DOGS LOCAL LAW

Under the powers conferred by the Dog Act 1976 and under all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Toodyay resolved on April 27, 2000 to make the following local law:

The Shire of Moora Dogs Local Law as published in the *Government Gazette* of 29 November 1999, is adopted as a local law of the Shire of Toodyay with the modifications which follow—

1. Preliminary

Wherever the “Shire of Moora” is mentioned in the local law substitute “Shire of Toodyay”

2. Clause 1.2—Repeal

PARKING AND PARKING FACILITIES LOCAL LAW

Under the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1995 and under all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Toodyay resolved on April 27, 2000 to make the following local law:

The Town of East Fremantle Parking and Parking Facilities Local Law published in the *Government Gazette* of 8 November 1999, is adopted as a local law of the Shire of Toodyay with the modifications which follow—

1. Preliminary

Wherever the “Town of East Fremantle” is mentioned in the local law substitute “Shire of Toodyay”

2. In the Table of Contents, delete—

“Schedule 5—Fees Relating to Obstructing Vehicles”.

3. Clause 1.2—Repeal

Delete clause 1.2 and substitute—

“1.2 Repeal

The Shire of Toodyay Local Law Relating to Parking Facilities published in the *Government Gazettes* of 2 December 1983 and 12 May 1995, are repealed.

The Shire of Toodyay Local Law Order in Council—Vehicles on roads published in the *Government Gazette* of March 22, 1951.

The Shire of Toodyay Local Law Order in Council—Stands and parking for vehicles published in the *Government Gazette* of November 9, 1956.

The Shire of Toodyay Local Law Commercial vehicles on street verges No.20 published in the *Government Gazette* of February 8, 1972.

4. Clause 1.3 Interpretation

Delete the definition of "specified place".

5. Clause 2.5 Suspension of requirement to pay fee

In clause 2.5—

- (a) insert "by a resolution" after "time to time";
- (b) insert "in the resolution" after "specified".

6. Clause 3.4 Suspension of parking station restrictions

In clause 3.4—

- (a) delete "from time to time" and substitute "by resolution"; and
- (b) insert "in such resolution" after "specified".

7. Clause 4.8 Parking on Verges

Delete clause 4.8 and substitute—

"4.8 Parking on Verges

- (1) A person shall not—
 - (a) Park a vehicle;
 - (b) Park a commercial vehicle or bus, or a trailer or caravan unattached to a motor vehicle; or
 - (c) Park a vehicle during any period when the parking of vehicles on that verge is prohibited by a sign adjacent and referable to that verge.
- (2) Subclause 1(a) does not apply to the person if he or she is the owner or occupier of the premises adjacent to that verge, or is a person authorised by the occupier of those premises to park the vehicle so that any portion of it is on the verge.
- (3) Subclause 1(b) does not apply to a commercial vehicle when it is being loaded or unloaded with reasonable expedition with goods, merchandise or material collected from or delivered to the premises adjacent to the portion of the verge on which the commercial vehicle is parked, provided no obstruction is caused to the passage of any vehicle or person using a carriageway or a footpath."

8. Clause 5.3 Removal and cancellation of residential parking permit

In clause 5.3—

- (a) Delete the subclause designation "(1)"; and
- (b) Delete subclause (2)

9. Clause 6.6 Vehicles not to obstruct a public place

In clause 6.6 delete subclauses (3) to (10) inclusive.

10. Schedule titles

Change the following Schedule titles—

- (a) "Schedule One" to "First Schedule";
- (b) "Schedule Two" to "Second Schedule";
- (c) "Schedule Three" wherever it occurs to "Third Schedule"; and
- (d) "Schedule Four" to "Fourth Schedule".

INQUIRY WITH REFERENCE TO THE CONDUCT OF DR GREGORY JAMES DUCK DOB 6/2/1955

The Board held an Inquiry on 9 December 1999 pursuant to Section 13(1)(d) of the Medical Act 1894. The Board reserved its decision about Dr Duck's compliance with or contravention of a condition or restriction imposed by the Board.

At a subsequent meeting of the Board on the 18th April 2000 the following Orders were made—

That Dr Duck give an undertaking to be of good behaviour for a period of three years and to comply during that period with conditions in relation to his practice of medicine as set out below. The period of three years to be calculated taking into account only those periods during which Dr Duck is resident within the State—

The following conditions and restrictions be imposed namely—

1. For general practice, Dr Duck work under the supervision at all times of another medical practitioner nominated by Dr Duck and approved by Dr Chiu or other practitioner as nominated by the Board. ("The Approved Supervisor") Supervision to include—
 - (i) regular monitoring of Dr Duck's daily working hours, case load and variety of case material. Monitoring to be carried out at least twice weekly and to include inspection of appointment books, receipts and random file inspections.
 - (ii) weekly meetings of at least one hour duration between the nominated supervisor and Dr Duck at which Dr Duck is to present formal case presentations on cases selected by Dr Duck and randomly selected by the Approved Supervisor.
 - (iii) provision of reports by the Approved Supervisor to the Board every three months.
Dr Duck is to inform the Board immediately in writing of any proposal to nominate another practitioner for the role of Approved Supervisor.
2. Dr Duck continue attending Dr Richard Hester regularly for treatment.
3. Dr Hester provide progress reports to the Medical Board every 3 months.
4. (i) Any practice by Dr Duck in the field of addictions/psychological counselling and/or alternative treatments for drug addiction be professionally supervised by Dr Michael Hagan such supervision to be focussed on Dr Duck's well being and include counter transference issues.
(ii) Dr Hagan provide reports to the Medical Board every 3 months including confirmation of Dr Duck's attendance for such supervision sessions.
5. Dr Duck undergo urine testing for the presence of opiates and other substances to be specified by the Board from time to time, three times per week and that Dr Duck authorise the results to be forwarded to Dr Hester directly on a monthly basis.
6. Dr Duck be prohibited from administering any drugs of addiction.
7. Dr Duck not procure, prescribe or administer pethidine.
8. Dr Duck undergo a formal psychiatric review every 12 months by a practitioner appointed by the Medical Board to reassess his condition.

9. Dr Duck undergo a formal psychiatric review by a practitioner appointed by the Medical Board to reassess his condition, within 14 days of his return to the State after any period of absence from the State. Dr Duck should make an advance appointment with the appointed psychiatrist prior to departing from the State.
 10. Dr Duck notify the Board in writing of any intended date of departure from the State and notify the Board immediately in writing his return to the State.
 11. Dr Duck pay the costs of the inquiry of 18 December 1998 by instalments of \$500 per calendar month, each instalment to be paid on the first day of each month with the first instalment to commence on 1 May 2000.
 12. Dr Duck pay the costs of the inquiry of 9 December 1999.

INQUIRY WITH REFERENCE TO THE DR ADRIANA RHIANNON ELISE MAXWELL

2. That random urine testing for drugs of dependency be conducted at not less than two weekly intervals. These tests to be arranged with the treating practitioner, and forwarded to the Board.
3. That following discussion with treating practitioners, professional rehabilitation services be considered.
