LOCAL LAWS RELATING TO DOGS

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Dog Act 1976*, the City of Melville hereby resolves on 17 July 2001 to make the following amendments—

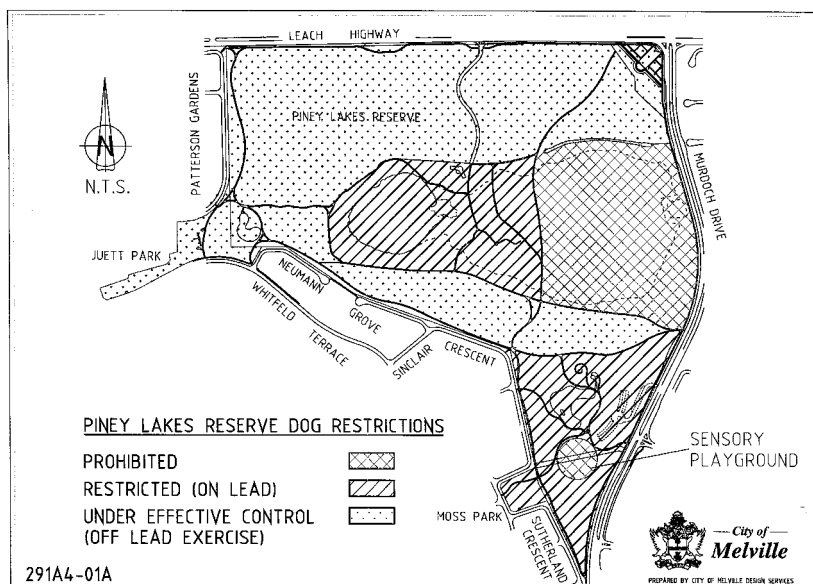
- (a) the local law relating to dogs gazetted on 26 October 1990 is the principal local law.
- (b) into the Third Schedule—“Areas on which Dogs are Prohibited Totally”, insert—
“The Eastern Core Conservation Area and Children’s Playground at Piney Lakes Reserve Number 35927.”
- (c) into the Fourth Schedule—“Public Recreation Reserves on which Dogs must be controlled in accordance with Section 31(1) of the *Dog Act 1976*”, insert—
“The Central Natural Lake on Piney Lakes Reserve, Murdoch that includes the Western Core Conservation Area bounded by the pathway. The triangular portion of Piney Lakes Reserve south of the walkway and bounded by Sinclair Crescent, Sutherland Crescent, Murdoch Drive and including Moss Park as shown on the attached diagram. All pathways within the reserve”.

Poisons (Section 24) (Registered Pesticide 1080) Variation Notice 2001

Made by the Commissioner of Health under section 24 of the Act.

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the *Poisons (Section 24) (Registered Pesticide 1080) Variation Notice 2001*.

Commencement

2. This notice comes into operation on the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.

Principal order

3. The amendments in this notice are to the *Poisons (Section 24) (Registered Pesticide 1080) Notice 2000**.

Clause 2 amended

4. (1) Clause 2(1) is amended by deleting the definition of "authorised department" and inserting instead—

“ "authorised department" means the Department of Agriculture or the Department of Conservation and Land Management; ”.

(2) Clause 2(3) is repealed and the following subclauses are inserted instead—

“(3) A reference in this notice to the "chief executive officer", in relation to the performance of a function under this notice by the chief executive officer of an authorised department, includes a reference to—

- (a) an officer of the department authorised in writing by the chief executive officer to perform the function, or
- (b) subject to subclause (4), an employee of a local government authorised in writing by the chief executive officer of the Department of Agriculture to perform the function and the function is restricted by the written authorisation to authorising—
 - (i) the sale, supply, possession and use of 1080 in respect to persons who reside in the local government district in which the authorised person is employed, and
 - (ii) the use of 1080 only within the local government district in which the authorised person is employed.

(4) The chief executive officer of the Department of Agriculture shall—

- (a) only issue an authorisation under subclause (3)(b) if—
 - (i) the local government employee is employed in a local government district in which no officer of the Department of Agriculture is permanently located;
 - (ii) the local government has been consulted and neither the local government nor the employee has raised any objection to the authorisation being issued; and
 - (iii) the local government employee has been given—
 - A. appropriate 1080 training prior to the authorisation being given, and
 - B. the chief executive officer of the Department of Agriculture is satisfied that the employee has the necessary training and skills to be able to effectively and competently perform his/her functions under the authorisation.
- (b) notify the Commissioner of the details of each written authorisation given under subclause (3)(b) within 7 days of the authorisation being issued. ”.

BUSH FIRE ACT, 1955

Shire of Dandaragan

Notice to all owners/occupiers of land within the Shire of Dandaragan

FIREBREAKS

Pursuant to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 1st day of November 2001 to clear of all inflammable materials and / or install firebreaks in accordance with the following, and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of all inflammable materials up to and including the 29th day of March 2002.

RURAL LAND

1. Clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks at least three (3) metres wide inside and within fifty (50) metres of all external boundaries of all improved and unimproved land owned or occupied by you. For the purpose of this section, all road reserves are to be taken as boundaries.
2. Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn or not), clear of all inflammable materials firebreaks not less than twenty (20) metres wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land on which bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated.
3. Where there is standing timber on land owned or occupied by you and it is intended to burn such timber, to clear of all inflammable materials, fire breaks not less than six (6) metres wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land on which the timber is standing.
4. Landowners and/or occupiers adjoining Crown Land are, in addition to the above, encouraged to maintain external firebreaks where their property adjoins the vacant Crown Land.

TOWNSITES

Pursuant to the powers contained in section 33 of the aforementioned Act, for property owners within the townsites of Jurien Bay and Cervantes, you are hereby required on or before the 15th day of November 2001, to clear all inflammable materials, install firebreaks and/or remove any fire hazards in accordance with the following, and thereafter to maintain the property clear of all inflammable materials up to and including the 29th March 2002.

The townsites of Badgingarra and Dandaragan shall comply with the aforementioned requirements on or before the 1st day of November 2001, and shall maintain the property clear of all inflammable materials up to and including the 29th March 2002.

Owners and/or Occupiers of any land within the townsites of Dandaragan, Regans Ford, Badgingarra, Cervantes and Jurien Bay on all undeveloped and/or vacant properties shall comply with the following—

That within all townsites, on all undeveloped lots, that a two (2) metre wide firebreak be slashed around all boundaries of each lot and that all inflammable materials be removed from the property.

All properties, which have buildings or structures upon the property, shall remove all/any inflammable materials from the property.

Inflammable material is defined for the purpose of this notice to include bush, dry grasses, timber, boxes, cartons, paper and similar flammable materials, rubbish and any combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees or growing bushes and plants in gardens or lawns.

The Council is aware soil erosion may occur in some circumstances, therefore should soil erosion begin, it is the owners responsibility to stabilise the property with suitable natural material eg: gravel, shell grit, gypsum etc.

NOTE: TREE LIMBS OR ANY COMBUSTABLE MATERIALS MUST NOT BE USED AS A SOIL STABILISER

GENERAL

If, for any reason, it is considered impractical to comply with the requirements of this notice, you may apply in writing to the Council or it's duly authorised officer by no later than the 15th October 2001, for permission to provide alternative fire hazard reduction within the property and include details

outlining what alternatives. If Council or its duly appointed officer does not grant such permission, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

1. Persons who fail to comply with the requirements stated in this order may incur penalties, either by way of infringements or prosecutions, as defined in the Bush Fire Act 1954 Regulations. In addition, should property owners fail to comply with this order, Council can, at any time AFTER the specified dates, enter the property and carry out the required work, where the owner(s) of the property will be liable for all penalties and costs incurred.

2. If the requirements of this order are carried out by burning, such burning must be carried out in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

3. The requirements of this notice are considered to be the minimum standard of fire prevention to protect not only individual properties, but also the district generally. In addition to this order, the Shire of Dandaragan may issue separate special orders on owners or occupiers if a particular fire hazard removal is deemed necessary.
