Plant Diseases Act 1914

Plant Diseases Amendment Regulations (No. 6) 2001

Made by the Lieutenant-Governor and deputy of the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Plant Diseases Amendment Regulations (No. 6) 2001*.

2. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Plant Diseases Regulations 1989*.*

3. Regulation 17C inserted

After regulation 17B the following regulation is inserted —

“

17C. Banana plants (*Musa spp.*) — Panama Disease Tropical Race 4

(1) In this regulation —

“quarantine area” means —

- (a) the area within 50 kilometres of the Broome Post Office;
- (b) the area within 50 kilometres of the Carnarvon Post Office; or
- (c) the area within 50 kilometres of the Kununurra Post Office.

(2) This regulation applies to a covering that contains banana fruit grown or packed within 50 kilometres of a known outbreak of Panama Disease Tropical Race 4 (*Fusarium oxysporum f. sp. cubense*).

- (3) A person shall not take or send a covering to which this regulation applies into a quarantine area from another part of the State, unless the covering is stamped in accordance with subregulation (5).
- (4) A person shall not take delivery, in a quarantine area, of a covering to which this regulation applies from another part of the State, unless the covering is stamped in accordance with subregulation (5).
- (5) The covering is to be stamped in an approved manner to indicate that the covering and its contents have been inspected by an inspector and found to be free of soil and plant debris.
- (6) For the purposes of regulation 16(1) —
 - (a) a quarantine area is a specified portion of the State; and
 - (b) Panama Disease Tropical Race 4 (*Fusarium oxysporum f. sp. cubense*) is a specified disease.

4. Regulation 17F amended

“ April ”.

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995* and under all other powers, the Council of the Shire of Dowerin, resolved on the 16th day of October 2001 to make the following local law—

The Shire of Donnybrook/Balingup local law relating to Activities on Thoroughfares and Trading in Thoroughfares and public places Local Law published in the *Government Gazette* 17th October 2000, is adopted as a local law of the Shire of Dowerin, with such alterations as here set out—

1. Preliminary

1.1 Wherever the “Shire of Donnybrook/Balingup” is mentioned in the local law substitute the “Shire of Dowerin”.

1.2 Delete Clause 1.4 Repeal and substitute—

“1.4 Repeal

The following laws are repealed—

Activities on Thoroughfares and Trading in Thoroughfares and Public Places published in the *Government Gazette* 12th June 2001”.

2. Part 2—Activities on Thoroughfares and Public Place

2.1 Delete Subclause “2.1(h)”

3. Part 3—Verge Treatments

3.1 Delete the whole of Division 3.

3.2 Delete “*Division 4—Public Works*” and substitute “*Division 3—Public Works*”

3.3 Renumber Clause “3.8” to “3.7”

4. Part 4—Advertising Signs on Thoroughfares

4.1 Insert the following Clause as—

“4.5 conditions on election sign.

If the local government approves an application for a permit for the erection or placement of an election sign on a thoroughfare, the application is to be taken to be approved subject to the sign—

- (a) being erected at least 30m from any intersection;
- (b) being free standing and not being affixed to any existing sign, post, power or light pole or similar structure;
- (c) being placed so as not obstruct or impede the reasonable use of a thoroughfare, or access to a place by any person;
- (d) being placed so as not to obstruct or impede the vision of a driver of a vehicle entering or leaving a thoroughfare or crossing;
- (e) being maintained in good condition;
- (f) not being erected until the election to which it relates has been officially announced;
- (g) being removed within 24 hours of the close of polls on voting day;
- (h) Not being placed within 100m of any works on the thoroughfare;
- (i) Being securely installed;
- (j) Not being an illuminated sign;
- (k) Not incorporating reflective or fluorescent materials; and
- (l) Not displaying only part of a message, which is to be read with other separate signs in order to obtain the whole message.”

DETERMINATION OF STANDARD RATES OF INTEREST

Ministry of Housing (The State Housing Commission),
Perth, 30 April 2001.

Pursuant to Sections 33 and 42 being loans under Section 36 of the Housing Act 1980, The State Housing Commission by this determination which was approved by the Honourable Minister for Housing fixes the following maximum standard rates of interest to apply in respect of the various classes of loan granted by it.

1. Keystart Loans, Income Based Loans, pre 1985 Variable Interest Schemes and Wisechoice under Sections 33 and 36 to 5.99% per annum.
2. In respect of Shared Equity 1994 (Real Start) (Subsidised Rate) Loans the standard rate of interest shall be 6.5% per annum rising by 1.0% per annum on every June 30 subsequent to the date from which interest is to be calculated until the rate of interest is 5.99% per annum.
3. In respect of Shared Equity 1994 (Aboriginal) (Subsidised Rate) Loans the standard rate of interest shall be 6.5% per annum rising 0.5% per annum on every June 30 subsequent to the date from which interest is to be calculated until the rate of interest is 5.99% per annum.
4. In respect of Shared Equity 1994 (Access) (Subsidised Rate) Loans the standard rate of interest shall be 6.5% per annum rising 0.5% per annum on every June 30 subsequent to the date from which interest is to be calculated until the rate of interest is 5.99% per annum.
5. In respect of Shared Equity 1994 (Real Start) (Unsubsidised Rate) Loans the standard rate of interest shall be 5.99% per annum.
6. In respect of Shared Equity 1997 (GoodStart) (Subsidised Rate) Loans the standard rate of interest shall be 6.5% fixed per annum, until the borrowers' income exceeds Homeswest's maximum rental income eligibility limits. The rate will then move to the Commonwealth Bank standard home loan variable interest rate subject a minimum interest rate of 6.5% per annum.

This determination shall take effect from December 17, 2001.
