Wildlife Conservation Act 1950

### Wildlife Conservation Amendment Regulations 2001

Made by the Lieutenant-Governor and deputy of the Governor in Executive Council.

**1. Citation**

These regulations may be cited as the *Wildlife Conservation Amendment Regulations 2001*.

**2. Regulation 63 replaced**

Regulation 63 of the *Wildlife Conservation Regulations 1970\** is repealed and the following regulation is inserted instead —

“

**63. Suspension of section 23**

(1) The operation of section 23(1) of the Act is indefinitely suspended in all parts of the State with respect to the taking of any fauna declared under section 14(2)(ba) of the Act to be fauna which is likely to become extinct, or is rare, or otherwise in need of special protection, other than —

- (a) dugong (*Dugong dugon*);
- (b) loggerhead turtle (*Caretta caretta*);
- (c) leathery turtle (*Dermochelys coriacea*);
- (d) olive ridley turtle (*Lepidochelys olivacea*);
- (e) flatback turtle (*Natator depressus*);
- (f) green turtle (*Chelonia mydas*);
- (g) hawksbill turtle (*Eretmochelys imbricata*);
- (h) saltwater crocodile (*Crocodylus porosus*); and
- (i) Australian freshwater crocodile (*Crocodylus johnstoni*).

- (2) The operation of section 23(1) of the Act is indefinitely suspended in all parts of the State with respect to the taking of flora declared under section 23F of the Act to be rare flora.

## Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2001

Made by the Minister for the Environment and Heritage under section 14(2)(ba) of the Act.

### 1. Citation

This notice may be cited as the *Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2001*.

### 2. Interpretation

In this notice —

“**taxon**” includes any taxon that is described by a family name or a genus name or any other name or description.

Note: The plural form of “taxon” is “taxa”.

### 3. Declaration of specially protected fauna

For the purposes of the Act, all taxa of the fauna —

- (a) specified in Schedule 1, being fauna that is rare or likely to become extinct, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection;
- (b) specified in Schedule 2, being fauna that is presumed to be extinct, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection;
- (c) specified in Schedule 3, being birds that are subject to an agreement between the governments of Australia and

Japan relating to the protection of migratory birds and birds in danger of extinction, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection; and

- (d) specified in Schedule 4 are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection, otherwise than for the reasons mentioned in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c).

#### 4. Revocation

The *Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 1999* is revoked.

## Wildlife Conservation Act 1950

**Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 2001**

Made by the Minister for the Environment and Heritage.

**1. Citation**

This notice may be cited as the *Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 2001*.

**2. Interpretation**

In this notice —

“**extant**” means known to be living in a wild state;

“**protected flora**” means any flora belonging to the classes of flora declared by the Minister under section 6 of the Act to be protected flora by notice published in the *Gazette* 9 October 1987, at p. 3855;

“**taxon**” includes any taxon that is described by a genus name and any other name or description.

Note: The plural form of “taxon” is “taxa”.

**3. Rare flora**

Subject to clause 4, protected flora —

- (a) specified in Schedule 1, being taxa that are extant and considered likely to become extinct or rare and therefore in need of special protection; and
- (b) specified in Schedule 2, being taxa that are presumed to be extinct in the wild and therefore in need of special protection,

are declared to be rare flora for the purposes of section 23F of the Act throughout the State.

**4. Application**

Clause 3 does not apply to those plants of a taxon of protected flora specified in Schedule 1 or 2 that have been planted for any purpose other than such plants that have been planted for the purpose of conservation of that taxon and in accordance with approval given by the Executive Director.

**5. Revocation**

The *Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 1999* is revoked.

Retail Trading Hours Act 1987

### Retail Trading Hours (Christmas and New Year) Exemption Order 2001

Made by the Minister for Consumer and Employment Protection.

#### Part 1 — Preliminary

##### 1. Citation

This order may be cited as the *Retail Trading Hours (Christmas and New Year) Exemption Order 2001*.

##### 2. Interpretation

In this order —

“**motor shop**” means a general retail shop or portion of a general retail shop, as the case requires —

- (a) in, on or from which motor vehicles are sold by way of retail sale; or
- (b) in, on or from which spare parts are sold by way of retail sale in conjunction with the sale of motor vehicles;

“**Perth area**” has the same meaning as in the *Retail Trading Hours (Tourism Precincts) Exemption Order 1996*.

**3. Application**

- (1) This order applies to all general retail shops, other than motor shops, in the metropolitan area.
- (2) This order does not affect the operation of the *Retail Trading Hours Exemption Order (No. 12) 1994*.
- (3) This order does not affect the operation of the *Retail Trading Hours (Rockingham) Exemption Order 1995*.
- (4) This order does not affect the operation of the *Retail Trading Hours (Wanneroo) Exemption Order 1995*.

**Part 2 — Exemptions from Act provisions****4. Application of current exemption order**

The *Retail Trading Hours (Tourism Precincts) Exemption Order 1996* does not apply to a general retail shop on a day to which this Part applies.

**5. Sunday, 16 December 2001**

Each general retail shop to which this order applies is exempted from section 12(1)(d) of the Act on 16 December 2001 provided the shop is closed on that day until 11.00 a.m. and from and after 5.00 p.m..

**6. Wednesday, 19 December 2001**

Each general retail shop to which this order applies is exempted from section 12(1)(a) of the Act on 19 December 2001 provided the shop is closed on that day until 8.00 a.m. and from and after 9.00 p.m..

**7. Friday, 21 December 2001**

Each general retail shop to which this order applies is exempted from section 12(1)(a) of the Act on 21 December 2001 provided the shop is closed on that day until 8.00 a.m. and from and after 9.00 p.m..

**8. Sunday, 23 December 2001**

Each general retail shop to which this order applies is exempted from section 12(1)(d) of the Act on 23 December 2001 provided the shop is closed on that day until 11.00 a.m. and from and after 5.00 p.m..

**Part 3 — 1996 exemption disappplied****9. Part disapplication of *Retail Trading Hours (Tourism Precincts) Exemption Order 1996***

Clause 5 of the *Retail Trading Hours (Tourism Precincts) Exemption Order 1996* does not apply to a general retail shop in

the Perth area on Thursday 20 December 2001 and Thursday 27 December 2001.

*Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes*

**EXTRACTIVE INDUSTRIES LOCAL LAW**

Under the power conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995* and under all other powers, the Council of the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes resolved on 26<sup>th</sup> July 2001 to make the following local law.

The Shire of Donnybrook-Balingup Extractive Industries Local Law published in the *Government Gazette* on 9<sup>th</sup> June 1998 is adopted as a local law of the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes, with the alterations that follow—

### **1. Clause 1.1—Definitions**

1.1 In Clause 1.1—

- (a) in the definition of 'local government', delete 'Shire of Donnybrook-Balingup' and substitute 'Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes'
- (b) Insert in the appropriate alphabetical position—  
"person" or any word or expression descriptive of a person includes a public body, company, or association or body of persons, corporate or unincorporate but does not include the local government.

### **2. Clause 1.2—Application**

2.1 After the clause designation "1.2" the subclause designation "(1)" is inserted.

2.2 In clause 1.2(1)—

- (a) in paragraph (a) delete "and (d)" and substitute ", (d) "
- (b) in paragraph (c) delete "and"
- (c) delete existing paragraph (d)
- (d) insert the following paragraph—  
"(d) do not apply to the carrying on of an extractive industry on land by the owner or occupier of that land for exclusive use on that land, where no extracted material will be transported on a public road"

2.3 After clause 1.2(1) insert the following subclause—

- "(2) In subclause (1)(d) land includes adjoining lots or locations in the same occupation or ownership of the owner or occupier referred to in subclause (1)(d)."

### **3. Clause 1.3—Repeal**

3.1 Delete clause 1.3.

### **4. Clause 2.3—Application for Licence**

4.1 After the clause designation "2.3(1)" delete "A" and substitute "Subject to subclause (3), a".

4.2 In clause 2.3(1)(a) delete "3" and substitute "2".

4.3 In clause 2.3(1)(b) delete "3" and substitute "2".

4.4 In clause 2.3(1)(c) delete "3" and substitute "2".

4.5 In clause 2.3(1)(c), subparagraph (v) delete "and irrigated".

4.6 In clause 2.3(1)—

- (a) renumber paragraphs (i) and (j) to (j) and (k) respectively
- (b) insert the following as paragraph (i)—  
"evidence that a notice of clearing has been given to the Commissioner of Soil and Land Conservation if that is required under regulation 4 of the *Soil and Land Conservation Regulations 1992*"
- (c) in renumbered paragraph (j), insert "reasonably" after "may".

4.7 After clause 2.3(2) insert the following subclause—

- "(3) The local government may exempt a person making application for a licence under subclause (1) from providing any of the data otherwise required under subclause (1), if, in the opinion of the local government, the location and size of the proposed excavation are such that no significant adverse environmental affects will result therefrom."

### **5. Clause 3.1—Determination of Application**

5.1 In clause 3.1(3)(a)—

- (a) substitute "10 years" for "21 years"

5.2 In clause 3.1(5)—

- (a) renumber paragraphs (q) and (r) to (r) and (s) respectively
- (b) "requiring the licensee to enter into an agreement with the local government by which it agrees to pay any extraordinary expenses incurred by the local government in repairing damage caused to roads in the district by heavy or extraordinary traffic conducted by or on behalf of the licensee under the licence".

### **6. Clause 5.2—Use by the Local Government of Secured Sum**

6.1 In clause 5.2(1) in paragraph (c), after "may carry out" insert "or cause to be carried out".

### **7. Clause 6.2—Prohibitions**

7.1 In clause 6.2(c), delete "site to which the licence applies" and substitute "area excavated under the licence".

**8. Clause 6.3(1)—Blasting**

8.1 In clause 6.3(1)(c), delete "Environment" and substitute "Environmental".

8.2 In clause 6.3(1)(d)—

- (a) insert "and" after subparagraph (ii)
- (b) delete subparagraphs (iii) and (iv)
- (c) renumber subparagraph (v) to (iii).

**9. Forms 3, 4 & 5**

9.1 In Forms 3, 4 and 5, delete "Shire of Donnybrook-Balingup" whenever it occurs and substitute "Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes".
