LG301**LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995***City of Rockingham***PARKING LOCAL LAW 1995 AMENDMENT**

Under the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1995 and by all other powers, the Council of the City of Rockingham resolved to amend the Parking Local Law 1995 on the 25th day of May 1999, as follows—

deletion of the following words in clause 4(2)

“other than a parking facility or parking station which—

- (a) is neither owned, controlled nor occupied by the municipality; or
- (b) although owned by the municipality, is leased to another person.”

and the following words substituted

“If—

- (a) the parking station(s) and/or parking facility(ies) are either owned, controlled or occupied by the municipality; or
- (b) the parking station(s) and/or parking facility(ies) are owned by the municipality, are leased to another person and that person consents in writing to their use as such; or
- (c) the parking station(s) and/or parking facility(ies) are privately owned and the owner or occupier consents in writing to their use as such.”
