Supreme Court Act 1935

Supreme Court Amendment Rules (No. 4) 1999

Made by the Judges of the Supreme Court.

1. Citation

These rules may be cited as the *Supreme Court Amendment Rules (No. 4) 1999*.

2. Commencement

These rules come into operation on the day on which the *Surveillance Devices Act 1998* comes into operation.

3. Rules amended

The amendments in these rules are to the *Rules of the Supreme Court 1971**.

4. Order 81H inserted

After Order 81G the following Order is inserted —

“

Order 81H

Proceedings under the *Surveillance Devices Act 1998*

1. Interpretation

In this Order —

“**the Act**” means the *Surveillance Devices Act 1998*.

2. Application for warrant

- (1) An application under the Act for a warrant, other than an application under section 16 of the Act, is to be made by originating motion and accompanied by an affidavit in support.
- (2) In the case of a warrant under section 16 of the Act, the applicant is to file an originating motion in respect of the warrant when he or she forwards to the Court the documents referred to in section 17 of the Act.

3. Reports to Judges

A report to a Judge under section 21 or 30 of the Act is to be —

- (a) sworn as an affidavit in accordance with these Rules; and
- (b) filed with an originating motion.

4. Application for order allowing publication or communication in the public interest

An application for an order under section 31 of the Act is to be made by originating motion and accompanied by an affidavit in support.

5. Identification of persons in documents

In a document filed in a proceeding under the Act a person may be referred to by —

- (a) the person's initials; or
- (b) a numerical reference identifying the law enforcement agency of which the applicant in the proceeding is a member or officer and the year in which the proceeding was commenced.

6. Practice Directions

- (1) The Chief Justice may from time to time issue Practice Directions —
 - (a) to facilitate compliance with the confidentiality requirements of the Act; and
 - (b) as to the practice and procedure applicable in proceedings under the Act.
- (2) All parties to proceedings under the Act must comply with any such Practice Directions.

5. Order 83A amended

Order 83A(2) is amended by inserting the following paragraphs after paragraph (b) —

“

(c) proceedings under the *Surveillance Devices Act 1998*;

(ca) proceedings under the *Witness Protection (Western Australia) Act 1996*;

”.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

SHIRE OF NANNUP

LOCAL LAWS REFUSE SITE

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the above mentioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Nannup hereby records having resolved on the 26 August 1999 to make the following local laws:

1.1 CITATION

These local laws may be cited as “Shire of Nannup (Local Government Act) Local Laws” or as “Shire of Nannup” (LGA) Local Laws for Refuse Site”

1.2 GENERAL APPLICATION

These local laws shall apply to the whole of the district of the Shire of Nannup unless otherwise stated.

1.3 READ AS WHOLE

These local laws shall be read as a whole and the treatment of a subject matter in one part does not exclude the treatment of the same subject matter in another part.

Division 1—Preliminary

1.4 DEFINITIONS

“Act” means the Local Government Act 1995

“Authorised Officer” means a person appointed to an office by the Council.

“CEO” means the Chief Executive Officer of the Nannup Shire Council.

“Council” means the Nannup Shire Council

“Facility” means the property and buildings at the Shire of Nannup Refuse disposal Site, Reserve 38737, Beggars Road, Nannup.

“Fauna” and “flora” have the meaning given to them in Section 6 of the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950.

“To deposit Waste” includes to dump, to dispose of or in any way to place or leave waste at the Facility.

“Waste” means all manner of material discarded as being no longer required by the person owning or in possession of that material.

Division 2—User Obligations

2.1 Any person using, or on, the Facility shall comply with any lawful direction given to that person by an Authorised Officer.

2.2 No person shall deposit any waste at the Facility other than:

2.2.1 at a location designated by notice; or

2.2.2 as directed by an Authorised Officer

2.3 No person shall remove any waste from the Facility without prior written authorisation from an Authorised Officer.

2.4 No person shall deposit any liquid waste at the Facility unless authorised in writing by the CEO.

2.5 No person shall deposit at the Facility any waste which is toxic, poisonous or hazardous, or the depositing of which is regulated or prohibited by any statute.

2.6 Any person convicted of an offence against clauses 2.4 or 2.5 of these laws shall, in addition to any penalty imposed and costs awarded, be liable to Council for the costs of removing and lawfully disposing of such liquid, toxic, hazardous or poisonous waste, and for making good any damage caused to the Facility and for any other expenses incurred by Council, as a result of the illegal depositing.

Division 3—Care of Facility

3.1 No person shall light a fire within the Facility unless authorised to do so by an Authorised Officer.

3.2 No person shall remove from or otherwise damage flora on the Facility unless authorised by an Authorised officer.

3.3 No person shall trap, chase, worry or otherwise injure or maim any fauna at the Facility, unless authorised by an Authorised Officer.

3.4 No person shall damage, deface or destroy any building, sign, plant or equipment or property of the Council situated in and on the Facility.

Division 4—Conduct on Facility

4.1 All persons entering the Facility shall be subject to these local laws.

4.2 The drivers of all vehicles entering the Facility shall comply with any speed limit signs erected by the Council on the Facility.

Division 5—Council Exemption

5.1 The provisions of these local laws requiring payment of fees, do not apply to the deposit of waste, owned by, or in the possession of Council.

Division 6—Objections & Appeals

6.1 When Council makes a decision under these local laws as to whether it will —

(a) grant a person an authorisation; or

(b) renew, vary, or cancel an authorisation that a person has under these local laws; the provisions of Part 9 Division 1 of the Act shall apply.

Division 7—Enforcement of Local Laws

7.1 The Council may appoint a person as an Authorised Person for the purposes of performing particular functions under these local laws and a person shall not hinder or interfere with an authorised Person in the course of that person's duties.

7.2 An Authorised Person shall on demand show an identification of that person as such.

Division 8—General Offence and Penalty Provisions

8.1 Any person failing to do any act directed to be done, or doing any act forbidden to be done by these local laws, or any notice or order under these local laws commits an offence.

8.2 Subject to clause 8.1 any person who commits an offence against these local laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding a fine of \$5,000.00, and if the offence is of a continuing nature, to a daily penalty not exceeding a fine of \$500.00 in respect of each day or part of a day during which the offence has continued.

8.3 The offences and modified penalties prescribed, with respect to offences against these local laws, shall be as specified in Schedule 1.

Betting Control Act 1954

Betting Control Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 1999

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Betting Control Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 1999*.

2. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Betting Control Regulations 1978**.

3. Regulation 3 amended

Regulation 3(1) is amended by inserting in the appropriate alphabetical position the following definition —

“

“**internet betting**” means a method of making and accepting bets by means of an on-line telecommunications system (commonly known as “the Internet”) using a computer system that is subject to the procedures set out in regulation 76;

”.

4. Regulation 14 amended

Regulation 14(7) and (8) are repealed and the following subregulations are inserted instead —

“

(7) A bookmaker’s licence which is endorsed to that effect authorizes the licensee to carry on the business of a bookmaker, in relation to sporting events or contingencies approved under section 4B, by means of —

(a) on-course telephone betting conducted in accordance with regulation 71; or

- (b) on-course internet betting, conducted in accordance with regulations 74 and 76,

or both, as the case may be.

- (8) A bookmaker's licence which is endorsed to that effect authorizes the licensee to carry on the business of a bookmaker, in relation to racing, by means of —

- (a) on-course telephone betting conducted in accordance with regulation 72; or
- (b) on-course internet betting, conducted in accordance with regulations 75 and 76,

or both, as the case may be.

”.

5. **Regulations 74, 75 and 76 inserted**

After regulation 73 the following regulations are inserted —

“

74. Internet betting (sporting events)

When betting on a sporting event, or a contingency, is approved under section 4B a licensee who is so authorized by endorsement on the licence may carry on business as a bookmaker by means of on-course internet betting, in relation to that sporting event or contingency —

- (a) in accordance with the procedures established and approved by the Board under regulation 76 for the conduct of internet betting; and
- (b) if the committee or other authority controlling the racecourse so permits,

and not otherwise.

75. Internet betting (racing)

A licensee who is so authorized by endorsement on the licence may only carry on business as a bookmaker by means of on-course internet betting in relation to racing —

- (a) in accordance with the procedures established and approved by the Board under regulation 76 for the conduct of internet betting;
- (b) if the committee or other authority controlling the racecourse so permits;
- (c) if the bet is on a race being conducted at any other race meeting in the State, if the committee or other authority controlling that other race meeting so permits; and

- (d) if the amount of the bet is not less than \$200, or if the amount to be won on the bet is not less than \$2 000,

and not otherwise.

76. Procedures for internet betting

- (1) For the purposes of regulations 74 and 75 the Board has established the following procedures:
 - (a) any internet betting system shall be developed in accordance with the Board's specifications;
 - (b) an internet betting system shall not be used unless it is first audited and approved by the Board;
 - (c) an approved internet betting system shall not be modified or changed unless consent for the specific modification or change is obtained from the Board;
 - (d) any internet betting using an approved internet betting system shall be conducted in accordance with any further conditions that are imposed by the Board, as part of the licence endorsement, under regulation 14;
 - (e) any internet bet using an approved internet betting system shall be confirmed in a manner, and within a time, that the Board approves;
 - (f) an internet betting ticket —
 - (i) may be written in such a form; and
 - (ii) notwithstanding section 31(1)(b)(iii), is to be delivered (or not delivered) in a manner,
approved by the Board.
- (2) Where an internet bet is not confirmed in the manner or within the time approved by the Board, that transaction does not constitute a valid bet.
- (3) The details of all internet bets received are to be separately recorded in a format approved by the Board under regulation 37 and, for the purposes of section 15, included in the returns to be delivered under the Act.

”.

REVIEW OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (GOLDFIELDS RESIDENTIAL AREAS)
(SULPHUR DIOXIDE) POLICY 1992

As part of its review of the Environmental Protection (Goldfields Residential Areas) (Sulphur Dioxide) Policy 1992, the Environmental Protection Authority has prepared a new draft Environmental Protection (Goldfields Residential Areas) (Sulphur Dioxide) Policy 1999 which has been released for public comment. The policy applies to ambient air quality limits and standards for sulphur dioxide in residential areas of the Goldfields region.

In accordance with section 26 (d) of the Environmental Protection Act 1986, the Environmental Protection Authority invites submissions from the public on the new draft policy. INSTRUMENT OF DELEGATION

DOLA 1791/998, 13688/902v6

I, Douglas James Shave, MLA, Minister for Lands, acting in accordance with section 9 of the *Land Administration Act 1997*, hereby delegate to the Chief Executive Officer of the Rottneest Island Authority ("Authority") my powers and duties under section 18 of the *Land Administration Act 1997* subject to the following conditions:

A. Limited Extent of Delegation

- These powers are delegated for the purpose of administering the *Rottneest Island Authority Act 1997* ("the said Act").
- This delegation is limited to approving dealings over Crown land—
 - (i) set apart for the purposes of, or subject to the provisions of, the said Act; or
 - (ii) the subject of a management order issued to the Authority pursuant to section 46 of the *Land Administration Act 1997*, or a vesting order issued to the Authority under section 33(2) of the *Land Act 1933*;
 - (iii) to the extent of the statutory power of the Authority to grant or deal in interests in such land;

(iv) in accordance with any terms and conditions of a management order issued under section 46 of the *Land Administration Act 1997* or a vesting order issued under section 33(2) of the *Land Act 1933*, and associated policies and law.

- This delegation does not extend to transfers in fee simple; assignments of vesting or management to other parties; or to leases or licences for terms exceeding any limits specified in the said Act or in any management order or vesting order issued in relation to the land.

B. Limited Extent of Delegation

This delegation will only endure until—

- Legislation is enacted to exclude or modify application of section 18 of the *Land Administration Act 1997* in relation to Crown land set apart for the purposes of, or subject to the provisions of, the said Act, or the subject of any management order or vesting order; or
- Existing management orders or vesting orders already issued in relation to the subject land are revoked and replaced by management orders issued under section 46 of the *Land Administration Act 1997*, excluding the need for the approval of the Minister for Lands to dealings in the such land.
