(COCKBURN SOUND) POLICY 2001

The Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) has prepared a draft *Environmental Protection (Cockburn Sound) Policy 2001*. The policy provides for the ongoing management of Cockburn Sound within a defined policy area. This draft policy details the environmental values to be protected and the programme for protection. A draft *Cockburn Sound Environmental Management Plan* has been developed by the Cockburn Sound Management Council to assist in the implementation of this policy.

FISH RESOURCES MANAGEMENT ACT 1994

PILBARA FISH TRAWL FISHERY (INTERIM) MANAGEMENT PLAN AMENDMENT 2001

FD 2234/99 [397]

Made by the Minister under section 54.

Citation

1. This amendment may be cited as the *Pilbara Fish Trawl Fishery (Interim) Management Plan Amendment 2001*.

Principal Plan

2. In this amendment the *Pilbara Fish Trawl Fishery Interim Managed Fishery Management Plan 1997** is referred to as the principal Plan.

Clause 4 amended

3. Clause 4 of the principal Plan is amended by deleting the definitions of—
- (a) “authorised Nickol Bay Prawn Fishery boat”; and
 - (b) “NBPMF licence”.

Clause 12 amended

4. The principal Plan is amended by deleting clause 12(2).

Clause 17 deleted

5. The principal Plan is amended by deleting clause 17.

Clause 19 amended

6. Clause 19(8)(b) of the principal Plan is amended by deleting “72” and replacing it with the following—

“48”.

Clause 21 amended

7. Clause 21 of the principal Plan is amended by—

(a) deleting subclause (1);

(b) deleting in subclause (2) the following—

“authorised boat shows that the boat is a Zone or Area of the Fishery”

and replacing it with the following—

“authorised boat shows that the boat is in a Zone or Area of the Fishery”; and

(c) adding after subclause (2) the following—

“(3) If an authorised boat is in an unauthorised area of the Fishery the time for which that boat is in that unauthorised area (in this subclause referred to as “the period”) is to be taken to have been time used—

(a) prior to the period; and

(b) in the last Area in which authorised fishing took place using that boat.

(4) For the purpose of determining the exercise of an entitlement following a nomination made in accordance with subclause 28(1)(c), subject to subclause (3) fishing shall be taken to have commenced when the authorised boat has entered any Area of the Fishery in which, according to this Plan, it may be used for fishing, and fishing shall be taken to have ceased when the boat leaves that Area.”.

Clause 26 amended

8. The principal Plan is amended by deleting clause 26 and replacing it with the following—

“Grounds for refusal to transfer a permit

26. The Executive Director may refuse to transfer a permit if the total licence fee for that permit has not been paid.”.

Clause 27 amended

9. The principal Plan is amended by deleting Clause 27 and replacing it with the following—

“Grounds to cancel a permit

27. It shall be grounds for the Executive Director to cancel a permit if other than fish trawl units transferred in accordance with clause 24, all the fish trawl units are transferred from that permit.”.

Clause 28 amended

10. The principal Plan is amended by deleting clause 28 and replacing it with the following—

“Presence in the Fishery

28. (1) The master of an authorised boat must, when intending to fish within the Fishery, not use that boat—

(a) to enter the waters of the Fishery; or

(b) outside a port area within the waters of the Fishery;

at any time when any part of the Fishery is open to fishing unless—

(c) the Department has received from the master of that boat a nomination of intention to enter the Fishery and comply with the requirements of the Management Plan; and

(d) that nomination is current.

(2) If the Department receives a nomination in accordance with subclause 1(c) in any calendar year, that nomination is current for the remainder of that year unless—

(a) the Department receives a nomination from the master of that boat cancelling it;

(b) the boat leaves the waters of the Fishery; or

(c) the boat is used in accordance with the *Nickol Bay Prawn Management Plan 1991* to fish in that part of the waters of the Fishery that coincides with the waters of the Nickol Bay Prawn Limited Entry Fishery.

(3) The master of an authorised boat must not use that boat to enter or be underway in an unauthorised area of the Fishery either in the waters of the Fishery west of 116° east longitude or within Zone 2 unless the Department—

(a) has received a nomination to enter or be underway in an unauthorised area of the Fishery (as the case may be); and

(b) received the nomination no more than one hour before the boat entered or was underway in that unauthorised area.

(4) For the purposes of section 62(1) of the Act and this clause the areas specified are those detailed in Schedules 1, 2, and 3.

(5) Any nomination to the Department made in accordance with this clause must be made using an ALC in accordance with the approved directions for use.

(6) In any proceedings for an offence against the Act, unless proven to the contrary, the position of an authorised boat received by the Department from an ALC installed on that boat is to be taken to be conclusive evidence of the actual position of that boat at that time.

(7) For the purpose of this clause, if a person uses an authorised boat on behalf of another person they are both taken to have so used the boat.”.

Clause 29 amended

11. (1) Subclause 29(a) of the principal Plan is amended by—

- (a) deleting “28(1),” and “28(2),” and
- (b) deleting “and 29(3)” and substituting for it the following—
“or 28(3)”.

(2) Subclause 29(b) of the principal Plan is amended by deleting “or 28(2)(b)” and substituting for it the following—

“, 28(1) or 28(5)”.

Borden

Issued by the Water Corporation under By-law 2(3) of the *Water Agencies (Water Restrictions) By-laws 1998*.

Notice is hereby given that the Stage 5 water restrictions applied (pursuant to the notice published in the *Government Gazette* on 11 September 2001) to every person using water supplied by the Water Corporation in the town of Borden are substituted with Stage 4 water restrictions with effect from Friday 21 December 2001 until further notice.

STAGE 4 WATER RESTRICTIONS

- (1) A person must not water a lawn or garden except by—
- reticulation during either, but not both, the morning period or the evening period on one or both of 2 days of the week specified in relation to the relevant property;
 - a hand held hose with one outlet; or
 - a hand held watering can.
- (2) A person must not spray a building, path, paved area or road except to the minimum extent necessary for—
- fire fighting;
 - the cleaning of the building, path, paved area or road so as to avoid a threat to public health; or
 - the construction or repair of the building, path, paved area or road.
- (3) A person must not fill a swimming pool except to the minimum extent necessary to maintain the proper functioning of the pool by replacing water lost through evaporation or ordinary use.

Note—

“morning period” means the period before 9.00 a.m.

“evening period” means the period after 6.00 p.m.

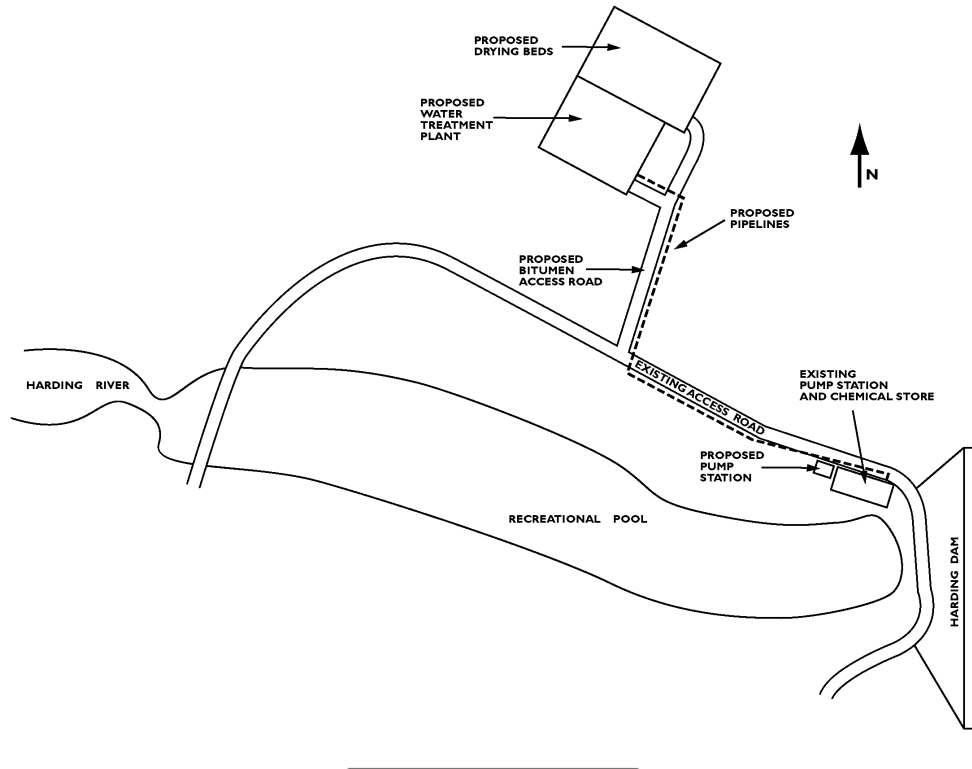

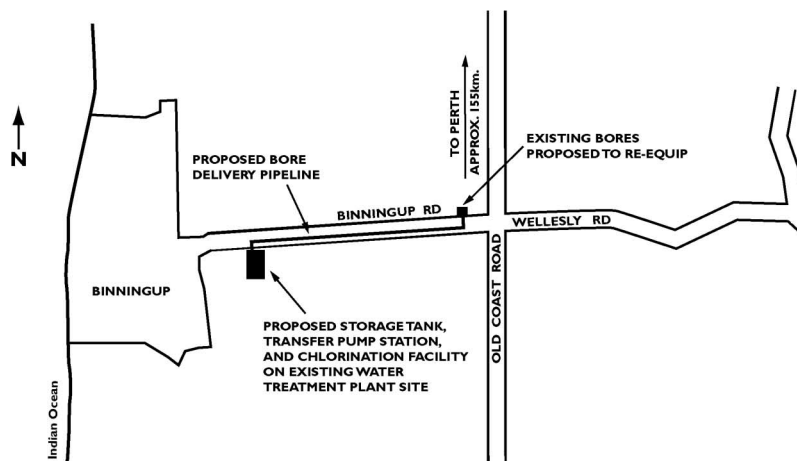
