The Department of Conservation and Land Management advises on behalf of the Conservation Commission that an amendment to the Shannon Park and D'Entrecasteaux National Park Management Plan 1987-1997 has been approved.

The amendment to the 1987 Management Plan was prepared in accordance with section 61 of the Conservation and Land Management Act 1984 and was approved by the Minister for the Environment on 1 August 2000. No modifications were made to the amendment under section 60 (2) of the Act, and it comes into operation with this *Government Gazette* notice.

The amendment is required to allow the installation of an Infrasound Monitoring Facility within the Shannon Park and D'Entrecasteaux National Park. The facility will be part of an international network of stations monitoring a ban on nuclear testing. The function of the facility will be to detect very low frequency sound waves generated by an atmospheric nuclear test.

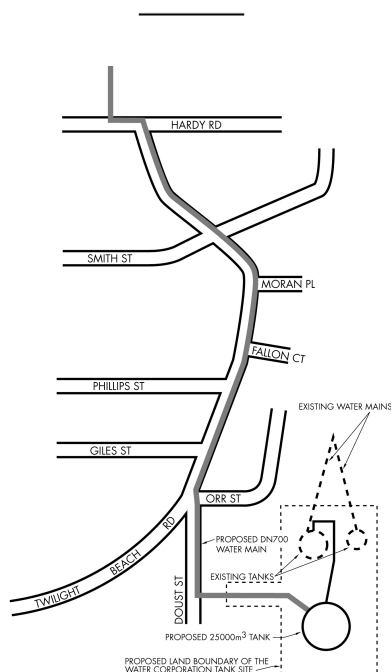
