### Environmental Protection Amendment Regulations 2001

Made by the Governor in Executive Council on the recommendation of the Environmental Protection Authority.

**1. Citation**

These regulations may be cited as the *Environmental Protection Amendment Regulations 2001*.

**2. Schedule 6 amended**

Prisons Act 1981

### **Prisons Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2001**

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

**1. Citation**

These regulations may be cited as the *Prisons Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2001*.

**2. The regulations amended**

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Prisons Regulations 1982*\*.

**3. Regulation 2 amended**

After the definition of “contact visit” the following definition is inserted —

“

“**contract worker**” means a contract worker as defined  
in section 15A of the Act;

”.

**4. Regulation 2A inserted**

After regulation 2 the following regulation is inserted in Part I —

“

**2A. Certain regulations not applicable to contract workers**

A reference to a prison officer or any other officer in a provision of these regulations that is specified in the Table to this regulation does not include a reference to a contract worker.

**5. Regulation 26C amended**

- (1) If property has been damaged, destroyed or lost because of an act or omission on the part of a prisoner the chief executive officer may order a deduction from the gratuities or other moneys credited to the prisoner to defray the costs of replacement or repair of the property.

(2) In this regulation —

“**property**” —

- (a) if prisons services in relation to a prison are being provided under a contract, means either —
  - (i) property of the State of Western Australia; or
  - (ii) property of the contractor;
 and
- (b) in any other case, means property of the State of Western Australia.

”.

**9. Regulation 54A replaced**

Regulation 54A is repealed and the following regulation is inserted instead —

“

**54A. Prescribed prisons in relation to visitors to prisoners**

The prisons that are specified in the Table to this regulation are prescribed for the purposes of section 60 of the Act.

- (1) Upon the death of a prisoner, the Superintendent shall ensure that a medical officer records —
  - (a) the time of death and the time of certification of death;
  - (b) the nature of illness or other apparent cause of death;
  - (c) the progression of any illness suffered by the prisoner; and
  - (d) any other remarks that the medical officer considers necessary.
- (2) The medical officer shall, as soon as practicable after recording the matters under subregulation (1), send a copy of the record to the chief executive officer.

”.

**13. Regulation 78 amended**

Regulation 78(5) is amended by deleting “the prison medical officer or” and inserting instead —

“ a ”.

**14. Regulation 81 amended**

Regulation 81(1)(a) is amended by deleting “the prison medical officer or” and inserting instead —

“ a ”.

**15. Regulation 85 replaced**

Regulation 85 is repealed and the following regulation is inserted instead —

“

**85. Responsibility for prisoners in lock-ups**

- (1) If a prisoner is confined in a place prescribed as a lock-up for the purposes of the *Court Security and Custodial Services Act 1999*, the CEO as defined in that Act is responsible for the management and routine of the prisoner while the prisoner is confined in that place.
- (2) If a prisoner is confined in any other lock-up, the Commissioner of Police is responsible for the management and routine of the prisoner while the prisoner is confined in the lock-up.

”.

**16. Regulation 85A amended**

- (1) Regulation 85A(1) is repealed and the following subregulation is inserted instead —

“

- (1) A person shall not be permitted to enter a prison specified in the Table to this regulation unless —
- (a) an officer has stamped a visible part of the person's skin with an identification mark that is visible under ultraviolet light; or
  - (b) an officer has applied an identification band to the person's wrist.

#### HEALTH ACT 1911

##### CITY OF BELMONT HEALTH (STABLES PREMISES) AMENDMENT LOCAL LAWS 2001

Made by the Council of the City of Belmont under section 342 of the *Health Act 1911* in accordance with subdivision 2 of Part 3 of the *Local Government Act 1995*.

#### Citation

1. These local laws may be cited as the *City of Belmont Health (Stables Premises) Amendment Local Laws 2001*.

#### Principal local laws

2. In these local laws, the *City of Belmont Health (Stables Premises) Local Laws 1999* made under the *Health Act 1911* and passed by the Council of the City of Belmont on 15 March 1999, by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on 14 April 1999, and amended by the *City of Belmont Health (Stables Premises) Amendment Local Laws 1999* made under the *Health Act 1911* and passed by the Council of the City of Belmont on 13 September 1999, by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on 12 November 1999, are referred to as the principal local laws.



**Principal local laws amended**

3. The principal local laws are amended as described in the following Schedule—

1	3	In the definition of " Dwelling House" (a) in the second line, insert a comma after the word "building"; and (b) after the last word "habitation", remove the full stop and insert the words "but does not include open verandahs or patios".
2	10 (1)	In paragraph (b) of subclause 10 (1), after the word "brickwork", insert the words "or other materials approved by Council".
3	10 (1)	Delete paragraph (c) and substitute— " (c) Every stall shall have an area of not less than 12 square metres with walls not less than 3 metres in length, except when in accordance with subclause 10 (2)."
4	10 (1)	Delete paragraph (d) and substitute— " (d) Every stall shall be provided with a roof that covers the entire floor area of the stall and allows for a minimum ceiling height of 2.7 metres, with an average ceiling height of 3 metres."
5	10 (2)	Delete paragraphs (e), (f), (g) and (h) and substitute— " (e) The stable design must provide minimum access widths of 1.5 metres to each stall and must allow sufficient access into each stall for small earth moving machinery. (f) The minimum floor area of each stall shall not be less than 28 square metres and each stall shall have a minimum ceiling height of 2.7 metres, with an average ceiling height of 3 metres." (g) Walls to each stall shall have a minimum length of 4 metres. (h) The roofed area of each stall shall be not less than 80 per cent of the floor area of the stall. (i) In all other respects, subclause 10 (1) shall apply to the stable building."
6	13 (1)	Delete subclause 13 (1) and substitute the following— (1) No part of any stall shall be less than 6 metres from any dwelling house on the same property or 15 metres from any office or commercial premises or 10 metres from a dwelling house on an adjacent property, except in accordance with subclause (3).
7	14	Delete clause 14 and substitute— "14. (1) Yards are to be constructed of approved material and shall conform to the following requirements— (a) The minimum floor area of each yard shall not be less than 28 square metres and the side of each yard shall not be less than 4 metres in length. (b) A 300mm thick bed of crushed limestone, or any other proposed alternative acceptable to the Swan River Trust, shall be laid under the sand of all yards including lunging and rolling yards. (c) A minimum distance of 6 metres is to be maintained between a yard and any dwelling house on the same property and not less than 15 metres from an office or commercial premises or 10 metres from any dwelling house, on any adjacent property."

8	14A	Delete the reference to sub-clause "14(1)(b)" and substitute "14(1)(c)".
9	15 (1)	In paragraph (a), delete the word and number "four (4)" and substitute "six (6)".
10	15 (1)	Delete paragraph (b) and substitute— <p>"(b) between 900 square metres and up to 1400 square metres, for every increase of 50 square metres or part thereof, one (1) additional horse may be accommodated."</p>

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**HE401\*****POISONS ACT 1964**

POISONS (AUTHORIZED POSSESSION OF SUBSTANCES) ORDER 2001

Made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 41 of the Act.

**Citation**

1. This order may be cited as the *Poisons (Authorized Possession of Substances) Order 2001*.

**Commencement**

2. This order comes into operation on the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.

**Revocation**

3. The *Poisons (Authorized Possession of Substances) Order (No. 6) 2000\** is revoked.

[ \* *Published in the Gazette 31 December 1999, pp. 7069-70  
and amended in Gazette of 23 May 2000, pp. 2511* ]

**Interpretation**

4. In this order—

“**Metropolitan Complex**” means the Metropolitan Prison Complex, Nicholson Road, Canning Vale;

“**specified substances**” means the amount of the substance included in Schedule 9 to the Act, possession of which is authorized under clause 5.

**Possession of certain substance authorized**

5. Subject to clause 6, the people listed in the table to this clause are authorized to together possess at the places mentioned in Schedule 1, and while travelling directly between any of those places, not more than—

- (a) 1kg of cannabis;
- (b) 5g of cannabis resin;
- (c) 100g of heroin; and
- (d) 50g of 3,4-Methylenedioxy-N,a-Dimethylphenylethylamine (MDMA),

for the purpose of training animals in the detection of those substances.

- (a) the specified substances, when not required for the purpose referred to in clause 5, are stored at the Metropolitan Complex in a secure manner, as directed by the Commissioner of Health;
- (b) written records relating to the specified substances are maintained at the Metropolitan Complex, as directed by the Commissioner of Health; and
- (c) that, if requested by the Commissioner of Health, any oral information or written report relating to the specified substances is given to the Commissioner.

**Expiry**

7. This order expires on 30 September 2002.
