Control Officer is the person to give advice for your area if you are in doubt.

GARDEN REFUSE

Garden refuse up to 1 cubic metre can be burnt during restricted periods, other than on days of Very High or Extreme fire danger and/or when a Total Fire Ban is in place, where there is a 5 metre clearance from buildings, trees or flammable material to any point of the fire. Such refuse burns can only be carried out between 6.00 pm and 11.00 pm and all flame must be extinguished by midnight of the same day. It is requested that you notify your local Fire Control Officer of your intention to burn.

PROHIBITED AND RESTRICTED BURNING PERIODS

A Permit to Burn can only be obtained from a Shire of Gingin Fire Control Officer. A Permit to Burn is subject to all the conditions attached to that permit, *including notification to neighbours and relevant authorities*. Permits are not valid on days of Very High or Extreme fire danger, as issued by the Weather Bureau, nor on Sundays or Public Holidays.

VOLUNTEERS

Fire fighting in the Shire of Gingin is undertaken almost entirely by volunteers. If you wish to join your local brigade your assistance will be welcome. Volunteers come from many walks of life and those unable to be fire fighters can still assist with communications, or welfare support, or in many of the back-up roles which allow others to stay at the fire front.

Volunteers, including Fire Control Officers, provide a much relied upon service to the community. Please comply with any reasonable requests they make of you.

PENALTIES

As well as infringement penalties of \$80.00 and \$100.00, severe penalties apply to offences against the Bush Fires Act. They include fines from \$400.00 to \$250,000.00 and/or jail terms up to five years should an offender appear in Court.

HARVEST BANS / MOVEMENT OF VEHICLES

A total ban on the movement of vehicles, in paddocks will apply when the atmospheric temperature reaches thirty six degrees Celsius (36° C) or higher. If you are in any doubt, please contact your nearest Fire Control Officer, or the Shire Office, prior to commencing any harvesting or movement of vehicles in paddocks.

Notice to All Owners and/or Occupiers of Land situated in the Shire of Mundaring

FIREBREAKS

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are hereby required to clear of inflammable material firebreaks not less than 3 metres in width in the following positions on all land owned or occupied by you and situated within the Shire of Mundaring—

1. Immediately inside all external boundaries of the said land.
2. Immediately surrounding all buildings erected on the said land.

Such firebreaks may be constructed by one or more of the following methods:

Ploughing, cultivating, scarifying, burning, chemical spraying or other approved method; and are to be cleared to the satisfaction of the Shire's Ranger Service. In addition you may be required to carry out further works which may be deemed necessary by the Shire's Ranger Service and specified by way of a separate written notice forwarded to the address as shown on the Shire of Mundaring rates records for the land.

In some instances naturally occurring features such as rocky outcrops, natural water courses or landscaping such as reticulated gardens, lawns or driveways may be an acceptable substitute for cleared firebreaks. This option must first be discussed with and approved by the Shire's Ranger Service.

All firebreaks as designated above must be prepared on or before the 30th day of November 1998 (or within 14 days of you becoming the owner or occupier should this be after that date) and maintained clear of inflammable material up to and including the 14th day of March 1999.

Take notice that pursuant to Clause 33(4) of the Bush Fires Act, where the owner or occupier of land who has received notice fails or neglects to comply with the requisitions of the notice within the time specified, the Shire of Mundaring may, by its officers and with such servants, workmen and contractors, vehicles and machinery as the officers deem fit, enter upon the land and carry out the requisitions of the notice which have not been complied with and pursuant to Clause 33(5) of the Bush Fires Act the amount of any costs and expenses incurred may be recovered from you as the owner or occupier of the land.

APPLICATION TO VARY THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason whatsoever to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council of the Shire of Mundaring or its duly authorised officers not later than the 15th day of November 1998 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officers, you must comply with the requirements of this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine not exceeding \$1000.00 and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not to pay the costs of performing the work directed by this notice if it is not carried out by the owner and/or occupier by the date required by this notice.

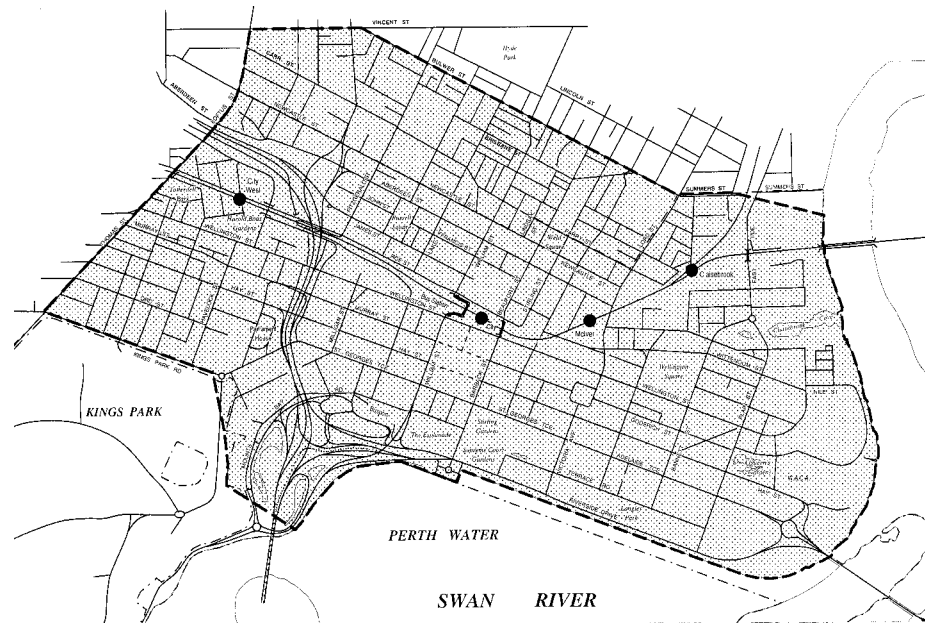
