Supreme Court Act 1935

### Supreme Court Amendment Rules (No. 5) 1999

Made by the Judges of the Supreme Court.

**1. Citation**

These rules may be cited as the *Supreme Court Amendment Rules (No. 5) 1999*.

**2. The rules amended**

The amendments in these rules are to the *Rules of the Supreme Court 1971\** unless otherwise indicated.

*For amendments to 8 October 1999 see 1998 Index to Legislation of Western Australia, Table 4, p. 296-7, and Gazette 16 July 1999.]*

**3. Order 1 amended**

After Order 1 Rule 6 the following Rule is inserted —

“

**7. Electronic documents and communications**

(1) The Court may give directions to facilitate —

- (a) the preparation, filing, service and exchange of electronic documents relating to proceedings before the Court;
- (b) the preparation and issue of electronic documents by the Court; and
- (c) the conduct of proceedings before the Court by means of the electronic communication of written information between the Court and parties to the proceedings.

(2) The directions may be given —

- (a) by the Chief Justice in practice directions applicable to proceedings generally or to a particular class of proceeding; or

- (b) by a Judge or the Full Court in particular proceedings.
- (3) The directions may vary the operation of, or allow non-compliance with, these Rules.
- (4) A direction given under this Rule has effect as if it were part of these Rules.
- (5) Nothing done under such a direction shall be treated as an irregularity for the purposes of Order 2.

”.

#### 4. Order 81G amended

- (1) Order 81G Rule 1(2) is amended by deleting the definition of “Commission” and inserting instead —

“

**“Commission”** means the Australian Securities and Investments Commission established by the *Australian Securities and Investments Commission Act 1989* of the Commonwealth;

”.

- (2) Order 81G Rule 3 is amended by deleting “ASC Law” and inserting instead —

“ ASIC Law ”.

- (3) Order 81G Rule 4 is repealed and the following Rule inserted instead —

“

#### 4. Jurisdiction of Master

- (1) A Master may exercise any of the Court’s jurisdiction referred to in Rule 3 but may not hear and determine —
  - (a) an appeal referred to in Rule 29;
  - (b) a matter referred to in column 1 of Part 2 of the Seventh Schedule; or
  - (c) a complaint for an offence.
- (2) A Master, on his or her own motion or on an application by a party, may refer a matter within his or her jurisdiction for hearing and determination by a Judge if the Master is of the opinion that it should be heard and determined by a Judge.
- (3) A Judge, on his or her own motion or on an application by a party, may refer a matter referred under paragraph (2) or referred to in column 1 of Part 2 of the Seventh Schedule for hearing and determination by a Master with any directions the Judge thinks fit.

- (4) In exercising his or her jurisdiction under this Order, a Master may exercise any of the powers conferred on the Court or a Judge.
- (5) This Rule does not prevent a Judge from exercising the jurisdiction it confers on a Master.
- (6) The descriptions in column 2 of Part 2 of the Seventh Schedule are inserted for convenience only and do not affect the operation of this Order.

”.

- (4) Order 81G Rule 22(2) is amended by deleting “, 452(4)”.
- (5) Order 81G Rule 25(1) is amended by deleting the Table and inserting instead —

- (10) Part 7 of Order 81G is amended as follows:
- (a) in the heading to Part 7 by deleting “SECTION 260” and inserting instead —  
“ **SECTION 246AA** ”;
  - (b) in Rules 57(1), (6) and (7) by deleting “section 260” wherever appearing and in each place inserting instead —  
“ section 246AA ”;
  - (c) in Rule 57(2) by deleting “section 260(1)” and inserting instead —  
“ section 246AA(1) ”.
- (11) Order 81G Rule 73(c) is deleted.

- (12) Order 81G Rule 75(1) is repealed and the following paragraph is inserted instead —

“

- (1) Upon the filing of an application under this Part the applicant may file a consent to be appointed liquidator signed by an official liquidator but otherwise the Registrar shall nominate in writing the official liquidator who is entitled to be appointed as liquidator if an order for winding up the company is made.

”.

**5. Order 85 inserted**

After Order 84 the following Order is inserted —

“

**Order 85 — Proceedings to which the *Federal Courts (State Jurisdiction) Act 1999* applies**

**1. Interpretation**

- (1) In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears —  
“**section**” means a section of the Act;  
“**the Act**” means the *Federal Courts (State Jurisdiction) Act 1999*.
- (2) Unless the contrary intention appears, words defined in the Act and used in this Order have the same respective meanings as in the Act.

**2. Title of proceedings**

An application under this Order shall be entitled “In the matter of the *Federal Courts (State Jurisdiction) Act 1999*, [section number, if applicable] and in the matter of proceedings in the [name of Commonwealth court] in [number of the Commonwealth court proceedings] between [names of parties to the Commonwealth court proceedings]”.

**3. When ineffective judgment to be registered**

- (1) If a person wants to take any proceedings in the Supreme Court in respect of an ineffective judgment, the person must first apply to have the judgment registered in the Supreme Court.
- (2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to an ineffective judgment that is —
- (a) an interlocutory judgment or order; or
  - (b) a relevant order in a proceeding that is the subject of an application under section 11(2).

- (3) An application to have an ineffective judgment registered may be made at the same time as an application referred to in Rule 6(1)(a).

#### **4. Application for registration**

- (1) An application for the registration of an ineffective judgment must be made by originating summons to —
  - (a) a Master in chambers; or
  - (b) if made at the same time as an application referred to in Rule 6(1)(a), to a Judge in chambers.
- (2) Notice of the application must be given to all parties affected by the ineffective judgment unless the Court orders otherwise.
- (3) If an ineffective judgment relates to 2 or more matters some of which are not State matters, the summons must identify the matters in respect of which registration is sought.
- (4) The application must be supported by an affidavit that —
  - (a) exhibits a copy of the ineffective judgment or of the Commonwealth court's record of the judgment; and
  - (b) states why it is sought to register the judgment.
- (5) If the reason for seeking registration of the ineffective judgment is to enforce payment of an amount of money due under the judgment, the affidavit must —
  - (a) state the amount as at the date of the affidavit;
  - (b) state the rate of interest (if any) that applies to the amount;
  - (c) state the full name, title, trade or business, and the usual or last known place of abode or business of the judgment creditor and of the judgment debtor, so far as they are known to the deponent; and
  - (d) state to the best of the deponent's knowledge and belief that the applicant is entitled to enforce the judgment.

#### **5. Ineffective judgments may be registered**

The Court is to register an ineffective judgment if satisfied that —

- (a) the judgment concerned is an ineffective judgment;
- (b) the application to register it complies with these Rules;



- (c) the judgment is not wholly satisfied; and
- (d) it is appropriate to do so.

**6. Applications for an order under section 10**

- (1) An application for an order under section 10(1) or (3) in respect of an ineffective judgment must be made —
  - (a) if the order sought is one that, had the judgment been one of a Judge or Master of the Supreme Court, could be made by such a Judge or Master — by summons (with a supporting affidavit) to a Judge in chambers; or
  - (b) if the order sought is one that, had the judgment been one of a Judge or Master of the Supreme Court, could be made only by the Full Court on an application for leave to appeal or on an appeal — by way of appellate proceedings to the Full Court under Order 63 or 63A, as the case requires.
- (2) If an application under paragraph (1)(a) also includes an application under Rule 3(1) —
  - (a) the application under paragraph (1)(a) must be made by originating summons; and
  - (b) the supporting affidavit must, in addition to complying with Rule 4, exhibit a copy of each document on the Commonwealth court's file, unless that file has been transferred to the Supreme Court or the Supreme Court orders otherwise.

**7. Applications under section 11**

- (1) An application under section 11(2) in relation to a proceeding in a Commonwealth court must be made by originating summons to a Judge in chambers.
- (2) The application must be supported by an affidavit that —
  - (a) summarizes the cause of action in the proceeding to which the relevant order relates;
  - (b) exhibits a copy of the relevant order, or of the Commonwealth court's record of the relevant order;
  - (c) exhibits a copy of each document on the Commonwealth court's file, unless that file has been transferred to the Supreme Court or the Supreme Court orders otherwise;

- (d) states, in respect of the proceeding in the Commonwealth court, what procedural steps have been completed and what procedural step has been reached; and
- (e) states what procedural steps are likely to be taken in the Supreme Court before the proceeding can be listed for a hearing of the action.

**8. Effect of order under section 11**

When an order is made under section 11(2) in relation to a proceeding in a Commonwealth court —

- (a) the Principal Registrar is to assign the proceeding the appropriate Supreme Court code or action number;
- (b) the proceeding shall be conducted and dealt with in the Supreme Court in accordance with these Rules; and
- (c) documents filed in the Commonwealth court —
  - (i) shall have the same effect and may be used for the same purposes as if they had been documents of the same or a similar nature filed in the Supreme Court; and
  - (ii) shall not be taken to be irregular only because they do not comply, in form or otherwise, with these Rules.

”.

Vocational Education and Training Act 1996

### **Vocational Education and Training Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1999**

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

**1. Citation**

These regulations may be cited as the *Vocational Education and Training Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1999*.

**2. Commencement**

- (1) These regulations, other than regulation 3, come into operation on the day on which they are published in the *Gazette*.
- (2) Regulation 3 is taken to have come into operation on the day on which section 67(2)(c) of the Act came into operation.

**3. Schedule 4 to the Act amended**

Schedule 4 to the Act is amended by inserting the following clause after clause 7 —

“

**7A. Superannuation**

For the purposes of the *Superannuation and Family Benefits Act 1938a* college is to be taken to be a department within the first paragraph of the definition of that term in that Act.

”.

**4. The regulations amended**

The amendments in regulations 5 and 6 are to the *Vocational Education and Training Regulations 1996\**.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of land within the Shire of Kojonup 1999-2000

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required to have firebreaks clear of all inflammable material, in the position, of the width, and for the period as specified hereunder.

#### 1. URBAN LAND (Land within a townsite)

During the period from the 15th December to 31st May inclusive, you shall have firebreaks in the following positions—

- 1.1 On land that is 4000 square metres or less in area, you shall remove all inflammable material from the whole of the land.
- 1.2 On land which exceeds 4000 square metres (one acre) in area as per item 2.1 hereunder.
- 1.3 However, owners of property with an area greater than 4000 square metres that bounds a developed residentially zoned property, must install 2.4 metre wide boundary firebreak cleared of all flammable material on their land abutting that residential property and all flammable vegetation on the remainder of the block shall not exceed 150mm in height.

**2. RURAL LAND—HOMESTEADS, BUILDINGS, HAYSTACKS, BULK FUEL, DRUMS AND LIQUID PETROLEUM.**

During the period from 15th December, to the 31st May inclusive you shall have fire breaks at least 20 metres wide, if provided by burning, cultivating or spraying or 60 metres wide, if provided by being closely grazed or mowed to the satisfaction of a Bush Fire Control Officer in such positions as are necessary to completely surround the perimeter of any homestead building (excluding isolated non flammable buildings) fuel installation (including drums), hay stack (but only haystacks within 100 metres of any building) or group of such structures or installations. In each case the outer 2.4 metres of an area must be totally free of any inflammable material and where mowing is the method used all residue of the mowing process must be removed from the area.

**NOTE—**

Boundary firebreaks are not compulsory within the Shire of Kojonup Rural Area. Landholders can provide fire breaks if they wish.

**GENERAL INFORMATION—**

If its considered impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks on the land as required by this notice you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If Council or its duly authorised officer does not grant permission you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

**PLEASE NOTE—**

Following the method adopted by Council to inspect the firebreaks required in this notice, it is not necessary for Council to notify you or give you any prior warning that legal action may proceed for failing to comply with the requirements of this notice.

2. Including portion of Wellington Location 4 Raymond Road, Roelands in Schedule 4 of the Scheme Text—'Additional Requirements—Special Rural Zone' and inserting the following—
  - 4.9 AREA 9—RAYMOND ROAD (EAST), ROELANDS
    - 4.9.1 Subdivision shall generally be in accordance with the Subdivision Guide Plan (Plan No. 98041P-04) dated October 1999, attached to the Scheme Amendment Report (Amendment No. 32).
    - 4.9.2 The Council will recommend to the Western Australian Planning Commission that a minimum lot size of 2 hectares should apply.
    - 4.9.3 Boundary fencing shall be post and four strand wire, or post and ringlock or similar as approved by Council. Solid fencing such as fibro cement sheeting, metal sheeting, masonry walls or wooden pickets as boundary fencing is prohibited and only permitted in proximity to buildings where Council determines that it will not adversely impact on the rural character of the area.
    - 4.9.4 Residential occupation of any lot will not be permitted unless a potable water supply is available to the lot. Each dwelling shall be provided with a supply of potable water from a rainwater storage system with a minimum capacity of 92,000 litres to the satisfaction of Council.
    - 4.9.5 Disposal of on-site effluent is to be to the specification and satisfaction of the Local Government and the Health Department of Western Australia. In some instances alternative effluent disposal systems with a nutrient retention capacity may be required.
    - 4.9.6 The minimum vertical clearance between the bottom of any conventional leach drain and the highest known water table or bedrock shall be 2.0 metres.
    - 4.9.7 No dwelling house, outbuilding or structure shall be constructed unless it, is within a building envelope defined on the Subdivision Guide Plan.
    - 4.9.8 Where for the purpose of retaining natural flora, sound environmental reasons or the physical constraints of a site dictate, council may set an alternative building envelope.
    - 4.9.9 On the proposed 2.0493 ha lot, as shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan (Plan No. 98041P-04) dated October 1999, the contours within the building envelope area may exceed a 1:10 slope. As such standard building methods may not be appropriate and Council may require specific building methods to be implemented.
    - 4.9.10 Council will request at the subdivision stage the developer to plant and maintain the equivalent of 100 trees (per hectare) capable of growing to at least 3 metres in height within a 20 metre buffer along the Raymond Road and South Western Highway frontages and the escarpment which separates the flood plain from the balance of the land, to the specifications and satisfaction of Council.
    - 4.9.11 The developer is required to maintain the revegetated areas and to replace any dead or diseased plants for a period of two years.
    - 4.9.12 Council may require lot owners to erect and maintain a fence of satisfactory standard in order to protect the escarpment and exclude stock therefrom.
    - 4.9.13 No trees or substantial vegetation shall be felled or removed from the site except where—
      - it is inside the approved building envelope;
      - it is required to establish a firebreak or driveway; or
      - trees are dead, diseased or dangerous.
    - 4.9.14 As a condition of development approval, Council shall require the planting and maintenance of 20 native trees capable of growing to at least 3 metres in height for each hectare or part of a hectare of the area of the lot. The planting shall be concentrated around the proposed buildings and between the front setback line and the front boundary.
    - 4.9.15 Council shall not give planning consent for the agistment or the stabling of horses, or the keeping of livestock on any lot, unless Agriculture Western Australia has formally advised that it is satisfied that the soil conditions and type of vegetation existing on a particular lot is capable of supporting such a use.

- 4.9.16 With the intention of preventing land degradation Council may, with the advice of Agriculture Western Australia, require the removal of, or reduction in the number of, stock on any lot within Area 9.
- 4.9.17 Council may request the Western Australian Planning Commission at the time of subdivision to advise prospective purchasers of those lots which include an area of the 1 in 100 year flood plain that in winter this portion of land may be affected by flooding.
- 4.9.18 The estimated 1 in 100 year flood level is at 9m AHD. Council may request the Western Australian Planning Commission at the time of subdivision to impose a condition requiring the land within the 1 in 100 year flood level to be noted on the titles and that the land may be susceptible to water erosion caused by floodwater and inundation.

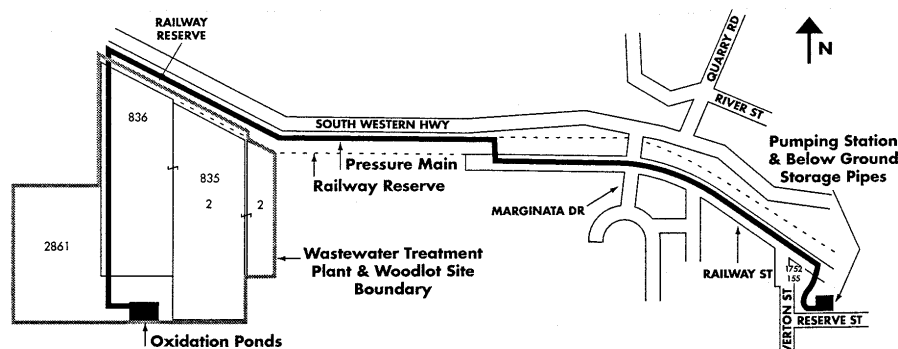
