Financial Administration and Audit Act 1985

**Financial Administration Amendment
Regulations 2001**

Made by the Lieutenant-Governor and deputy of the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Financial Administration Amendment Regulations 2001*.

2. Regulation 24A inserted

After regulation 24 of the *Financial Administration Regulations 1986** the following regulation is inserted —

“

24A. Internal audit function — exemptions

- (1) For the purposes of section 53(f) or 55(f) of the Act, the Treasurer may exempt the accountable officer of a department or the accountable authority of a statutory authority respectively from the responsibility to develop and maintain an effective internal audit function if —
 - (a) adequate internal controls and adequate financial reporting practices are in place in the department or statutory authority; or
 - (b) the costs incurred or likely to be incurred in developing and maintaining an effective internal audit function would or would be likely to outweigh the benefits.
- (2) An exemption is subject to the following conditions —
 - (a) the condition that the accountable officer or accountable authority notifies the Treasurer of any changes that affect or could affect the internal controls or reporting practices of the department or statutory authority;
 - (b) any other condition specified in the exemption.

- (3) An exemption remains in force until one of the following happens —
- (a) a condition of the exemption is contravened;
 - (b) the exemption is revoked;
 - (c) the period specified in the exemption ends.
- (4) The period specified in an exemption must not exceed 3 years.

”.

The boundary of the Harvey Dam Catchment Area is altered so that the boundary is —

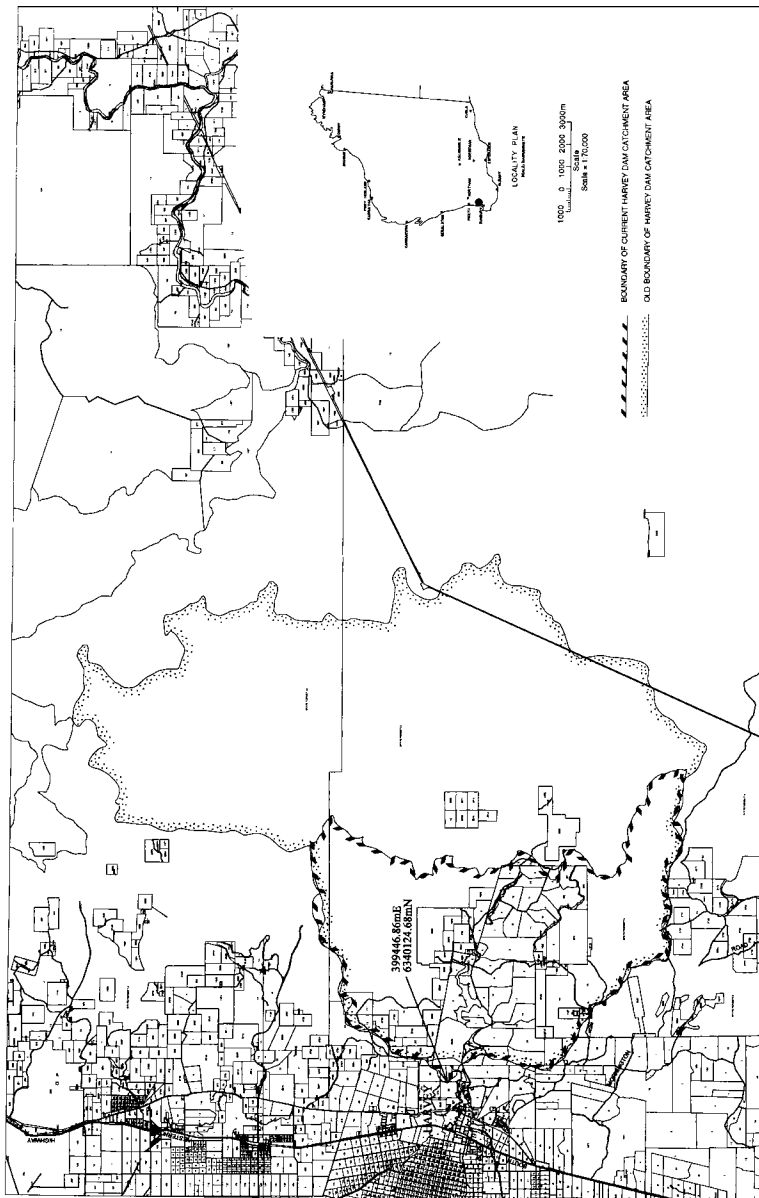
- (a) as shown bordered  on plan WRC13082-01 held by the Water and Rivers Commission at its office at 3 Plain Street, East Perth; and

FISH RESOURCES MANAGEMENT ACT 1994

ONSLOW PRAWN MANAGED FISHERY MANAGEMENT PLAN AMENDMENT 2001

FD 529/01 [422]

Made by the Minister under section 54.

Citation

1. This amendment may be cited as the *Onslow Prawn Managed Fishery Management Plan Amendment 2001*.

Principal Plan

2. In this amendment the *Onslow Prawn Management Plan 1991** is referred to as the principal Plan.

Clause 2 amended

3. Clause 2 of the principle Plan is amended by inserting in alphabetical order the following—

“try net” means a trawl net having a headrope length not exceeding 5 metres.”.

Clause 11 amended

4. Clause 11 of the principal Plan is amended by inserting immediately after—

(a) “11.”, the following—

“1”, and

(b) paragraph (b) the following subclause—

“(2) In addition to or instead of any means of fishing for prawns authorised or approved under subclause 11(1) a person may fish for prawns with a single try net.”.

Clause 12 amended

5. Clause 12 of the principle Plan is amended by;

(a) deleting from subclause (1) the words from and including “subclass” to and including “anchoring” and replacing them with the following—

“this clause the Master of a boat licensed to operate in the Fishery must ensure that all otter boards are stowed on board and all trawl nets are unshackled from the otter boards and are lowered on deck while the boat is moving through or is anchored”;

(b) deleting from subclass (2) the words “securely attached to the boat and”; and

(c) inserting immediately after subclass (6) the following subclass—

“(7) Despite clause 12(1)(b) a net may be streamed for one hour immediately following the closure of a part of the Fishery if all otter boards are kept clear of the water at all times.”.

Clause 13 amended

6. Clause 13 of the principal Plan is deleted and replaced by the following clause—

“13.(1) It is a condition of every “C” Class licence that the boat to which it applies is a boat to which a licence under the *Exmouth Gulf Prawn Management Plan 1989* also applies.

(2) It is a condition of every “D” Class licence that the boat to which it applies is a boat to which a licence under the *Nickol Bay Prawn Management Plan 1991* also applies.”.

FISH RESOURCES MANAGEMENT ACT 1994

PROHIBITION ON FISHING (COTTESLOE REEF) ORDER 2001

FD 896/99 [443]

Made by the Minister under section 43.

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the *Prohibition on Fishing (Cottesloe Reef) Order 2001*.

Prohibition on commercial fishing

2. A person must not fish for a commercial purpose in the waters specified in Schedule 1.

Prohibition on non-commercial fishing

3. A person must not fish for a non-commercial purpose in the waters specified in Schedule 1.

Exception to prohibition on non-commercial fishing

4. Clause 3 of this Order does not apply in the circumstances specified in Schedule 2.

Prohibition on certain forms of bait

5. A person must not use blood or offal for the purpose of attracting fish in the waters specified in Schedule 1.

Schedule 1

All those waters bounded by—

- (a) the high water mark,
- (b) a line drawn 800 metres westward from the high water mark (being a prolongation of the centre of Grant Street, Cottesloe where Grant Street meets with Marine Parade, Cottesloe),
- (c) a line drawn 800 metres westward from a point on the high water mark west of a point fifty metres north of the northernmost part of the Leighton Railway Overpass where it meets Curtin Avenue, Cottesloe, and
- (d) a line linking the westernmost points of the lines described in (b) and (c).

Schedule 2

A person authorised under the Act may fish for abalone and rock lobster (being all fish of those common names described by the scientific classification opposite those names in Column 2 of Schedule 7 of the regulations).

A person fishing for Shark (all species of the superorder *Salachoidei*) pursuant to an exemption under s.7 of the Act.

A person may fish for Osteichthyes.
A person may fish with a single rod and line.

COTTESLOE REEF FISH HABITAT PROTECTION AREA ORDER 2001

FD 896/99 [442]

Made by the Minister under section 115.

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the *Cottesloe Reef Fish Habitat Protection Area Order 2001*.

Definition

2. In this Order "waters of the Cottesloe Reef" means all those waters bounded by—
- the high water mark,
 - a line drawn 800 metres westward from the high water mark (being a prolongation of the centre of Grant Street, Cottesloe where Grant Street meets with Marine Parade, Cottesloe),
 - a line drawn 800 metres westward from a point on the high water mark west of a point fifty metres north of the northernmost part of the Leighton Railway Overpass where it meets Curtin Avenue, Cottesloe, and
 - a line linking the westernmost points of the lines described in (b) and (c).

Area of WA waters set aside as fish habitat protection area

3. The waters of the Cottesloe Reef are set aside as a fish habitat protection area.

Purposes for which area is set aside

4. The purposes for which the waters of the Cottesloe Reef are set aside as a fish habitat protection area are the—
- conservation and protection of fish, fish breeding areas, fish fossils and the aquatic ecosystem; and
 - management of fish and activities relating to the appreciation and observation of fish.
