Adoption Amendment Regulations 2002

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Adoption Amendment Regulations 2002*.

2. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Adoption Regulations 1995**.

3. Regulation 38 amended

Regulation 38(4)(a) is deleted and the following paragraph is inserted instead —

“

(a) pay —

(i) the fee referred to in regulation 87(a);
and

- (ii) the fee referred to in regulation 87(b) or (c), as is relevant to the case,

unless the applicant is exempted under regulation 88(1) or (2) from paying the particular fee;

”

4. Regulation 44 amended

Regulation 44 is amended as follows:

- (a) after paragraph (b) by deleting “or”;
- (b) after paragraph (c) by deleting the full stop and inserting —

“

; or

- (d) the person adopts a child under an adoption order.

”

5. Regulation 87 replaced and regulation 87A inserted

Regulation 87 is repealed and the following regulations are inserted instead —

“

87. Fees on proceeding with application to be prospective adoptive parent

The fees for the purposes of regulation 38(4)(a) are as follows —

- (a) \$750 for registration as an applicant to be a prospective adoptive parent;
- (b) \$986 for the preparation of the assessment report under section 40 of the Act in the case where the applicant or the joint applicants have not previously adopted a child;
- (c) \$650 for the preparation of the assessment report under section 40 of the Act in the case where the applicant or the joint applicants have previously adopted a child.

87A. Fee for preparation of report for Court in step-parent adoptions

A fee of \$450 is payable for the preparation of a report under section 61 of the Act if the report is required in relation to an application for an order for a child to be adopted by a step-parent.

6. Regulation 88 replaced

Regulation 88 is repealed and the following regulation is inserted instead —

“

88. Exemptions from paying fees

- (1) A person is exempted from paying all the fees referred to in regulation 87 if the person proceeds with the application under section 38 of the Act in respect of the adoption of a child who, in the opinion of the Director General, has a disability.
- (2) A person is exempted from paying the fee referred to in regulation 87(b) or (c), as is relevant to the case, if the person proceeds with the application under section 38 of the Act in respect of the adoption of a child who resides, or is domiciled, in the State at the time the application is proceeded with.

”.

**Radiation Safety (General) Amendment
Regulations (No. 2) 2002**

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Radiation Safety (General) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2002*.

2. The regulations amended

3. Regulation 5 amended

Regulation 5(4) is amended as follows:

- (a) at the end of paragraph (a) by deleting “or”;
- (b) by deleting paragraph (b) and inserting the following paragraphs instead —

“

- (b) a personal timekeeping or other device referred to in subregulation (1)(d) which does not comply with the requirements set out in Schedule VI; or
- (c) a gaseous self-luminous device which is not a self-luminous device referred to in subregulation (1)(e),

”.

4. Schedule VI amended

Schedule VI is amended as follows:

- (a) in Table 1 by deleting “280 megabecquerels” and inserting instead —
“ 1 gigabecquerel ”;

POISONS ACT 1964

POISONS (AUTHORIZED POSSESSION OF SUBSTANCES) ORDER 2002

Made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 41 of the Act.

Citation

1. This order may be cited as the *Poisons (Authorized Possession of Substances) Order 2002*.

Commencement

2. This order comes into operation on the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.

Revocation

3. The *Poisons (Authorized Possession of Substances) Order 2001** is revoked.

Interpretation

4. In this order—

“**Hakea Complex**” means the Hakea Prison Complex, Nicholson Road, Canning Vale;

“**specified substances**” means the amount of the substance included in Schedule 9 to the Act, possession of which is authorized under clause 5.

Possession of certain substance authorized

5. Subject to clause 6, the people listed in the table to this clause are authorized to together possess at the places mentioned in Schedule 1, and while travelling directly between any of those places, not more than —

- (a) 1kg of cannabis;
- (b) 5g of cannabis resin;
- (c) 100g of heroin; and
- (d) 100g of 3,4-Methylenedioxy-N,a-Dimethylphenylethylamine (MDMA),

for the purpose of training animals in the detection of those substances.

Conditions of authorized possession

- (b) written records relating to the specified substances are maintained at the Hakea Complex, as directed by the Commissioner of Health; and
- (c) that, if requested by the Commissioner of Health, any oral information or written report relating to the specified substances is given to the Commissioner.

Expiry

7. This order expires on 30 September 2002.

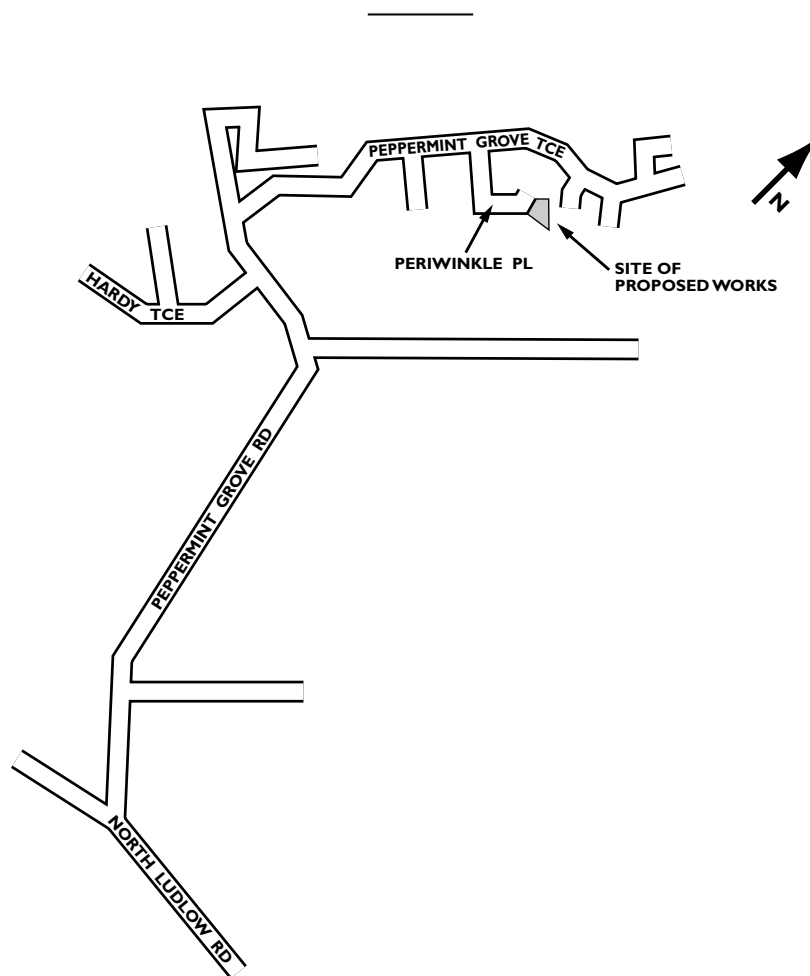
