BUSH FIRES ACT. 1954*City of Geraldton***NOTICE TO ALL OWNERS AND/OR OCCUPIERS OF LAND IN THE CITY OF GERALDTON**

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are required, on or before the 15th day of November of each year, or within 14 days of the date of your becoming an owner or occupier should this be after the 15th day of November to remove from the land owned or occupied by you, all inflammable materials or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of March the following year—

- i. Where the area of land is 2020 Square Metres or less, all inflammable material on the land shall be removed from the whole of the land.
- ii. Where the land exceeds 2020 Square Metres in area, firebreaks at least 3 metres wide and high shall be cleared of all inflammable materials immediately—
 - (a) inside all external boundaries of the land; and
 - (b) surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

Inflammable material is defined for the purpose of this notice to include bush, timber, boxes, cartons, paper and like inflammable materials, rubbish and also any combustible matter, but does not include living trees, shrubs, growing bushes and plants under cultivation.

For the purpose of this notice, clearing includes ploughing, cultivation, scarifying, slashing, mowing or to otherwise clear the land or firebreaks as determined above. Where the option of mowing is preferred, the height of the grass when slashed shall not exceed 150mm.

Burning of any rubbish or refuse is not permitted within the City of Geraldton without Council permission; therefore burning of vegetation for clearing purposes is not a permitted method, except in special circumstances approval may be authorised by the Manager of Administration on receipt of a written application.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks by this notice, you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer, no later than the 1st day of November of each year, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by Council or its duly authorised officer, you are to comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is either \$100.00 infringement or a court fine to the maximum of \$1000. A person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

WATER SKI AREA

Belmont

Acting pursuant to the powers conferred by Regulation 48A of the Navigable Waters Regulations 1989, the Department by this notice revokes the boundary description as published in Notice TR411 of the *Government Gazette* dated 8 August 1997 and substitutes the following—

Belmont: All the waters commencing from a line drawn at 017 degrees true across the river 80 metres upstream of the eastern edge of the Orrong Road Boat Launching Ramp extending

downstream for 1000 metres to a line drawn at 270 degrees true from the eastern foreshore to the western foreshore dissecting the first starboard navigation marker downstream of the boat launching ramp, located at approximately 31°56.75' S 115°53.74' E. (coordinates based on GDA94). All water skiing in this area is to be carried out in an anti clockwise direction.

Providing however: No motor boat or water skier shall approach within 45 metres of the river bank and no water ski take-off or landing shall be permitted on any foreshore within this area except at the designated area on the southern foreshore situated 225 metres downstream of the boat launching ramp and extending along the foreshore for 70 metres thence recommencing 185 metres further downstream for 125 metres as marked by signs on the foreshore.
