Environmental Protection Act 1986

Environmental Protection Amendment Regulations 2002

Made by the Governor in Executive Council on the recommendation of the Environmental Protection Authority.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Environmental Protection Amendment Regulations 2002*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation on the same day as the *Environmental Protection (Rural Landfill) Regulations 2002* come into operation.

3. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Environmental Protection Regulations 1987**.

1. Citation

These by-laws may be cited as the *Evaporites (Lake MacLeod) (Cape Cuvier Berth) Amendment By-laws 2001*.

2. *Evaporites (Lake MacLeod) (Cape Cuvier Berth) By-laws 1991* amended

By-law 3 of *Evaporites (Lake MacLeod) (Cape Cuvier Berth) By-laws 1991* is amended in the definition of “related

corporation” by deleting “Corporations Law of Western Australia” and inserting instead —

“ *Corporations Act 2001* of the Commonwealth ”.

Government Railways Act 1904

Kojonup — Farrar Railway Order 2002

Made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 66A.

1. Citation

This order may be cited as the *Kojonup — Farrar Railway Order 2002*.

2. Interpretation

In this order —

“**Kojonup — Farrar Railway**” means the portion of a railway described in Schedule 1.

3. Declaration

It is declared that the Kojonup — Farrar Railway is not, while this order remains in force, a Government railway for the purposes of the Act.

4. Grant

- (1) Subject to the conditions in Schedule 2, the Shire of Kojonup is granted the right, while this order remains in force, to occupy the Kojonup — Farrar Railway for a tourist railway and, subject to the *Rail Safety Act 1998*, to manage, operate and maintain a tourist railway service on it.
- (2) The right granted by subclause (1) is not capable of being transferred.

5. Term of order

- (1) Unless it is revoked under subclause (2), this order remains in force for a period of 25 years commencing on the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.
- (2) This order may be revoked under section 66A(4)(b) of the Act if —
 - (a) the Shire of Kojonup has contravened any of the conditions set out in Schedule 2 or a provision of the *Rail Safety Act 1998*;
 - (b) the Shire of Kojonup has ceased to operate a tourist railway service on the Kojonup — Farrar Railway; or
 - (c) a period of at least 5 years after the day on which this order is published in the *Gazette* has elapsed and the Minister responsible for the administration of the *Government Railways Act 1904* decides that the Kojonup — Farrar Railway is required for use by the Commission.

Schedule 1 — Kojonup — Farrar Railway

[cl. 2]

That section of railway and all necessary land appurtenant to the railway constructed under the authority of the *Katanning — Kojonup Railway Act 1905* and the *Boyup — Kojonup Railway Act 1909* being that part of the land contained in Titles Office Plan 2952 Sheet 4 and Plan 3311 Sheets 22 to 26 inclusive between the alignment of the western boundary of reserve 10691 and the Broomehill Road crossing at Kojonup, but excluding that portion contained in Western Australian Government Railways lease number 6685.

Schedule 2 — Conditions

[cl. 4]

1. Interpretation

In this Schedule —

“**civil liability**” means any liability, based in tort, contract, statute, or otherwise, in respect of —

- (a) any damage to property; or

- (b) any injury to, or death of, a person, resulting from the condition or use of the Kojonup — Farrar Railway or the operation of a tourist railway on it;

“**Minister for Lands**” means the body corporate continued under section 7(1) of the *Land Administration Act 1997*.

2. Indemnity

- (1) The Shire of Kojonup is required, in writing, to indemnify the State of Western Australia, the Minister for Lands, the Commission, and their servants, agents, contractors and subcontractors against any civil liability that may arise while the order is in force.
- (2) The indemnity is to be in terms acceptable to the Minister for Lands.

3. Insurance policy

- (1) The Shire of Kojonup is required to obtain and maintain an insurance policy covering —
- (a) the Shire’s liability under the indemnity required by condition 2; and
 - (b) any civil liability of the Shire or any of its servants, agents, contractors, or subcontractors, that may arise while the order is in force.
- (2) The insurance policy is required —
- (a) to be obtained from an insurer acceptable to the Minister for Lands and the Commission; and
 - (b) to be in terms acceptable to the Minister for Lands and the Commission.
- (3) The Shire of Kojonup is required each year to give to the Minister for Lands and the Commission a copy of a certificate of currency from the insurer for the insurance policy within 14 days of its receipt by the Shire.

4. Changes to the Kojonup — Farrar Railway

The Shire of Kojonup cannot, without the written approval of the Commission —

- (a) alter or remove from the Kojonup — Farrar Railway any building, fence, track or other structure or fixture; or
- (b) carry out any excavation or earthworks on the Kojonup — Farrar Railway.

Jetties Act 1926

Jetties Amendment Regulations 2002

Made by the Lieutenant-Governor and deputy of the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Jetties Amendment Regulations 2002*.

2. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Jetties Act Regulations 1940**.

3. Regulation 2 inserted

After regulation 1 the following regulation is inserted —

“

2. Liability for dues, charges and fees

Unless otherwise stated in a specific regulation, the owner and the master of a vessel are jointly and severally liable for the dues, charges and fees incurred by, or in relation to, the vessel or its cargo under these regulations.

”

4. Regulation 3 amended

Regulation 3(1) is amended as follows:

- (a) by rearranging the definitions into alphabetical order;
- (b) by inserting in the appropriate alphabetical positions the following definitions —

“

“**Master**” means a person, other than a pilot, having command or charge of a vessel.

“**Owner**”, in relation to a vessel, means —

- (a) if the vessel is owned by an individual, that individual;

- (b) if the vessel is owned by a body corporate or unincorporate, that body;
- (c) a person who is purchasing the vessel under a contract that is a credit sale contract for the purposes of the *Credit Act 1984*;
- (d) a person who is the purchaser or hirer of the vessel under a contract that for the purposes of the Consumer Credit (Western Australia) Code is a credit contract, or is to be regarded as a credit contract, to which that Code applies;
- (e) a person who has the use of the vessel under a hiring, hire purchase, lease, loan, charter or other agreement;
- (f) a person who holds a current Certificate of Survey of the vessel, or in whose name the vessel is registered, but does not include an unpaid vendor under a hire purchase agreement or the lessor under a lease.

”

5. Regulation 70A replaced

Regulation 70A is repealed and the following regulation is inserted instead —

“

70A. Rottnest Island berthing fee

The berthing fee set out in Appendix IA is payable when a vessel is berthed at the Main Ferry Jetty at Rottnest Island.

6. Regulation 94A replaced

Regulation 94A is repealed and the following regulation is inserted instead —

“

94A. Fees, etc. for pen rentals and services

The fees and charges payable for pen rentals and services in particular ports and harbours (other than the Port of Perth) are as set out in Appendix III Part 1.
