1. This notice may be cited as the *Pesticides (Regulation 20B) (Prohibition of Specified Registered Pesticides) Notice 2003*.

Commencement

2. This notice comes into operation on 1 March 2003.

Interpretation

3. In this notice –

“**use**” means application of a specified registered pesticide on a specified crop by means of aerial spraying;

“**specified registered pesticide**” means a registered pesticide specified in the table to this notice;

“**specified crop**” means a Eucalyptus spp. plantation.

Prohibition

4. The use of a specified registered pesticide on a specified crop growing anywhere in the State is prohibited until 29 February 2004.

TOWN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT 1928

STATEMENT OF PLANNING POLICY NO. 7

LEEWIN - NATURALISTE RIDGE

(Amendment No. 1 – Smiths Beach)

In accordance with section 5AA of the Town Planning and Development Act 1928, the Western Australian Planning Commission has prepared changes to the Leeuwin - Naturaliste Ridge Statement of Planning Policy (No. 7). The Statement of Planning Policy was first published in the *Government Gazette* on 18 September 1998.

Statement of Planning Policy No. 7 is amended as set out hereunder. The amendments have been approved by the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure and the Governor in accordance with section 5AA. The amendments have force and effect from 22 January 2003 being the date following the Governor's approval.

Amendments to Statement of Planning Policy No. 7: Leeuwin-Naturaliste Ridge (in relation to Smiths Beach) —

- i) Modify Policy PS 1.3 by deleting the second sentence, which reads:

“The Tourist Node of Smiths Beach will have a ratio of not more than one third residential to two thirds tourism development.”

and replacing it with the following:

“The Tourist Node of Smiths Beach, defined as being land west of Smiths Beach Road, has potential for tourist development, including short-stay accommodation.

Residential development will be permitted on Sussex Location 413 but will be secondary to the predominant tourist function.

Subdivision and development of the identified developable area(s) of Sussex Location 413 will have a ratio of not less than seventy percent (70%) tourist development and not more than thirty percent (30%) residential development calculated from the developable land area. Mixed residential densities of up to a maximum R Coding of R25 under Statement of Planning Policy No 1 (Residential Design Codes) for residential development will be considered.

Identifiable developable land will exclude areas to be set aside for Principal Ridge Protection, national park, public open space, or similar purposes as designated on an approved Development Guide Plan.”

- ii) Modify Policy PS 3.8 by adding a new dot point:

- avoid impacts on significant flora or fauna communities.

- iii) Modify *Table 1 – Settlement Hierarchy* in relation to the Tourist Node of Smiths Beach by:

- a) deleting the following words under the column headed “Permanent Population (unless otherwise stated)”:

“Up to 500 permanent residents (approximately 230 dwellings)”

and replacing them as follows:

“Short-stay and permanent populations to be determined in accordance with policy PS 1.3 (as amended), policy LUS 1.21 (as amended), policy LUS 1.23 (as amended) and other relevant provisions.”

- b) deleting the following words under the column headed “Commercial and Community Services”:

“Hotel, convenience and tourist facilities.”

and replacing them as follows:

“Local convenience services, tourist facilities and community focus.”

- c) deleting the following words under the column headed “Function”:

“At Smiths Beach, up to one third of the accommodation developed on Sussex Location 413 may be for permanent residential use.”

and replacing them as follows:

“At Smiths Beach, the function is determined by policy PS 1.3 (as amended).”

- d) deleting the following words under the column headed “Settlement”:

“Smiths Beach”

and replacing them as follows:

“Smiths Beach (west of Smiths Beach Road only).”

- iv) Modify Policy LUS 1.21 (Tourist Node) by replacing it with the following words:

“Proposed Development at Smiths Beach will reinforce the primary tourism function of the site and not compromise the natural landscape values of the area. The size, nature and location of any development in the development investigation area at Smiths Beach must be determined having regard to the overriding need to protect the visual amenity and environmental values of the area.”

- v) Modify Policy LUS 1.23 (Development Investigation Area) by replacing it with the following words:

“Proposals for rezoning, subdivision and development within the Development Investigation Area will be considered only after comprehensive planning has been undertaken and a resultant Outline Development Plan/Development Guide Plan which complies with the requirements of PS 3.8 has been the subject of community consultation, including public advertising, and approved by the local government and the Western Australian Planning Commission having consulted with relevant agencies.”
